POPULATION OF MISSOURI BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Missouri by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Missouri was organized as a territory December 7, 1812, and admitted as a state August 10, 1821. Table 1 shows the population of Missouri at each census from 1810 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 3,106,665 as compared with a population in 1890 of 2,679,184, showing an increase since 1890 of 427,481, or 16.0 per cent. This is the lowest rate of increase which has appeared for any decade in the history of the state, and it is also observed that the rate of increase for each preceding decade (with one exception) has declined with substantial uniformity. The greatest numerical increase occurred in the decade from 1860 to 1870, in which period the population was augmented by 539,288. More than half a million was also added to the population of the state during the ten years from 1880 to 1890.

The population of Missouri in 1900 is more than 149 times as large as the population given in 1810, the first census in which the population of the territory now comprising the state of Missouri was reported separately.

The total land surface of Missouri is, approximately, 68,735 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 39.0; 1900, 45.2.

Table 2 shows the population of Missouri by counties at each census from 1810 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

There have been no territorial changes in the counties of Missouri since 1890.

Of the 115 counties in the state all but 20 have increased in population since 1890, the counties showing an increase of more than 50 per cent being Pemiscot, 102.8 per cent; Buchanan, 73.8 per cent; Jasper, 66.4 per cent; Butler, 65.0 per cent; and Ripley, 54.9 per cent.

The 20 counties showing a decrease in population are Audrain, Barton, Bates, Clay, Cooper, Dekalb, Grundy, Henry, Iron, Johnson, Knox, Monroe, Montgomery, Morgan, Pike, Platte, Ralls, Randolph, Saline, and Schuyler.

Table 4 shows the population of Missouri by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

There are 553 incorporated cities, towns, and villages in Missouri, for which the population in 1900 is separately returned, and these incorporated places are presented in table 5 in alphabetical order, being abstracted from table 4, in which they are presented in detail under the counties in which they are severally situated.

Of the above named 553 incorporated places there are 67 which have a population of more than 2,000; and of these 42 have less than 5,000; 18 have more than 5,000 and less than 10,000; 3 have more than 10,000 and less than 25,000; and 4 have more than 25,000, namely, St. Louis, with 575,238; Kansas City, with 163,752; St. Joseph, with 102,979; and Joplin, with 26,023 inhabitants.

For the 4 cities having a population in 1900 of more than 25,000 a summary is presented in table 6, showing the population of these cities from 1820 to 1900, inclusive, so far as it is separately stated in the census reports at each decennial period, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

According to the above summary the population of St. Louis, beginning with 10,049 in 1820, increased by moderate stages to 16,469 in 1840, then to 77,860 in 1850, then to 160,773 in 1860, and to 310,864 in 1870. Following these 3 decades of rapid progress the rate of increase was slight for the decade from 1870 to 1880, and since then has been normal for a city of its magnitude. Kansas City and St. Joseph each made its first appearance in the census report of 1860. At that census Kansas City had a population of 4,418, which in 1870 had increased to 32,260, or 630.2 per cent, and St. Joseph during the same interval increased in population from 8,932 to 19,565, or 119.0 per cent. During the next decade the greatest increase in population came to Kansas City when it was 137.9 per cent, and to St. Joseph during the decade from 1890 to 1900, when it was 96.8 per cent. The most conspicuous example of gain in population during the last decade is afforded by the city of Joplin, which had 9,943 inhabitants in 1890 and 26,023 in 1900, representing a gain of 161.7 per cent.

POPULATION OF MONTANA BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Montana by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Montana was organized as a territory May 26, 1864, and admitted as a state November 8, 1889. Table 1 shows the population of Montana at each census from 1870 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 243,329 as compared with a population in 1890 of 132,159, showing an increase during the decade of 111,170, or 84.1 per cent. A part of this increase is due to the fact that there were 10,346 Indians and 419 other persons, or a total of 10,765 persons, on Indian reservations, etc., in Montana, who were specially enumerated in 1890 under the provisions of the census act, but were not included in the general population of the state at that census. The population of the territory of Montana in 1870 was 20,595, and in 1880, 39,159, showing an increase of 18,564, or 90.1 per cent. During the following decade, from 1880 to 1890, in the last year of which the territory became a state, the population increased from 39,159 to 132,159, or 237.5 per cent. Although the numerical increase has been greater during the last decade than for any preceding one, the percentage of increase has declined.

The population of Montana in 1900 is more than eleven times as large as the population given for 1870, the first census taken after its organization as a territory in 1864.

The total land surface of Montana is, approximately, 145,310 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 0.9; 1900, 1.7.

Table 2 shows the population of Montana by counties at each census from 1870 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

The following territorial changes in the counties of Montana have been made since 1890: Flathead organized from part of Missoula in 1893; Granite organized from part of Deerlodge in 1893; Ravalli organized from part of Missoula in 1893; Teton organized from part of Choteau in 1893; Valley organized from part of Dawson in 1893; Carbon organized from parts of Park and Yellowstone in 1895; Sweet Grass organized from parts of Meagher, Park, and Yellowstone in 1895; Broadwater organized from parts of Jefferson and Meagher in 1897; parts of Deerlodge annexed to Flathead and Lewis and Clarke; and parts of Meagher annexed to Cascade and Lewis and Clarke.

From the foregoing it appears that 8 counties, namely, Broadwater, Carbon, Flathead, Granite, Ravalli, Sweet Grass, Teton, and Valley have been formed since 1890. Of the remaining 16 counties all but 3 have increased in population during the decade. The 3 that show a decrease in population, namely, Jefferson, Meagher, and Missoula, have also suffered material losses in territory.

Table 4 shows the population of Montana by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 26 incorporated places 15 have less and 11 have more than 2,000 inhabitants. Of the latter the 4 largest cities are Butte, with 30,470; Great Falls, with 14,930; Helena, with 10,770; and Anaconda, with 9,458 inhabitants.

Butte is the only city in Montana having a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, and for this city a summary is presented in table 6, showing its population from 1870 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

As shown by the above summary, Butte had a population of only 241 in 1870, which has since then increased to 30,470. Much the greater part of this growth has taken place during the last decade, the population having increased from 10,728 in 1890 to 30,470 in 1900, representing a numerical increase of 19,747, or more than one-half of the present population of the city.

POPULATION OF NEBRASKA BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Nebraska by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Nebraska was organized as a territory May 30, 1854, and admitted as a state March 1, 1867. Table 1 shows the population of Nebraska at each census from 1860 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 1,068,539 as against 1,058,910 in 1890, representing an increase since 1890 of 9,629, or 0.9 per cent. A portion of this increase is due to the fact that there were 3,538 Indians and 208 other persons, or a total of 3,746 persons, on Indian reservations, etc., in Nebraska, who were specially enumerated in 1890 under the provisions of the census act, but were not included in the general population of the state at that census. In 1860 the population of the territory which afterwards became the state of Nebraska was 28,841, and during the ten years from 1860 to 1870 it increased to 122,993, a gain of 326.5 per cent. In the first decade after Nebraska became a state, from 1870 to 1880, its population was increased by 329,409, and in the succeeding ten years, from 1880 to 1890, by 606,508, but at this point the rapid growth of the state in population came abruptly to an end. In 1900 the recorded population is only 9,629 more than that for 1890, and the rate of increase for the decade is only nine-tenths of 1 per cent.

The population of Nebraska in 1900 is more than thirty-seven times as large as that given for 1860, the first year in which the population appears in the census report.

The total land surface of Nebraska is, approximately, 76,840 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 13.8; 1900, 13.9.

Table 2 shows the population of Nebraska by counties at each census from 1860 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

The following territorial changes in the counties of Nebraska have been made since 1890: Boyd was organized from unorganized territory in 1891, although the population was returned in 1890, and Arthur was annexed to McPherson.

Of the 90 counties in the state 35 have decreased in population during the decade, but a few show large percentages of increase, namely, Boyd, 955.0 per cent; Thurston, 175.7 per cent; Cedar, 77.4 per cent; Pierce, 73.6 per cent; Knox, 67.1 per cent; Grant, 66.6 per cent; and Wayne, 59.9 per cent.

The counties showing a decrease in population are Adams, Banner, Blaine, Brown, Buffalo, Cass, Chase, Cheyenne, Clay, Custer, Dawes, Deuel, Douglas, Dundy, Fillmore, Gage, Hamilton, Hayes, Hitchcock, Holt, Keith, Keyapaha, Kimball, Lancaster, Logan, Loup, Otoe, Perkins, Polk, Rock, Saline, Seward, Sheridan, Sioux, and Wheeler.

Table 4 shows the population of Nebraska by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 365 incorporated places there are 27 which have more than 2,000 inhabitants, and of these 17 have less than 5,000, 7 have more than 5,000 but less than 10,000, and 3 have more than 25,000.

For the 3 cities which have a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, a summary is presented in table 6, showing the population of each from the first year in which it was separately stated in the census report, to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during each of the ten-year periods.

According to this summary, the census history of Omaha began in 1860, when it had a population of 1,883, which increased to 140,452 in 1890; that of Lincoln began in 1880, when it had a population of 13,003, which increased to 55,154 in 1890; and that of South Omaha began in 1890, when it had a population of 8,062, which increased to 26,001 in 1900. Both Omaha and Lincoln have suffered a loss in population during the last decade equivalent to 27 per cent of the population reported for those cities at the census of 1890.

POPULATION OF NEVADA BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of Nevada by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

Nevada was organized as a territory March 2, 1861, and admitted as a state October 31, 1864. Table 1 shows the population of Nevada at each census from 1860 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 42,335 as compared with a population in 1890 of 45,761, representing a decrease since 1890 of 3,426, or 7.5 per cent. There were in 1890, also, 1,557 Indians and 37 other persons, or a total of 1,594 persons, on Indian reservations, etc., who were specially enumerated under the provisions of the census act, but were not included in the general population of the state at that census. The population increased rapidly from 1860 to 1880, but during the two succeeding decades it decreased, and in 1900 the population shown is somewhat less than it was in 1870. It will be noticed, however, that the state has in 1900 more than six times as large a population as that given for 1860, the first census in which it appears.

The total land surface of Nevada is, approximately, 109,740 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 0.4; 1900, 0.4.

Table 2 shows the population of Nevada by counties at each census from 1860 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

There have been no territorial changes in the counties of Nevada since 1890.

Of the 14 counties in the state 7 have increased and 7 have decreased in population since 1890. The counties which show the largest rates of increase are Washoe, 42.0 per cent; Lincoln, 33.2 per cent; and Humboldt, 30.0 per cent.

The 7 counties showing a decrease in population are Douglas, Esmeralda, Eureka, Lander, Nye, Ormsby, and Storey.

Table 4 shows the population of Nevada by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.



POPULATION OF NEW JERSEY BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of New Jersey by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

New Jersey was one of the original thirteen states. Table 1 shows the population of New Jersey at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 1,883,669 as compared with a population in 1890 of 1,444,933, representing an increase during the decade of 438,736, or 30.4 per cent. This is a little higher rate of increase than that for the decade from 1880 to 1890, when it was 27.7 per cent, and a still greater rate of increase than that for the decade 1870 to 1880, when it was 24.8 per cent. The numerical increase for the last decade is also more than that for the decade from 1880 to 1890, and in fact more than that for any preceding ten-year period. It is observed that the increase of the state in population was relatively slow during the first half-century of its history, from 1790 to 1840, during that period its population was but little more than doubled, while in the subsequent sixty years its population has become more than five times as large as it was in 1840.

The population of New Jersey in 1900 is more than ten times as large as that given for 1790, the first year in which its population is given in the census report.

The total land surface of New Jersey is, approximately, 7,525 square miles, the average number of persons per square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 192.0; 1900, 250.3.

Table 2 shows the population of New Jersey by counties at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the years from 1890 to 1900.

The only territorial change which has been made in the counties of New Jersey since 1890 is the annexation of part of Burlington to Ocean.

Of the 21 counties in the state all but 2 have increased in population during the decade, the counties showing the largest percentages of increase being Bergen, 66.1 per cent; Atlantic, 60.9 per cent; Passaic, 47.7 per cent; Hudson, 40.3 per cent; and Essex, 40.2 per cent.

The 2 counties showing a decrease in population are Burlington and Hunterdon.

Table 4 shows the population of New Jersey by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 190 incorporated places 72 have more than 2,000 inhabitants in 1900: of these 32 have less than 5,000; 16 have more than 5,000 and less than 10,000; 10 have more than 10,000 and less than 20,000; 4 have more than 20,000 and less than 25,000; and 10 have more than 25,000, namely, Newark, with 246,070; Jersey City, with 206,433; Paterson, with 105,171; Camden, with 75,935; Trenton, with 73,807; Hoboken, with 59,864; Elizabeth, with 52,130; Bayonne, with 32,722; Atlantic City, with 27,838; and Passaic, with 27,777 inhabitants.

For the 10 cities which have a population in 1900 of more than 25,000, a summary is presented in table 6, showing the population of each from the first year in which it was separately stated in the census report, to 1900, inclusive. Table 7, which immediately follows, shows, for each city, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during each of the ten-year periods.

Of the foregoing 10 principal cities of New Jersey, Elizabeth, Newark, and Trenton are the oldest in the census records, having been first enumerated in 1820. Twenty years later, in 1840, Camden, Jersey City, and Paterson first appeared as separately enumerated. Atlantic City had only 687 inhabitants in 1860, and the first census returns were made for Passaic in 1880, when it had a population of 6,532. All these cities have increased materially in population during the last decade, and Atlantic City and Passaic have more than doubled their population. Bayonne, which was first enumerated in 1870, with 3,834 inhabitants, has, during the last ten years, increased in population from 19,033 to 32,722, or 71.9 per cent.

POPULATION OF NEW MEXICO BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of New Mexico by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

New Mexico was organized as a territory December 13, 1850. Table 1 shows the population of New Mexico at each census from 1850 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the territory in 1900 is 195,310 as compared with a population in 1890 of 153,593, showing an increase during the decade of 41,717, or 27.2 per cent. A part of this increase is due to the fact that there were 6,490 Indians and 199 other persons, or a total of 6,689 persons, on Indian reservations, etc., in New Mexico, who were specially enumerated in 1890 under the provisions of the census act, but were not included in the general population of the territory at that census. The population of the territory, as shown by the census of 1850, taken during the year in which the territory was organized, was 61,547, and since then it has increased, though by rather small percentages as compared with other territories, for each succeeding decade, except for that from 1860 to 1870, when a slight decrease was reported.

The population of New Mexico in 1900 is more than three times as large as the population given for 1850, the first census in which the population of the territory appears.

The total land surface of New Mexico is; approximately, 122,460 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 1.3; 1900, 1.6.

Table 2 shows the population of New Mexico by counties at each census from 1850 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

The following territorial changes in the counties of New Mexico have been made since 1890: Chaves and Eddy organized from part of Lincoln in 1891; Guadalupe organized from parts of Lincoln and San Miguel in 1891; Union organized from parts of Colfax, Mora, and San Miguel in 1893; Otero organized from parts of Donna Ana, Lincoln, and Socorro in 1899; and part of Santa Fe annexed to Bernalillo.

As above stated, 5 counties, namely, Chaves, Eddy, Guadalupe, Otero, and Union have been formed since 1890. Of the remaining 14 counties all but 4 have increased in population since 1890, the counties showing the largest percentages of increase being San Juan, 155.4 per cent; Bernalillo, 36.9 per cent; Grant, 33.4 per cent; Colfax, 27.3 per cent; and Socorro, 27.1 per cent.

The 4 counties showing a decrease in population are Lincoln, Mora, San Miguel, and Sierra; of these, Lincoln and San Miguel have suffered material losses of territory.

Table 4 shows the population of New Mexico by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

POPULATION OF NEW YORK BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of New York by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

New York was one of the original thirteen states. Table 1 shows the population of New York at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 7,268,012 as compared with a population in 1890 of 5,997,853, representing an increase during the ten years of 1,270,159, or 21.2 per cent. A small portion of this increase is due to the fact that there were 5,318 Indians and 3 other persons, or a total of 5,321 persons, on Indian reservations, etc., in New York, who were specially enumerated in 1890 under the provisions of the census act, but were not included in the general population of the state at that census. The numerical increase in the population of New York has been greater during the last decade than in any former ten-year period, and the percentage of increase has been greater than at any census since 1860. In 1790 the population of the state was 340,120, and at each succeeding census there has been a marked numerical increase.

The present population of the state is more than 21 times as large as the population reported at the first census in 1790.

The total land surface of New York is, approximately, 47,620 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 126.0; 1900, 152.6.

Table 2 shows the population of New York by counties at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

The following territorial changes have been made in the counties of New York since 1890: Nassau organized from part of Queens and part of Westchester annexed to New York.

Of the 61 counties in the state 38 have increased in population since 1890, the counties showing the largest percentages of increase being Schenectady, 57.2 per cent; Kings, 39.1 per cent; New York, 35.3 per cent; Erie, 34.3 per cent; Richmond, 29.7 per cent; and Westchester, 24.9 per cent.

The 22 counties showing a decrease in population since 1890 are Allegany, Chenango, Columbia, Cortland, Essex, Greene, Lewis, Livingston, Madison, Orleans, Oswego, Otsego, Putnam, Rensselaer, Schoharie, Schuyler, Seneca, Tioga, Washington, Wayne, Wyoming, and Yates.

Table 4 shows the population of New York by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.

Of the above named 460 incorporated places 156 have a population in 1900 of more than 2,000: of these 90 have less than 5,000 inhabitants; 26 have more than 5,000 but less than 10,000; 19 have more than 10,000 but less than 20,000; 9 have more than 20,000 but less than 25,000; and 12 have more than 25,000, namely, New York, with 3,437,202; Buffalo, with 352,387; Rochester, with 162,608; Syracuse, with 108,374; Albany, with 94,151; Troy, with 60,651; Utica, with 56,383; Yonkers, with 47,931; Binghamton, with 39,647; Elmira, with 35,672; Schenectady, with 31,682; and Auburn, with 30,345 inhabitants.

Table 6 gives for each of the 12 cities having upwards of 25,000 inhabitants in 1900, the population at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, so far as it is separately stated in the census report at each decennial period. Table 7, which immediately follows, shows for each city the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during each of the ten-year periods.

All the above named cities show a satisfactory increase in population since 1890, except Albany and Troy, in which there have been slight decreases.

The city of New York, as constituted prior to the act of consolidation which became effective January 1, 1898, had a population in 1890 of 1,515,301 as compared with a population in 1900 of 3,437,202, showing an apparent increase of 1,921,901, or 126.8 per cent.

In 1890 the city comprised all of what is now the borough of Manhattan and the greater part of what is now the borough of Bronx, but under the act of consolidation above referred to, Kings county, Richmond county, the larger part of Queens county, and a small part of Westchester county became a part of the city.

Manhattan borough comprises all that part of the old city of New York lying to the south of the Harlem river, this area being known formerly as Manhattan Island.

Bronx borough was formed from that part of the old city of New York lying to the north of the Harlem river and the small part of Westchester county annexed under the act of consolidation. All of this area was at one time a part of Westchester county, but in 1873 the towns of Morrisania, West Farms, and Kings Bridge were annexed to New York, and under the act which took effect January 1, 1898, all of the town of Westchester and parts of the towns of Eastchester and Pelham became a part of the city.

Under an act of the legislature the towns of Flatbush, Flatlands, Gravesend, and New Utrecht were absorbed by the city of Brooklyn in 1894, the town of Flatbush becoming the twenty-ninth ward, the town of New Utrecht the thirtieth ward, the town of Gravesend the thirty-first ward, and the town of Flatlands the thirty-second ward of the city. The city thus became coextensive with Kings county, and on January 1, 1898, the city of Brooklyn became the borough of Brooklyn, one of the five boroughs of what is now the city of New York.

Richmond county, or what is commonly known as Staten Island, under the provisions of the same act, became the borough of Richmond.

Queens borough was organized at the same time from what was Long Island City, the towns of Flushing, Jamaica, and Newtown, and a small portion of the town of Hempstead, all of which were civil divisions of Queens county. The remaining towns of the county, Oyster Bay and North Hempstead, together with the greater part of the town of Hempstead, were taken to form the new county of Nassau. The first ward of Queens borough comprises what was formerly Long Island City, the second ward what was formerly Newtown town, the third ward what was formerly Flushing town, the fourth ward what was formerly Jamaica town, and the fifth ward that part of the town of Hempstead now within the limits of the borough of Queens.

It is impossible to state definitely the population in 1890 of that part of the town of Hempstead, Queens county, which became a part of Queens borough, and of the parts of the towns of Eastchester and Pelham, Westchester county, which became a part of Bronx borough, but the following table shows the estimated population for the city of New York, as now constituted, and in detail for each borough of the city, from 1790 to 1900:

The preceding table shows that the area comprised within the present limits of the city of New York had an estimated population of 49,401 in 1790, which had grown to 696,115 in 1850, representing an increase of 646,714, or 1,309.1 per cent. The population of the present city of New York had grown to 2,507,414 in 1890, or an increase since 1850 of 1,811,299, or 260.2 per cent. Since 1890 there has been an increase of 929,788, or 37.1 per cent, the population in 1900 being 3,437,202.

POPULATION OF NORTH CAROLINA BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS.

This bulletin, prepared under the direction of Mr. WILLIAM C. HUNT, chief statistician for population, gives the aggregate population of North Carolina by counties and minor civil divisions, according to the official count of the returns of the Twelfth Census, taken as of June 1, 1900.

North Carolina was one of the original thirteen states. Table 1 shows the population of North Carolina at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, together with the increase by number and per cent during each decade.

The population of the state in 1900 is 1,893,810 as against 1,617,947 in 1890, representing an increase since 1890 of 275,863, or 17.1 per cent. This rate of increase is somewhat greater than that for the decade from 1880 to 1890, when it was 15.6 per cent, but is little more than half that for the decade from 1870 to 1880, when it was 30.7 per cent. North Carolina had a population at the first census, in 1790, of 393,751, and has shown an increase at each succeeding census, though by a rather small percentage.

The population of North Carolina in 1900 is nearly five times as large as the population given for 1790, when the first census of the state was taken.

The total land surface of North Carolina is, approximately, 48,580 square miles, the average number of persons to the square mile at the censuses of 1890 and 1900 being as follows: 1890, 33.3; 1900, 39.0.

Table 2 shows the population of North Carolina by counties at each census from 1790 to 1900, inclusive, while table 3, which immediately follows, shows, for each county, the increase (or decrease) by number and per cent during the ten years from 1890 to 1900.

But one territorial change has been made in the counties of North Carolina since 1890, namely, Scotland organized from part of Richmond.

Of the 97 counties in the state all but 10 have increased in population during the decade, the counties showing the largest percentages of increase being Gaston, 57.1 per cent; Durham, 45.4 per cent; Alamance, 40.5 per cent; Guilford, 39.3 per cent; Rutherford, 33.7 per cent; Surry, 32.3 per cent; Graham, 31.1 per cent; Rockingham, 30.8 per cent; Mecklenburg, 29.5 per cent; Rowan, 28.8 per cent; and Robeson, 28.2 per cent.

The 10 counties showing a decrease in population are Camden, Caswell, Chatham, Currituck, Granville, Northampton, Orange, Richmond, Vance, and Warren.

Table 4 shows the population of North Carolina by minor civil divisions, so far as it was separately returned at the censuses of 1890 and 1900.
