

# CENSUS BULLETIN.

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## POPULATION OF KANSAS BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Kansas by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Kansas was organized as a territory May 30, 1854, and admitted as a state January 29, 1861. Table 1 shows the population of Kansas at each census from 1860 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 1,470,495 as compared with a population in 1890 of 1,427,096, representing an increase during the decade of 43,399, or 3.0 per cent. The population of the state in 1860 was 107,206, and during the ten years from 1860 to 1870 it increased 257,193, or 239.9 per cent, showing a total population in 1870 of 364,399. During the decade from 1870 to 1880 it increased from 364,399 to 996,096, a numerical gain of 631,697, which is more than that for any other decade in the history of the state, the rate of increase being 173.4 per cent. The growth of Kansas during the last ten years has been very slight, the numerical increase and the per cent of increase being much less than in any corresponding period.

The population of Kansas in 1900 is more than thirteen times as large as the population given for 1860, the first year in which its population appears in the census report.

The total land surface of Kansas is, approximately, 81,700 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 17.4; 1900, 18.0.

Table 2 shows the population of Kansas by counties at each census from 1860 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

The only territorial change which has occurred in the counties of Kansas since 1890 is the annexation of Garfield to Finney in 1893.

Of the 105 counties in the state 51 have increased in population during the decade, and 54 have suffered a loss in population. The counties which show the greatest percentages of increase are Cherokee, 53.7 per cent; Allen, 44.4 per cent; Wyandotte, 34.6 per cent; Crawford, 28.1 per cent; and Montgomery, 25.7 per cent.

The counties which show the greatest percentages of decrease are Stanton, 68.3 per cent; Grant, 67.7 per cent; Greeley, 61.0 per cent; Morton, 58.0 per cent; Haskell, 57.6 per cent; and Stevens, 56.3 per cent.

Table 4 shows the population of Kansas by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.


Of the above named 356 incorporated cities, 53 have more than 2,000 inhabitants; 34 have from 2,000 to 5,000; 10 have from 5,000 to 10,000; 5 have from 10,000 to 20,000; and 4 have more than 20,000. The cities having a population of more than 20,000 are Kansas City, with 51,418; Topeka, with 33,608; Wichita, with 24,671; and Leavenworth, with 20,735.

Kansas City and Topeka are the only cities in Kansas that have a population in 1900 of more than 25,000 inhabitants, and for these two cities a summary is presented in table 6, showing the population from 1860 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

As shown by the above summary, Kansas City had a population of only 3,200 in 1880, and in 1890 had 38,316, a gain of 1097.4 per cent. The progress of this city during the last decade has, however, been only normal, as shown by an increase in population of only 34.2 per cent. Topeka was first enumerated separately in 1860 with 759 inhabitants; during the following decade it increased in population at the rate of 662.8 per cent, and in the two succeeding decades at the rate of 166.9 and 100.7 per cent, respectively, but during the last decade has increased only 8.4 per cent.

## POPULATION OF KENTUCKY BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, shows the aggregate population of Kentucky by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Kentucky was admitted as a state June 1, 1792. Table 1 shows the population of Kentucky at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 2,147,174 as compared with a population of 1,858,635 in 1890. This shows an increase during the ten years of 288,539, or 15.5 per cent, as against an increase of 209,945, or 12.7 per cent, from 1880 to 1890. Kentucky had a population in 1790 of 78,677 and its increase since then has been continuous, but for several decades the percentage of gain was comparatively small. The most notable gains in number have occurred in the decades from 1870 to 1880 and from 1890 to 1900. In the former, the increase was 327,679, or 24.8 per cent, and in the latter, 288,539, or 15.5 per cent.

The population of Kentucky in 1900 is nearly thirty times as large as the population given for 1790 by the census taken two years before it was admitted as a state.

The total land surface of Kentucky is, approximately, 40,000 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 46.5; 1900, 53.7.

Table 2 shows the population of Kentucky by counties at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

There has been but one territorial change in the counties of Kentucky since 1890, namely, part of Estill annexed to Powell.

Of the 119 counties in the state all but 10 show increases in population since 1890, and 5 of them show over 50 per cent of increase, namely: Leslie, 70.4 per cent; Breathitt, 64.5 per cent; Knott, 60.1 per cent; Harlan, 58.8 per cent; and Bell, 52.3 per cent.

The 10 counties showing a decrease in population are Anderson, Boone, Bracken, Franklin, Hancock, Mason, Mercer, Owen, Pendleton, and Warren.

Table 4 shows the population of Kentucky by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the 354 incorporated places, 42 have more than 2,000 inhabitants in 1900, and of these, 27 have less than 5,000 inhabitants; 8 have more than 5,000 and less than 10,000; 3 have more than 10,000 and less than 20,000; and 4 have more than 25,000, namely: Louisville, with 204,731; Covington, with 42,938; Newport, with 28,301; and Lexington, with 26,369 inhabitants. Table 6 shows the population of these 4 cities at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, so far as the population is separately stated in the census report, together with the increase by number and per cent during each of the ten-year periods.

Of these 4 principal cities, Lexington is the oldest and was first enumerated separately in 1790 with 834 inhabitants; Louisville was first enumerated in 1800 with 359; Newport in 1810 with 413; and Covington in 1830 with 743. All of these cities have made satisfactory gains, but for the last ten years have all shown a diminishing numerical increase, except the city of Louisville, in which the increase in number has been 43,602, or 27.1 per cent, showing a total population in 1900 of 204,731. Covington, the second city in magnitude, with a present population of 42,938, has increased during the last decade 5,567 in number, or 14.9 per cent; Newport, with 28,301, has increased 3,383, or 13.6 per cent; and Lexington, with 26,369, has increased 4,802 in number, or 22.3 per cent.

# CENSUS BULLETIN.

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## POPULATION OF LOUISIANA BY PARISHES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Louisiana by parishes and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Louisiana was admitted as a state April 30, 1812. Table 1 shows the population of Louisiana at each census from 1810 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 1,381,625 as against 1,118,587 in 1890, representing an increase of 263,038, or 23.5 per cent. This is a little higher rate of increase than that for the decade from 1890, but a less rate than that for the decade from 1870 to 1880. The decennial period immediately preceding from 1860 to 1870, is noticeable as showing an increase in the population of only 2.7 per cent.

Louisiana had in 1810 a population of 76,556, and in the ten years following acquired 76,367 more, representing an increase of 99.8 per cent. Since then there has been a continuous and natural increase for each decade with the one exception noted.

The population of Louisiana in 1900 is more than eighteen times as large as the population given for 1810, at which census the territory subsequently constituting the state was separately enumerated as the "territory of Orleans."

The total land surface of Louisiana is, approximately, 45,420 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 24.6; 1900, 30.4.

Table 2 shows the population of Louisiana by parishes at each census from 1810 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each parish, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

There have been no territorial changes in the parishes of Louisiana since 1890.

Of the 59 parishes in the state all but 6 have increased in population during the decade, the parishes showing more than 50 per cent of increase being Acadia, 77.5 per cent; Vernon, 74.9 per cent; Sabine, 64.2 per cent; Grant, 56.0 per cent; St. Mary, 52.3 per cent; and Calcasieu, 50.8 per cent.

The 6 parishes showing a decrease in population are Claiborne, Concordia, East Carroll, Madison, Morehouse, and West Carroll.

Table 4 shows the population of Louisiana by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 104 incorporated cities, towns, and villages, 18 have more than 2,000 inhabitants, and of these, 11 have less than 5,000; 4 have more than 5,000 and less than 10,000; and 3 have more than 10,000. The cities having more than 10,000 inhabitants are New Orleans, with 287,104; Shreveport, with 16,013; and Baton Rouge, with 11,269.

New Orleans is the only city in Louisiana that has a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, and for this city a summary is presented in table 6, showing the population from 1810 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

According to this summary, New Orleans, beginning with a population of 17,242 in 1810, increased but little, compared with the early growth of other cities, for two decades, but from 1830 to 1840, the population of the city increased from 29,737 to 102,193, or 243.7 per cent. Since then the rate of increase has been relatively low, although in the decade from 1890 to 1900, it is somewhat greater than it has been in any decade since 1860.

## POPULATION OF MAINE BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Maine by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Maine was admitted as a state March 15, 1820. Table 1 shows the population of Maine at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 694,466 as compared with a population in 1890 of 661,086, showing an increase during the last ten years of 33,380, or 5.0 per cent. The population in 1790 was 96,540, and during the years from 1790 to 1800, it increased 55,179, or 57.2 per cent. This was a greater rate of increase than that of any decennial period afterwards. The percentage of increase declined continuously at each census (except that for 1860, when the population was found to be only 7.7 per cent greater than in 1850. From 1860 to 1870 a decrease in population was found, and for the succeeding two censuses only small percentages of gain. The increase during the last decade, though only 5.0 per cent, is larger than that for any ten-year period since 1860.

The present population of the state is more than seven times as large as that given for 1790, at which census the territory subsequently constituting the state was separately enumerated as the "district of Maine."

The total land surface of Maine is, approximately, 29,895 square miles, the average number of persons per square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 22.1; 1900, 23.2.



Table 2 shows the population of Maine by counties at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

There have been no territorial changes in the counties of Maine since 1890.

Of the 16 counties in the state all but 4 have increased in population during the decade, the counties showing the largest percentages of increase being Aroostook, 22.5; Androscoggin, 10.8; Cumberland, 10.7; and Franklin, 8.2 per cent.

The 4 counties showing a decrease are Hancock, Knox, Lincoln, and Waldo.

Table 4 shows the population of Maine by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 39 incorporated cities and villages 26 have more than 2,000 inhabitants, and of these 10 have less than 5,000; 9 have more than 5,000 and less than 10,000; 4 have more than 10,000 and less than 20,000; and 3 have more than 20,000, namely, Bangor, with 21,850; Lewiston, with 23,761; and Portland, with 50,145 inhabitants. Portland is the only city in Maine which has a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, and a summary is presented in table 6 showing the population of this city from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

According to this table, the population of Portland, beginning with 2,233 in 1790, increased steadily by material percentages of gain for each decade until 1870, when, for two decades, the increase for each was only about 7 per cent. During the ten years from 1890 to 1900, however, the increase in population has been very marked, being 13,720, or 37.7 per cent, which represents a greater growth than that of any other decade since 1830.

## POPULATION OF MARYLAND BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Maryland by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Maryland was one of the original thirteen states. Table 1 shows the population of Maryland at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 1,190,050 as compared with a population in 1890 of 1,042,390, showing an increase since 1890 of 147,660, or 14.2 per cent. This is both a greater numerical increase and rate of increase than that for the decade from 1880 to 1890, but less than both the absolute and proportional increase from 1870 to 1880. The growth of the state in population has been rather small and shows fluctuating percentages throughout the eleven decades for which census returns have been made. The largest rate of increase was 24.0 per cent for the ten years from 1840 to 1850, but this immediately followed a decade in which the increase was only 5.1 per cent, the lowest in the history of the state.

The population of Maryland in 1900 is more than three times as large as that given for 1790, the year in which the first census was taken.

The total land surface of Maryland is, approximately, 9,860 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 105.7; 1900, 120.7.

There have been no territorial changes in the counties of Maryland since 1890.

Of the 24 counties in the state all but 3 have increased in population during the decade, the counties showing the greatest percentages of gain being Allegany, 29.2 per cent; Baltimore, 24.5 per cent; Garrett, 24.5 per cent; and Charles, 20.6 per cent.

The 3 counties showing a decrease in population are, Cecil, Harford, and Queen Anne.

Table 4 shows the population of Maryland by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 98 incorporated places there are 18 that have a population in 1900 of more than 2,000, and of these, 11 have less than 5,000; 4 have more than 5,000 and less than 10,000; and 3 have more than 10,000, namely, Baltimore, with 508,957; Cumberland, with 17,128; and Hagerstown, with 13,591 inhabitants.

Baltimore is the only city in the state having a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, and for this city a summary is presented in table 6, showing its population from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, together with its increase by number and per cent for each of the ten-year periods.

From the foregoing summary it appears that the population of Baltimore in 1900 is 508,957, or 74,518 more than in 1890, which represents an increase during the decade of 17.2 per cent. This is materially less both in number and per cent than the increase for the preceding decade from 1880 to 1890; it is likewise a lower rate of increase than that for any preceding decade. The growth of the city has, however, from the first been in much greater ratio than that of the state, as appears from the fact that Baltimore had a population in 1790 of 13,503, while that of the state at the same census was more than twenty-three times as great; in 1900 nearly one-half of the population of the state is within the boundaries of the city.

## POPULATION OF MICHIGAN BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Michigan by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Michigan was organized as a territory June 30, 1805, and admitted as a state January 26, 1837. Table 1 shows the population of Michigan from 1810 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 2,420,982 as compared with a population in 1890 of 2,093,889, showing an increase since 1890 of 327,093, or 15.6 per cent. This increase both in number and per cent is materially less than that for any decade since 1860. The most noticeable rate of increase occurred in the decade from 1830 to 1840 when the population increased from 31,639 to 212,267, or 570.9 per cent. It was during this decade that the territory became a state. Viewed as a whole, the progress of the state as indicated by its growth in population has been strong and constant from the time the first census was taken of the territory in 1810.

The population of Michigan in 1900 is more than five hundred times as large as that given for 1810, the first year in which its population is given in the census report.

The total land surface of Michigan is, approximately, 57,480 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 36.5; 1900, 42.2.

Table 2 shows the population of Michigan by counties at each census from 1810 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

The following territorial changes in the counties of Michigan have been made since 1890: Part of Charlevoix has been annexed to Emmet; part of Manitou was annexed to Charlevoix in 1896; Dickinson was organized from parts of Iron, Marquette, and Menominee in 1891; parts of Marquette and Menominee have been annexed to Iron; Isle Royal was annexed to Keweenaw in 1897; and Manitou was absorbed by Charlevoix and Leelanaw in 1896.

Of the 83 counties in the state all but 20 have increased in population during the decade, the counties showing more than 50 per cent of increase being Alger, 374.0 per cent; Montmorency, 117.5 per cent; Iron, 102.8 per cent; Presque Isle, 88.2 per cent; Houghton, 86.7 per cent; Benzie, 84.9 per cent; Missaukee, 84.4 per cent; Emmet, 81.9 per cent; Chippewa, 77.5 per cent; Arenac, 72.8 per cent; Ontonagon, 65.0 per cent; Antrim, 59.1 per cent; Gladwin, 56.0 per cent; Delta, 55.8 per cent; and Grand Traverse, 53.3 per cent. Two of these, Emmet and Iron, have received accession of territory during the decade.

The 20 counties showing a decrease in population are Allegan, Barry, Cass, Clinton, Crawford, Eaton, Hillsdale, Iosco, Lake, Lapeer, Lenawee, Livingston, Mackinac, Menominee, Muskegon, Nawaygo, Oscoda, Roscommon, Saginaw, and St. Joseph. One of these, Menominee, has also suffered some loss in territory during the decade.

Table 4 shows the population of Michigan by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 382 incorporated places 87 have more than 2,000 inhabitants, and of these 46 have less than 5,000; 22 have more than 5,000 and less than 10,000; 12 have more than 10,000 and less than 20,000; 2 have more than 20,000 and less than 25,000; and 5 have more than 25,000, namely, Detroit, with 285,704; Grand Rapids, with 87,565; Saginaw, with 42,345; Bay City, with 27,628; and Jackson, with 25,180 inhabitants.

For the 5 cities which have a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, a summary is presented in table 6, showing their population from 1820 to 1900, inclusive, so far as it is separately stated in the census reports at each decennial period. Table 7, which immediately follows, shows for each city the increase or decrease in population by number and per cent during each of the ten-year periods.

From the foregoing tables it appears that Detroit was first enumerated in 1820, when its population was 1,422. In three decades it had increased to 21,019, and subsequently advanced rapidly to its present rank among cities with a population of 285,704. The numerical increase, as well as the percentage of increase, in the population of Detroit during the last decade is somewhat less than that for the ten years immediately preceding. Grand Rapids and Jackson first appeared in the census reports of 1850, with 2,686 and 2,363 inhabitants, respectively. During the last decade, Grand Rapids has increased in population from 60,278 to 87,565, or 45.3 per cent, which is the largest percentage of gain attained by any of the principal cities of Michigan during the last decade. Jackson has increased from 20,798 to 25,180, or 21.1 per cent. Both Bay City and Saginaw have suffered a slight loss in population since 1890.

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## POPULATION OF MINNESOTA BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Minnesota by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Minnesota was organized as a territory March 3, 1849, and admitted as a state May 11, 1858. Table 1 shows the population of Minnesota at each census from 1850 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 1,751,894 as compared with a population in 1890 of 1,301,826, showing an increase since 1890 of 449,568, or 34.5 per cent. A part of this increase is due to the fact that there were 8,208 Indians and 249 other persons, or a total of 8,457 persons, on Indian reservations, etc., in Minnesota, who were specially enumerated in 1890 under the provisions of the census act, but were not included in the general population of the state at that census. The increase of 34.5 per cent, though materially less than that of earlier decades, represents in fact a large accession to the population of a state which has been distinguished for its rapid growth throughout its brief history. Attention is particularly arrested by the influx of population to this territory during the decade from 1850 to 1860, when the number of inhabitants increased from 6,077 to 172,023, or 2,730.7 per cent.

The population of Minnesota in 1900 is more than 288 times as large as that given for 1850, the first census in which the population of the territory, now comprising the state, was enumerated.

The total land surface of Minnesota is, approximately, 79,205 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 16.4; 1900, 22.1.

Table 2 shows the population of Minnesota by counties at each census from 1850 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

The following territorial changes in the counties of Minnesota have been made since 1890: Red Lake organized from part of Polk; Roseau organized from part of Kittson; and parts of Cass annexed to Crow Wing and Hubbard.

All of the 82 counties in the state have increased in population during the decade, the counties showing more than 100 per cent of increase being Beltrami, 3,435.3 per cent; Cook, 726.5 per cent; Cass, 523.7 per cent; Itasca, 515.5 per cent; Hubbard, 365.9 per cent; Lake, 258.3 per cent; Kanabec, 192.2 per cent; Pine, 184.9 per cent; Millelacs, 183.5 per cent; and Aitkin, 173.9 per cent. There are also 24 counties which have increased in population more than 50 per cent but less than 100 per cent during the last ten years.

Table 4 shows the population of Minnesota by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 447 incorporated places, there are 53 which have a population in 1900 of over 2,000; and of these 35 have less than 5,000; 11 have more than 5,000 and less than 10,000; and 6 have more than 10,000, namely, Minneapolis, with 202,718; St. Paul, with 163,065; Duluth, with 52,969; Winona, with 19,714; Stillwater, with 12,818; and Mankato, with 10,599 inhabitants.

For the 3 cities with a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, a summary is presented in table 6, showing the population of these cities at each census from 1850 to 1900, inclusive, so far as it is separately stated in the census reports at each decennial period, together with the increase by number and per cent during each of the ten-year periods.

St. Paul first appeared in the census returns in 1850, with only 1,112 inhabitants; Minneapolis in 1860, with 2,564; and Duluth in 1870, with 3,131. Subsequently the increase in population of all these cities, both in number and per cent, has been conspicuously rapid for each succeeding decade until the last, except that Duluth made only a nominal gain from 1870 to 1880. During the ten years from 1880 to 1890, however, the city made a phenomenal gain, increasing from 3,483 to 33,115, or 850.8 per cent. Within the same decade the population of Minneapolis increased from 46,887 to 164,738, or 251.4 per cent, and that of St. Paul from 41,473 to 133,156, or 221.1 per cent. As compared with this record the increase in the population of these cities during the last decade, as shown by the enumeration for 1900, is so small as to afford a noticeable contrast.

## POPULATION OF MISSISSIPPI BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Mississippi by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Mississippi was organized as a territory April 7, 1798, and admitted as a state December 10, 1817. Table 1 shows the population of Mississippi at each census from 1800 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 1,551,270 as against 1,289,600 in 1890, representing an increase since 1890 of 261,670, or 20.8 per cent. This rate of increase is materially greater than that for the decade immediately preceding, which was 14.0 per cent, though much less than that for the ten years from 1870 to 1880, which was 36.7 per cent. Throughout the century a marked degree of fluctuation is observed in the growth of the state. In 1800 the population of the territory that afterwards became the state of Mississippi was 8,850; in 1820, three years after the territory became a state, the population was 75,448; the increase since then has been continuous, and the present population is more than 175 times as large as the population of one hundred years ago, when the first census was taken.

The total land surface of Mississippi is, approximately, 46,840 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 27.8; 1900, 33.5.

Table 2 shows the population of Mississippi by counties at each census from 1800 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

No territorial changes have been made in the counties of Mississippi since 1890.

Of the 75 counties in the state all but 3 have increased in population during the decade, the counties showing the largest percentages of increase being Pearl River, 126.5 per cent; Perry, 126.1 per cent; Jones, 114.2 per cent; Greene, 74.0 per cent; Sunflower, 71.4 per cent; Harrison, 68.3 per cent; Quitman, 65.4 per cent; and Covington, 57.6 per cent.

The 3 counties showing a decrease in population are Benton, Grenada, and Issaquena.

Table 4 shows the population of Mississippi by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 238 incorporated places there are 30 that have a population in 1900 of more than 2,000, but of these only 7 have a population in excess of 5,000, namely, Vicksburg, with 14,834; Meridian, with 14,050; Natchez, with 12,210; Jackson, with 7,816; Greenville, with 7,642; Columbus, with 6,484; and Biloxi, with 5,467 inhabitants.
