STATISTICS OF MANUFACTURES.

Washington, January 1, 1900.

Section 7 of the act entitled "An act to provide for taking the Twelfth and subsequent censuses," approved March 3, 1899, provides that whenever the Director of the Census shall deem it expedient he may withhold the schedules relating to the statistics of the manufacturing and mechanical industries from the enumerators and may charge the collection of these statistics upon special agents.

In accordance with this provision, the following cities and towns in the several States and Territories have been withdrawn from the enumerators, who will be relieved of all responsibility for the collection of the statistics of manufactures therein. In all other subdivisions of the supervisors' districts, except those named in this bulletin, the schedules for manufactures will be distributed among the enumerators, to be taken by them in connection with the statistics of population and agriculture. In the cities and towns withdrawn from the enumerators, special agents will be appointed, who will be charged with the sole responsibility of collecting the statistics of the manufacturing and mechanical industries.

The cities and towns are arranged by supervisors' districts, and are grouped by geographical contiguity where several places may be advantageously canvassed by the same special agent or agents. The geographical arrangement makes it necessary in many cases to group cities and towns in one supervisor's district with those in another district. The estimated number of special agents required to make the canvass is given for each city, town, or group. In the 1,412 cities and towns withdrawn from the enumerators, it is estimated that 2,033 special agents will be required.

This bulletin is published in order that the supervisors may become familiar with the places in which the enumerators must be instructed not to secure reports from establishments of productive industry.

In preparing this list of cities and towns the recommendations of the supervisors have been given due consideration. Suggestions from the supervisors or other persons relative to modifications or additions to this list may be made to S. N. D. North, Chief Statistician for Manufactures.

It is the intention to have the statistics of manufactures collected by special agents only in cities and towns where the number or importance of the establishments is such that the enumerators can not make the canvass within the time allowed for their work.

STATISTICS OF MANUFACTURES.

CITIES AND TOWNS WITHDRAWN FROM ENUMERATORS.

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, CENSUS OFFICE,

Washington, April 2, 1900.

Section 7 of the act entitled "An act to provide for taking the Twelfth and subsequent censuses," approved March 3, 1899, provides that whenever the Director of the Census shall deem it expedient he may withhold the schedules relating to the statistics of the manufacturing and mechanical industries from the enumerators and may charge the collection of these statistics upon special agents.

In accordance with this provision, the following cities and towns in the several States and Territories have been withdrawn from the enumerators, who will be relieved of all responsibility for the collection of the statistics of manufactures therein. In all other subdivisions of the supervisors' districts, except those named in this Bulletin, the schedules for manufactures will be distributed among the enumerators, to be taken by them in connection with the statistics of population and agriculture. In the cities and towns withdrawn from the enumerators, special agents will be appointed, who will be charged with the sole responsibility of collecting the statistics of the manufacturing and mechanical industries.

The cities and towns are arranged by supervisors' districts, and are grouped by geographical contiguity where several places may be advantageously canvassed by the same special agent or agents. The geographical arrangement makes it necessary in many cases to group cities and towns in one supervisor's district with those in another district. The estimated number of special agents required to make the canvass is given for each city, town, or group. In the 1,339 cities and towns withdrawn from the enumerators, it is estimated that 2,002 special agents will be required.

This Bulletin is published in order that the supervisors may become familiar with the places in which the enumerators must be instructed not to secure reports from establishments of productive industry, and their attention is called to the fact that a number of cities included in the Bulletin as published January 1, 1900, have been omitted and some others added. Supervisors and others will please destroy all copies of the first edition of this Bulletin.

It is the intention to have the statistics of manufactures collected by special agents only in cities and towns where the number or importance of the establishments is such that the enumerators can not make the canvass within the time allowed for their work, and this list of such cities and towns has been prepared under the supervision of S. N. D. North, Chief Statistician for Manufactures.

Washington, D. C., January 10, 1900.

By the terms of an act approved March 3, 1899, for taking the Twelfth and subsequent censuses, the Director of the Census is required to designate the number of supervisors of census to be appointed within each State and Territory, the District of Columbia, Alaska, and the Hawaiian Islands, who shall be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, provided that the number of such supervisors shall not exceed three hundred; but in the enumeration of the population and products of Alaska and the Hawaiian Islands, the Director of the Census may employ supervisors and enumerators, or special agents, as he may deem necessary.

In accordance with this provision, the country has been divided into three hundred districts, two hundred and ninety-seven of which are to be under the direct charge of one supervisor each; two of which, in Alaska, are to be in charge of one special agent each; and one, the Hawaiian Islands, to be in charge of one special agent. A full description of these several districts is contained in Census Bulletin No. 1 (revised edition), published under date of April 17, 1899.

The following statement gives the names and addresses of the persons who have been appointed to serve as supervisors of census and special agents in their respective districts.

POPULATION OF NEW HAMPSHIRE BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. William C. Hunt, chief statistician for population, gives aggregate population of New Hampshire by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

New Hampshire was one of the original thirteen states. Table 1 shows the population of New Hampshire at excensus from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 411,588 as against 376,530 in 1800, representing an increase since 1890 of 35,058, or 9.3 per cent. This rate of increase has been substantially constant for three successive decades, having been 8.5 per cent for the decade from 1880 to 1890, and 9.0 per cent for the decade from 1870 to 1880. There was a decrease in the population of the state of 2.3 per cent from 1860 to 1870, and an increase of only 2.5 per cent during the decade immediately preceding.

The population of New Hampshire in 1900 is nearly three times as large as the population given for 1790. The largest increase was for the decade from 1790 to 1800, when it was 41,973, or 29.5 per cent.

The total land surface of New Hampshire is, approximately, 9,005 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 41.8; 1900, 45.7.

Table 2 shows the population of New Hampshire by counties at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

There have been no territorial changes in the counties of New Hampshire since 1890.

Of the 10 counties in the state all but 2 have increased in population during the decade. The greatest gains are shown in Coos county, 26.9 per cent, and in Hillsboro county, 20.7 per cent. Hillsboro county shows much the largest numerical increase, having gained 19,393 inhabitants, but 12,861 of these represent the increase in Manchester city.

The 2 counties showing a decrease in population are Belknap and Carroll.

Table 4 shows the population of New Hampshire by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 11 cities the smallest, Franklin, has a population of 5,846, and the largest, Manchester, a population of 56,987. They all show a marked increase in population since 1890, but the most striking instance of growth is presented by the city of Berlin, which has increased in population from 3,729 to 8,886, or 138.2 per cent. The greatest numerical increase is exhibited by Manchester, which has 12,861 more inhabitants than it had in 1890.

Manchester is the only city in New Hampshire that has a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, and for this city a summary is presented in table 6, showing its population from 1820 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each of the ten-year periods.

According to this summary, the population of Manchester, starting with only 761 in 1820, increased but little during the next decade, but for the two succeeding ten-year periods increased 268.8 per cent from 1830 to 1840, and 330.6 per cent from 1840 to 1850. Having attained a population of 13,982 in 1850, Manchester has since exhibited a strong normal growth for five succeeding decades, and at present has more than four times as many inhabitants as it had fifty years ago.

POPULATION OF ALABAMA BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Alabama by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Alabama was organized as a territory March 3, 1817, and admitted as a state December 14, 1819. In 1800 Washington county, then in the territory of Mississippi, but subsequently included in the territory of Alabama, had a population of 1,250. In 1810 the counties of Baldwin, Madison, and Washington, then in the territory of Mississippi, but subsequently included in the territory of Alabama, had a population of 9,046. Table 1 shows the population of Alabama at each census from 1820 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 1,828,697 as against 1,513,017 in 1890, representing an increase since 1890 of 315,680, or 20.8 per cent. This rate of increase is slightly greater than that for the decade from 1880 to 1890, when it was 19.8 per cent, but somewhat less than that for the decade from 1870 to 1880, when it was 26.6 per cent. From 1820 to 1830, the first decennial period in the history of the state, its population increased 142 per cent, and in the following decade 90.8 per cent, but subsequently the rate of increase declined until the decade from 1860 to 1870, when it was only 3.4 per cent.

The population of Alabama in 1900 is more than fourteen times as large as the population given for 1820, the first census taken after its organization as a state in 1819.

The total land surface of Alabama is, approximately, 51,540 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 29.3; 1900, 35.4.

Table 2 shows the population of Alabama by counties at each census from 1820 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the 10 years from 1890 to 1900.

The following territorial changes have been made in the counties of Alabama since 1890: Part of Colbert has been annexed to Franklin; part of Jefferson has been annexed to Walker; part of Lawrence has been annexed to Colbert; and part of Talladega has been annexed to Clay.

Of the 66 counties in the state all but 2 have increased in population during the decade, the counties showing more than 50 per cent of increase being Covington, 103.6 per cent; Geneva, 78.6 per cent; Coffee, 72.3 per cent; Jefferson, 58.6 per cent; Walker, 56.4 per cent; and Franklin, 54.5 per cent. Jefferson county shows the largest numerical increase (51,919), but nearly one-fourth of this increase is due to the increase in the population of the city of Birmingham.

The 2 counties showing a decrease in population are Cleburne and Lawrence.

Table 4 shows the population of Alabama by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

According to this summary, the population of Birmingham increased from 3,086 in 1880 to 26,178 in 1890, or 748.2 per cent; and from 26,178 in 1890 to 38,415 in 1900, or 46.7 per cent. Mobile increased in population from 1880 to 1890 only 6.6 per cent, but in the last decade 23.7 per cent. The population of Montgomery increased from 1880 to 1890 at the rate of 30.9 per cent, but in the decade just closed, at the rate of 38.6 per cent. The greatest numerical increase and the greatest percentage of increase during the last 10 years have occurred in the city of Birmingham.

POPULATION OF ARIZONA BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. William C. Hunt, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Arizona by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Arizona was organized as a territory February 24, 1863. In 1860 Arizona constituted the county of Arizona, in the territory of New Mexico, and had a population of 6,482. Table 1 shows the population of Arizona at each census from 1870 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the territory in 1900 is 122,212 as compared with a population in 1890 of 59,620. This shows an increase during the decade of 62,592, or 104.9 per cent. This large increase is due in part to the fact that there were 28,469 Indians and 154 other persons, or a total of 28,623 persons, on Indian reservations, etc., in Arizona, who were specially enumerated in 1890 under the provisions of the census act, but were not included in the general population of the territory at that census. The population of the territory in 1870 was 9,658, and during the 10 years from 1870 to 1880 it increased 30,782, or 318.7 per cent, giving a population in 1880 of 40,440. The population in 1890, as stated in the report for that census, was 59,620, representing an increase during the decade of 19,180, or 47.4 per cent.

The population of Arizona in 1900 is more than twelve times as large as the population given for 1870, the first census taken after its organization as a territory in 1863.

The total land surface of Arizona is, approximately, 112,920 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 0.5; 1900, 1.0.

Table 2 shows the population of Arizona by counties at each census from 1870 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase by number and per cent during the 10 years from 1890 to 1900.

The following territorial changes in the counties of Arizona have been made since 1800: Part of Yavapai taken to form Coconino in 1891; part of Apache taken to form Navajo in 1895; and part of Pima taken to form Santa Cruz in 1899.

As above stated, 3 counties, namely, Coconino, Navajo, and Santa Cruz, have been formed since 1890. The remaining 10 counties all show increases in population since 1890, and some of them very large increases. These large increases are due in certain cases, however, to the exclusion from the general population of the territory in 1890 of Indians and other persons on Indian reservations, etc.

The population of Arizona can not be given by precincts for the different counties in 1900, as it is not separately returned. Table 4 shows the population of Arizona by cities, towns, and Indian reservations, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. William C. Hunt, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Arkansas by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Arkansas was organized as a territory March 2, 1819, and admitted as a state June 15, 1836. In 1810 Arkansas county, then in the territory of Louisiana, but subsequently included in the territory of Arkansas, had a population of 1,062. The population of the state in 1900 is 1,311,564 as against 1,128,179 in 1800, representing an increase since 1890 of 183,385, or 16.25 per cent. This rate of increase is only about two-fifths of that for the decade from 1880 to 1890, when it was 40.58 per cent, and less than one-fourth of that for the decade from 1870 to 1880, when it was 65.65 per cent. From 1860 to 1870 there was an increase of only 11.26 per cent, but prior to 1860 the population more than doubled itself during each decade, and for the decade from 1830 to 1840 showed an increase of 221.09 per cent.

The population of Arkansas in 1900 is more than ninety times as large as the population given for 1820, the first census taken after its organization as a territory in 1819.

The total land surface of Arkansas is, approximately, 53,045 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 21.27; 1900, 24.78.

There have been no territorial changes in the counties of Arkansas since 1890.

Of the 75 counties in the state all but 4 have increased in population during the decade, the counties showing more than 50 per cent of increase being Polk, 97.69 per cent; Poinsett, 64.44 per cent; Sevier, 62.22 per cent; Craighead, 62.20 per cent; Little River, 54.28 per cent, and Union, 50.20 per cent. Pulaski county shows the largest numerical increase (15,850), but fully three-fourths of this increase is due to the increase in the population of the city of Little Rock.

The 4 counties showing a decrease in population are Crawford, Franklin, Grant, and Logan.

Table 4 shows the population of Arkansas by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 184 incorporated places there are only 19 that have a population in 1900 of more than 2,000, and of these only 5 that have a population in excess of 5,000, namely, Little Rock, with 38,307; Fort Smith, with 11,587; Pine Bluff, with 11,496; Hot Springs, with 9,973, and Helena, with 5,550 inhabitants.

Little Rock is the only city in Arkansas that has a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, and for this city as summary is presented in table 6, showing its population from 1850, the first year in which it is separately stated in the census report, to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each of the ten-years periods.

According to this summary, the population of Little Rock, starting with only 2,167 in 1850, increased to 12,880 in 1870, to 25,874 in 1890, and to 38,307 in 1900. The numerical increase during the past ten years is practically the same as that for the decade preceding, but the percentage of increase is only half as great, being 48.05 from 1890 to 1900 as compared with 96.94 from 1880 to 1890.

POPULATION OF DELAWARE BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS, AND OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Delaware by counties and minor civil divisions, and of the District of Columbia, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Delaware was one of the original 13 states. The District of Columbia was formed March 30, 1791, but that portion situated in Virginia was receded to that state July 9, 1846. Table 1 shows the population of Delaware and the District of Columbia at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of Delaware in 1900 is 184,785 as against 168,493 in 1890, representing an increase since 1890 of 16,242, or 9.6 per cent. The population of Delaware in 1790 was 59,096, from which it appears that the population in 1900 is a little more than three times the population reported in 1790.

The population of the District of Columbia in 1900 is 278,718, as compared with a population in 1890 of 280,892, showing an increase of 48,826, or 20.9 per cent, during the past 10 years. The population of the District of Columbia in 1800, the first census taken after its formation in 1791, was 14,093, which, as compared with the population in 1900, shows an increase of not quite twenty fold in 100 years.

The total land surface of Delaware is, approximately, 1,960 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 85.9; 1900, 94.2.

The total land surface of the District of Columbia is, approximately, 60 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 3,839.8; 1900, 4,645.3.

Table 2 shows the population of Delaware by counties at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, and the population of the District of Columbia by counties at each census from 1800 to 1870 only, the county government having been abolished in 1874. Table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county in Delaware, the increase by number and per cent during the 10 years from 1890 to 1900.

Of the incorporated cities and towns in Delaware there are only 6 having a population in 1900 of more than 2,000, namely, Wilmington, with 76,508; Newcastle, with 3,380; Dover, with 3,329; Milford, with 2,500; Lewes, with 2,259, and Smyrna, with 2,168 inhabitants.

Wilmington is the only city in Delaware that has a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, and for this city a summary is presented in table 6, showing its population from 1840, the first year in which it is separately stated in the census report, to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each of the ten-year periods.

The above summary shows that Wilmington had in 1840 a population of 8,367, and that the city has steadily increased during each decade, its population in 1900 being 76,508, or an increase of 24.5 per cent during the last 10 years.

POPULATION OF CONNECTICUT BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. William C. Hunt, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Connecticut by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Connecticut was one of the original 13 states. Table 1 shows the population of Connecticut at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 908,355 as compared with a population in 1890 of 746,258, showing an increase since 1890 of 162,097, or 21.7 per cent. This is a little higher rate of increase than that of the decade from 1880 to 1890, when it was 19.8 per cent. Connecticut had in 1790 a population of 237,946, and did not increase rapidly in population until the ten-year period from 1840 to 1850, when it showed an increase of 19.6 per cent, which was followed in the succeeding 10 years, from 1850 to 1860, by an increase of 24.0 per cent.

The total land surface of Connecticut is, approximately, 4,845 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 154.0; 1900, 187.4.

Table 2 shows the population of Connecticut by counties at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the 10 years from 1890 to 1900.

There has been no territorial change in the counties of Connecticut since 1890.

Of the 8 counties of the state all but 1 have increased in population during the decade, the counties showing the largest percentages of increase being Hartford, 32.7 per cent; New Haven, 28.7 per cent; Fairfield, 22.7 per cent, and Litchfield, 18.9 per cent.

Tolland county shows a decrease of 558, or 2.2 per cent, during the decade.

Of the above named 39 incorporated cities and boroughs there are only 6 that have less than 2,000 inhabitants in 1900.

There are 5 cities that have a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, namely, New Haven, with 108,027; Hartford, with 79,850; Bridgeport, with 70,996; Waterbury, with 45,859, and New Britain, with 25,998 inhabitants. All of the above named cities show a satisfactory increase during the last 10 years, the largest percentage being 60.0 for Waterbury, and the smallest 32.8 for New Haven. Waterbury has practically maintained the rate of increase reached during the preceding decade, while New Haven shows a larger percentage of increase as compared with that for the decade immediately preceding. The rate of increase for Hartford from 1890 to 1900 is 50.0 per cent as compared with 26.6 per cent from 1880 to 1890, while New Britain shows an increase of 57.3 per cent during the last 10 years as compared with an increase of 39.9 per cent for the preceding ten-year period. Bridgeport shows an increase of 45.2 per cent from 1890 to 1900, which is considerably smaller than the rate of increase from 1880 to 1890, when it was 76.7 per cent.

POPULATION OF CALIFORNIA BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. Hunt, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of California by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

California was admitted as a state September 9, 1850. Table 1 shows the population of California at each census from 1850 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 1,485,053 as against 1,208,130 in 1890, representing an increase since 1890 of 276,923, or 22.9 per cent. A small portion of this increase is due to the fact that there were 5,107 Indians and 161 other persons, or a total of 5,268 persons, on Indian reservations, etc., in California, who were specially enumerated in 1890 under the provisions of the census act, but were not included in the general population of the state at that census. The population of the state in 1850 was 92,597, and during the ten years from 1850 to 1860 it increased 287,397, or 310.3 per cent, showing a total population in 1860 of 379,994. During the decade from 1860 to 1876 the increase was only 180,253, or 47.4 per cent, but for each of the three succeeding decades the numerical increase has been much greater, though the percentage of increase for the last two decades has declined.

The population of California in 1900 is more than sixteen times as large as that given for 1850, the first census in which the population of the state appears.

The total land surface of California is, approximately, 155,980 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 7.7; 1900, 9.5.

Table 2 shows the population of California by counties at each census from 1850 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

The following territorial changes in the counties of California have been made since 1890: Glenn was organized from a part of Colusa in 1892; Kings was organized from a part of Tulare in 1893; Madera was organized from a part of Fresno in 1893; and Riverside was organized from parts of San Bernardino and San Diego in 1893.

Of the 57 counties in the state all but 11 have increased in population during the decade, the counties showing more than 50 per cent of increase being Tuolumne, 83.5 per cent; Kern, 68.0 per cent; and Los Angeles, 67.8 per cent. Los Angeles county shows the largest numerical increase (68,844), but more than three-fourths of this increase is due to the increase in the population of the city of Los Angeles.

The 11 counties showing a decrease in population are Alpine, Butte, Colusa, Del Norte, Eldorado, Lake, Plumas, Sierra, Stanislaus, Tulare, and Yuba.

Table 4 shows the population of California by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.
