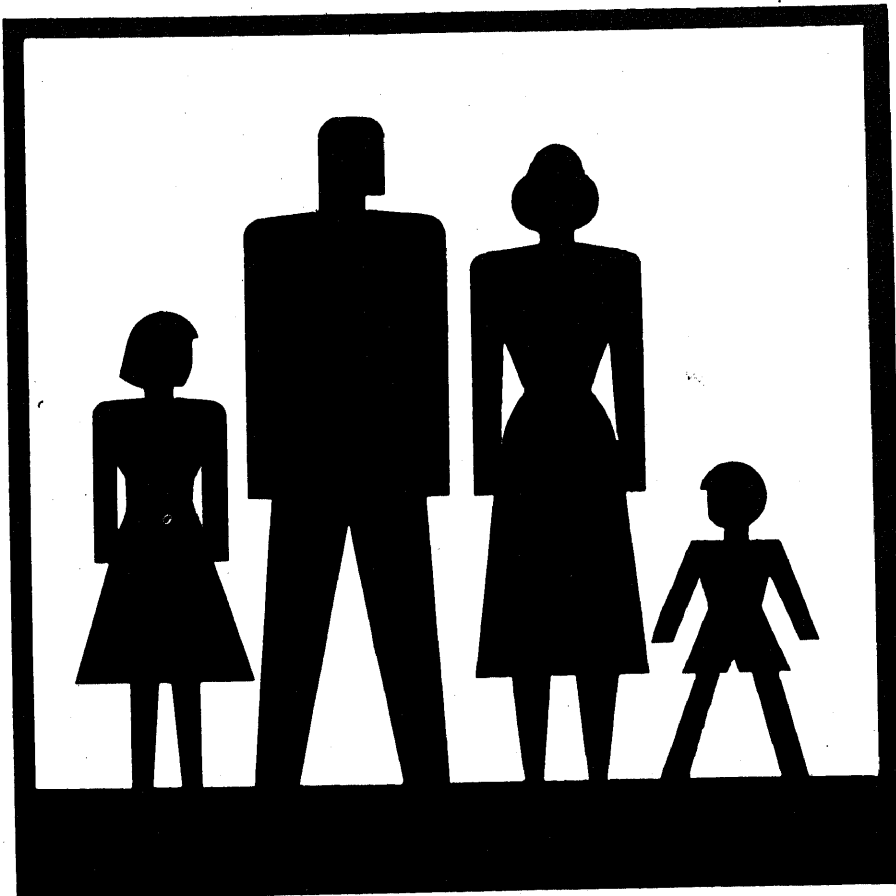

RACIAL COMPOSITION OF THE POPULATION, FOR THE UNITED STATES  
BY STATES: 1950

(This is one of a series of reports presenting summary statistics on selected characteristics of the population for various types of areas. The tables presented here are preprinted from the P-B U. S. Summary bulletin, which provides a fuller description of the terms. The present data supersede corresponding preliminary sample data published in Series PC-6, Nos. 1-10, and Series PC-7, Nos. 1 and 3; and advance data published in Series PC-12, Nos. 1-39)

The decade 1940 to 1950 was characterized by a pronounced movement of Negroes out of the South, according to figures released by Robert W. Burgess, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. In this region the Negro population increased by only 320,788 (3.2 percent); whereas, the number of Negroes in other regions rose by 1,855,980 (62.7 percent). The rate of increase for the West (234.4 percent) exceeded the rate for the Northeast and the North Central States by a wide margin. These regional differences in rate of change are the result of considerable interregional migration.

Despite the movement to the North and West during the 1940's, Negroes were still heavily concentrated in the South in 1950. The South had somewhat more than two-thirds of the total Negro population, and 8 of that region's States were among the 10 States ranking highest in Negro population. Five of the Southern States—Georgia, North Carolina, Mississippi, Alabama, and Texas—outranked New York, the State with the largest number of Negroes outside the South. Illinois, the second largest State in Negro population outside the South, was outranked by the States already named and three additional States—Louisiana, South Carolina, and Virginia.

**Japanese.**—Considerable change in the distribution of Japanese resulted from their evacuation from the Pacific Coast and the resettlement programs developed by the War Relocation Authority. The Japanese population increased by 385.5 percent in the Northeastern, North Central, and Southern States but decreased by 6.9 percent in the West (table A). The most significant regional rise was in the North Central States. There the increase was from 1,571 to 18,734. In spite of these changes, however, in 1950 the number of Japanese in California, 84,956, was still much higher than the number in any other State. Illinois, the next State in rank, had only 11,646.

**Chinese.**—For the Chinese, the rate of increase was highest in the South (112.5 percent) where there were 10,468 in 1950 as compared with 4,926 in 1940. Numerically, however, their increase of 20,744 for the West was somewhat higher than the combined increases for other regions. The Chinese, like the Japanese, were heavily concentrated in California. California accounted for 58,324, or 49.6 percent, of all Chinese in the United States in 1950.

**Indians.**—Nationally, the number of Indians increased from 333,969 to 343,410 between 1940 and 1950. The largest regional gain in number of Indians was in the West where they increased to 181,681, or 24,987 (15.9 percent) above their 1940 total. For the Northeastern and North Central Regions, the corresponding increases were from 11,786 to 15,947 (35.3 percent) and from 71,350 to 76,832 (7.7 percent).

There was an apparent decline of 25,189 in the number of Indians in the South because certain mixed racial groups in the Southeastern United States (see "Mixed parentage," below), formerly classified as Indian, were included in the residual group "Other races" in the 1950 Census along with minor races included in this category in 1940.

In 1950 Arizona had the largest number of Indians, 65,761. Oklahoma, with 53,769, and New Mexico, with 41,901, ranked second and third, respectively.

In the "Other races" category the number of persons for the South increased by 37,089 between 1940 and 1950 chiefly because of the reclassification of the mixed racial groups already mentioned in connection with the Indian population of the South. Outside of this region, there was an increase of 22,684 in the number of persons of "Other races." This increase includes, for the most part, increases among Filipinos and other Asiatic groups and only a small number of persons of mixed racial groups.

No major variation occurred in the racial composition of the national population between 1940 and 1950. There was a slight decrease from 89.8 percent to 89.5 percent in the proportion of white persons in the total population. The percentage of Negroes in 1950 was 10.0 in contrast to 9.8 in 1940. The proportion that all other nonwhite races combined formed of the total population rose from 0.4 percent in 1940 to 0.5 percent in 1950.

## DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

**Race.**—The concept of race as it has been used by the Bureau of the Census is derived from that which is commonly accepted by the general public. It does not, therefore, reflect clear-cut definitions of biological stock, and several categories obviously refer to nationalities. The information on race is ordinarily not based on a reply to questions asked by the enumerator but rather is obtained by observation. Enumerators were instructed to ask a question when they were in doubt.

**Color.**—The term "color" refers to the division of the population into two groups, white and nonwhite. The group designated as "nonwhite" consists of Negroes, Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and other nonwhite races. Persons of Mexican birth or ancestry who were not definitely Indian or of other nonwhite race were classified as white in 1950 and 1940.

**Negro.**—In addition to full-blooded Negroes, this classification includes persons of mixed white and Negro parentage and persons of mixed Indian and Negro parentage unless the Indian blood very definitely predominates or



unless the individual is accepted in the community as an Indian.

American Indian.—This category includes full-blooded Indians and persons of mixed white and Indian blood if they were enrolled on an Indian reservation or agency roll. Also included are persons of mixed Indian blood if the proportion of Indian blood is one-fourth or more, or if they are regarded as Indians in the community.

Japanese and Chinese.—These groups are identified very largely in terms of country or area of origin.

Other races.—This category includes Filipinos, Koreans, Asiatic Indians, Indonesians, Polynesians, and so forth, similarly identified largely in terms of area of origin. As indicated below, persons of mixed white, Negro, and Indian ancestry in certain communities in the Eastern United States are also included in this category.

Mixed parentage.—Persons are classified according to the race of the nonwhite parent, and mixtures of nonwhite races are classified according to the race of the father, with the special exceptions noted above.

In 1950, for the first time, enumerators were instructed to report persons of mixed white, Negro, and Indian ancestry who live in certain compact communities in the Eastern United States, in terms of the name by which they are locally known. These communities, or "racial islands," are of long standing and are locally recognized by special names such as "Siouian" or "Croatan," "Moor," and "Tunica." There had been considerable variation in the classification of the inhabitants of such communities by race, but in 1950 an attempt was made to avoid this by including them all in the nonwhite total and the category "Other races." As compared with 1940, the major statistical result of the new procedure was an apparent decrease in the number of Indians for several of the Southern States, particularly North Carolina.

### EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT OF THE POPULATION 25 YEARS OLD AND OVER, FOR THE UNITED STATES, BY STATES: 1950

(This is one of a series of reports presenting summary statistics on selected characteristics of the population for various types of areas. The tables presented here are based on data collected for a 20-percent sample and originally printed in the P-B U. S. Summary bulletin, which provides a fuller description of the terms and a statement on the reliability of the sample data. The present data include corrections of data originally published in the P-B U. S. Summary bulletin)

The adult population in the West has received a greater amount of formal education, on the average, than that in other regions of the United States, according to figures from the 1950 Census returns released by Robert W. Burgess, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. The median number of school years completed by persons 25 years old and over ranged from 11.3 years for the West to 9.6 years for the Northeast, 9.4 years for the North Central States, and 8.6 years for the South. At the State level, the highest medians were recorded by Utah (12.0 years), California (11.6 years), and Nevada (11.5

years), and the lowest by South Carolina (7.6 years), Louisiana (7.6 years), Georgia (7.8 years), Alabama (7.9 years), and North Carolina (7.9 years).

Figures on educational attainment refer to progress in "regular" schools. Such schools are public, private, or parochial schools, colleges, universities, or professional schools, either day or night, full-time or part-time--that is, those schools where enrollment may lead to an elementary or high school diploma, or to a college, university, or professional school degree.

### COUNTRY OF BIRTH OF THE FOREIGN-BORN WHITE POPULATION, FOR THE UNITED STATES, BY STATES: 1950

(This is one of a series of reports presenting summary statistics on selected characteristics of the population for various types of areas. The tables presented here are preprinted from the P-B United States Summary bulletin, which provides a fuller description of the terms. The present data supersede corresponding preliminary sample data published in Series PC-6, Nos. 1-10 and Series PC-7, Nos. 1 and 3)

Of the 10 million foreign-born white in the United States in 1950, about 1.4 million, or 14 percent, were persons of Italian birth according to figures released by Robert W. Burgess, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. Persons of Canadian birth, with a total of 994,562, were the second largest foreign-born group, followed by persons of German, Russian (U.S.S.R.), and Polish birth with totals of 984,331, 894,844, and 861,184, respectively. Other leading countries of birth were England and Wales (584,615), Ireland (504,961), Mexico (450,562), and Austria (408,785).

The total foreign-born white population in 1950, 10,161,168, represents a decline of about 3.8 million, or 27.3 percent, from the all-time high of 13,983,405 of 1930. The corresponding decline from 1940 to 1950 was 1,257,970, or 11.0 percent of the 1940 figures. For most of the specific countries of birth, the figures also show a decrease between 1940 and 1950. France, Greece, and Mexico constitute the major exceptions, with increases of 4.9, 3.6, and 19.4 percent, respectively.

In 1950, the foreign-born white population was heavily concentrated in the highly urbanized States of the Northeast and North Central Regions and in California. Seven States--New York, California, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, Michigan, and Ohio--accounted for about 6.9 million, or more than two-thirds of the total foreign-born white in 1950. The foreign-born white were by far most numerous in New York State. Of the nine largest country-of-birth groups, seven--Italy, Germany, U.S.S.R., Poland, England and Wales, Ireland, and Austria--were more numerous in New York than in any other State. Massachusetts ranked first in the total number of persons of Canadian birth, and Texas ranked first in number of persons of Mexican birth.

Among the smaller nationality groups, Massachusetts ranked first in the number of French-Canadians and Portuguese; Pennsylvania, in the number of Czechoslovaks; Ohio, in the number of Yugoslavs; Michigan, in the number of Dutch, Belgians, and Finns; Illinois, in the number of Swedes and Lithuanians; and Minnesota in the number of Norwegians. For most of the remaining country-of-birth groups, the largest population was to be found in New York.

#### DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Country of birth.--The classification of the foreign born by country of birth is based on international boundaries as formally recognized by the United States in April 1950. In view of the many boundary changes which have occurred in Europe, some difficulty has been encountered in making a consistent classification by country of birth from one census to another. In the case of countries which have maintained the same boundaries over a long period of time, the classification appears to be reasonably adequate. It appears, however, that where there are elements of ambiguity in the definition of a country, the classification is less accurate. Thus, for example, the figures for the countries of Central and Eastern Europe, whose boundaries were extensively changed as a result of World War I, are open to question. Likewise, in the 1950 Census the figures for Northern Ireland which show a decrease between 1940 and 1950 of about 85 percent, appear to be at fault. This situation appears to be related to the fact that in previous censuses the population schedule itself carried a statement in the country-of-birth column instructing the enumerator to distinguish between Ireland (Eire) and Northern Ireland, but that this statement was not carried on the 1950 schedule. In addition, the name of the Irish Free State had been changed officially to Ireland.

Nativity.--A person born in the United States or any of its Territories or possessions is counted as native. Also included as native are the small group of persons who, although born in a foreign country or at sea, were American citizens at birth because their parents were American citizens. The small number of persons for whom place of birth was not reported was assumed to be native.

Color.--The term "color" refers to the division of population into two groups, white and nonwhite. The group designated as "nonwhite" consists of Negroes, Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and other nonwhite races. Persons of Mexican birth or ancestry who were not definitely Indian or of other nonwhite race were classified as white in 1950 and 1940. In the 1930 publications, Mexicans were included in the group "Other races."

On the average, the population of the South was younger than the population of any other region of the United States, according to figures from the 1950 Census of Population released by Robert W. Burgess, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. The median age of the population of the South was 27.2 years in contrast to 30.2 years for the Nation. The South also had a higher proportion of its population under 10 years of age and a smaller proportion 65 years and over than the Nation. For the young children, the percentages were 21.7 for the South and 19.5 for the United States. For the elderly group, they were 6.9 and 8.1, respectively.

The West ranked second to the South with respect to lowest median age, largest proportion under 10 years of age, and smallest proportion 65 years and over. The highest median age and smallest proportion under 10 years of age were found in the Northeast, whereas the highest proportion of those 65 years and over was in the North Central States.

Among the States, the lowest median age was that of South Carolina, where the population averaged 23.6 years of age. In two additional States--New Mexico and Mississippi--the median age was below 25.0 years. Of the 10 States with the relatively youngest populations, 7 were in the South and 3 in the Mountain Division. On the other hand, the three States with the highest median ages--New York (33.7), New Jersey (32.9), and Massachusetts (32.8)--were in the Northeast.

The proportion of children under 10 in the total population of the States ranged from 15.1 percent in the District of Columbia to 25.2 percent in New Mexico. In addition to the District, New York State also had fewer than one-sixth of its inhabitants under 10 years of age.

The lowest proportion of the population 65 years of age and over was found in New Mexico, where 4.9 percent of the State's population was in this age group. Of the 14 additional States having 7 percent or fewer of their inhabitants 65 years of age and over, 10 were in the South and the remaining 4 in the Mountain Division. At the other extreme, 1

out of every 10 persons in 7 States--Iowa, Kansas, Maine, Massachusetts, Missouri, and New Hampshire--was 65 years of age or older.

The median age of the rural-nonfarm population (27.9) was 3.7 years below that of the urban population and, in turn, 1.6 years above that of the rural-farm population. Among the States, however, there were five--Iowa, the Dakotas, Nebraska, and Kansas--in which the median age of the rural-nonfarm population ranked highest. In 19 States, on the other hand, the rural-farm population was older on the average than the rural-nonfarm population. In 6 of these 19 States--Connecticut, Indiana, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, and Texas--the median age of the rural-farm population also exceeded that of the urban population.

On the average, the nonwhite population was nearly five years younger than the white population. The median ages were 26.1 years for the nonwhites as against 30.8 for the whites. The median age of the nonwhites was below that of the whites in each of the residential categories, with the smallest difference (3.3 years) in the urban and the largest (9.4 years) in the rural-farm population. The average age of the nonwhites was lower than that of the whites in all but five States--Kentucky, Tennessee, Utah, Vermont, and West Virginia. A higher proportion of the nonwhites was under 10 years of age (22.7 as against 19.1 percent) and a lower proportion was 65 years and over (5.7 as against 8.4 percent).

At the national level, the median age of females (30.5 years) was somewhat higher than that of males (29.9 years). This relationship was also true for the urban population and the rural-nonfarm population. The rural-farm males, on the other hand, averaged 0.3 of a year older than the females.

The age classification is based on the age of the person at his last birthday as of the date of his enumeration, that is, the age of the person in completed years. The median age is that age which divides the population into two equal groups--one-half being older and one-half being younger than the median.

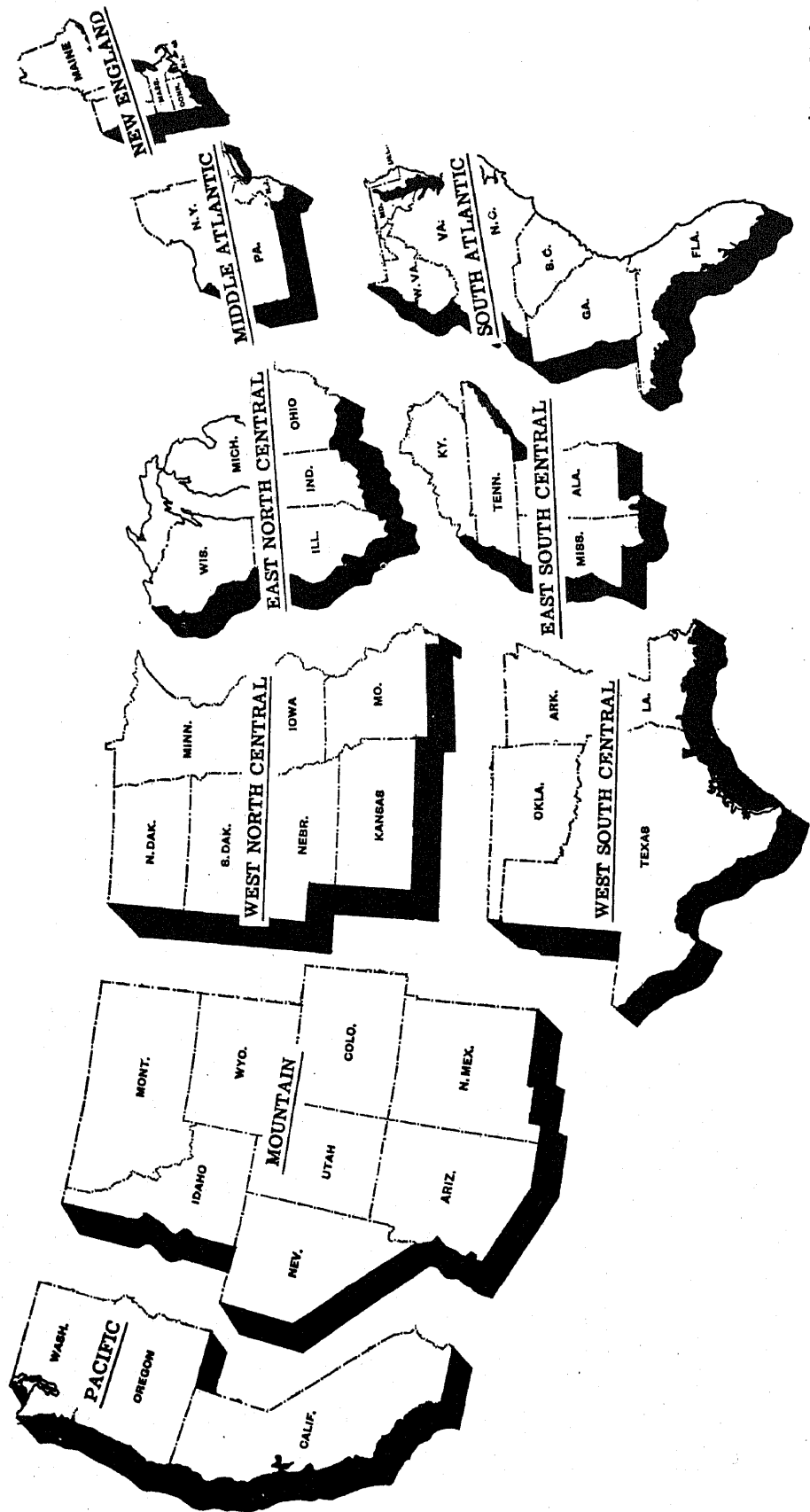

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### MOBILITY OF THE POPULATION--STATE OF RESIDENCE IN 1949 AND 1950

(This is one of a series of reports presenting summary statistics on selected characteristics of the population for various types of areas. The tables presented here are preprinted from the forthcoming special report Series P-E, No. 4B, "Mobility of the Population--States and State Economic Areas")

Figures from the 1950 Census of Population on the extent to which persons 1 year old and older living in continental United States at the time of the census changed their place of residence were released by Robert W. Burgess, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. The information is presented for the United States, the regions, the geographic divisions, and the States. The tables which appear here are preprints of some of those which will appear in the forthcoming special report Series P-E, No. 4B, "Mobility of the Population--States and State Economic Areas." That report will provide a fuller description of the terms employed and will also present selected demographic, social, and economic characteristics of the persons 1 year old and over classified by mobility status.

The inquiries on place of residence 1 year prior to the date of enumeration were asked of a representative 20-percent sample of the population 1 year old and over at the time of the census. Only those cards which represented persons who were not reported as living in the same house in 1950 as in 1949 (that is, movers, persons abroad in 1949, and those for whom mobility status was not reported) were tabulated for this report. The statistics on the number of persons 1 year old and over, by age, sex, color, and urban-rural residence in 1950, were available from earlier tabulations. The figures on nonmovers (that is, persons living in the same house in 1950 as in 1949) are derived by subtracting the statistics on those who were not reported as living in the same house in 1950 as in 1949 from those for the entire population 1 year old and over. The sources of the data are indicated in the headnotes to the various tables. Since most of the data are based on a sample,

they are subject to sampling variability as explained in the section on "Reliability of sample data."

The figures which appear here may vary in some instances from those which appear for corresponding items based on the 20-percent sample in other reports. These differences are caused, in part, by errors in the tabulation process. These errors include machine failure, loss of punch cards, and other types. The net effect is a tendency toward slightly smaller counts of the same item in successive tabulations. Experience has shown that in mass operations two tabulations of a set of punch cards are not likely to yield precisely identical results. Therefore, tolerance limits allowing for insignificant variations were established in advance of each tabulation. If the differences between the results of two tabulations fell within these limits, nothing was done to bring them into exact agreement with each other.

Statistics on the mobility status of the population 1 year old and over are also presented in Volume II (table 23 of the individual State parts and table 70 of the United States Summary). The total number of persons in the United States who were not reported as living in the same house in 1950 as in 1949 appears as 27,972,895 in Volume II. The number shown in this report is 27,813,260. The difference 159,635, represents 0.1 percent of the total population 1 year old and over. A comparison of the statistics for States which appear in Volume II with those presented in this report indicates that, in all but five States, the differences did not exceed 0.2 percent of the population 1 year old and over. The largest difference--1.2 percent--was in the statistic for Rhode Island. The data in Volume II appear

to be at fault, but the errors were discovered after it was no longer feasible to make corrections there.

#### DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Mobility and migration status.--Mobility status is expressed in terms of four main categories: (1) Mobile persons or movers, (2) non-mobile persons or nonmovers, (3) persons abroad, and (4) persons for whom mobility status was not reported. These categories are based on a comparison of the reported residence in 1949 and that in 1950.

1. Mobile persons or movers.--This group consists of all persons living in another house in the United States in 1950 than 12 months earlier in 1949.

2. Nonmobile persons or nonmovers.--This group consists of persons who were living in the same house in 1950 as 12 months earlier in 1949.

3. Persons abroad in 1949.--This group consists of persons, either citizens or aliens, whose place of residence in 1949 was outside continental United States, that is, in a Territory, possession, etc., of the United States or in a foreign country. These persons are distinguished from movers, who are persons who moved from one house to another within continental United States.

4. Mobility status not reported.--This group includes those persons 1 year of age and over for whom place of residence in 1949 was not reported or those for whom sufficient information was not reported.

Mobile persons are subdivided in terms of type of mobility into the following two groups:

1. Same-county, or intracounty, movers.--These are persons living in a different house in 1950 but in the same county as in 1949.

2. Migrants, or different-county movers.--This group consists of persons living in a different county in the United States in 1950 and in 1949. Migrants are further classified by type of migration on the basis of a comparison of the State of residence in 1950 with the State of residence in 1949.

a. Migrants within a State.--This group consists of migrants who moved from one county to another within a State.

b. Migrants between States.--Among the migrants crossing State boundaries, a distinction is made between those who moved between contiguous States and those who moved between noncontiguous States. States have been classified as contiguous if their boundaries touch at any point.

Children under 1 year old are omitted from the reports on the mobility of the population.

In-migrants and out-migrants.--The terms "in-migrants" and "out-migrants" have been used with reference to migrants into, or out of,

particular areas. In-migrants to an area are migrants who moved into that area from elsewhere in the United States between 1949 and 1950 and were still living there in 1950. Out-migrants from an area are migrants who were living in the area in 1949 and moved out to some other area in the United States where they were in 1950. In-migrants and out-migrants for any area exclude migrants within that area.

Net migration.--The term "net migration" like the terms "in-migration" and "out-migration" is used with reference to migration to or from a particular area. Net migration refers to the net gain or loss to an area through the balance of in-migration and out-migration. In the tables, net in-migration is distinguishable by a plus sign (+) and net out-migration by a minus sign (-) preceding the figure. The algebraic sum of net migration for all States and the District of Columbia is equal to zero, since a loss in one State must be compensated by a gain in other States.

The census statistics on mobility provide information on the number of movers, migrants, etc., and on in-migration and out-migration for a given area. The census statistics, however, do not take into account all the different moves that were made in the 1-year period, for example, by persons who moved into or out of a given area but died during the period or returned to their 1949 place of residence. Regardless of the number of moves made, a person is counted only once as a mover in the census data. Persons who moved were not asked the number of miles they had moved. The census data, however, provide some indication of the relative distance involved in the moves. On the average, a person who moves within a county moves a shorter distance than one who moves to another county in the same State, he in turn moves a shorter distance than a mover to a contiguous State, and so on.

The mobility statistics in this report relate to one particular 12-month period. The typicality of this period may be examined, however, on the basis of the annual data from the Current Population Survey. These indicate that in the period of slight economic recession from 1949 to 1950, mobility was at a relatively low level as compared with that of other postwar years. Therefore, the directions of net flow and the patterns of mobility may not be typical in some respects of the period since the end of World War II.

Usual place of residence.--In accordance with Census practice dating back to 1790, each person enumerated in the 1950 Census was counted as an inhabitant of his usual place of residence or usual place of abode, that is, the place where he lives and sleeps most of the time. This place is not necessarily the same as his legal residence, voting residence, or domicile, although, in the vast majority of cases, the use

of these different bases of classification would produce identical results.

The questions on place of residence in 1949 were supposed to refer to usual residence also. The respondent was not, however, furnished all the rules that the enumerator was instructed to use in determining the respondent's usual residence in 1950. Hence, in some cases, another type of residence may have been reported. For example, some college students incorrectly may have given the location of their parental home in 1949 so that they were classified as migrants when their situation was actually the same at both dates.

Age.--The age classification is based on the age of the person at his last birthday prior to the date of his enumeration, that is, his age in completed years.

Color.--The term "color" refers to the division of population into two groups, white and nonwhite. The group designated as "nonwhite" consists of Negroes, Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and other nonwhite races.

#### Urban, Rural-Nonfarm, and Rural-Farm Population

Urban and rural residence.--According to the new definition that was adopted for use in the 1950 Census, the urban population comprises all persons living in (a) places of 2,500 inhabitants or more incorporated as cities, boroughs, and villages, (b) incorporated towns of 2,500 inhabitants or more except in New England, New York, and Wisconsin, where "towns" are simply minor civil divisions of counties, (c) the densely settled urban fringe, including both incorporated and unincorporated areas, around cities of 50,000 or more, and (d) unincorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more outside any urban fringe. The remaining population is classified as rural. According to the old definition, the urban population was limited to all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more and in areas (usually minor civil divisions) classified as urban under special rules relating to population size and density. In view of this change in definition, the statistics for 1940 by urban-rural residence are not comparable with those presented here for 1950.

Farm population--urban and rural.--The farm population for 1950, as for 1940 and 1930, includes all persons living on farms without regard to occupation. In determining farm and nonfarm residence in the 1950 Census, however, certain special groups were classified otherwise than in earlier censuses. In 1950, persons living on what might have been considered farm land were classified as nonfarm if they paid cash rent for their homes and yards only. A few persons in institutions, summer camps, "mo-

Rural-nonfarm population.--The rural-nonfarm population includes all persons living outside of urban areas who do not live on farms. It comprises persons living in a variety of types of residences, such as isolated nonfarm homes in the open country, villages, and hamlets of fewer than 2,500 inhabitants, and some of the fringe areas surrounding the smaller incorporated places.

#### RELIABILITY OF SAMPLE DATA

Sample design.--Most of the data in this report are based on a representative sample of approximately 20 percent of the population. Statistics not based on the 20-percent sample are indicated in headnotes in the tables in which they appear and are either based on complete counts or were obtained by subtracting 20-percent sample data from complete counts.

On the schedules used in the 1950 Census of Population, a separate line was filled out for each person enumerated, with every fifth line designated as a sample line. Within each enumeration district, the schedules were divided approximately equally among five versions. On each version the sample constituted a different set of lines so that each line on the schedule was in the sample on one of the five versions. The sample data shown in this report are based on the persons enumerated on these sample lines.

Estimates of the number of persons with specified characteristics based on sample data have in all cases been obtained by multiplying the number of persons in the sample containing these characteristics by five. Estimates of percentages have been obtained in each case by using the values in this report for both the numerator and denominator.

Although the sampling plan used did not automatically insure an exact 20 percent of the population (because of the presence of blank or voided lines, special entries, etc.), it was unbiased and the deviation from 20 percent was expected to be quite small. Small biases arose, however, when the enumerator failed to follow his instructions exactly. These were usually in the direction of a slight underrepresentation of adult males. In the United States as a whole, the estimate of the total population from the 20-percent sample was 0.25 percent short. The shortage was 0.30 percent in the Northeast Region, 0.35 percent in the North Central States, 0.15 percent in the South, and 0.20 percent in

#### DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Mobility and migration status.--Mobility status is expressed in terms of four main categories: (1) Mobile persons or movers, (2) non-mobile persons or nonmovers, (3) persons abroad, and (4) persons for whom mobility status was not reported. These categories are based on a comparison of the reported residence in 1949 and that in 1950.

1. Mobile persons or movers.--This group consists of all persons living in another house in the United States in 1950 than 12 months earlier in 1949.

2. Nonmobile persons or nonmovers.--This group consists of persons who were living in the same house in 1950 as 12 months earlier in 1949.

3. Persons abroad in 1949.--This group consists of persons, either citizens or aliens, whose place of residence in 1949 was outside continental United States, that is, in a Territory, possession, etc., of the United States or in a foreign country. These persons are distinguished from movers, who are persons who moved from one house to another within continental United States.

4. Mobility status not reported.--This group includes those persons 1 year of age and over for whom place of residence in 1949 was not reported or those for whom sufficient information was not reported.

Mobile persons are subdivided in terms of type of mobility into the following two groups:

1. Same-county, or intracounty, movers.--These are persons living in a different house in 1950 but in the same county as in 1949.

2. Migrants, or different-county movers.--This group consists of persons living in a different county in the United States in 1950 and in 1949. Migrants are further classified by type of migration on the basis of a comparison of the State of residence in 1950 with the State of residence in 1949.

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the West. Among States the shortage in the estimate of total population ranged from 0.70 percent to 0.00 percent. For the United States, there was a shortage of 1.45 percent in the sample estimate of males 25 years and over. Errors of processing as noted earlier resulted in a further reduction in sample size. These slight biases result in the estimate of total movers being slightly lower, and the estimate of total nonmovers being slightly higher, than the figures which would have been obtained from an unbiased 20-percent sample. They have relatively little effect on the distributions shown, however. The figures on males per 100 females are probably the data most seriously affected by the biases, and even for these the figures would only be increased by about 1 percent if the shortages in the sample did not exist.

Sampling variability.--The data in this report based on the 20-percent sample are subject to sampling variability, which can be determined approximately from the standard errors shown in tables A and B. These tables do not reflect the effects of the biases mentioned above. Table A presents the approximate standard errors of sample estimates of selected sizes. Table B shows the approximate standard errors of percentages when computed by using values in this report for both numerator and denominator. Linear interpolation may be used for values not shown.

The standard error is a measure of sampling variability. The chances are about 2 out of 3 that the difference due to sampling variability between an estimate and the figure that would have been obtained from a complete count of the population is less than the standard error. The amount by which the standard error must be multiplied to obtain other odds deemed more appropriate can be found in most statistical textbooks. For example, the chances are about 19 out of 20 that the difference is less than twice the standard error, and 99 out of 100 that it is less than 2-1/2 times the standard error.

Illustration.--Table 3 shows that there were an estimated 19,075 nonwhites living in

the Northeast Region in April 1950 who were living in the South Region in April 1949 (32.3 percent of the 59,080 nonwhites who migrated into or within the Northeast Region). Linear interpolation in table A indicates that the approximate standard error of an estimate of 19,075 is about 280. Consequently the chances are about 2 out of 3 that the figure which would have been obtained from a complete count of nonwhites who migrated to the Northeast Region from the South Region between April 1949 and April 1950 would have differed by less than 280 from the sample estimate. It also follows that there is only about 1 chance in 100 that a complete census count would have differed by as much as 700, that is, by about 2-1/2 times the standard error. Table B indicates, also by linear interpolation, that the standard error of the 32.3 percent on a base of 59,080 is about 0.5 percent.

The standard errors in tables A and B are not directly applicable to differences between two estimates. The standard error of the difference between an estimate and a number obtained from a complete count (e.g., 1950 estimates derived by subtracting sample estimates from complete-count figures, such as the estimates of nonmovers) is identical with the standard error of the estimate based on the sample. The standard error of the difference between two estimates, based on samples, is approximately the square root of the sum of the squares of the standard error of each estimate considered separately. This formula will represent the actual standard error quite accurately for the difference between separate and uncorrelated characteristics. In other cases, however, if there is a high positive correlation between the two characteristics, it will overestimate the true standard error. Net migration is a difference between two sample estimates; its standard error is approximately the square root of the sum of the squares of the standard errors of the number of in-migrants and out-migrants.

The smaller figures and small differences between figures should be used with particular care because they are subject to larger relative error arising from processing and enumeration bias and larger relative sampling variability. These smaller figures have been included in the tables to permit analysis of broader groups with smaller relative bias and sampling variability.

**DETAILED OCCUPATION OF THE EXPERIENCED CIVILIAN LABOR FORCE: 1950**

(This is one of a series of reports presenting summary statistics on selected characteristics of the population for various types of areas. The table shown here is preprinted from the Series P-C United States Summary bulletin, which presents more complete explanatory information than is given here)

Information on the detailed occupational distribution of the American labor force, as shown by the Seventeenth Decennial Census, was released by Robert W. Burgess, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. This inventory of skills gives the numbers of men and women in each of 446 different occupational categories and is useful for such purposes as defense manpower planning and vocational guidance.

At the time of the 1950 Census, there were, for example, in the experienced civilian labor force, about 985,000 carpenters, 383,000 accountants and auditors, 324,000 electricians, 76,000 chemists, 36,000 social scientists, and 14,000 airplane pilots and navigators. Among the occupations in which women predominated were professional nurses (98 percent); practical nurses (96 percent); stenographers, typists, and secretaries (94 percent); and dietitians and nutritionists (94 percent). Women also constituted a large proportion--75 percent--of the elementary and high school teachers, but only 23 percent of the college teachers.

The figures shown here differ somewhat from the figures by major occupation group presented in the Series P-B bulletin for the United States (and the report Series PC-14, No. 9). These two sets of data were derived from separate tabulations and no attempt was made to adjust for minor processing differences. The forthcoming Series P-C United States Summary bulletin, from which this table is preprinted, presents information on such characteristics as age, race, and income of the persons in the several occupations. A fuller discussion of the definitions and explanations given below appears in this bulletin, as well as in the Series P-C State bulletins.

**EMPLOYMENT STATUS**

The data shown here relate to the experienced civilian labor force and to employed persons. These employment status groups are defined on the basis of the person's activity during the calendar week preceding the enumerator's visit. This week, designated as the "census week," is not the same for all respondents, because not all persons were enumerated during the same week. The majority of the population was enumerated during the first half of April 1950.

Experienced civilian labor force.--The experienced civilian labor force consists of employed persons and experienced unemployed persons, as defined below.

Employed.--Employed persons comprise all civilians 14 years old and over who, during the census week, were either (a) "at work"--those who did any work for pay or profit, or worked without pay for 15 hours or more on a family farm or business; or (b) "with a job but not at work"--those who did not work and were not looking for work but had a job or business from which they were temporarily absent because of vacation, illness, industrial dispute, or weather, or layoff with definite instructions to return to work within 30 days of layoff. All included as "with a job" are persons who had no jobs to which they were scheduled to report within 30 days.

Experienced unemployed.--This category comprises all persons 14 years old and over with previous work experience who were not at work during the census week, but were either looking

for work or would have been looking for work except that (a) they were temporarily ill, (b) they expected to return to a job from which they had been laid off for an indefinite period, or (c) they believed no work was available in their line of work or in their community.

OCCUPATION

The occupation data for employed persons relate to the job held during the census week. Persons employed at two or more jobs were reported in the job at which they worked the greatest number of hours during that week. Data on occupation for the experienced unemployed relate to the last job held.

Classification system.--The occupational classification system developed for the 1950 Census of Population consists of 469 items, 270 of which are specific occupation categories; the remainder are subgroupings (mainly on the basis of industry) of 13 of the occupation categories. For purposes of this table, certain of the occupation categories were combined, and the detailed occupation listing presented here consists of 446 items. The composition of each of the detailed categories is shown in the publication, U. S. Bureau of the Census, 1950 Census of Population, Classified Index of Occupations and Industries, Washington, D. C., 1950.

In the separation of "Managers, officials, and proprietors (n.e.c.)" by class of worker into salaried and self-employed components, the small number of unpaid family workers in this occupation is included in the self-employed component. Since the data presented in this table refer only to civilians, the category "Members of the armed forces" is limited to unemployed veterans who had not worked since their discharge from the armed forces.

Quality of data.--As the result of omissions from the labor force of an appreciable number of workers (mainly youths, women, and part-time workers), most of the occupation figures shown here are probably subject to some understatement.

Another factor to be considered in the interpretation of these data is that enumerators sometimes returned occupation designations which were not sufficiently specific for precise allocation; in many such cases, however, satisfactory assignment was made through the use of supplementary information.

It can be expected that the application of a detailed occupational classification to approximately 60 million workers will be subject to some error. Although the number of misclassifications probably does not have any serious effect on the usefulness of most of the data, there are a few cases where relatively small number of erroneous returns may produce what might be regarded as a serious misstatement of the facts. These cases relate mainly to the numbers of women shown in occupations which are unusual for such persons.

Comparability.--Although the 1940 occupational classification system is basically the same as the 1950 system, there are a number of differences which affect comparability. Data for 1940 adjusted for comparability with the 1950 occupation data for employed persons appear in the Series P-C bulletin for the United States.

Comparability between the statistics presented here and the statistics from other sources is frequently affected by a number of factors such as the use of different classification systems. In regard to comparisons with data from government licensing agencies, professional associations, trade unions, etc., comparability may be affected by (1) the inclusion in the organizational listing of retired persons or persons who devote all or most of their time to another occupation, (2) the inclusion of the same person in two or more different listings and (3) the fact that relatively few organizations obtain complete coverage or membership in an occupational field. Differences in definition and concept, as well as problems of quality of census data, may also be contributing factors to lack of comparability.

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### HOUSEHOLDS, FAMILIES, AND MARRIED COUPLES IN THE UNITED STATES, BY STATES: 1950

(This is one of a series of reports presenting summary statistics on selected characteristics of the population for various types of areas. The tables presented here are based on data tabulated, in part, for a 20-percent sample and are reprinted from the P-B U. S. Summary bulletin, which provides a fuller description of the terms and a statement on the reliability of the sample data. The present data supersede, in part, preliminary sample data published in Series PC-7, Nos. 1 and 3)

Each of 11 States in the United States contained over 1.0 million households in 1950, according to figures from the 1950 Census released by Robert W. Burgess, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. New York led with 4.3 million households, followed by California with 3.3 million, and Pennsylvania with 2.9 million. At the other extreme, only 50,288 households were reported in Nevada. For the entire United States, the census showed that there were 42.9 million households in 1950 containing 145.0 million persons, or an average of 3.38 persons per household. The remaining 5.7 million persons lived in quasi households, that is, in institutions, rooming houses, military barracks, etc. Among the States, the variation in the average number of persons per household was relatively small in 1950, ranging from 3.00 persons per household in Nevada to 4.01 persons in South Carolina. In general, the largest households were found in the South and in rural-farm areas.

About 91.6 percent of the Nation's population in 1950 lived in families. The census count showed a total of 38.3 million families, with an average of 3.60 persons per family. About 11 million persons, or 8.4 percent of the entire population in 1950, were not living as family members; these persons include unrelated individuals and inmates of institutions. Among the States, the average family size ranged from 3.29 persons in California to 4.19 persons in South Carolina.

There were 35.0 million married couples in the United States in 1950, of whom 32.7 million, or 93.4 percent, were living in households of their own. The remaining 2.3

million married couples were "doubling up" with relatives or nonrelatives or were living in quasi households. The percentage of married couples without own households ranged from 3.5 percent in the Mountain States of Utah and Idaho to 8.7 percent in Virginia; the corresponding figure for the Nation as a whole was 6.6 percent.

A married couple is defined as a husband and his wife enumerated as members of the same household or quasi household. Married couples are classified as "with own household" if the husband is head of the household. A family, as defined in the 1950 Census, is a group of two or more persons related by blood, marriage, or adoption, and living together; all such persons are regarded as members of one family. Unrelated individuals are persons (other than inmates of institutions) who are not living with any relatives. A household includes all the persons, without regard to relationship, who occupy a house, an apartment or other group of rooms, or a room that constitutes a dwelling unit. A person living alone in a dwelling unit, or a group of unrelated persons sharing a dwelling unit, is counted as a household. The count of households excludes groups of persons living as quasi households, that is, living in quarters not classified as dwelling units, in such places as houses with at least five lodgers, hotels, institutions, labor camps, or military barracks. The institutional population includes those persons living as inmates in such places as homes for delinquent or dependent children, homes and schools for the mentally or physically handicapped, places providing specialized medical care, homes for the aged, prisons, and jails.

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## NATIVITY AND PARENTAGE OF THE FOREIGN WHITE STOCK

(This is one of a series of reports presenting summary statistics on selected characteristics of the population. The table presented here is preprinted from the forthcoming special report, Series P-E, No. 3A, "Nativity and Parentage")

One out of every four white persons in the United States on April 1, 1950, was of foreign white stock (i.e., foreign born or of foreign parentage), according to figures from the 1950 Census of Population released today by Robert W. Burgess, Director, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce. The foreign white stock in 1950 numbered about 33.8 million, or 6.1 million below the all-time high of 39.9 million in 1930. Foreign-born whites declined 3.8 million, or 27.3 percent, over the 20-year period to 10.2 million, and native whites of foreign or mixed parentage were down 2.3 million, or 8.9 percent, to 23.6 million.

The leading countries of origin of the foreign white stock were Germany and Italy. The number of persons of German descent--4.7 million--was only slightly larger than the 4.6 million persons born in Italy or of Italian parents, whereas 20 years earlier the figures were 6.9 million and 4.5 million, respectively. Other leading countries of origin were as follows: Canada, 3.0 million; Poland, 2.8 million; U.S.S.R. (Russia), 2.5 million; Ireland, 2.4 million; and England and Wales, 2.0 million.

The foreign white stock was concentrated largely in the highly urbanized, populous States. New York led with 6.8 million, or one-fifth of the total, followed by California with 3.0 million. Other States with 1.5 million or more were Pennsylvania, Illinois, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Michigan, and Ohio. These eight States accounted for about three-fourths of the foreign-born whites and two-thirds of the native whites of foreign or mixed parentage.

The figures on the foreign-born whites are from a complete count; those on the native whites of foreign or mixed parentage are from a 20-percent sample. The forthcoming report, Series P-E, No. 3A, will provide a statement on the reliability of the sample data, as well as a fuller discussion of the terms.

### DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Country of origin.--The classification of the foreign white stock by country of origin is based on

international boundaries as formally recognized by the United States in April 1950. In view of the many boundary changes in Europe, some difficulty has been encountered in making a consistent classification by country of origin from one census to another. In the case of countries which have maintained the same boundaries over a long period of time, the classification appears to be reasonably adequate. Where country boundaries have changed, the classification is apparently less accurate. Thus, for example, the figures for the individual countries of Central and Eastern Europe are open to question. Likewise, in the 1950 Census the figures for Northern Ireland and Ireland appear to be at fault. In previous censuses the population schedule carried an instruction to the enumerator to distinguish between Ireland (Eire) and Northern Ireland.

Nativity and parentage.--A person born in the United States or any of its Territories, possessions, etc., is counted as native. Also included as native are the small group of persons who, although born in a foreign country or at sea, were American citizens at birth because their parents were American citizens. The small number of persons for whom place of birth was not reported was assumed to be native.

The native white population is classified by parentage into four groups: (1) Native parentage (both parents born in the United States or in the outlying possessions, etc.); (2) foreign parentage (both parents foreign born); (3) father foreign (father foreign born and mother native); (4) mother foreign (mother foreign born and father native). The last two of these groups are frequently combined under the heading "Mixed parentage," and the last three, under the heading "Foreign or mixed parentage."

Foreign white stock.--The term "foreign white stock" is used to indicate the combined total of two classes, namely, the foreign-born white and the native white of foreign or mixed parentage. The "foreign white stock," therefore, comprises those persons who were born abroad or who had at least one parent foreign born.

# 1950 CENSUS OF POPULATION

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## FERTILITY BY SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC STATUS, FOR PUERTO RICO: 1950

(This is one of a series of reports presenting summary statistics from the 1950 Census on selected characteristics of the population for various types of areas. The tables presented here for Puerto Rico contain data not previously published)

There are wide differences in the average number of children ever born to women in Puerto Rico classified by social and economic status, according to data from the 1950 Census. Most groups in Puerto Rico have very high fertility, but women who have completed at least 4 years of high-school generally have an inadequate number of children for population replacement.

About one-fourth of the women in Puerto Rico in 1950 were 45 years old and over and had therefore completed the childbearing period. Among all women in this age group (including single women), 13 percent had borne no children; for continental United States, the corresponding figure for 1952 was 24 percent. The average woman of completed fertility in Puerto Rico in 1950 had borne 5.8 children, or more than twice the number for the average woman in the States in 1952. She also exceeded the high average for women in rural-farm areas of continental United States as a whole in 1910. Data from other sources indicate that ratios of young children to women of childbearing age and annual birth rates for Puerto Rico are of about the same magnitude as in continental United States around 1850.

## URBAN-RURAL RESIDENCE AND COLOR

Half of the women 45 years old and over in Puerto Rico in 1950 were living in urban areas and half were living in rural areas. In urban areas, the proportion childless among women in this age group was twice as large as that in rural areas (18 percent as compared with 9 percent). The average number of children born per woman of completed fertility was only about two-thirds as large in urban areas (4.8) as in rural areas (6.8).

About 23 percent of the women in Puerto Rico in 1950 were nonwhite. White and nonwhite women were of approximately equal fertility except in urban areas where nonwhite women between the ages of 25 and 44 years averaged about 6 percent more children ever born than did white women.

## MARITAL STATUS

Of all women in Puerto Rico in 1950 who were married or consensually married, about one-fourth were reported as consensually married. At ages up to about 35 years, women in consensual unions averaged more children ever born than did married women. Among older women, the situation was reversed; married women averaged more children. Among women 40 years old and over, the proportion of women who were in consensual marriages was less than among younger women.

A large proportion of women in Puerto Rico eventually marry. Among women 45 years old and over in 1950, 8.6 percent were reported as single; however, if most of the single women with one or more children ever born had at one time been consensually married, it would appear that only about 6 percent of all women of this age had never been married. Single women 45 years old and over averaged 1.9 children ever born; those who reported at least one child had an average of 5.3 children ever born.

ABILITY TO SPEAK ENGLISH

About 24 percent of the women in Puerto Rico in 1950 were able to speak English. The majority of these were in urban areas. Probably the majority of women who speak English have some acquaintance with customs in the States, a superior degree of education, and a higher-than-average social and economic status. Other census reports show that 99.4 percent of the population residing in Puerto Rico were born there; therefore, nearly all of the English-speaking women must be native Puerto Ricans rather than migrants from the United States. In urban areas, English-speaking women 45 years old and over averaged 2.8 children ever born; as compared with 5.1 among other women of this age. Corresponding figures for rural areas are 4.2 children for English-speaking women and 6.9 for other women.

ABILITY TO READ AND WRITE

A diminishing but sizable proportion of women in Puerto Rico cannot read or write in any language. The proportion ranged from 62.9 percent among women 45 years old and over to 11.9 percent among women 15 to 19 years old. Fewer women in urban areas than in rural areas were illiterate.\*

As would be expected, illiterate women averaged more children ever born than did literate women. In urban areas, women 25 years old and over had about a third more children than literate women had. The excess was much higher at ages under 25 years than at older ages; this pattern probably reflected earlier marriages of illiterate women.

In Puerto Rico, the factor of literacy seems to be less closely related to fertility than the factor of urban-rural residence. Among those 25 years old and over, illiterate women in urban areas averaged fewer children ever born than did literate women in rural areas.

YEARS OF SCHOOL COMPLETED

Half of the women 15 to 19 years old in Puerto Rico had completed less than 6 years of elementary school. This level represented a marked improvement, however, over the median of 3.4 years of school completed by women 40 to 44 years old and of 0.8 years by women 45 years old and over.

Women with no schooling had the most children ever born, on the average. Those who had completed 1 to 3 years of grade school were less fertile than women with no schooling, particularly among women over 40 years of age. Beginning with women who had completed 4 to 7 years of grade school, fertility rates dropped off sharply among successively higher levels of education, in every age and residence group. Women who had completed 1 to 3 years of high school had rates of children ever born that were generally less than half as large as those among women with no schooling.

In urban areas, the fertility rates for women with 1 to 3 years of high school were a little above replacement needs, and in rural areas they were well in excess of replacement needs.<sup>1</sup> Women who had completed 4 years of high school, and particularly women who had completed at least 1 year of college, had rates of children ever born that were well below replacement needs, in urban and rural areas alike.

MUNICIPALITY (COUNTY) OF BIRTH

About 75.7 percent of the women in rural areas in 1950 were living in their municipality of birth, as compared with 43.0 percent of the women in urban areas. Except at ages under 25 years, the fertility of women who had moved to a different municipality tended to be a little lower than that of women living in their municipality of birth.

SAN JUAN BIRTHPLACE AND RESIDENCE

San Juan, the capital, is the largest city in Puerto Rico. Only 21.6 percent of the women living in San Juan in 1950 were born there; the rest were in-migrants, many of whom had moved from rural areas. The native residents of San Juan were considerably less fertile than the in-migrants. Women who had moved to San Juan, however, were less fertile than the population residing in other urban areas, and much less fertile than the population in rural areas.

Some natives of San Juan had moved to other areas by 1950. Among women born in San Juan, 18.6 percent were living in other urban areas, and 7.2 percent were living in rural areas. (These figures do not include women who had left Puerto Rico.) The fertility of women who moved from San Juan to other parts of Puerto Rico was intermediate between the low fertility of women who stayed in San Juan and the higher fertility of the population elsewhere.

FARM RESIDENCE

In 1950, about 23 percent of the women in Puerto Rico lived on farms and 13 percent lived on parcelas (small plots of land not regarded as farms). Data from other sources, however, indicate that 48 percent of the employed men in Puerto Rico were engaged in agriculture in 1950; of the agricultural workers, five out of six were laborers. Many women in non-farm areas probably were wives of agricultural workers. In rural areas, among women over the age of 30, farm residents were the most fertile, parcela residents were slightly less fertile, and women not living on farms or parcelas were least fertile.

<sup>1</sup> Computations based on mortality at the level prevailing in 1940 indicate that about 3.1 children per woman of completed fertility were required for replacement; but mortality declined sharply after 1940, and the replacement quota under mortality conditions existing in 1949 was 2.6 children.

## LABOR FORCE STATUS

About 27.2 percent of the urban women and 16.9 percent of the rural women were in the labor force. The peak proportions occurred in the age group 20 to 24 years, where 36.0 percent of the urban women and 23.0 percent of the rural women were in the labor force. (These proportions are relatively low as compared with those in continental United States.) For all women 15 years old and over, the fertility rate for women in the labor force (2.2 children born per woman) was lower than that for women not in the labor force (3.7 children). Thus, in Puerto Rico as elsewhere, small families and labor force participation of women are interrelated.

## DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Source of data.--The data contained in the present report are from a complete count of women enumerated in the 1950 Census of Puerto Rico.

Related reports.--Other data for Puerto Rico on women by number of children ever born appear in U. S. Bureau of the Census, U. S. Census of Population: 1950, Vol. II, Characteristics of the Population, Parts 51-54, Territories and possessions, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C., 1953. Fertility data from the 1950 Census have not yet been published for continental United States. Recent data on children ever born for continental United States appear in U. S. Bureau of the Census, Current Population Reports, Series P-20, No. 46, "Fertility of the Population: April 1952," December 31, 1953.

Urban and rural residence.--The urban population comprises all persons living in places of 2,500 inhabitants or more. The remaining population is classified as rural.

Children ever born.--The 1950 Census was the first census of Puerto Rico in which a question was asked on children ever born. The question was asked of all women, including single women. All live births the woman had had during her lifetime were counted, including those by any former marriage or consensual union. As tabulated, the terminal class in the frequency distribution of women by number of children ever born was "15 or more"; in computing the total number of children ever born, mean values were estimated for this class by graphic extrapolation.

Age.--The age classification is based on the age of the woman at her last birthday prior to the date of the enumeration, that is, the age of the woman in completed years.

Color.--In the classification by color, the group designated as "nonwhite" consists of Negroes, persons of mixed white and Negro blood, and the small number of persons of other nonwhite races.

Marital status.--This classification refers to the status at the time of enumeration. Persons classified as "married" or "consensually married" comprise both those who have been married only once and those who remarried after having been widowed or divorced. The category "Consensually married," that is, persons living together in a common-law marriage without a civil or religious ceremony, probably includes some persons whose union has been broken by separation. The category "Single" probably includes some persons whose former consensual union had been dissolved by separation or death.

Years of school completed.--The data on years of school completed were derived from the combination of answers to two questions: (a) "What is the highest grade of school that this person has attended?" and (b) "Did he finish this grade?" The questions applied only to progress in "regular" schools, that is, schools where enrollment leads to an elementary or high school diploma, or to a college, university, or professional school degree.

Ability to read and write.--This classification is based on replies to the question, "Does this person know how to read and write?" Ability to read and write any language was acceptable.

Ability to speak English.--The data on ability to speak English were derived from answers to the question, "Does this person know how to speak English?"

Municipality of birth.--The statistics on this subject are based on the respondent's answer to the question, "In what municipality was he born?" If the respondent was born outside Puerto Rico, the enumerator was instructed to enter the name of the country of birth.

Farm residence.--For purposes of the present report, a farm is defined as a place of 3 or more "cuerdas" on which agricultural operations are performed. (A cuerda is equivalent to 0.9712 of an acre.) All other places are regarded as nonfarm. Places of less than 3 cuerdas on which agricultural operations are performed are shown separately in the category "Parcela" under "Nonfarm."

Labor force status.--The labor force comprises the total of (a) all civilians 14 years old and over classified as employed or unemployed, and (b) persons serving in the Armed Forces. Employed persons comprise civilians who, during the week preceding the enumerator's visit, were either (a) "at work" or (b) "with a job but not at work."

# 1950 CENSUS OF POPULATION

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## FERTILITY BY DURATION OF MARRIAGE: 1950

(This is one of a series of reports presenting summary statistics from the 1950 Census on selected characteristics of the population. The tables presented here contain data that were tabulated as a part of a project financed by a grant from the Population Council, Inc.)

Women in the higher education brackets had fewer children on the average than women with less schooling, according to an analysis of 1950 Census data. Likewise, the wives of "white-collar" workers had fewer children than those of "blue-collar" or manual workers. Similar differences in fertility have been observed at earlier dates but the amount of these differences has tended to diminish through the last several decades. Moreover, in 1950, persons in the upper economic groups tended to postpone somewhat longer the birth of their first child and to have their last child after fewer years of married life than persons in the lower economic groups.

Married women college graduates of child-bearing age in 1950 who had been married 10 years or more had about half as many children

on the average (1,954 children per 1,000 women) as married women who had not completed the seventh grade of school (3,632 children per 1,000 women) (table A). The more detailed statistics in table 1 show a generally consistent pattern of progressively higher fertility among groups with progressively lower amounts of schooling. During the first 2 years of married life, the college graduates had 172 children per 1,000 women and those with less than 7 years of school had 427 children per 1,000 women. In the marriage period "10 years or more," the college graduates gave birth to 261 children per 1,000 women and those with less than 7 years of school gave birth to 1,242 children per 1,000 women. During each period of married life shown in table A, the college graduates bore fewer children than the women with less than 7 years of school. The differences in

fertility between these two education groups were small, however, for each of the periods of married life from 2 to 7 years.

The data shown in this report are based on a 1-percent sample of the 1950 Census of Population. Consequently, they are subject to sampling variability, as explained below in the section on the reliability of the estimates. Some of the irregularities in fertility patterns by single years of duration of marriage shown in tables 1 and 2 may reflect sampling variability. These irregularities tend to disappear when the data are grouped, as in table A. The averages in table A labeled "during specified period" were derived from the cumulative averages labeled "since marriage" by subtracting the figure on one line from the next figure below it. The figures for "specified" periods provide approximations to the numbers of children added during successive periods of married life even though they actually involve comparisons between the fertility experience of different groups of women.

It is estimated that married women need an average of about 2,500 children per 1,000 by the end of their reproductive period if the population is to be maintained from one generation to the next. Among all married women 40 to 44 years old in unbroken first marriages lasting 20 years or more, the average number of children was 2,954 per 1,000

women or more than enough to insure population increase (table 1). Corresponding figures by educational level of the women varied from 4,186 for women with less than 7 years of schooling down to 2,272 for women who had quit school after graduating from high school and to 1,926 for women who had graduated from college.

Women who had relatively early marriages had more children than the women who had relatively late marriages. Thus, in the age group 40 to 44 years the women who had been married 20 years or more had 2,954 children per 1,000 women as compared with 2,041 for the women married 15 to 19 years.

Table B shows that the wives of farmers and other "blue-collar" workers tended to have their first children after fewer years of married life than did the wives of "white-collar" workers. Moreover, the former groups were much more likely to have children after they had been married 10 years or more. The wives of farmers and of nonfarm laborers had particularly high fertility rates, and the wives of professional workers had particularly low fertility rates, after 10 years or more of marriage. The tendency for childbearing to occur most frequently during the second and third years of marriage and to diminish (on an annual basis) thereafter was characteristic of women regardless of the occupation group of their husbands.

RELATED REPORTS

The data in the present report may be regarded as a supplement to those contained in the 1950 Census of Population, Volume IV, Spe-

cial Reports, Part 5C, Fertility, and Part 2E, Duration of Current Marital Status. They correspond to the data published in the 1940 Census special report Differential Fertility: 1940 and 1910--Fertility by Duration of Marriage.

The Bureau of the Census conducts every month the Current Population Survey covering a scientifically selected sample of households. Irregularly since 1946, data have been obtained on number of children under 5 years old and on number of children ever born. The most recent data were for April 1954 and were published in Current Population Reports, Series P-20, No. 65. None of these reports, however, contains fertility data by duration of marriage.

The National Office of Vital Statistics publishes statistics annually on registered births by ages of the parents, color, and order of the birth (first child born to the mother, second, etc.). It also publishes monthly estimates of the number of births and birth rates per 1,000 population, and various special reports. None of these statistics include data by duration of marriage.

#### AVAILABILITY OF UNPUBLISHED DATA

Data for nonwhite women were tabulated in identical detail with those for white women; the detailed data for nonwhite women contained too few cases to warrant publication on the basis of a 1-percent sample. Marginal totals for nonwhite women by education only, occupation only, and duration of marriage only were published in the 1950 Census report on fertility cited above. For the present study, duration of marriage was tabulated uniformly in single years from 0 to 9 years but was abridged into under 5 years and 5 to 9 years for those parts of tables 1 and 2 showing women by age groups; this was done largely because of the small number of cases.

The tabulated, but unpublished, statistics can be made available upon request, for the cost of processing and transcription. Requests for such unpublished material should be addressed to the Director, Bureau of the Census, Washington 25, D. C.

#### DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

The definitions of the major concepts used in the 1950 Census are given below. Several of these definitions differ from those used in 1940. These changes were made after consultation with users of census data in order to improve the statistics, even though it was recognized that comparability would be

adversely affected. In many cases, the new definitions were tested in connection with the Current Population Survey; and, where feasible, measures of the impact on the statistics were developed.

For a discussion of the definitions of concepts used in the 1950 Census, the quality of data, and the problems of comparability with earlier census data, see Volume II, Characteristics of the Population, Part 1, United States Summary. The comparability with earlier census data on fertility, times married, and duration of marriage is discussed in Volume IV, Special Reports, Part 5G, Fertility. The 1950 Census schedule and the major part of the instructions to enumerators are also reproduced in Volume II, Part 1.

Children ever born.--The data on women by number of children ever born were derived from answers to the question, "How many children has she ever borne, not counting stillbirths?" A check box was provided for replies of "None."

The enumerator was instructed to count all children ever born alive to the woman, including children by any previous marriage, children who had died, and children not living in the household. The enumerator was instructed not to inquire about adopted children or stepchildren; but he was told that, if the question was raised, he was not to count children who were not born to the woman. There is evidence that most of the reports on the number of children ever born were accurate.

The distribution of women by number of children ever born is shown in the full detail that was tabulated. In the computation of total children ever born, estimated mean values were applied to the groupings of 5 and 6 children, 7 to 9 children, and 10 children or more.

Age.--The age classification is based on the age of the woman at her last birthday, that is, the age of the woman in completed years. The enumerator was instructed to obtain age as of the date of his visit.

Marital status.--The data in the present report are limited to women classified as married once and husband present. The category comprises women married only once, with both the husband and the wife reported as members of the household or quasi household, even

though the husband or wife may have been temporarily away on business or vacation, visiting, in a hospital, etc., at the time of the enumeration. The women with no report on times married were assigned an appropriate entry by means of a prorating process based on a special national sample of 1950 Census data for approximately 60,000 women.

Duration of marriage.--Information on duration of marriage was obtained in response to the question, "How many years since this woman was married?" A check box was provided for answers of "Less than 1 year" but it is possible that some women reported to the nearest whole year of duration rather than the completed years, because the intervals "Less than 1 year" and "1 year" seem to be underreported. Also, for some women the length of marriage may have been reported to be consistent with the age of the oldest child. A peak at "3 years" is correct as this reflects the unprecedented numbers of marriages in 1946 and 1947. When duration of marriage was not reported, an estimate was made, based on data from the 1950 Census for a national sample of about 60,000 women.

Years of school completed.--The data on years of school completed were derived from the combination of answers to two questions: (a) "What is the highest grade of school that she has attended?" and (b) "Did she finish this grade?" The questions applied only to progress in "regular" schools, that is, schools where enrollment may lead to an elementary or high school diploma, or to a college, university, or professional school degree.

Major occupation group of husband.--The data on major occupation group presented here are for husbands in the experienced civilian labor force and refer to the job held during the calendar week preceding the enumerator's visit, or, if the person was unemployed, to the last job held. The data are based on answers to the question, "What kind of work was he doing?" If a person was employed at two jobs or more, the job at which he worked the greatest number of hours during the census week was reported. The occupational categories shown are major groups in the classification system used in the 1950 Census, except that in the present report the categories "Service workers, except private household" and "Private household workers" have been combined into "Service workers, including private household." A list of the 469 detailed

occupation items that make up the major groups appears in Volume II, Characteristics of the Population, and in other reports of the 1950 Census, including Volume IV, Special Reports, Part 5C, Fertility.

Experienced civilian labor force.--The experienced civilian labor force comprises the total of civilians who were employed and of civilians who were unemployed but had previous work experience.

Employed persons comprise those who during the census week were either (1) "at work"--those who did any work for pay or profit, or worked without pay for 15 hours or more on a family farm or in a family business; or (2) "with a job but not at work"--those who did not work and were not looking for work but had a job or business from which they were temporarily absent because of vacation, illness, industrial dispute, bad weather, or lay-off with definite instructions to return to work within 30 days of layoff. Also included as "with a job" are persons who had new jobs to which they were scheduled to report within 30 days.

Unemployed persons comprise civilians who were not at work during the census week but who were either looking for work or would have been looking for work except that (1) they were temporarily ill, (2) they expected to return to a job from which they had been laid off for an indefinite period, or (3) they believed no work was available in their community, or in their line of work.

#### SOURCE AND RELIABILITY OF DATA

The data for 1950 presented in this report are based on a sample of approximately 1 percent of married women with husband present who were enumerated in the 1950 Census of Population. This sample is a subsample of what was designated as Sample C in the 1950 Census. Information on the procedure used for the selection of the 1-percent sample and the full Sample C, and the methods used to obtain United States estimates from the sample data may be found in the section entitled "Sample design" in the 1950 Census of Population, Volume IV, Special Reports, Part 5C, "Fertility," and Part 2E, "Duration of Current Marital Status." Since the information used for this report is not based on the same sample as the 1950 Census report on "Fertility," minor differences



between the two reports will be found in identical items.

Because the estimates in this report are based on a sample, they are subject to sampling variability. The standard error is a measure of sampling variability. The chances are about 68 out of 100 that the difference due to sampling variability between an estimate and the figure that would have been obtained from a complete enumeration is less than the standard error. The chances are about 95 out of 100 that the difference is less than twice the standard error and 99 out of 100 that it is less than  $2\frac{1}{2}$  times the standard error.

Rough approximations to the standard errors which would apply to estimates shown in this report may be obtained by increasing by 50 percent the standard errors shown on pages 14 and 15 of the 1950 Census report on "Fertility" (Vol. IV, Part 5C). The following illustrations indicate the order of magnitude of the standard errors for some typical statistics. Table 1 shows that in April 1950 there were an estimated 58,400 ever-married women 15 to 24 years of age who had completed less than seven years of public school, and had no children ever born. The standard error of the estimate of 58,400 is about 2,900. Consequently, the chances are about 68 out of 100 that the figure which would have been obtained

from a complete enumeration would have differed by less than 2,900 from the sample estimate. It also follows that there is only about 1 chance in 100 that a complete census count would have differed by as much as 7,250, that is, by about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  times the standard error. Table 1 also shows that there were an estimated 1,422 children ever born per 1,000 ever-married women 15 to 24 years old who had completed less than seven years of public school. The standard error of the estimate of 1,422 is about 42.

In addition to sampling variability, the data are subject to errors of response and to errors occurring in processing operations (transcription, coding, punching, and tabulating). Processing errors were kept below specific tolerance limits by sample verification and other controls. Small frequencies in the tables may well represent solely errors from the above sources. For example, the estimate of 900 women married less than one year and having 10 or more children probably does not represent this many genuine cases in the population. (Genuine cases represent stepchildren of the women, illegitimate children born before the marriage, etc.) It was not considered feasible, however, to edit the data so as to remove or reduce those frequencies arising partly from rare events and partly from response and processing errors.
