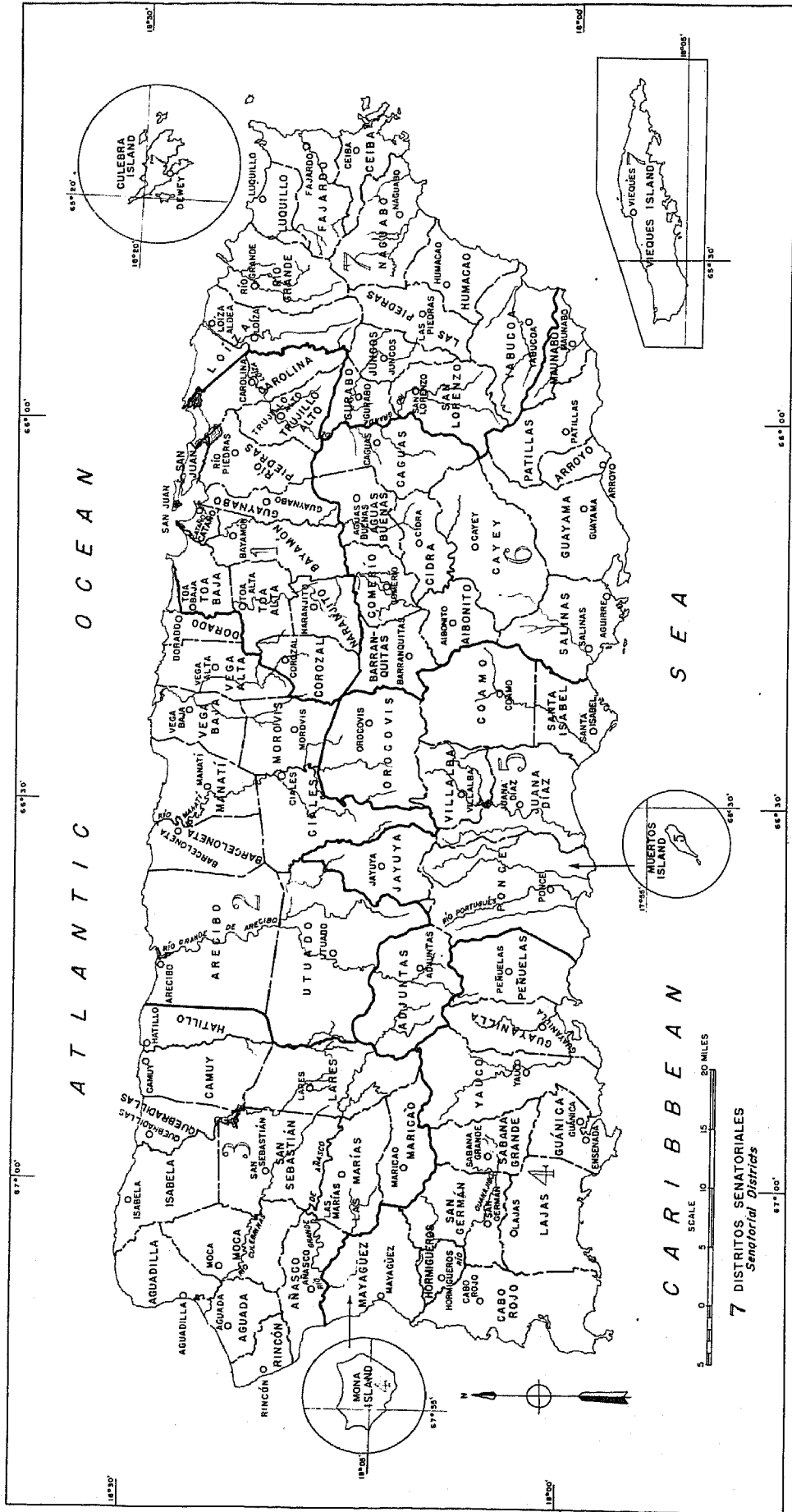

INTRODUCCION

Historia del censo de agricultura.—El primer censo de agricultura levantado en Puerto Rico por los Estados Unidos se efectuó el 15 de abril de 1910. Desde entonces siempre se ha hecho un censo de agricultura simultáneamente con el censo de población cada diez años. En 1935 un censo especial fué levantado por la Administración de Reconstrucción de Puerto Rico.

Base legal para el censo de agricultura de 1950.—La autorización para levantar el Censo de Agricultura de 1950 está provista en la ley del Congreso aprobada el 18 de junio de 1929 la cual autoriza un censo para Puerto Rico en el 1930 y cada diez años subsiguientes.

La enumeración.—Los planes para el Censo de 1950 incluían tres disposiciones cuyo fin era asegurar un censo de agricultura completo.

Primero, el cuestionario usado para el censo de población incluía tres preguntas para cada familia enumerada. Estas preguntas eran:

¿Está la vivienda situada en—

1. Un predio de terreno de 3 o más cuerdas?
2. Una parcela de un cuarto de cuerda pero menor de 3 cuerdas?
3. Otra parcela (menos de un cuarto)?

Si la casilla correspondiente a la primera pregunta era marcada, el enumerador tenía orden de obtener un cuestionario para finca de la persona a cargo. Este procedimiento fué usado para asegurar la enumeración de cualquier predio de terreno, no considerado localmente como finca, pero con suficiente producción agrícola para calificar como tal de acuerdo con el criterio del Censo. Aunque este método resultó en la obtención de un considerable número de cuestionarios que no estaban de acuerdo con los conceptos usados, por lo menos aseguró la inclusión de muchas fincas que de otra manera no hubiesen sido enumeradas. Si la casilla correspondiente a la segunda pregunta era marcada, el enumerador debía obtener los datos correspondientes al cuestionario para parcela de la persona a cargo. Si la casilla correspondiente a la tercera pregunta era marcada, no se requería llenar un cuestionario para finca o para parcela.

Segundo, con anterioridad al censo de 1950, y usando como base los récords del Censo de Agricultura de 1940, se prepararon listas de fincas de 200 cuerdas o más en tamaño. Estas listas fueron revisadas por miembros del Negociado del Censo y agrónomos del Negociado de Economía Agrícola del Departamento de Agricultura y Comercio de Puerto Rico (juramentados como agentes especiales del Censo) con el propósito de hacer correcciones, cancelaciones o adiciones a las mismas. Se utilizaron datos suministrados previamente por distintos agricultores, administradores de centrales azucareras y por agentes del Servicio de Extensión Agrícola de Puerto Rico para la corrección de estas listas de fincas grandes. Las listas finales fueron entregadas a los supervisores del Censo quienes tenían la responsabilidad de verificarlas para estar seguros de que cada finca fuese debidamente enumerada. Todos los cuestionarios de fincas grandes fueron cotejados en las oficinas de Washington para determinar las omisiones y eliminar los cuestionarios repetidos. Aquellos cuestionarios con respuestas dudosas fueron debidamente corregidos utilizando el sistema de correspon-

INTRODUCTION

History of the census of agriculture.—The first census of agriculture taken in Puerto Rico by the United States was made as of April 15, 1910. Since that time, a census of agriculture has been taken in conjunction with the census of population in each decennial enumeration. In 1935, a special census of Puerto Rico was taken by the Puerto Rico Reconstruction Administration.

Legal basis for the 1950 Census of Agriculture.—Authorization for the 1950 Census of Agriculture was made in the act of Congress, approved June 18, 1929, providing for a Census of Puerto Rico to be taken in the year 1930 and every ten years thereafter.

The enumeration.—Plans for the 1950 Census included three provisions designed to insure completeness of coverage of the census of agriculture.

First, the questionnaire used for the census of population contained three possible inquiries for every family enumerated. These inquiries were:

Is this house located on—

1. A tract of land of 3 or more cuerdas?
2. A parcela of at least one-fourth of a cuerda but less than 3 cuerdas?
3. Other parcela (less than one-fourth)?

If the square corresponding to the first inquiry was checked, the Census enumerator was instructed to obtain an agriculture questionnaire from the person in charge. This procedure was used in order to insure the enumeration of any tract of land, not locally considered a farm, with sufficient agricultural production to qualify as a farm according to Census criteria. While this method resulted in the securing of a considerable number of questionnaires which did not meet the criteria, it did insure the inclusion of many farms that might not have been enumerated otherwise.

If the square corresponding to the second inquiry was checked, the Census enumerator was to obtain a parcela questionnaire from the person in charge. If the square corresponding to the third inquiry was checked, neither an agriculture nor a parcela questionnaire was required.

Second, prior to the Census, lists of farms 200 cuerdas or more in size were prepared from the records of the 1940 Census of Agriculture, and were reviewed by members of the Census staff and by agronomists of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics of the Department of Agriculture and Commerce of Puerto Rico (sworn in as special agents of the Census) for the purpose of making corrections, deletions, and additions to the list. In revising these large farm lists, information gathered from individual farmers, sugar mill operators, agents of the Agricultural Extension Service of Puerto Rico, and various insular and federal agencies was utilized. The lists were given to the Census supervisors who were required to check them to see that each of the farms was enumerated. In Washington the questionnaires for the large farms were further checked for omissions and duplications, and answers to any questions arising during this checking were secured by correspondence.

Third, enumerators in the rural areas were instructed to indicate on their maps the location of every dwelling place and farm.

Tercero, los enumeradores de la zona rural tenían órdenes de marcar en sus mapas la ubicación de cada vivienda y finca. Este procedimiento fué designado con el objeto de ayudar al supervisor a comprobar si el enumerador había visitado cada vivienda y finca en su distrito de enumeración.

Cuestionarios usados en el Censo de Agricultura de 1950.—El Cuestionario para Finca de 1950 usado para enumerar todos los predios de terreno de 3 o más cuerdas se componía de 114 preguntas relacionadas con las características del operador de la finca; terreno en la finca de acuerdo con la tenencia; área cosechada, cantidad cosechada y cantidad vendida de cada producto agrícola; área sembrada en huertos frutales y árboles de nueces, número de árboles frutales y cantidad de frutas cosechadas y vendidas; terreno en la finca, clasificado de acuerdo con el uso; número y año del último modelo de tractor del tipo oruga y del tipo de ruedas; número de agregados y medianeros y terreno cultivado por ellos; número de trabajadores agrícolas clasificados en varias categorías; gastos especificados; número de las distintas clases de ganado en la finca; producción y venta de ciertos productos de ganadería; y ubicación del terreno en la finca.

Se usó un cuestionario distinto en la enumeración de parcelas de un cuarto de cuerda pero menor de tres cuerdas. Este cuestionario contenía 17 preguntas relacionadas con las características del operador de la parcela, incluyendo la tenencia, ocupación y número de días trabajados fuera de la parcela; tamaño de la misma, área cosechada de grupos específicos de productos agrícolas, cantidad cosechada de frutas específicas, valor total de todos los productos agrícolas, vegetales y frutas vendidas, número de las clases más importantes de ganado en la parcela y valor de las ventas de ganado y productos de ganadería.

Fincas grandes.—Se realizaron esfuerzos especiales para asegurar la más completa enumeración de todas las fincas de 200 o más cuerdas en tamaño. Estas fincas fueron enumeradas por un personal técnico debidamente entrenado o por jefes de grupos seleccionados especialmente para esta labor. Los cuestionarios de fincas grandes fueron revisados cuidadosamente en la oficina central antes de remitirse a Washington.

PRESENTACION DE LAS ESTADISTICAS

Este informe presenta los datos del Censo de Agricultura de 1950 y datos comparables de censos anteriores empezando con el Censo de 1910. Los datos están presentados para Puerto Rico y para cada municipio.

Tablas para Puerto Rico.—Las tablas para Puerto Rico presentan datos sobre aquellos productos agrícolas para los cuales existen cifras anteriores a 1950, incluyendo datos para ciertos productos agrícolas como vainilla, el cual no está incluido en las tablas por municipios para 1950. También presentan datos en tabulaciones cruzadas según la tenencia del operador, y el tamaño y tipo de finca para 1950.

Tablas por municipios.—Las tablas por municipios contienen algunos datos relacionados con la mayoría de los productos agrícolas que aparecen en el Cuestionario para Finca de 1950. No obstante, estas tablas no incluyen todos los datos disponibles, por ejemplo, aquéllos relacionados con la tenencia del operador, tamaño y tipo de finca, los cuales están informados en las tablas para Puerto Rico. Para la mayor parte de los productos agrícolas los datos comparativos disponibles del Censo de 1940 son presentados en las tablas por municipios.

Tablas por divisiones civiles menores.—Los datos correspondientes a la mayoría de los productos agrícolas incluidos en el Censo de 1950 fueron tabulados por divisiones civiles menores o barrios pero estas tabulaciones detalladas no están incluidas en los informes publicados. Las informaciones para estas pequeñas áreas geográficas pueden ser obtenidas pagando el costo de buscar los datos y de preparar las tablas estadísticas.

This procedure was designed to help the supervisor to ascertain if the enumerator had visited each dwelling and farm in his enumeration district.

Questionnaires used for the 1950 Census of Agriculture.—The 1950 Agriculture Questionnaire used for the enumeration of places of 3 or more cuerdas contained 114 inquiries relating to farm operator characteristics; land in the farm according to tenure; area harvested, quantity harvested, and quantity sold for individual crops; area in fruit orchards and planted nut trees, number of fruit trees, and quantity of fruit harvested and sold; land in the farm according to use; number and latest model of wheel and crawler tractors; number of agregados and medianeros and land cultivated by them; number of farm workers in various categories; specified expenditures; number of the important classes of livestock on farm; production and sales of certain livestock items; and location of farm land.

A separate questionnaire was used in the enumeration of places containing at least one-fourth but less than 3 cuerdas (parcelas). This questionnaire contained 17 inquiries relating to characteristics of the operator, including tenure, occupation, and number of days worked off the parcela; size of the parcela; area of specified groups of crops harvested; quantity of specified fruits harvested; total value of all crops, vegetables, and fruits sold; number of the more important classes of livestock on the parcela; and value of sales of livestock and livestock products.

Large farms.—Special efforts were made to insure the complete and accurate enumeration of all farms 200 cuerdas and over in size. These large farms were enumerated by technically trained persons or crew leaders who were specially selected for the task. Questionnaires for large farms were carefully reviewed in the central field office before being forwarded to Washington.

PRESENTATION OF STATISTICS

This report presents data from the 1950 Census of Agriculture with comparable data for previous censuses, beginning with 1910. Data are presented for Puerto Rico and for each municipality.

Puerto Rico tables.—The Puerto Rico summary tables present data for items for which historical figures are available for censuses prior to 1950, including data for some items, such as vanilla, not included in the municipality tables for 1950. They also present the data for cross tabulations made by tenure of operator, size of farm, and type of farm for 1950.

Municipality tables.—The municipality tables contain some information for most of the items on the 1950 Agriculture Questionnaire. However, they do not contain all the available information; for example, data for some items by tenure of operator, size of farm, and type of farm do not appear in the municipality tables but are given in the Puerto Rico tables. For most items, the available comparable data from the 1940 Census are shown in the municipality tables.

Minor civil division tables.—Data for most of the items included in the 1950 Census were tabulated by minor civil divisions (barrios), but these detailed tabulations are not included in any published reports. Information for these small geographic areas may be obtained by paying the cost of checking the data and preparing statistical tables.

Comparabilidad de datos.—La comparabilidad de los datos puede ser afectada por factores tales como el mes en el cual se hizo la enumeración, la definición de finca, la redacción de las preguntas, etc. Cuando la comparabilidad es afectada considerablemente, se hace mención de las diferencias bajo el producto agrícola específico. Los datos sobre la producción pueden ser afectados por factores climáticos y económicos prevaletentes durante el período cubierto por la enumeración. Por ejemplo, de acuerdo con la oficina en San Juan del Negociado del Tiempo del Departamento de Comercio de los Estados Unidos, el huracán que pasó al sur de Puerto Rico el 21 de septiembre de 1949 causó daños considerables a las distintas cosechas, del mismo modo que el tiempo anormal lluvioso en diciembre de 1949 y enero y febrero de 1950 fué también probablemente perjudicial a ciertas cosechas en la isla.

DEFINICIONES Y EXPLICACIONES

Se presentan definiciones y explicaciones solamente para aquellas preguntas en las cuales las descripciones anotadas en las tablas se consideran inadecuadas. Los términos descriptivos y explicaciones se refieren principalmente al Censo de Agricultura de 1950, aunque en general éstas son también aplicables a censos anteriores. Las definiciones consisten principalmente de un resumen del texto usado en el cuestionario, ocasionalmente suplementado por las partes más esenciales de las instrucciones dadas a los enumeradores. Para obtener el texto completo de las preguntas y las instrucciones incluidas en el cuestionario, véase el facsímil del Cuestionario para Finca de 1950, en el apéndice.

INFORMACION GENERAL SOBRE FINCA

La fecha del censo.—El Censo de Agricultura de 1950 fué levantado el 1.º de abril de 1950. Las preguntas sobre inventario se refieren aproximadamente a esa misma fecha. Los datos relacionados con el área, la producción y venta de productos agrícolas (con excepción de la caña de azúcar), se refieren al año agrícola que se extiende de abril 1, 1949 a marzo 31, 1950. Los datos respecto al área y cantidad de caña de azúcar producida se refieren al año agrícola de diciembre 1, 1948 a noviembre 30, 1949. Aunque el encabezamiento de la sección de ganadería y aves en el cuestionario para finca especifica el 1.º de abril como la fecha para enumerar todas las preguntas sobre inventario, las preguntas individuales no se refieren a ninguna fecha en particular. Por lo tanto, las respuestas pueden representar condiciones existentes a la fecha en la cual se llenó el cuestionario. Generalmente los cuestionarios fueron llenados pocos días después del 1.º de abril. La fecha en la cual el enumerador obtuvo la información requerida para el censo de agricultura puede afectar las estadísticas debido a cambios que ocurrieron entre la fecha del censo y la fecha de enumeración.

En censos anteriores, las preguntas sobre inventario se refieren a la fecha del censo y las preguntas sobre producción, con excepción del año 1935, al año calendario precedente. Para el 1935 las preguntas sobre producción corresponden al año calendario 1935.

Una finca.—Predios de 3 o más cuerdas eran contados como fincas para el Censo de Agricultura de 1950 si en los mismos se había llevado a efecto la siembra y cosecha de cualquier producto agrícola durante 1949, con la excepción de la siembra de vegetales para uso en el hogar, o si había en dichos predios algún ganado o 15 o más gallinas u otras aves.

Todo el terreno bajo el dominio de una persona o sociedad fué incluido como una sola finca. El dominio pudo haber sido mediante posesión o contrato de arrendamiento.

No se le entregó al enumerador la definición de una finca, sino que se le instruyó a que llenara un cuestionario para finca para cada predio de 3 o más cuerdas aunque el mismo fuese considerado o no como finca. De este modo se llenaron cuestionarios para finca para más predios que los que calificaban como fincas. La determinación en cuanto a cuáles eran los informes

Comparability of data for various censuses.—Comparability of the data may be affected by such factors as the month in which the enumeration was made, the definition of a farm, the wording of the questions, etc. When the comparability is affected to an appreciable extent, mention is made of the differences under the specific item. Production figures may also be influenced by climatic and economic conditions existing during the period covered by the enumeration. For instance, according to the Weather Bureau of the United States Department of Commerce, San Juan Station, the hurricane which passed south of Puerto Rico on September 21, 1949, caused considerable crop damage, while abnormally wet weather in December 1949, and January and February 1950, was also probably detrimental to certain crops on the Island.

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Definitions and explanations are presented only for those items for which the table descriptions are considered inadequate. The descriptive terms and explanations refer principally to the 1950 Census of Agriculture, although, in general, they are also applicable to earlier censuses. The definitions consist primarily of a résumé of the questionnaire wording, occasionally supplemented by the more essential parts of instructions given to the enumerators. For the exact phrasing of the inquiries and of the instructions included on the questionnaire, reference should be made to the facsimile of the 1950 Agriculture Questionnaire shown in the Appendix.

GENERAL FARM INFORMATION

The census date.—The 1950 Census of Agriculture was taken as of April 1, 1950. Inventory items relate approximately to that date. Data relating to area and quantity of crops (except sugarcane) harvested and to sales of agricultural products are for the crop year extending from April 1, 1949, to March 31, 1950. Data on the area and quantity of sugarcane harvested are for the crop year extending from December 1, 1948, to November 30, 1949. Although the heading of the livestock and poultry section of the agriculture questionnaire specified April 1 for all inventory items, the individual inquiries did not refer to any date. Therefore, the replies may represent conditions as of the date the questionnaires were filled.

Questionnaires were generally filled within a few days following April 1. The date on which the enumerator obtained the information required for the census of agriculture may affect the statistics because of changes that occurred between the census date and the actual date of enumeration.

For previous censuses, the inventory items relate to the date of the census and the production items, with the exception of 1935, to the preceding calendar year. For 1935, the production items relate to the calendar year 1935.

A farm.—For the 1950 Census of Agriculture, places of 3 or more cuerdas were counted as farms if any agricultural products other than vegetables for home use were produced in 1949 or if any livestock or 15 or more chickens or other poultry were kept on the place.

All the land under the control of one person or partnership was included as one farm. Control may have been through ownership, or through lease or rental, arrangement.

The Census enumerator was not given the definition of a farm. He was instructed to obtain an agriculture questionnaire for every place of 3 or more cuerdas, whether or not it was considered a farm. Thus, agriculture questionnaires were filled for more places than those that qualified as farms. The determination as to which reports were to be included in the tabulations as representing farms was made during the processing of the questionnaires in

que debían considerarse como representativos de fincas y que debían incluirse en las tabulaciones, se llevó a efecto durante la elaboración de los cuestionarios en Washington. Se siguió este sistema con el objeto de aplicar un criterio uniforme.

Para el censo de 1940 y otros censos anteriores de agricultura, la definición de finca se hizo un tanto más amplia. En cada censo anterior al de 1950, todos aquellos predios de 3 o más cuerdas en los cuales se llevaron a efecto operaciones agrícolas, fueron contados como fincas. Predios de menos de tres cuerdas fueron considerados como fincas en 1940 si los productos agrícolas producidos en 1939 tenían un valor de \$100 o más; en 1935, 1930 y 1920, si la producción agrícola durante el año cubierto por el censo tenía un valor de \$100 o más, o si el predio requería los servicios continuos de por lo menos una persona; y en 1910, si la producción agrícola en 1909 tenía un valor de \$250 o más. A los enumeradores de todos los censos anteriores a 1950 se les entregó la definición de finca y fueron instruidos a que llenaran informes solamente para aquellos predios que reunían los requisitos de la definición.

En todos los censos desde el 1910 al 1940 se obtuvieron cuestionarios separados para los medianeros, pero en 1950 las operaciones agrícolas de éstos se incluyeron en los cuestionarios correspondientes a las fincas donde ellos trabajaron.

La disminución en el número de fincas entre el 1940 y 1950 es probablemente el resultado, en parte, de los cambios en la definición de finca. Las fincas de menos de tres cuerdas en 1940 no se contaban como fincas en 1950.

Enumeración de terreno ubicado en más de un barrio o municipio.—El terreno en una finca individual puede estar ubicado en dos o más barrios o municipios. En tales casos, la finca entera fué enumerada en solamente un barrio o municipio. Si el operador de la finca vivía en la misma, ésta se enumeraba en el barrio o municipio donde el operador vivía. Si el operador no vivía en la finca, los datos para dicha finca se incluían en el barrio o municipio en donde estaba localizado el almacén principal. Si había alguna duda en cuanto a la localización del almacén principal de la finca, ésta y todos los datos pertinentes a ella se incluían en el barrio o municipio en donde la mayor parte del terreno estaba ubicado.

Operadores de fincas.—Un operador de finca es una persona que explota una finca, ya sea desempeñando él mismo la labor o supervisándola directamente. Puede ser el dueño, un administrador asalariado, o un arrendatario. Si da terreno en arrendamiento a otras personas, se le considera como operador solamente de aquel terreno que él retiene. En el caso de una sociedad, un sólo miembro fué incluido como operador. El número de operadores de fincas es considerado igual al número de fincas.

Fincas que informan u operadores que informan.—Las cifras para todas las fincas u operadores que informan representan el número de fincas u operadores de fincas para los cuales la pregunta especificada fué informada. Por ejemplo, si habían 1122 fincas en un municipio y de éstas solamente 300 tenían cabros, el número de fincas informando cabros sería 300. La diferencia entre el número total de fincas y el número de fincas informando dicho dato representa el número de fincas que no tienen cabros, siempre y cuando que la pregunta fuera contestada para todas las fincas.

Terreno propio, arrendado, y administrado.—El terreno a ser incluido en cada finca fué determinado preguntando el número de cuerdas poseídas, las cuerdas arrendadas de otras personas y las cuerdas arrendadas a otras personas. Se obtuvo el total de cuerdas en la finca sumando las cuerdas poseídas y las cuerdas arrendadas de otras personas y restando las cuerdas arrendadas a otras personas. En el caso de una finca bajo un administrador asalariado, se le preguntó a la persona a cargo el área total administrada para su patrono. Del área total administrada se restó el área que hubiese arrendada a otros. Para el 1950, las cifras para terreno propio, terreno arrendado de otros y terreno administrado por operadores de fincas incluyen el terreno que los operadores de fincas arrendaron a otras personas.

Washington. This procedure was followed in order that uniform criteria could be applied.

For the 1940 and earlier censuses of agriculture, the definition of a farm was somewhat more inclusive. In each census prior to 1950 all places of 3 or more cuerdas on which there were agricultural operations were counted as farms. Places of less than 3 cuerdas were considered farms in 1940 if agricultural production during 1939 was valued at \$100 or more; in 1935, 1930, and 1920 if agricultural production during the year covered by the census was valued at \$100 or more or the plot required the continuous services of at least one person; and in 1910, if agricultural production during 1909 was valued at \$250 or more. Enumerators in censuses prior to 1950 were provided with the definition of a farm and were instructed to fill reports only for those places which met the criteria.

In censuses from 1910 through 1940, separate questionnaires were obtained for medianeros (sharecroppers), but in 1950 the operations of these individuals were included on the questionnaires for the farms on which they worked.

The decrease in the number of farms between 1940 and 1950 is probably the result in part of changes in the definition of a farm. The farms of less than 3 cuerdas in 1940 would not be counted as farms in 1950.

Enumeration of land located in more than one barrio or municipality.—Land in an individual farm may be located in two or more barrios or municipalities. In such cases, the entire farm was enumerated in only one barrio and one municipality. If the farm operator lived on the farm, the farm was enumerated in the barrio and municipality in which the farm operator lived. If the farm operator did not live on the farm, the figures for the farm have been included in the barrio and municipality in which the farm headquarters was located. If there was any question as to the location of the headquarters of the farm, the farm and all the data for it have been included in the barrio and municipality in which most of the land was located.

Farm operators.—A "farm operator" is a person who operates a farm, either performing the labor himself or directly supervising it. He may be an owner, a hired manager, or a tenant. If he rents land to others he is considered as the operator of only that land which he retains. In the case of a partnership, one member was included as the operator. The number of farm operators is considered the same as the number of farms.

Farms reporting or operators reporting.—Figures for all farms reporting or operators reporting represent the number of farms, or farm operators for which the specified item was reported. For example, if there were 1,122 farms in a municipality and only 300 had goats, the number of farms reporting goats would be 300. The difference in the total number of farms and the number of farms reporting that item represents the number of farms not having that item, provided the inquiry was answered for all farms.

Land owned, rented, and managed.—The land to be included in each farm was determined by asking the number of cuerdas owned, the cuerdas rented from others, and the cuerdas rented to others. The cuerdas in the farm were obtained by adding the cuerdas owned and cuerdas rented from others, and subtracting the cuerdas rented to others. In case of a managed farm, the person in charge was asked the total area managed for his employer. From this total managed area was subtracted any of the area which was rented to others. For 1950, the figures for land owned, land rented from others, and land managed by farm operators include the land that farm operators rented to others.

In earlier censuses, the enumerator was instructed to include all land rented from others and to exclude all land rented to others.

En censos anteriores, el enumerador fué instruído a incluir todo el terreno arrendado de otros y excluir todo el terreno arrendado a otros. Solamente anotó aquella parte del área que era de propiedad del operador y del área arrendada de otros. De este modo el terreno incluido en cada finca fué prácticamente igual al incluido en el Censo de 1950.

Terreno propio.—Terreno propio incluye todo el terreno que el operador o su esposa, o ambos, poseen bajo título, contrato de compra, o como uno de los herederos, o como fideicomisario de una herencia.

Terreno tomado a título de arrendamiento.—El terreno tomado a título de arrendamiento incluye terreno arrendado bajo ciertas condiciones mediante las cuales el arrendatario tiene el derecho al uso de la tierra.

Terreno dado en arrendamiento.—La mayor parte de este terreno dado en arrendamiento representa terrenos para faenas agrícolas pero también incluye predios dados en arrendamiento para fines residenciales y otros propósitos. Cuando el terreno es dado en arrendamiento, el arrendatario es considerado como operador de la finca. El dueño de la finca es considerado como explotador solamente de aquella parte del terreno no asignado a los arrendatarios. El terreno trabajado por los medianeros no se clasificó como terreno arrendado a otros.

Area del terreno.—El área aproximada del terreno informada para Puerto Rico en 1950 es igual a la informada en el Censo de 1940. Todas las áreas se informan en términos de cuerdas. Una cuerda es equivalente a 0.9712 de un acre.

Terreno de las fincas.—El área designada como "terreno de las fincas" incluye áreas considerables de terreno que no están realmente bajo cultivo y algún terreno no usado para pasto de corte o pastoreo. Todo terreno enmalezado y terreno baldío propiedad de los operadores de las fincas o incluido en predios arrendados de otros está comprendido como terreno en las fincas.

Terrenos en las fincas de acuerdo con su uso.—El terreno en las fincas fué clasificado basándose en el uso que se hizo del mismo durante el período de abril 1ro 1949 a marzo 31, 1950. Estas clases de terreno se excluyen mutuamente, o sea, cada cuerda de terreno fué incluida una sola vez aún cuando la misma hubiese tenido más de un uso durante el período específico. Las clases de terreno son como sigue:

Terreno de cultivo usado para cosechas.—Esta clase incluye terreno del cual se cosecharon productos agrícolas, terreno con árboles frutales y nueces en estado de producción y de no producción, incluyendo plátanos, guineos y cocos, y terreno del cual no se cosechó ningún producto agrícola durante el período cubierto por el censo pero que estaba sembrado de café, caña de azúcar o piñas para cosecha futura. Terreno del cual se cosecharon dos o más productos agrícolas debía contarse una sola vez. Debido a que cada producto agrícola fué informado por separado bajo "productos agrícolas cosechados" el total de las cuerdas de los productos agrícolas individualmente cosechados en un municipio puede exceder del área designada como "terreno de cultivo usado para cosechas."

Terreno de pasto que se puede cultivar.—Este incluye el terreno con pasto abierto o enmalezado que el operador de la finca consideró apropiado para cultivar.

Terreno de pasto que no se puede cultivar.—Este incluye el terreno de pasto abierto o enmalezado que el operador de la finca no consideró apropiado para cultivar.

Terreno que no es de cultivo ni de pasto.

Cubierto por montes y malezas.—Este incluye todo terreno de montes o malezas que el operador de la finca no consideró apropiado para cultivar o para pasto.

Ocupado por edificaciones, caminos y terreno baldío.—Esta clasificación incluye todo el terreno ocupado por edificaciones, caminos, verjas y terreno baldío. Incluye todo el terreno en la finca no clasificable bajo ninguna de las otras clases de uso del terreno.

Los datos del Censo de 1950 en relación con el uso del terreno no son enteramente comparables con los del 1940. El Cuestionario de Agricultura de 1940 solicitaba información con respecto a cinco clases de terreno de cultivo. La combinación de dos de las

He recorded only that portion of the area owned and the area rented from others which was retained by the farm operator. Thus, the land included in each farm was essentially the same as that included in the 1950 Census.

Land owned.—Land owned includes all land which the operator or his wife, or both, hold under title, purchase contract, or as one of the heirs, or as a trustee of an individual estate.

Land rented from others.—Land rented from others includes land rented or leased under some arrangement whereby the tenant controls the use of the land.

Land rented to others.—For the most part, this land rented to others represents agricultural lands but it also includes tracts rented for residential or other purposes. When land is leased or rented, the tenant is considered the farm operator. The owner of the farm is considered as operating only that portion of the land not assigned to tenants. Land worked on shares by medianeros was not classified as "land rented to others."

Land area.—The approximate land area reported for 1950 for Puerto Rico is the same as that reported in the 1940 Census. All land areas are given in terms of cuerdas. A cuerda is equivalent to 0.9712 of an acre.

Land in farms.—The area designated "land in farms" includes considerable areas of land not actually under cultivation and some land not used for pasture or grazing. All woodland and wasteland owned by farm operators, or included in tracts rented from others, is included as land in farms.

Land in farms according to use.—Land in farms was classified according to how it was used during the period from April 1, 1949, to March 31, 1950. These classes of land are mutually exclusive, i. e., each cuerda of land was included only once even though it may have had more than one use during the period specified. The classes are as follows:

Cropland used for crops.—This includes land from which crops were harvested, land in bearing and nonbearing fruit and nut trees including plantains, bananas, and coconuts, and land from which no crop was harvested during the year covered by the census but which was occupied by coffee, sugarcane, or pineapples for future harvest. Land from which two or more crops were harvested was to be counted only once. Since each crop was reported separately under "crops harvested," a total of the cuerdas of the individual crops harvested in a municipality may exceed the area designated as "cropland used for crops" in that municipality.

Pastureland suitable for crops.—This includes open or brushland pasture which the respondent considered suitable for use for crops.

Pastureland not suitable for crops.—This includes any open or brushland pasture which the respondent did not consider suitable for use for crops.

Land not used for crops or pasture, occupied by hills and mountains.—This includes all land in hills, mountains, and brushland which the respondent did not consider as suitable for crops or for use as pastureland.

Buildings, roads, and wastelands.—This item includes all house lots, roads, fences, and wasteland. It includes all farm land which does not belong under any of the other land-use classes.

Figures for the 1950 Census on use of land are not entirely comparable with those for 1940. In 1940, five classes of cropland were listed on the Agriculture Questionnaire. Two of these 1940 classes—"cropland harvested" and "cropland in crops for future

clases informadas en 1940, o sea, "terreno de cultivo cosechado" y "terreno de cultivo sembrado de productos agrícolas para cosechar en el futuro," son comparables con la clasificación simple usada en 1950 como "terreno de cultivo usado para cosechas." Las otras categorías de terreno de cultivo usadas en 1940, las cuales son "cosechas perdidas," "terreno de cultivo en barbecho" y "terreno de cultivo no usado" no fueron incluidas en la clasificación de 1950. El área correspondiente a estas tres categorías de terreno de cultivo para el Censo de 1940, ha sido combinada en este informe como "terreno de pasto que se puede cultivar," pues se consideró que dichas clases de terreno eran usadas para pasto alguna vez durante el año. En el Censo de 1940 se clasificó el pasto en "terreno de pastos que puede ser usado para cultivos," "pastos enmalezados" y "otro terreno usado para pastos." Esta primera clasificación ha sido incluida en las tablas en las cifras correspondientes a "terreno de pasto que se puede cultivar." No obstante, el Censo de 1940 no consideraba que el terreno de pasto era cultivable a menos que dicho terreno hubiese sido cultivado en los últimos diez años, y por lo tanto, algún terreno apropiado para cultivo puede haber sido incluido en la categoría de "otro pasto." En este informe, las cifras del Censo de 1940 para "pasto enmalezado," y "otro pasto" han sido sumadas para obtener el total correspondiente a la clase "terreno de pasto que no se puede cultivar."

Terreno bajo riego.—Terreno bajo riego es aquél al cual se le ha aplicado agua por medios artificiales con el objeto de utilizarlo para fines agrícolas. El terreno informado como bajo riego fué incluido en "terreno de cultivo para cosechas" o en "terreno de pasto que se puede cultivar." Las fincas que informan terreno bajo riego incluyen todas aquéllas que estaban bajo riego, aunque toda la finca o sólo parte de la misma fuera regada.

Equipo específico.—El cuestionario contenía preguntas referentes al número y año del último modelo de tractor del tipo de ruedas y del tipo oruga.

Agregados.—Un agregado es un miembro de una familia que vive en una finca que no es explotada por ningún miembro de dicha familia. Un agregado puede ser o no un empleado del operador de la finca y puede o no producir en la finca cualquier producto agrícola para su uso personal. Usualmente un agregado vive en un pequeño predio de terreno lo suficientemente grande para permitirle la siembra de algunos productos agrícolas o la crianza de algunas gallinas, cerdos o vacas. Puede estar autorizado a usar el terreno gratuitamente o puede pagar informalmente por el uso del mismo por medio de su trabajo, en productos agrícolas o dinero. No tiene control sobre el uso del terreno y no tiene contrato definitivo con el operador de la finca. La casa en la cual vive el agregado puede ser de su propiedad, alquilada o usada sin pagar alquiler.

El Cuestionario para Finca de 1950 solicitaba del operador de la finca que informara el número de familias de agregados que no eran medianeros, viviendo en la finca en la fecha del censo y el área de terreno cultivado por éstos entre el 1ro de abril de 1949 y el 31 de marzo de 1950. El operador de la finca era el responsable de suministrar al enumerador e incluir como parte de su finca todos los datos en relación con el total de ganado perteneciente a los agregados y mantenido en la finca al igual que toda la producción agrícola de dichos agregados.

Medianeros.—Un medianero es una persona que trabaja terreno bajo un arreglo definitivo con un operador de finca recibiendo una parte de las cosechas en retribución por su labor u otra contribución.

El Censo de 1940 consideraba el terreno trabajado por un medianero como una finca individual si dicho predio de terreno era de 3 cuerdas o más en tamaño o si el valor de los productos agrícolas cosechados en 1939 era de \$100 o más. En 1950 no se llenaron cuestionarios para finca por separado para aquellos predios operados por medianeros. Los operadores de fincas fueron instruidos a informar el número de medianeros trabajando en la finca desde el 1ro de abril de 1949 al 31 de marzo de 1950 y las

harvest"—taken together are comparable with the single 1950 class "cropland used for crops." The remaining 1940 cropland classes "crop failure," "cropland in soil-improvement crops or fallow," and "idle cropland," were not included in the 1950 classification. The 1940 areas of these three classes of cropland have been combined in this report as "pastureland suitable for crops," as it was considered that such classes of land were usually used for pasture sometime during the year. In 1940, pasture was classified into "plowable pasture," "woodland pasture," and "other pasture." "Plowable pasture" has been included in the tables in the figures for "pastureland suitable for crops." However, in 1940, pasture was not considered plowable unless it had been cultivated in the last ten years, and therefore some land suitable for crops may have been included under "other pasture." In this report, the figures for 1940 for "woodland pasture" and "other pasture" have been added to obtain the total for the class "pastureland not suitable for crops."

Irrigated land.—Irrigated land is that to which water is applied by artificial means for agricultural purposes. The land reported as under irrigation was included in cropland used for crops or in pastureland suitable for crops. Farms reporting irrigated land include all farms with irrigation, regardless of whether all or part of the farm was irrigated.

Specified equipment.—The questionnaire contained inquiries as to the number of and year of newest model of wheel and crawler tractors.

Agregados.—An agregado is a member of a family living on a farm not operated by any members of the family. An agregado may or may not be an employee of the farm operator, and he may or may not produce any agricultural products of his own on the farm. An agregado usually lives on a small plot large enough for the cultivation of a few crops or the raising of some chickens, hogs, or cows. He may be allowed to use the land gratuitously or may pay informally for the use of the land in work, agricultural products, or money. He does not control the use of the land and does not have a definite contract with the operator of the farm. The agregado may own, rent, or use rent-free the house in which he lives.

The 1950 Agriculture Questionnaire asked the farm operator to report the number of agregado families that were not medianeros living on the farm at the time of the census and the amount of land cultivated by these agregados between April 1, 1949, and March 31, 1950. Livestock belonging to agregados and kept on the farm, and all agricultural production by agregados on the farm, were to be reported by the operator of the farm on which the agregado lived.

Medianeros (sharecroppers).—A medianero is a person who works land under a definite arrangement with a farm operator, receiving a certain share of the crops in return for his labor or other contribution.

The 1940 Census considered the land operated by a medianero as a separate farm if the tract of land was 3 cuerdas or more in size or if its agricultural products in 1939 were valued at \$100 or more. In 1950 separate agriculture questionnaires were not obtained for places operated by medianeros. Farm operators were instructed to report the number of medianeros working on the farm from April 1, 1949, to March 31, 1950, and the cuerdas cultivated

cuerdas cultivadas por éstos durante dicho período, y a incluir en los datos para sus fincas todo el ganado perteneciente a los medianeros y mantenido en la finca al igual que toda la producción agrícola de dichos medianeros. En censos anteriores no se tomaron medidas para la enumeración de terreno explotado por medianeros, si el tamaño del predio y el valor de la producción agrícola era menos de tres cuerdas y \$100 respectivamente. En 1950, sin embargo, cuando tales predios eran parte integrante de una finca, la producción debía informarse en el cuestionario para la finca donde el medianero trabajaba. Si tales predios no eran parte integrante de una finca, la producción debía informarse en el cuestionario para parcela, siempre y cuando que el tamaño del predio no fuese menor de un cuarto de cuerda.

Debido a que una persona puede trabajar como medianero en más de una finca, puede haber cierto grado de exageración en las cifras del Censo en cuanto al número de medianeros. Igualmente, como una persona puede vivir como agregado en una finca y trabajar como medianero en otra, algunas personas pueden ser contadas como agregados y como medianeros a la vez.

Trabajo en la finca.—En 1950 las preguntas relacionadas con el trabajo en la finca solicitaban el número de personas de 14 años o más trabajando en la finca en cualquier operación agrícola o tarea similar, durante la semana calendario precedente a la enumeración. Esta semana no es la misma para todas las fincas debido a que la enumeración cubrió un período de varias semanas.

Trabajo en la finca debía incluir cualquier trabajo, faena agrícola y la planificación necesaria para la operación de una finca. El trabajo doméstico no debía ser incluido.

Se obtuvieron datos por separado para el operador, miembros de la familia del operador trabajando sin paga, trabajadores asalariados y obreros a jornal. Los enumeradores fueron instruidos a informar como personas trabajando dos días o más durante la semana precedente a la enumeración, a los miembros de la familia del operador trabajando sin paga.

Gastos especificados de la finca.—Se obtuvieron únicamente datos sobre gastos en la finca para partidas seleccionadas. Las cantidades gastadas por agregados y medianeros trabajando el terreno debían ser informadas para la finca en donde esas personas vivían o trabajaban. Solamente los pagos en efectivo debían ser incluidos en la pregunta relacionada con la mano de obra alquilada. Los gastos del servicio doméstico no debían ser incluidos.

Los gastos para alimento de animales y aves debían incluir alimentos concentrados y suplementos minerales al igual que gastos para granos.

Los gastos para la compra de abono químico debían incluir la cantidad total gastada en la compra de toda clase de abonos comerciales usados en la finca.

ANIMALES EN LA FINCA

El Cuestionario para Finca usado para el Censo de Agricultura de 1950 estipulaba que se hiciera un inventario de toda clase importante de animales y aves en la finca. Los animales debían ser enumerados en la finca en que se encontraran el 1ro de abril, sin tomar en consideración quiénes eran los dueños de los mismos. Era responsabilidad del operador informar los animales que tenía en su finca pertenecientes a agregados y medianeros. Las preguntas en relación con la producción y venta de productos animales en las fincas se refieren al período del 1ro de abril de 1949 al 31 de marzo de 1950.

Vacas y novillas, vacas ordeñadas y leche vendida.—Los datos relativos al número de vacas y novillas se refieren al 1ro de abril de 1950 pero la información sobre el número de vacas ordeñadas y leche vendida cubre el período del 1ro de abril de 1949 al 31 de marzo de 1950.

Cabros y cabras ordeñadas.—La información sobre el número de cabros en la finca se refiere al 1ro de abril de 1950, mientras

by them during this period, and to include livestock kept and agricultural production by medianeros in the figures for their farms. In prior censuses, provisions were not made for the enumeration of land operated by medianeros if the size of the place was less than 3 cuerdas and the value of agricultural products was less than \$100. In 1950, however, when such places were part of a farm, the production was to be reported on the questionnaire for the farm on which the medianero worked. When such places were not a part of any farm, production was to be reported on the questionnaire for parcelas unless the place was less than one-fourth of a cuerda in size.

Since it is possible for the same person to work as medianero on more than one farm, Census figures may overstate the number of medianeros. Likewise, since it is possible for a person to live as an agregado on one farm and work as a medianero on another, some persons may be counted both as agregados and as medianeros.

Farm labor.—The farm labor inquiries for 1950 called for the number of persons 14 years old and over, doing farm work or chores on the farm during the calendar week preceding the enumeration. Inasmuch as the enumeration occurred over a period of several weeks, the calendar week preceding the enumeration is not the same for all farms.

Farm work was to include any work, chores on the farm, and the planning necessary to the operation of the farm. Housework was not to be included.

Separate figures were obtained for the operator, unpaid members of the operator's family, salaried workers, and hired workers. The enumerators were instructed to report only those persons working two or more days during the week preceding the enumeration as unpaid members of the operator's family.

Specified farm expenditures.—Data on farm expenditures were obtained only for selected items. Amounts spent by agregados and medianeros in working land were to be reported for the farm on which those persons lived or worked. Only cash payments were to be included for hired labor. Expenditures for housework were not to be included.

Expenditures for feed were to include concentrates and mineral supplements as well as expenditures for grain.

Expenditures for the purchase of chemical fertilizer were to include the total amount spent for commercial fertilizers of all kinds used on the farm.

LIVESTOCK

The 1950 Agriculture Questionnaire provided for an inventory of all the important kinds of animals and poultry on farms. Animals were to be enumerated on the farm on which they were located on April 1, regardless of ownership. It was the responsibility of the farm operator to report animals belonging to agregados and medianeros on his farm. The inquiries regarding animal production and sales of animal products on farms relate to the period from April 1, 1949, to March 31, 1950.

Cows and heifers, cows milked, and milk sold.—Data on number of cows and heifers relate to April 1, 1950, but the data on the number of cows milked and milk sold relate to the period from April 1, 1949, to March 31, 1950.

Goats and goats milked.—Data on the number of goats on the farm relate to April 1, 1950, while data on the number of goats

que los datos sobre el número de cabras ordeñadas se refieren al período del 1ro de abril de 1949 al 31 de marzo de 1950.

Comparabilidad con censos anteriores.—La comparabilidad de datos sobre animales con los datos de censos anteriores está afectada por la fecha de enumeración del Censo, cambios en las especificaciones de edades que debían informarse y otras variaciones en la terminología usada en el cuestionario y en las instrucciones. La Tabla "A" presenta la fecha de levantamiento censal y los animales de acuerdo con las edades mínimas que debían tener para ser enumerados en cada censo desde 1910 a 1950.

En 1940 aquellos animales en lugares que no reunían los requisitos para ser clasificados como fincas fueron informados como "animales domésticos fuera de fincas." Algunos de los animales que hubiesen sido clasificados como "animales fuera de fincas" de acuerdo con el criterio y procedimiento puestos en práctica en 1940, fueron enumerados en parcelas en 1950, mientras que aquellos otros animales pertenecientes a medianeros residentes en fincas fueron incluidos en el informe correspondiente a los operadores de las fincas donde estos medianeros vivían. Los animales que había en predios cuyas extensiones eran de menos de un cuarto de cuerda no fueron enumerados en el Censo de 1950.

En 1950 se solicitó del agricultor que diera datos por separado sobre el número de gallinas, pollos y gallos en la finca. En los Censos de 1920, 1930, 1935 y 1940 el cuestionario de agricultura solicitaba únicamente el número de gallinas. El término "gallinas" se refiere específicamente a las hembras del gallo o también puede usarse como término general que incluye gallinas, pollos y gallos sin tomar en cuenta el sexo o la edad. Por lo tanto para evitar confusión en la interpretación del término y que tal vez en algunos casos se omitiera el número de gallos y pollos, al informar este dato se hizo la pregunta por separado para cada clase.

milmed relate to the period from April 1, 1949, to March 31, 1950.

Comparability with previous censuses.—Comparability of data on the number of livestock and poultry for the various censuses is affected by the census enumeration date, changes in specification of age groups to be reported, and other variations in questionnaire wording and instructions. Table A lists the enumeration date and animal age groups enumerated for each census from 1910 to 1950.

In 1940, animals on places which did not qualify as farms were reported under "Domestic animals not on farms." Some of the animals that would have been classified as "not on farms" under 1940 procedures were enumerated on parcelas in 1950, while others belonging to medianeros living on farms were included in the report of the farms on which the medianeros lived. There was no provision in 1950 for the enumeration of animals located on places less than one-fourth cuerda in size.

In 1950, the farmer was asked to give separate reports on the number of hens (gallinas) and the number of roosters and pullets (pollos y gallos) on the farm. In the 1920, 1930, 1935, and 1940 Censuses, the agriculture questionnaire asked only for the number of "gallinas." The term "gallinas" specifically refers to "hens" but is also used in Puerto Rico in a more general sense to refer to all chickens. Separate inquiries regarding hens and roosters and pullets were included on the 1950 questionnaire in order to prevent misunderstanding as to the age and sex groups of chickens to be reported.

PRODUCTOS AGRICOLAS

Productos agrícolas cosechados.—El cuestionario para finca estaba preparado en tal forma que era posible anotar el área y la cantidad cosechada para cada producto agrícola que fué sembrado en la finca. Si no había en el cuestionario una pregunta específica para anotar los datos sobre un producto agrícola en particular, esta cosecha y sus datos respectivos debía de informarse bajo una de las varias preguntas con el epígrafe de "otros."

Las unidades de medidas usadas para informar la cantidad cosechada de algunos productos agrícolas han cambiado de un censo a otro. Las cifras sobre cantidad cosechada para cada producto

CROPS

Crops harvested.—The agriculture questionnaire was so organized that it was possible to list the area and quantity harvested for every crop that was grown on the farm. If a separate question was not on the questionnaire for a particular crop, that crop was to be reported under one of several "all other" questions.

The units of measure used for reporting the quantity harvested for some crops have varied from one census to another. The figures on quantity harvested for each crop are shown in the unit of measure appearing on the 1950 questionnaire. This required sometimes that the figures for earlier years be converted into

agrícola aparecen en la unidad de medida que se indica en el cuestionario para finca de 1950. Esto requirió que en algunos casos los datos informados en años anteriores se cambiaran a otras unidades distintas a las publicadas en dichos años. Los cambios se hicieron usando las medidas en uso corriente.

Cosechas principales y frutos menores.—Se obtuvieron datos en el cuestionario para finca de 1950 sobre las cuerdas de caña cortadas y las toneladas producidas de cada uno de los tres tipos distintos de siembra de esta cosecha durante el año agrícola 1949, que cubre el período del 1ro de diciembre de 1948 a noviembre 30, 1949, así como información sobre el área total de caña de los tres tipos sembrada el 1ro de diciembre de 1949 y el área de caña de Gran Cultura que estaba sembrada el 1ro de diciembre de 1949 para cortarse en 1950.

Con relación a la piña, se le preguntó al agricultor las cuerdas cosechadas, las toneladas producidas del 1ro de abril de 1949 al 31 de marzo de 1950, así como el área total sembrada de este producto agrícola el 1ro de abril de 1950 y el área estimada que se cosecharía en el año entrante.

Para las restantes cosechas principales y frutos menores (con excepción de ornamentales y aquéllas incluídas bajo el encabezamiento de "otras cosechas,") se publican datos sobre el número de cuerdas cosechadas y cantidad producida del 1ro de abril de 1949 al 31 de marzo de 1950, y la cantidad producida de dichos productos agrícolas durante este período que fué vendida o que estaba disponible para venderse.

Los cuestionarios de los censos anteriores no preguntaban la cantidad vendida de las distintas cosechas individuales. Se le pidió también a los agricultores que indicaran las cosechas que habían estado intercaladas y las sembradas sucesivamente durante el año anterior. Se pidió esta información con el propósito de ayudar en la completa enumeración de aquellos productos cosechados en terreno donde se cosechó más de un producto agrícola durante el año.

En 1950 se obtuvo información sobre el número de cuerdas de distintas clases de yerbas que se cortaron para forraje. El Censo de 1940 preguntaba solamente el área total de yerbas que se cortaron para forraje.

Vegetales.—Los operadores de las distintas fincas informaron al enumerador en 1950 las cuerdas cosechadas, cantidad vendida y valor de venta para cada vegetal que fué producido para el mercado. En el Censo de 1940 solamente se informaron las cuerdas cosechadas para cada hortaliza mientras que el valor de las ventas se refería al valor total de todos los vegetales.

Frutas.—El Censo de Agricultura de 1950 solicitaba el número de cuerdas sembradas de árboles frutales, la cantidad cosechada y vendida y el número de árboles o plantas en edad de producción y de no producción, con excepción de los guineos y plátanos en cada finca. Habían varias diferencias entre los cuestionarios del censo de 1940 y 1950. El café y la piña, incluídos en 1940 con las frutas, se incluyeron en 1950 entre las cosechas principales. El cuestionario de 1940 contenía preguntas específicas sobre las cuerdas cosechadas para siete clases de frutas, y una pregunta relacionada con el terreno sembrado de árboles en edad de producción y de no producción para todas las frutas. El cuestionario de 1950 no pedía el número de cuerdas cosechadas, pero pedía el área sembrada de árboles en edad de producción y de no producción para cada clase de fruta cuando el número de árboles era más de diez. Las cifras para el 1940 correspondientes al área informada de frutas específicas, tales como las chinás, no son por lo tanto exactamente comparables con los datos de 1950.

La unidad de medida de producción para algunas frutas informadas en el cuestionario, no fué la misma en 1950 y en 1940. La unidad de medida para plátanos fué en racimos para 1940 y en frutas para 1950. La unidad de medida para guayabas fué en latas de 5 galones en 1940 y en número de frutas en 1950. La unidad de medida para cidras fué en número de frutas en 1940 y en libras en 1950.

units different from those published for those years. Conversions have been made by using the weights and measures in current use.

Field crops.—The 1950 questionnaire obtained data on the cuerdas harvested and tons produced of each of the three types of cane culture during the 1949 crop year (December 1, 1948, to November 30, 1949), as well as information on the area planted in all three culture types on December 1, 1949, and the area planted in fall cane (gran cultura) on December 1, 1949, that would be harvested in 1950.

For pineapples, the farmer was asked to report cuerdas harvested and tons produced from April 1, 1949, to March 31, 1950, as well as the total area planted in this crop on April 1, 1950, and the estimated area to be harvested in the coming year.

For all remaining field crops (except "ornamentals" and those included under the heading of "other field crops"), data are published on the number of cuerdas harvested and quantity produced from April 1, 1949, to March 31, 1950, and the quantity of the crops produced during this period that was sold or was to be sold.

Inquiries concerning the quantity of individual crops sold had not been included on questionnaires of previous censuses. Farmers were also asked to indicate which crops had been interplanted and which had been harvested from land used for other crops during the previous year. This information was obtained for the purpose of aiding in the complete enumeration of crops harvested on land from which more than one crop was harvested during the year.

In 1950, information was obtained on the number of cuerdas of specified kinds of forage crops cut. In the 1940 Census, only one question regarding the area was asked for all forage crops harvested.

Vegetables.—In 1950, farm operators were asked to report the cuerdas harvested, quantity harvested, and value of sales for each vegetable harvested for sale. In the 1940 Census, only cuerdas harvested was enumerated for individual vegetables, and only one figure was obtained for the value of all vegetables sold.

Fruits.—For each fruit, the 1950 agriculture questionnaire called for the number of cuerdas planted in trees, the quantity harvested and sold, and, except for bananas and plantains, the number of bearing and nonbearing trees or plants on each farm. There were several differences between the 1940 and 1950 questionnaires. Coffee and pineapples, listed in 1940 with the fruits, were listed on the 1950 questionnaire with field crops. The 1940 questionnaire contained specific inquiries concerning cuerdas of fruit harvested for seven fruits, and a question regarding land planted in bearing and nonbearing trees for all fruits. The 1950 questionnaire did not call for cuerdas harvested, but for the area planted in bearing and nonbearing trees for each kind of fruit whenever the number of trees exceeded ten. The 1940 figures shown for the area for specific fruits, such as oranges, therefore, are not exactly comparable with those for 1950.

The unit of measure specified on the questionnaire for production for some fruits was not the same in 1950 as in 1940. The unit of measure for plantains was bunches in 1940 and number of fruits in 1950. The unit of measure for guavas was 5-gallon cans in 1940, and number of fruits in 1950. The unit of measure for citrons was number of fruits in 1940 and pounds in 1950.

CLASIFICACION DE FINCAS

Fincas por Tamaño.—Las fincas se clasificaron por tamaño de acuerdo con el área total de terreno en cada una. La clasificación de fincas por tamaño fué hecha en tal forma que permite la comparación con los censos anteriores en Puerto Rico, así como también con los censos en los Estados Unidos.

Fincas por Tenencia del Operador.—En el censo de 1950 los operadores de fincas están clasificados de acuerdo con la tenencia bajo la cual ellos operan el terreno en sus fincas. La tenencia fué determinada a base del informe sobre terreno propio, total de terreno tomado en arrendamiento y terreno administrado para otros.

Los propietarios poseen terreno pero no toman terreno en arrendamiento.

Los propietarios en parte poseen terreno y toman terreno en arrendamiento.

Los administradores operan fincas para otras personas y reciben un salario por sus servicios. Las personas que actúan meramente como vigilantes, mayordomos u obreros a sueldo no son clasificados como administradores. Si el operador de una finca administraba bajo salario terreno perteneciente a otra persona y también estaba a cargo de la operación de terreno propio, los terrenos así atendidos se consideraban como dos fincas distintas. La disminución en el número de fincas que fueron explotadas por administradores desde el 1940 al 1950 se debe mayormente a cambios de procedimientos en la clasificación de las fincas por tenencia. Un número considerable de fincas pequeñas operadas por mayordomos, hijos de los dueños, etc. fueron clasificadas como operadas por administradores asalariados en 1940 y censos anteriores. En 1950, tales fincas fueron clasificadas como operadas por dueños en vez de por administradores. Una finca era clasificada como operada por un administrador únicamente cuando el valor total de las ventas de los productos agrícolas era \$5,000 o más, o si la finca estaba operada por una iglesia, escuela, hospital o agencia del gobierno.

Los arrendatarios toman en arrendamiento todo el terreno que operan. El número de fincas arrendadas en 1950 fué más bajo que en ningún otro censo. Parte de esta disminución se debe a la política seguida por la Administración de Reconstrucción de Puerto Rico y otras agencias que vendieron a sus operadores todas aquellas fincas que operaban anteriormente en carácter de arrendatarios. También una parte de la disminución en el número de arrendatarios puede haber resultado del cambio en el procedimiento del censo según el cual todos aquellos predios trabajados por medianeros no fueron contados como fincas en 1950.

Fincas por tipos.—En 1950, en general, las fincas en Puerto Rico fueron clasificadas por tipo de finca a base de la relación entre el valor calculado de un producto o grupo especial de productos agrícolas vendidos y el valor calculado de todos los productos agrícolas vendidos. Con excepción de los vegetales, el valor de las ventas de los productos agrícolas, animales y productos de animales no se obtuvo en el Censo de 1950. El valor de las ventas fué estimado multiplicando la cantidad vendida de cada producto agrícola, animal o producto de animal por determinada unidad de precio. Las unidades de precios que se usaron son las siguientes:

CLASSIFICATION OF FARMS

Farms by size.—Farms were classified by size according to the total land area of each farm. Classification of farms by size was arranged to permit comparison with previous censuses in Puerto Rico as well as with censuses in the continental United States.

Farms by tenure of operator.—In the 1950 Census, farm operators are classified according to the tenure under which they operate the land in their farm. The tenure was determined on the basis of the report as to land owned, total land rented from others, and land managed for others.

Full owners own land but do not rent from others.

Part owners own land and rent land from others.

Managers operate farms for others and are paid a wage or salary for their services. Persons acting merely as caretakers, "mayordomos" (foremen), or hired laborers are not classified as managers. If a farm operator managed land for others and also operated land on his own account, the land operated on his own account was considered as one farm and the land managed for others as a second farm. The decrease in the number of farms operated by managers from 1940 to 1950 resulted largely from changes in procedures in the classification of farms by tenure. In the 1940 and prior censuses, a considerable number of small farms operated by foremen, sons of owners, etc., were classified as operated by managers. In 1950, such farms were classified as operated by owners, rather than by managers. A farm was classified as operated by a manager only if the total sales of agricultural products was \$5,000 or more, or if the farm was operated by a church, school, hospital, or government agency.

Tenants rent from others all the land they operate. Farm tenancy in 1950 was lower than at any previous census. Part of the decrease in tenancy resulted from the sale of tenant-operated farms to their operators by such agencies as the Puerto Rico Reconstruction Administration, etc. Also, a part of the decrease in the number of tenants may have resulted from the change in census procedure whereby places worked by medianeros were not counted as farms in 1950.

Farms by type.—In 1950, in general, farms in Puerto Rico were classified by type of farm on the basis of the relationship of the computed value of farm products sold from a particular source or sources to the computed total value of all farm products sold. Except in the case of vegetables, the value of crops, animals, or animal products sold was not obtained in the 1950 Census. The value of sales was estimated by multiplying the quantity sold for each crop, animal, or animal product by unit prices. The unit prices used were as follows:

Estas unidades de precios se obtuvieron del Departamento de Agricultura y Comercio de Puerto Rico y del Servicio de Extensión Agrícola de Puerto Rico.

Las fincas con productos agrícolas vendidos por valor de \$150 o más fueron clasificadas a base de aquel producto que produjo 50 por ciento o más del valor computado de todos los productos agrícolas vendidos. En algunos casos el tipo de finca se determinó a base del valor de las ventas de un solo producto agrícola, como por ejemplo la caña de azúcar; o a base de las ventas combinadas de productos relacionados entre sí, como frutas y nueces. En otros casos, cuando el 50 por ciento del valor total de las ventas no se derivó de productos individuales o de un grupo de productos relacionados entre sí, el tipo de finca se determinó a base del valor de las ventas de un grupo de productos más amplio. Por ejemplo, si el valor del algodón, arroz, gandules, frijoles, habichuelas secas, maíz, batatas, malangas, ñames, yautías, yuca, maní, papas, y otros frutos menores vendidos fué de 50 por ciento o más del valor total de productos agrícolas vendidos, la finca se clasificó como finca de frutos menores.

Los tipos, conjuntamente con los productos o grupos de productos de los cuales se derivó 50 por ciento o más del valor total de las ventas, se señalan a continuación:

These unit prices were secured from the Department of Agriculture and Commerce of Puerto Rico, and the Agricultural Extension Service of Puerto Rico.

Farms with a value of \$150 or more of farm products sold were classified by type on the basis of the source from which 50 percent or more of the computed value of all farm products sold was obtained. In some cases the type of farm was determined on the basis of the value of sales for an individual farm product, such as sugarcane, or on the basis of combined sales of closely-related products, such as fruits and nuts. In other cases, when 50 percent of the total value of sales was not derived from specified individual products or a closely-related group of products, the type was determined on the basis of the value of sales of a broader group of products. For instance, if the value of cotton, rice, pigeon peas, cowpeas, dry beans, corn, sweetpotatoes, dasheens, yams, taniers, cassava, peanuts, Irish potatoes, and other minor crops sold represented 50 percent or more of the total value of farm products sold, the farm was classified as a "minor-crop" farm.

Farms were classified as general-crop, crop-and-livestock and miscellaneous if they could not be classified as one of the preceding types.

Las fincas cuyos valores computados de los productos agrícolas vendidos fueron menores de \$150 se clasificaron como fincas de subsistencia o como fincas trabajadas parte del tiempo. Las fincas trabajadas parte del tiempo eran aquéllas en las que el operador de la finca informó que había trabajado fuera de la finca 75 días o más durante el año anterior al censo; fincas de subsistencia eran aquéllas en las que el operador de la finca informó que había trabajado fuera de la finca menos de 75 días durante el año anterior al censo.

ESTADISTICAS PARA PARCELAS

Se usó un cuestionario separado para la información relacionada con ganado, aves y productos agrícolas en predios con un área no menor de un cuarto de cuerda ni mayor de tres cuerdas. Una copia del cuestionario aparece como apéndice. El ganado y aves así como otras partidas informadas por parcelas, forman parte de los recursos y producción agrícola de Puerto Rico. La producción agrícola debía informarse para el año calendario 1949. Los totales de estas partidas deben sumarse a los del censo de agricultura para obtener los totales de ganado, aves y producción agrícola.

REALIZACION DE UN CENSO COMPLETO

A fin de tener una medida para determinar si el Censo de Agricultura de Puerto Rico de 1950 fué efectuado en forma completa, se hicieron arreglos con el Departamento de Agricultura y Comercio de Puerto Rico para cotejar las fincas enumeradas en el censo con las fincas que aparecen en las listas de una investigación por muestreo efectuada en mayo de 1950, la cual cubrió 15 áreas de muestra seleccionadas al azar. (Un área de muestra consistía de un barrio o grupo de barrios adyacentes.) Las áreas de muestra seleccionadas contenían 1,334 fincas con un total de 44,981 cuerdas de terreno agrícola. Sin embargo, el cotejo fué limitado a las fincas de menos de 200 cuerdas, de las cuales habían 1,298 con un total aproximado de 25,285 cuerdas en las 15 áreas de la muestra.

Los informes del censo de agricultura fueron confrontados con las listas de la investigación por muestreo y las discrepancias encontradas fueron investigadas por empleados del Departamento de Agricultura y Comercio de Puerto Rico. La revisión del cotejo de las diferencias entre los resultados del censo y los de la investigación por muestreo fué hecha en Washington después de realizada la elaboración de los cuestionarios para el Censo de 1950. De acuerdo con el análisis de las diferencias entre el censo y la investigación por muestreo, el número de fincas de menos de 200 cuerdas según el censo es aproximadamente un por ciento más de lo que debe ser. El exceso total de fincas encontrado fué el resultado de enumerar partes de una finca como fincas completas, y en muy pocos casos de enumerar algunas fincas dos veces y enumerar fincas que en realidad no existían. Asimismo el análisis indicó que según el censo el terreno de las fincas de menos de 200 cuerdas representa una sub-enumeración de aproximadamente tres por ciento. Debido a que los resultados tanto de la enumeración de más para el número de fincas, como de la enumeración de menos para el total de terreno en las fincas, están basados en el análisis de una pequeña muestra, las cifras están sujetas al error del muestreo, y con tal motivo este factor debe ser considerado al determinar las cifras totales para Puerto Rico.

Estos datos sobre la exactitud del censo se refieren únicamente a las fincas de menos de 200 cuerdas las cuales representan por lo menos el 97 por ciento de todas las fincas en Puerto Rico, aunque sin embargo, representan únicamente 52 por ciento de todo el terreno de las fincas en la isla.

No hay datos confiables disponibles sobre las fincas de 200 o más cuerdas con los cuales se puedan cotejar los datos del censo. Con anterioridad a este censo, las listas de fincas de 200 o más cuerdas obtenidas de los informes de censos anteriores fueron verificadas usando otras listas preparadas por agentes agrícolas y por departamentos del Gobierno de Puerto Rico. Durante la

Farms for which the computed value of all farm products sold was less than \$150 were classified either as subsistence or as part-time farms. Part-time farms were those where the farm operator reported that he worked off the farm 75 days or more during the year preceding the census; subsistence farms were those where the farm operator reported that he worked off the farm less than 75 days during the year preceding the census.

STATISTICS FOR PARCELAS

A separate questionnaire was used to obtain information regarding livestock and poultry and the production of agricultural products on places having an area of at least one-fourth but less than 3 cuerdas. A copy of this questionnaire appears in the Appendix. The livestock, poultry, and other items reported for parcelas form part of the agricultural resources and agricultural production of Puerto Rico. The production of agricultural products was to be reported for the calendar year 1949. These item totals should be added to those for the census of agriculture in order to obtain totals for all livestock, poultry, or agricultural production.

COMPLETENESS OF THE CENSUS

In order to provide a measure of the completeness of the 1950 Census of Agriculture for Puerto Rico, arrangements were made with the Department of Agriculture and Commerce of Puerto Rico, to check the farms enumerated in the census against records of farms listed for a sample survey in May 1950 by that Agency in 15 sample areas selected at random. (A sample area comprised a barrio or a group of adjacent barrios.) These sample areas contained 1,334 farms and 44,981 cuerdas of land in farms. However, the check was limited to farms of less than 200 cuerdas. There were 1,298 farms of less than 200 cuerdas containing approximately 25,285 cuerdas in the 15 sample areas.

The reports for the agriculture census and lists for the sample survey conducted by the Department of Agriculture and Commerce of Puerto Rico were matched and discrepancies were investigated by employees of the Department of Agriculture and Commerce. A review of the checking of the discrepancies between the census and the sample survey was made in Washington after the processing of the questionnaires for the 1950 Census. The analysis of the differences between the census and the sample survey indicated that the number of farms of less than 200 cuerdas as shown by the census represents a net overenumeration of approximately 1 percent. The overcounting of farms resulted largely from the enumeration of parts of farms as complete farms, and to a lesser extent resulted from the enumeration of some farms twice and the enumeration of farms that actually did not exist. The analysis also indicated that land in farms as shown by the census for farms of less than 200 cuerdas represents a net underenumeration of approximately 3 percent. Inasmuch as the measures of overenumeration of farms and underenumeration of land in farms were based upon the analysis of a small sample, the figures are subject to considerable sampling error and this fact should be considered when applying the figures to totals for Puerto Rico.

These data on the completeness of the census relate only to farms of less than 200 cuerdas. However, farms of less than 200 cuerdas represent at least 97 percent of all farms in Puerto Rico, but account for only about one-half of all land in farms in the Island.

There are no reliable data with which the coverage of farms of 200 or more cuerdas could be checked. Prior to the census, lists of all farms of 200 or more cuerdas, compiled from prior censuses, were checked against lists obtained from agricultural agents and departments of the Government of Puerto Rico. During the enumeration, the regular census enumerators were paid for making a list of farms of 200 or more cuerdas in their

Se cree, por lo tanto, haber cubierto por completo el total de fincas grandes en Puerto Rico durante el Censo de Agricultura de 1950. Las fincas de 200 o más cuerdas representan aproximadamente la mitad del terreno de cultivo usado para las cosechas y producen más de la mitad de la producción agrícola de la Isla.

districts. The lists prepared by census enumerators were checked against the lists prepared prior to the census. All farms of 200 or more cuerdas listed on these lists were enumerated by specially trained enumerators under the supervision of a member of the Washington staff. It is believed therefore, that the coverage of large farms in Puerto Rico in the 1950 Census is complete. Farms of 200 or more cuerdas account for approximately half of the cropland used for crops and for more than half of the agricultural production in the Island.
