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

## **ACKNOWLEDGMENTS**

Provision for the 1950 Census of Agriculture for American Samoa was made in the Act of Congress providing for the fifteenth and subsequent decennial censuses, approved June 18, 1929, as amended.

In compliance with Section I of this Act, a Census of Agriculture in American Samoa of the United States was taken by the Governor in accordance with plans prescribed by the Director of the Census. The planning of the census and the compilation of the statistics were supervised by Ray Hurley, Chief of the Agriculture Division and Warder B. Jenkins, Assistant Chief of the Division. They were assisted by Lois Hutchison, Faie Silvers, and Henry A. Tucker.

### INTRODUCTION

History of the census of agriculture.—The first United States Census of Agriculture of American Samoa was taken in 1920 in conjunction with the census of population. Since that date a census of agriculture has been taken every 10 years.

Legal basis for the 1950 Census of Agriculture.—Authorization for the 1950 Census of Agriculture was made in the act of Congress, approved June 18, 1929, providing for a census of American Samoa to be taken in the year 1930 and every 10 years thereafter. The act provided for the taking of the census by the Governor of the Island in accordance with the plans prescribed or approved by the Director of the Census.

The enumeration.—The questionnaire used for the census of population contained an inquiry ascertaining the occupation of each member of the household over 14 years old, who worked 1 or more weeks in 1949. This inquiry helped the enumerator to obtain an agriculture questionnaire for every place for which one was required. The enumerator was instructed to fill an agriculture questionnaire for every place on which crops were grown in 1949 or on which any livestock or poultry were kept on April 1, 1950.

Questionnaire used for the 1950 Census of Agriculture.—The 1950 Agriculture Questionnaire contained 31 questions calling for the name of the operator, the name of the owner of the property if other than operator, acres in the property, the area and quantity of the individual crops harvested in 1949, the number of trees or plants on April 1, 1950, and the quantity harvested in 1949 for individual fruits and nuts, and the number of the several classes of livestock on hand on April 1, 1950.

Presentation of statistics.—This report presents data from the 1950 Census of Agriculture with comparative data for the three previous censuses—1940, 1930, and 1920. The tables presenting data by counties show all the items on the 1950 Questionnaire with available comparative data from the 1940 Census

#### DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Definitions and explanations are presented only for those items for which the table descriptions are inadequate. The descriptive terms and explanations refer principally to the 1950 Census of Agriculture, although, in general, they are also applicable to the statistics presented for earlier censuses.

The census date.—The 1950 Census of Agriculture was taken as of April 1, 1950. Inventory items relate to approximately that date. Data on acreage of crops harvested are for the crop year, 1949. Although the section heading on the questionnaire specified April 1 for all inventory items, the individual inquiries did not refer to any date. Therefore, the replies may represent conditions at the date the questionnaires were filled. Generally, the questionnaires were filled within a few days following April 1.

A farm.—In the 1950 Census of Agriculture, places were counted as "farms" if any crops were harvested in 1949 or if any livestock or 5 or more chickens or other poultry were kept on April 1, 1950.

The enumerator was instructed to obtain an agriculture questionnaire for every household that grew any crops in 1949 or kept any livestock or poultry on April 1, 1950. The determination as to

which reports were to be included in the tabulations as representing farms was made during the processing of the questionnaires in Washington.

In 1940, the enumerator was instructed to obtain a questionnaire for every household that grew any crops in 1939 or kept 5 or more chickens or other poultry on April 1, 1940.

In 1930 and 1920, two questionnaires were used to record the agricultural activities. One was used to obtain the information for crops and the other for livestock.

Farm operator.—A "farm operator" is a person who operates a farm, either performing the labor himself or directly supervising it. He may be an owner or tenant. If he rents land to others, he operates only that land which he retains. The number of farm operators is considered the same as the number of farms.

Farms reporting.—The term "farms reporting," as used in the tables, indicates the number of farms for which the specified item was reported. For example, if there were 200 farms in a county and only 175 had chickens on hand, the number of farms reporting chickens would be 175. The difference in the total number of farms and the number of farms reporting an item represents the number of farms not having that item, provided the inquiry was answered completely for all farms when applicable.

Land in farms or acres in the property.—In the 1950 Census, the number of acres in the property was obtained for the first time. The 1940 Questionnaire contained an inquiry on the number of acres in the property, but the information was not obtained. The Governor-Commandant of the Island informed the Bureau of the Census that the information was not entered on the questionnaires because the natives could not answer the question with any degree of accuracy. The 1930 and 1920 Questionnaires did not contain an inquiry on the number of acres in the property.

Crops harvested.—Data on quantity harvested for field crops and fruits and nuts were so incomplete that they are not published. Therefore, the tables included in this report do not show any figures for quantity harvested.

Farms by size.—Farms were classified by size according to the total acres in each farm. In analyzing size-of-farm statistics, consideration should be given to the definition of a farm for Census purposes. Census farms are essentially operating units, not ownership tracts. If a landlord has tenants, the land assigned each tenant is a separate farm.

Farms by tenure of operator.—Farms were classified by tenure of operator in accordance with the replies to the following inquiries on the questionnaire:

1. What is the name of the operator?

Owners.—If a name was given under question 1 and a name did not appear under question 1a, the operator was classified as owner.

Tenants.—If a name appeared under question 1a, the operator was classified as tenant.
