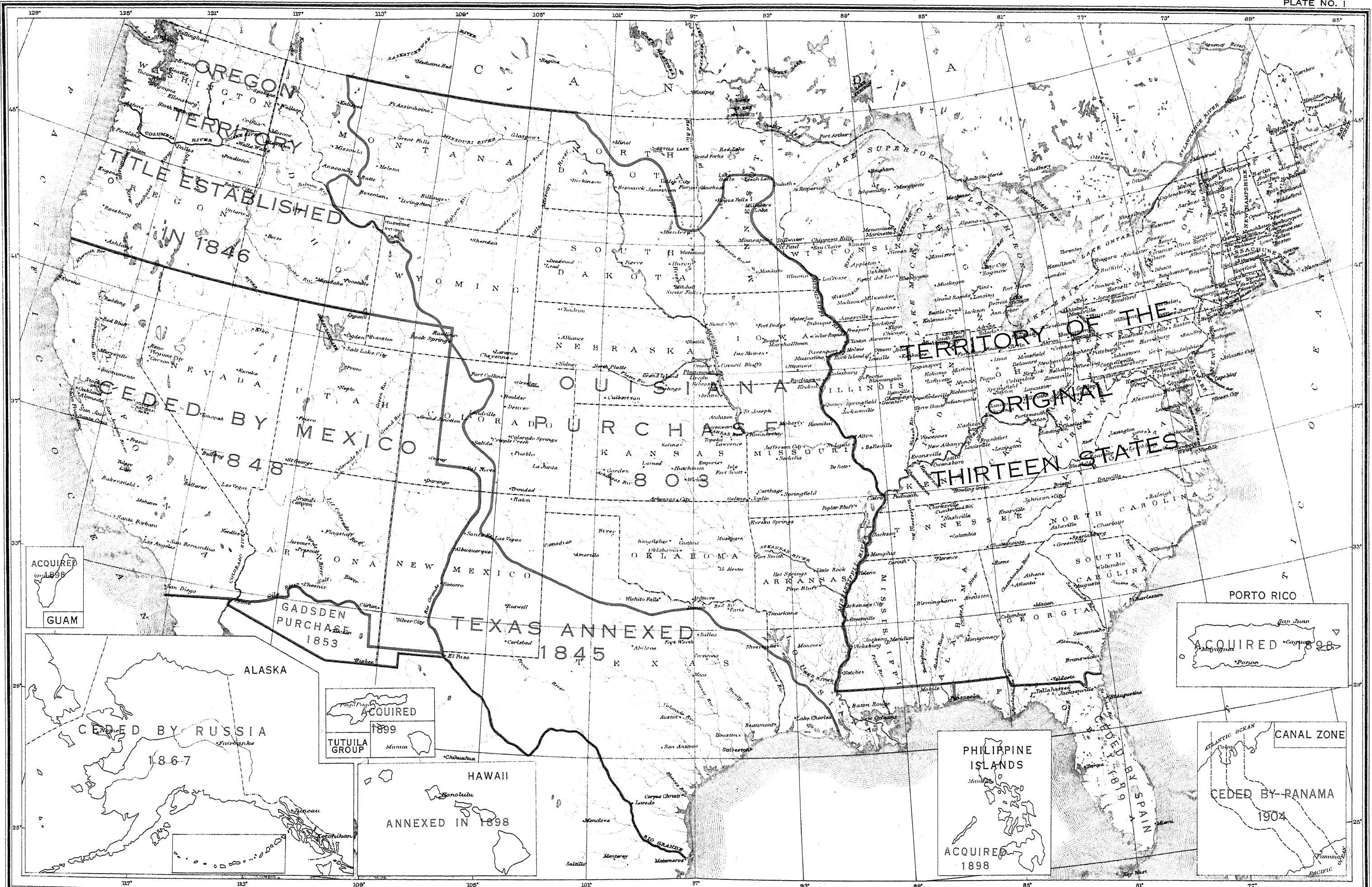

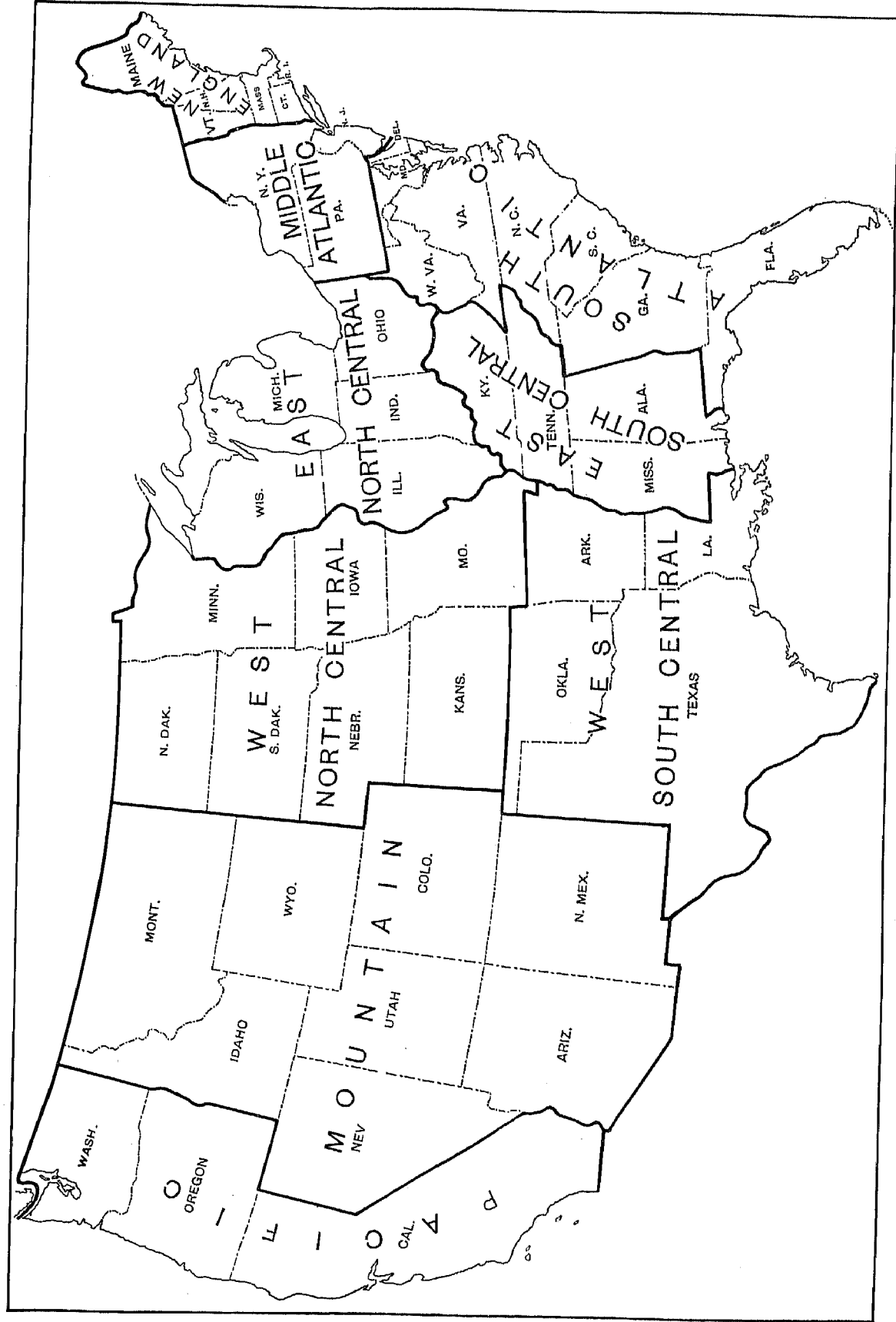

UNITED STATES, ORIGINAL AREA AND ACQUISITIONS OF TERRITORY, 1790 TO 1910



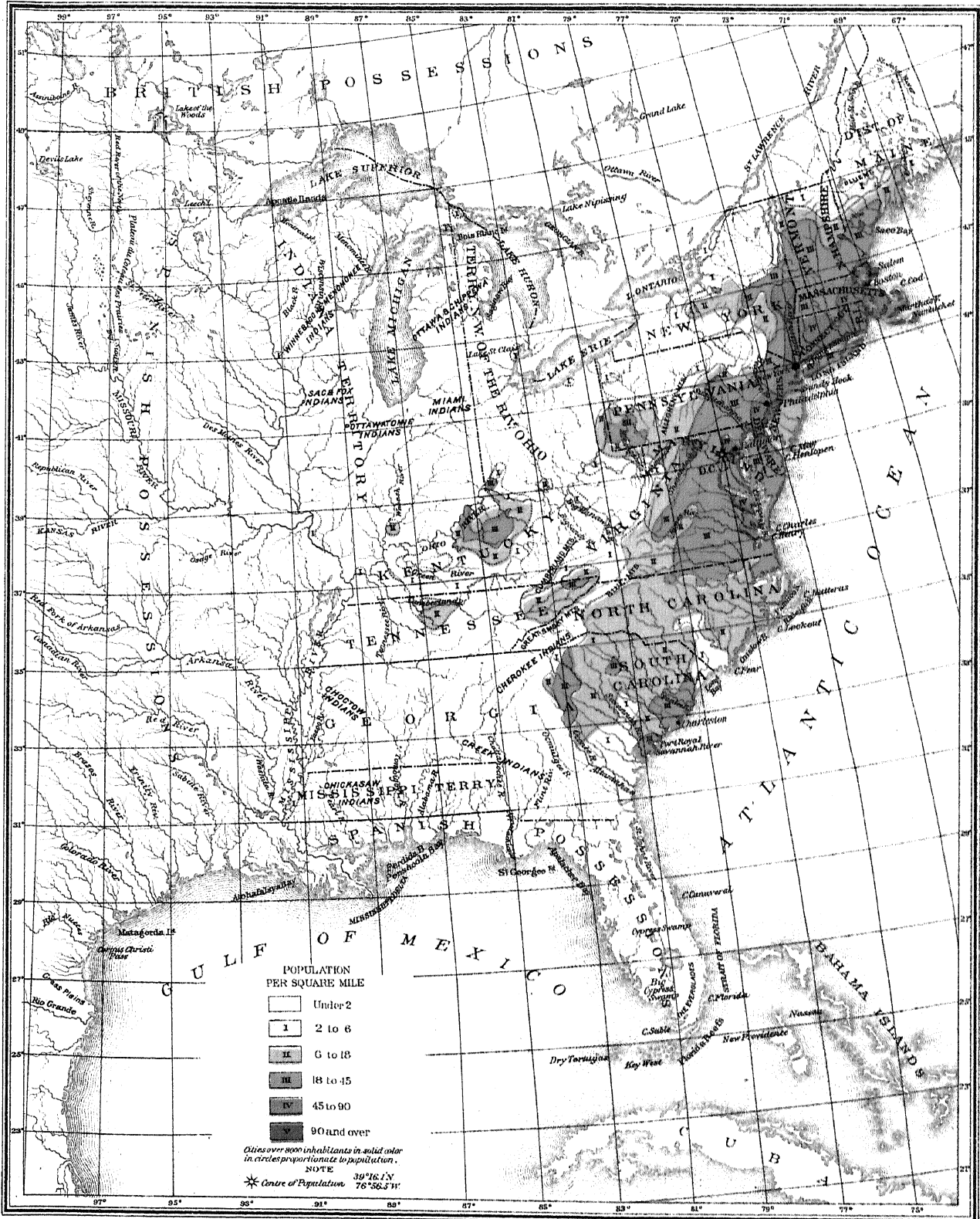

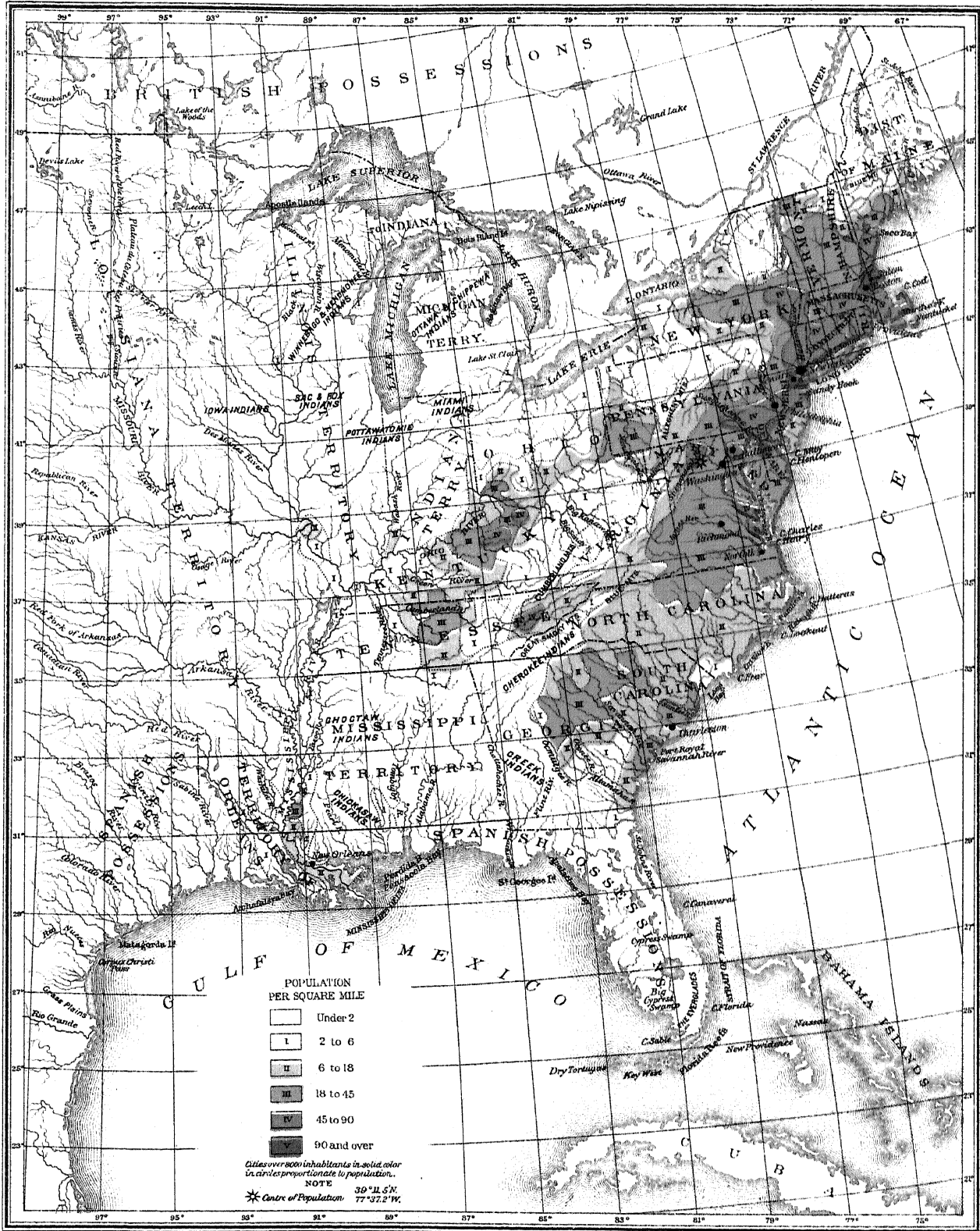
DISTRIBUTION OF THE RURAL POPULATION: 1790.
 (OUTSIDE OF MUNICIPALITIES HAVING 8,000 OR MORE INHABITANTS.)



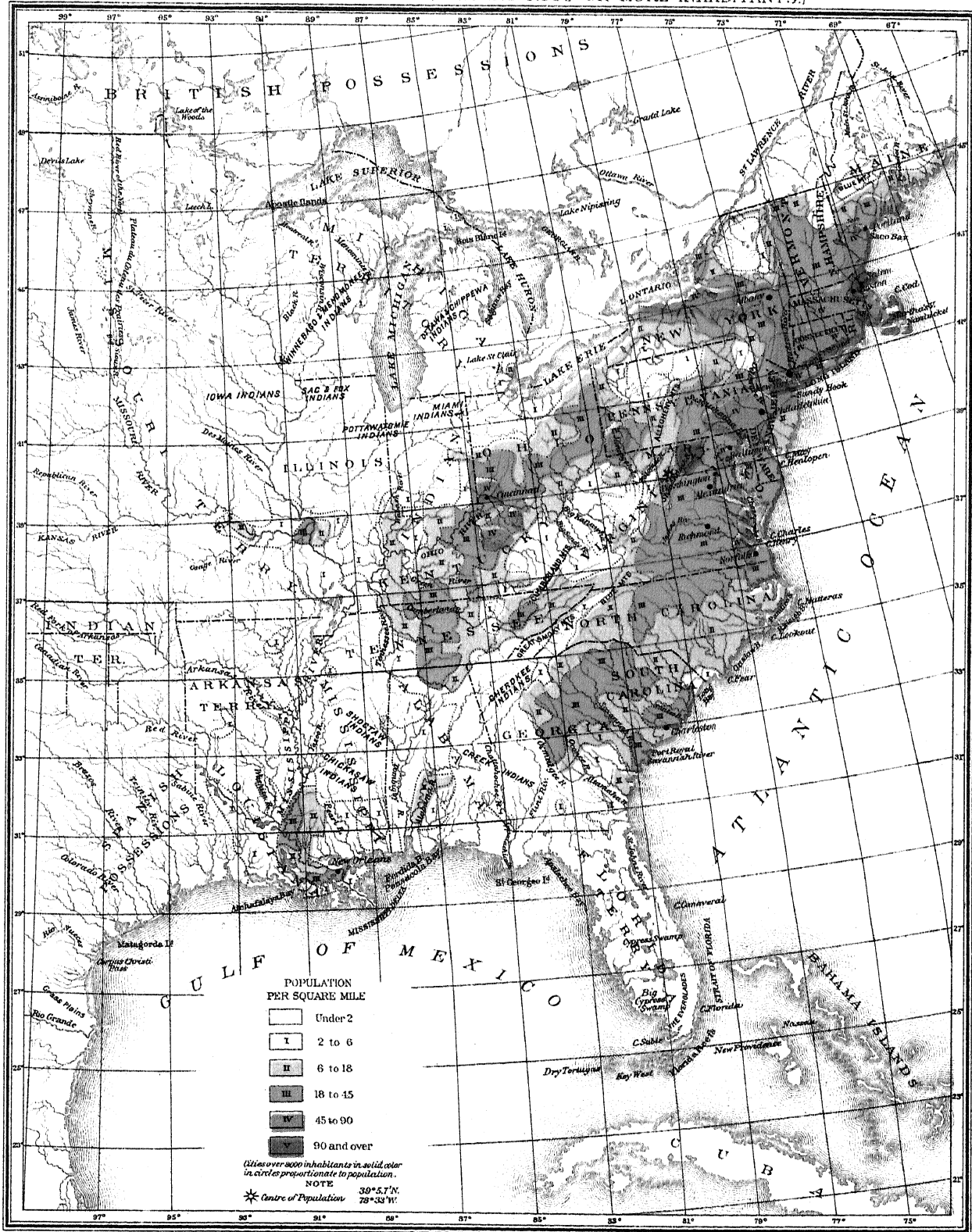
DISTRIBUTION OF THE RURAL POPULATION: 1800.
(OUTSIDE OF MUNICIPALITIES HAVING 8,000 OR MORE INHABITANTS.)



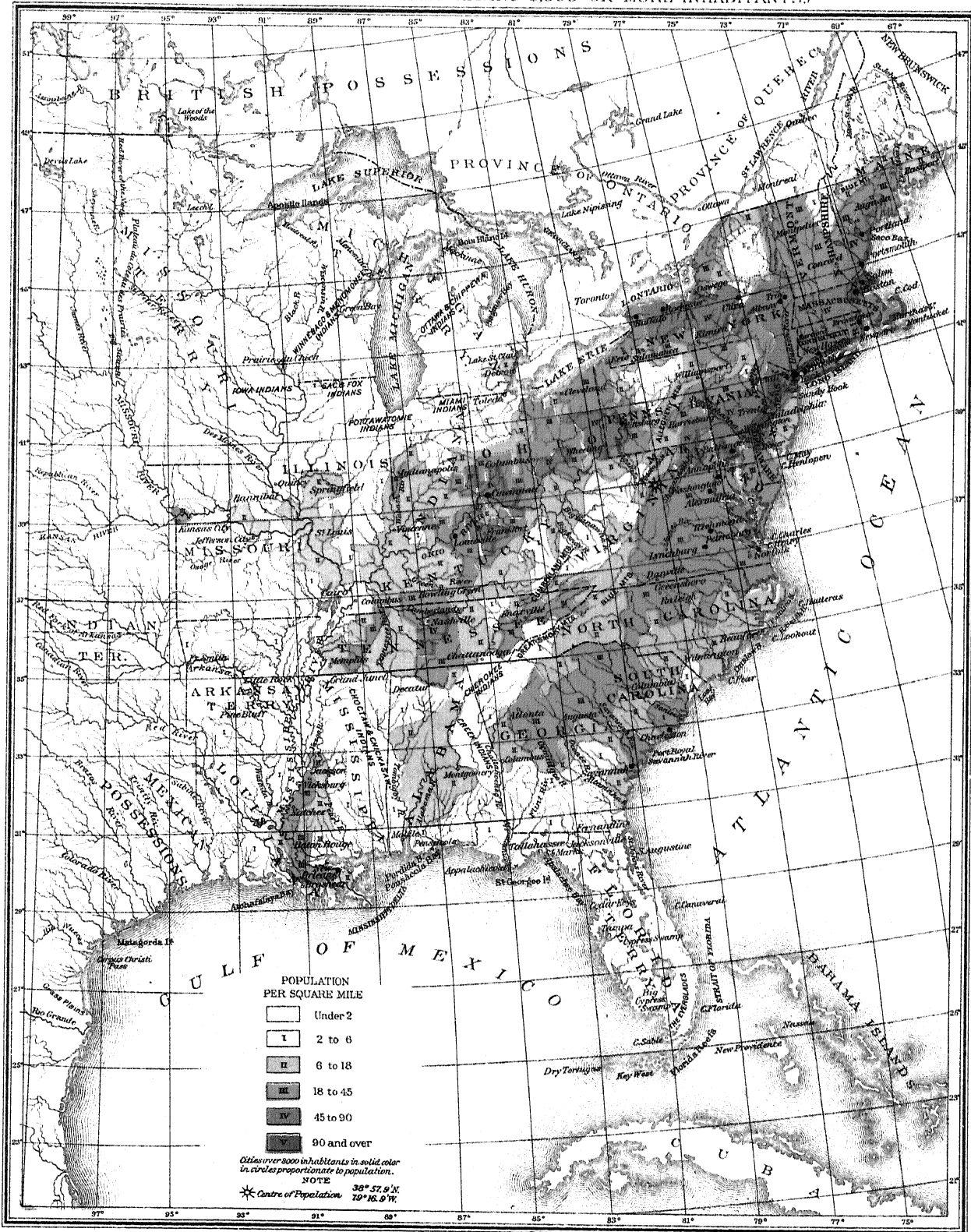
DISTRIBUTION OF THE RURAL POPULATION EAST OF THE 100TH MERIDIAN: 1810.
 (OUTSIDE OF MUNICIPALITIES HAVING 8,000 OR MORE INHABITANTS.)



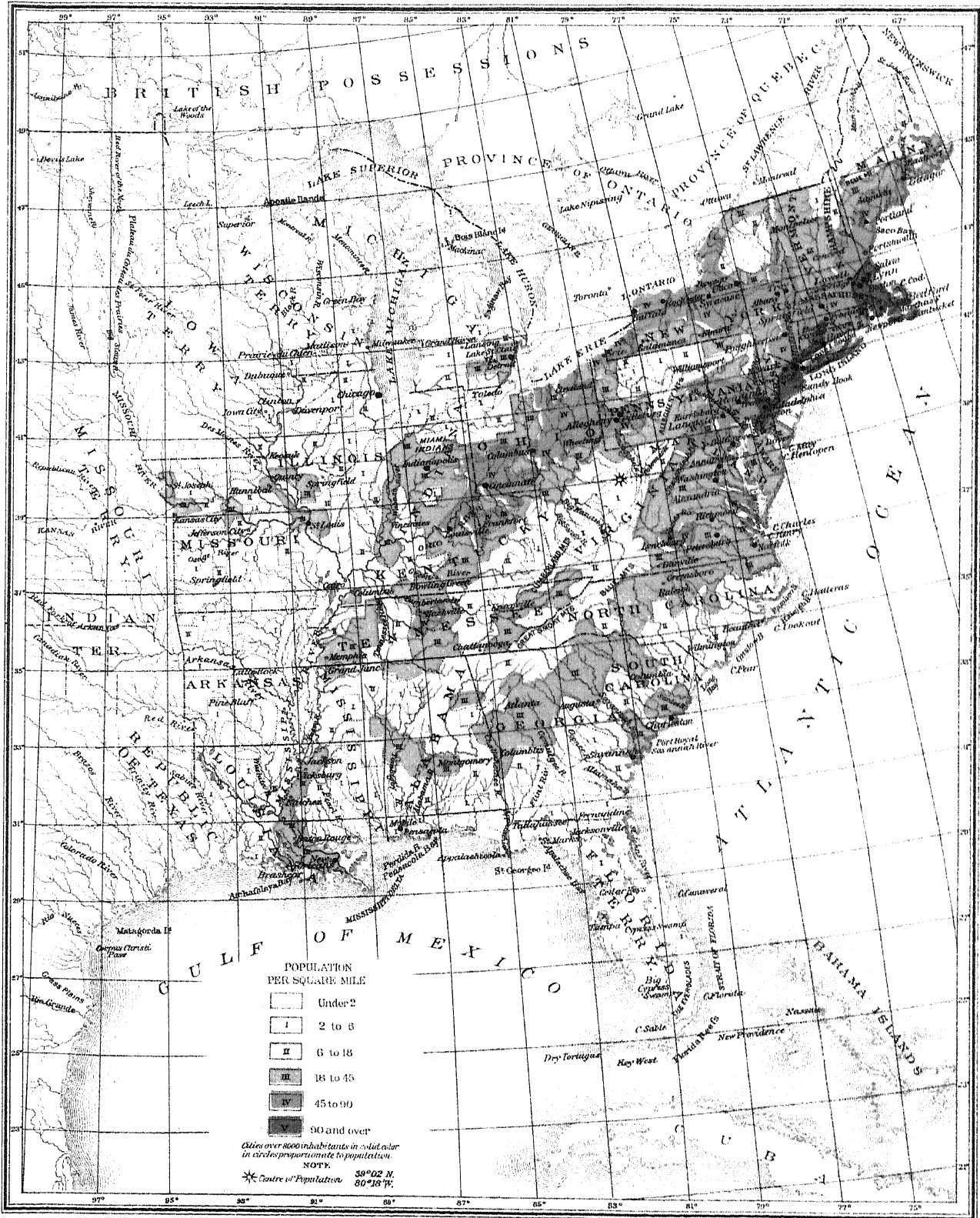
DISTRIBUTION OF THE RURAL POPULATION EAST OF THE 100TH MERIDIAN: 1820.

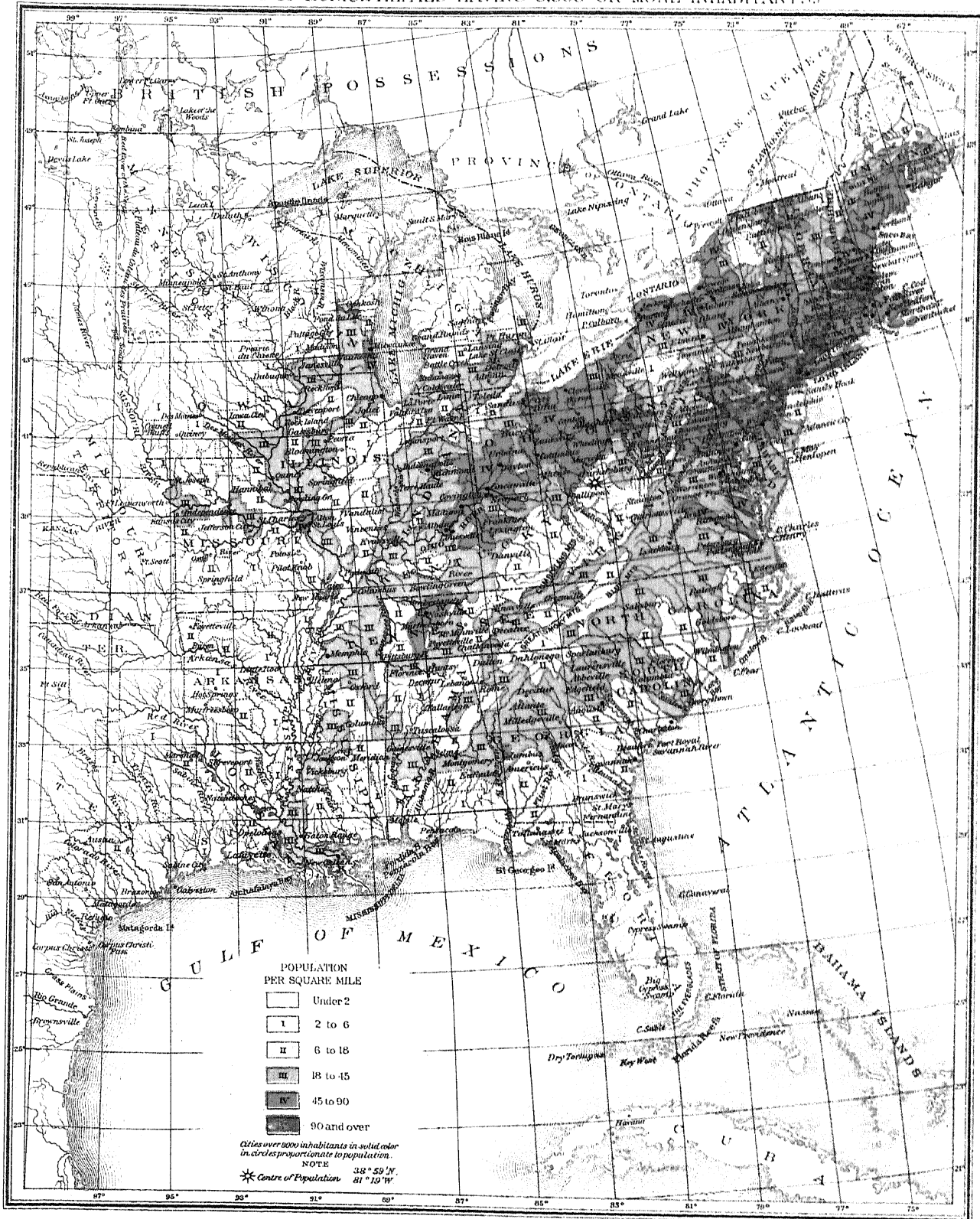
DISTRIBUTION OF THE RURAL POPULATION EAST OF THE 100TH MERIDIAN: 1830.
(OUTSIDE OF MUNICIPALITIES HAVING 8,000 OR MORE INHABITANTS.)



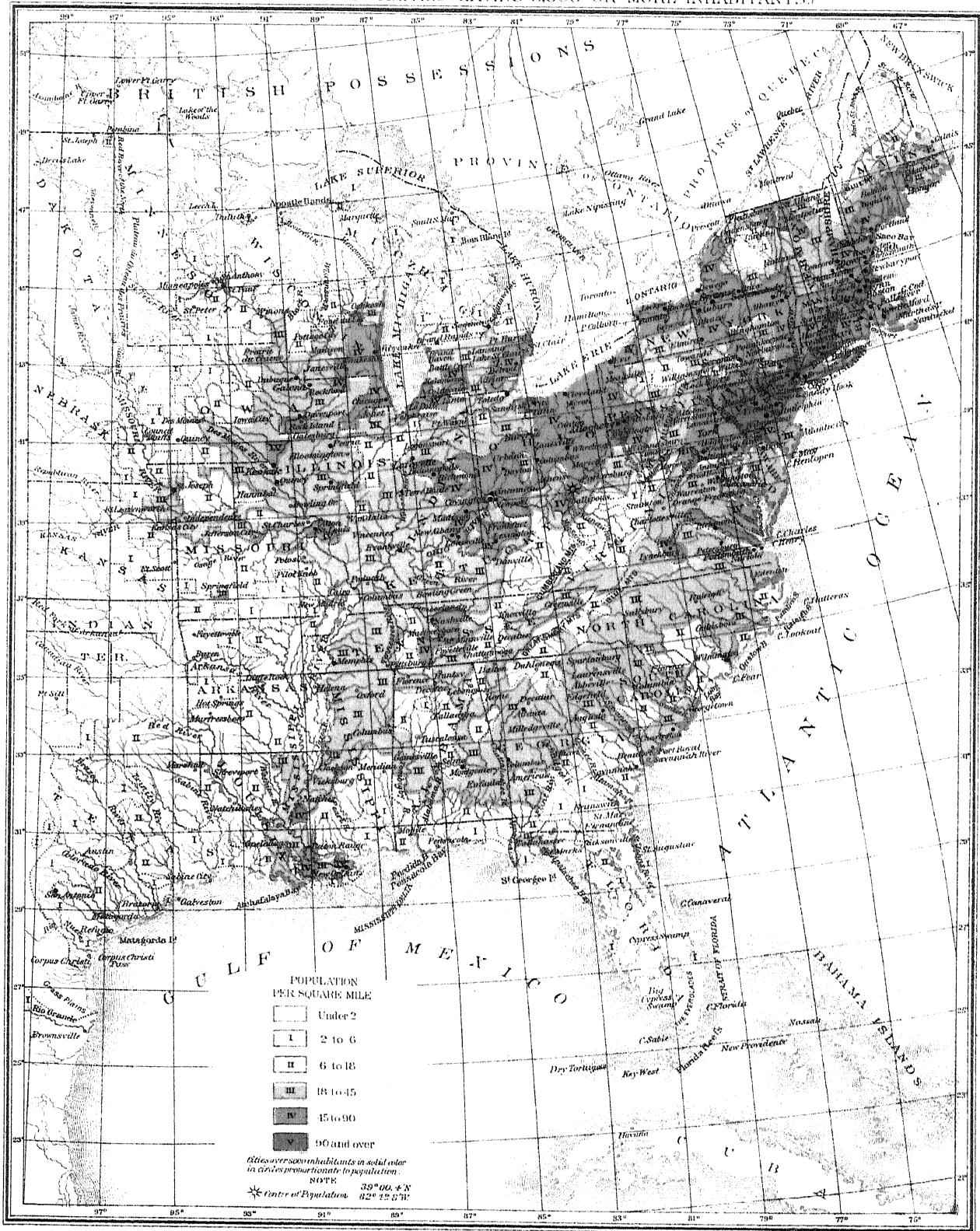
DISTRIBUTION OF THE RURAL POPULATION EAST OF THE 100TH MERIDIAN: 1840.

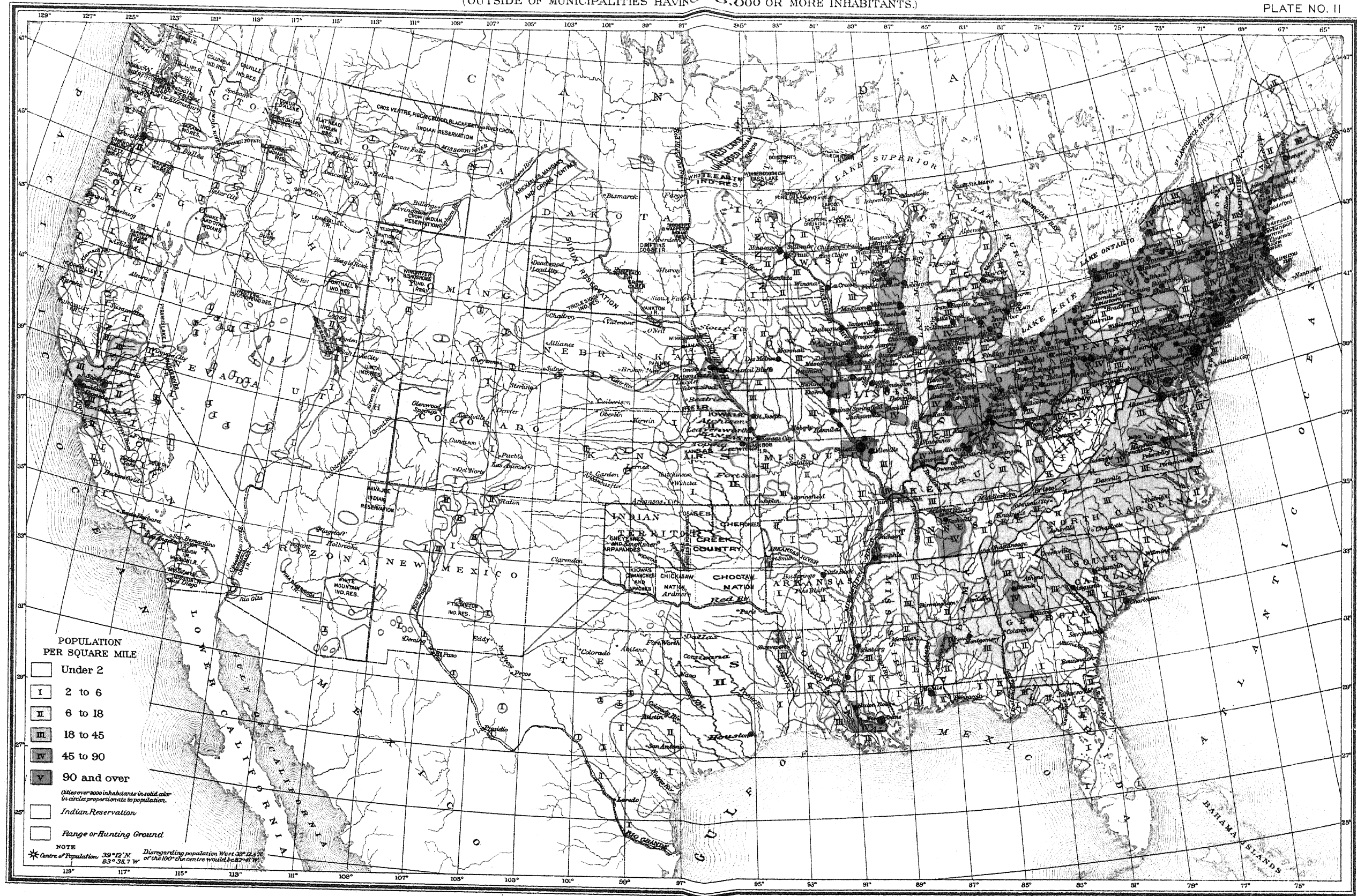


DISTRIBUTION OF THE RURAL POPULATION EAST OF THE 100TH MERIDIAN: 1860.
 (OUTSIDE OF MUNICIPALITIES HAVING 8,000 OR MORE INHABITANTS.)

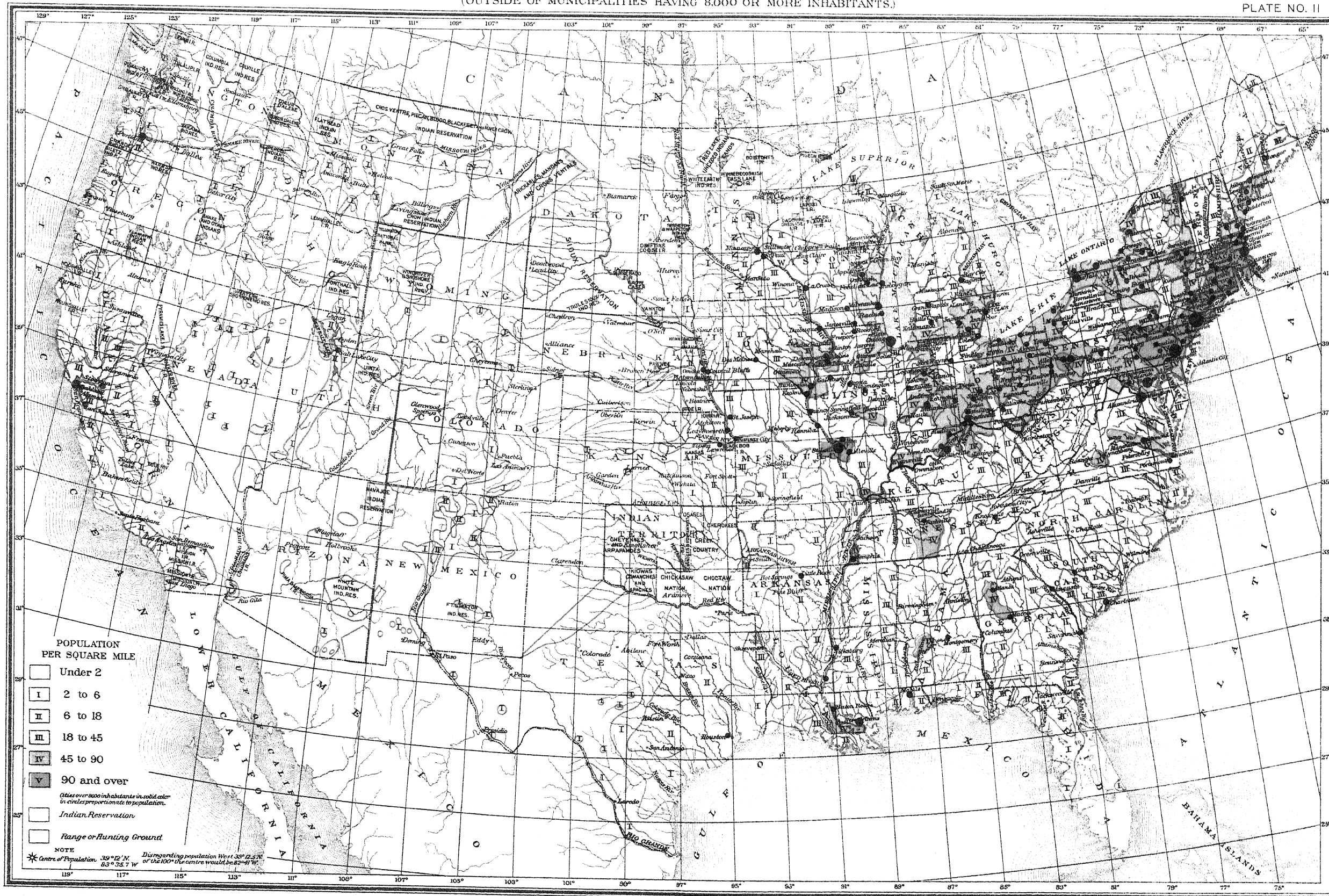


DISTRIBUTION OF THE RURAL POPULATION (EXCLUDING INDIANS NOT TAXED): 1870.

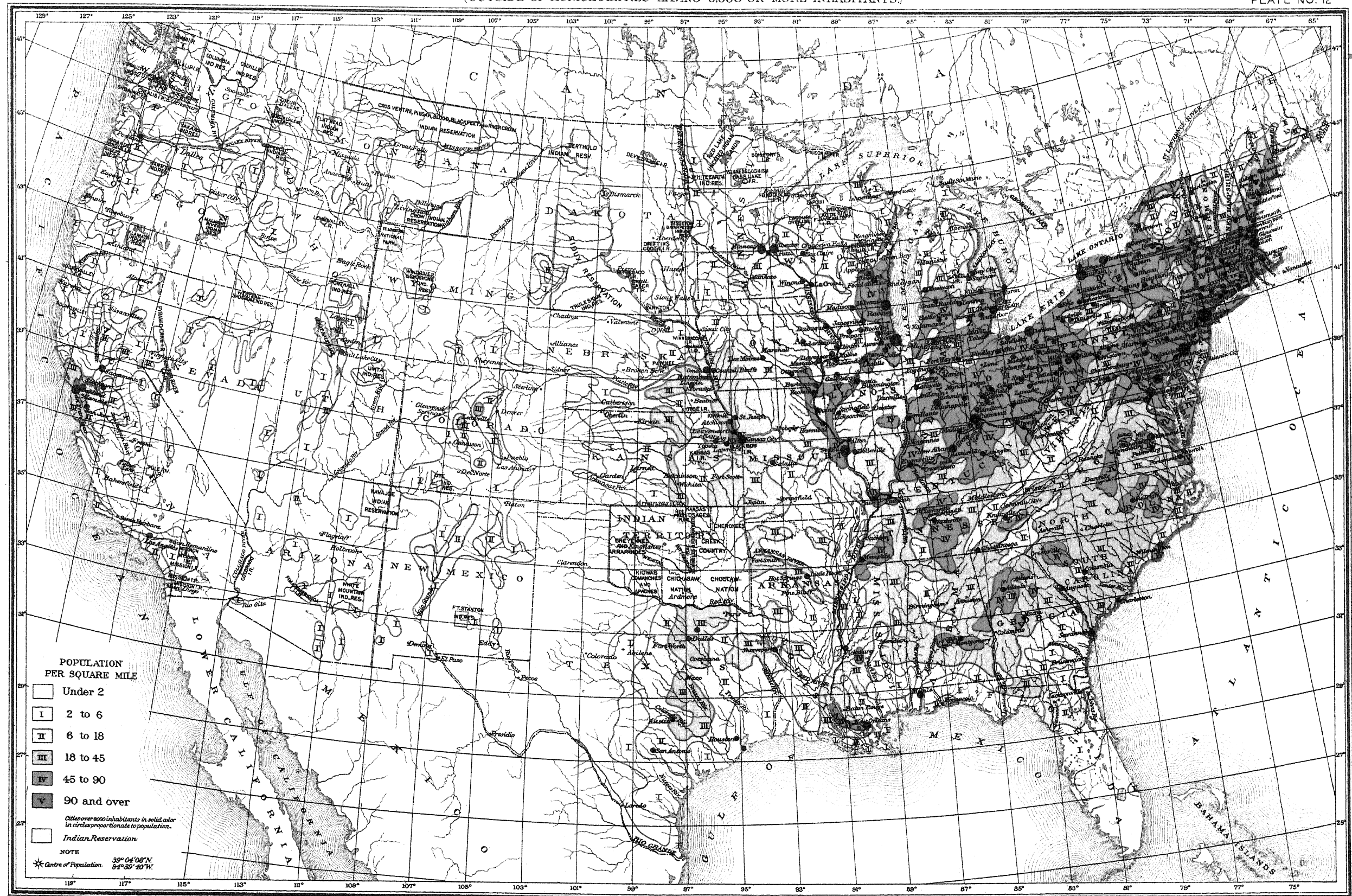


DISTRIBUTION OF THE RURAL POPULATION (EXCLUDING INDIANS NOT TAXED): 1870.
 (OUTSIDE OF MUNICIPALITIES HAVING 8,000 OR MORE INHABITANTS.)

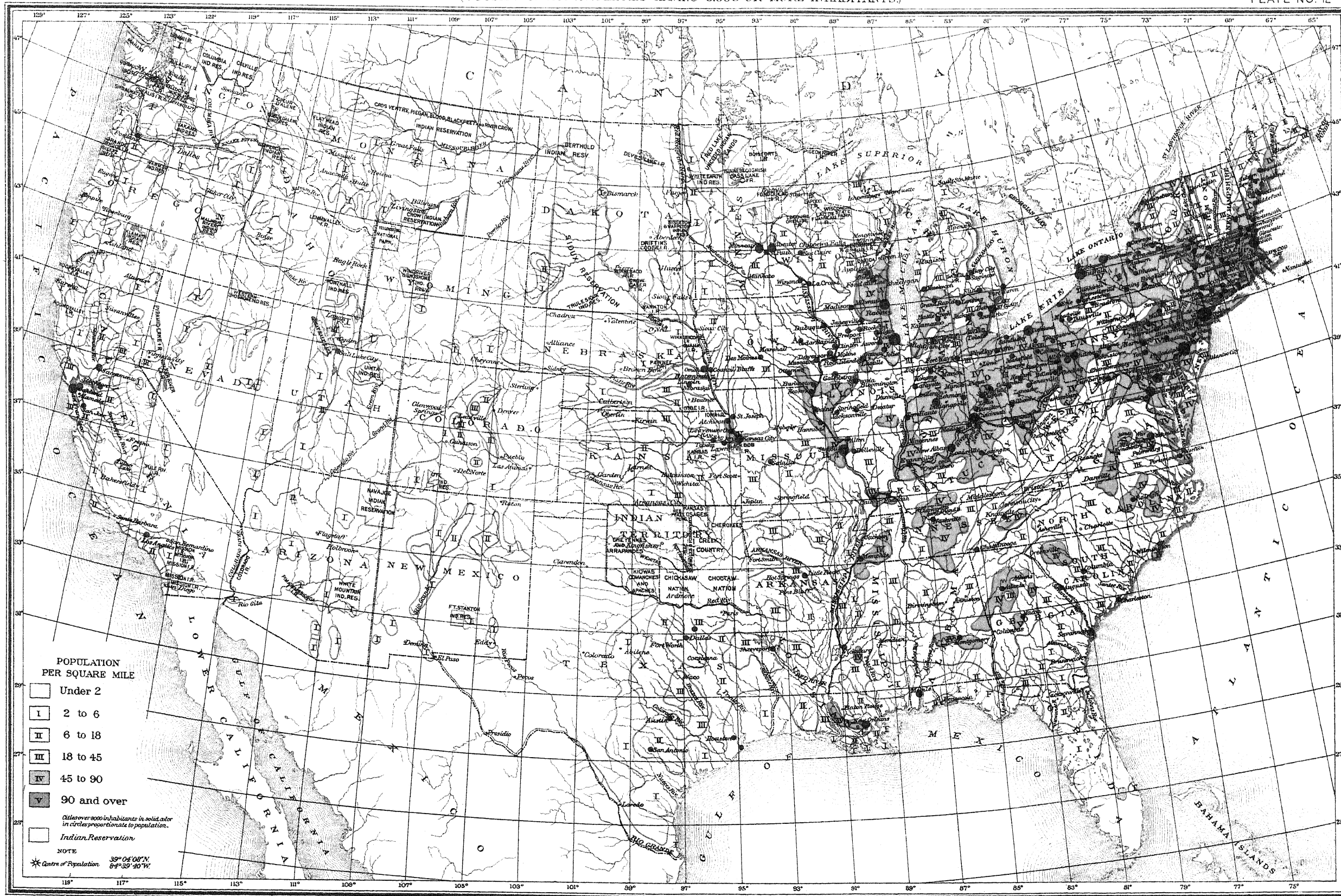


DISTRIBUTION OF THE RURAL POPULATION (EXCLUDING INDIANS NOT TAXED): 1880.
 (OUTSIDE OF MUNICIPALITIES HAVING 8,000 OR MORE INHABITANTS.)

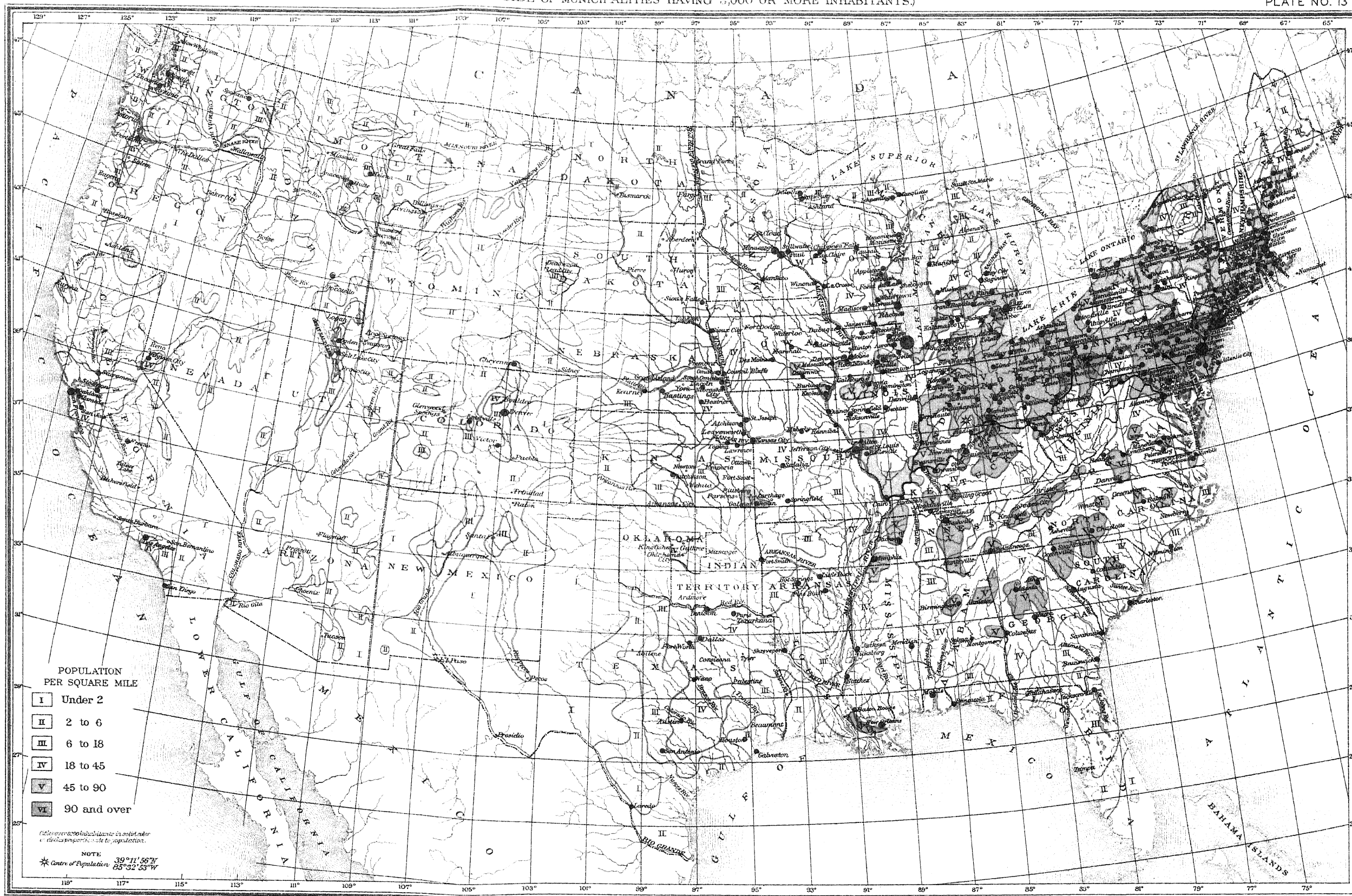

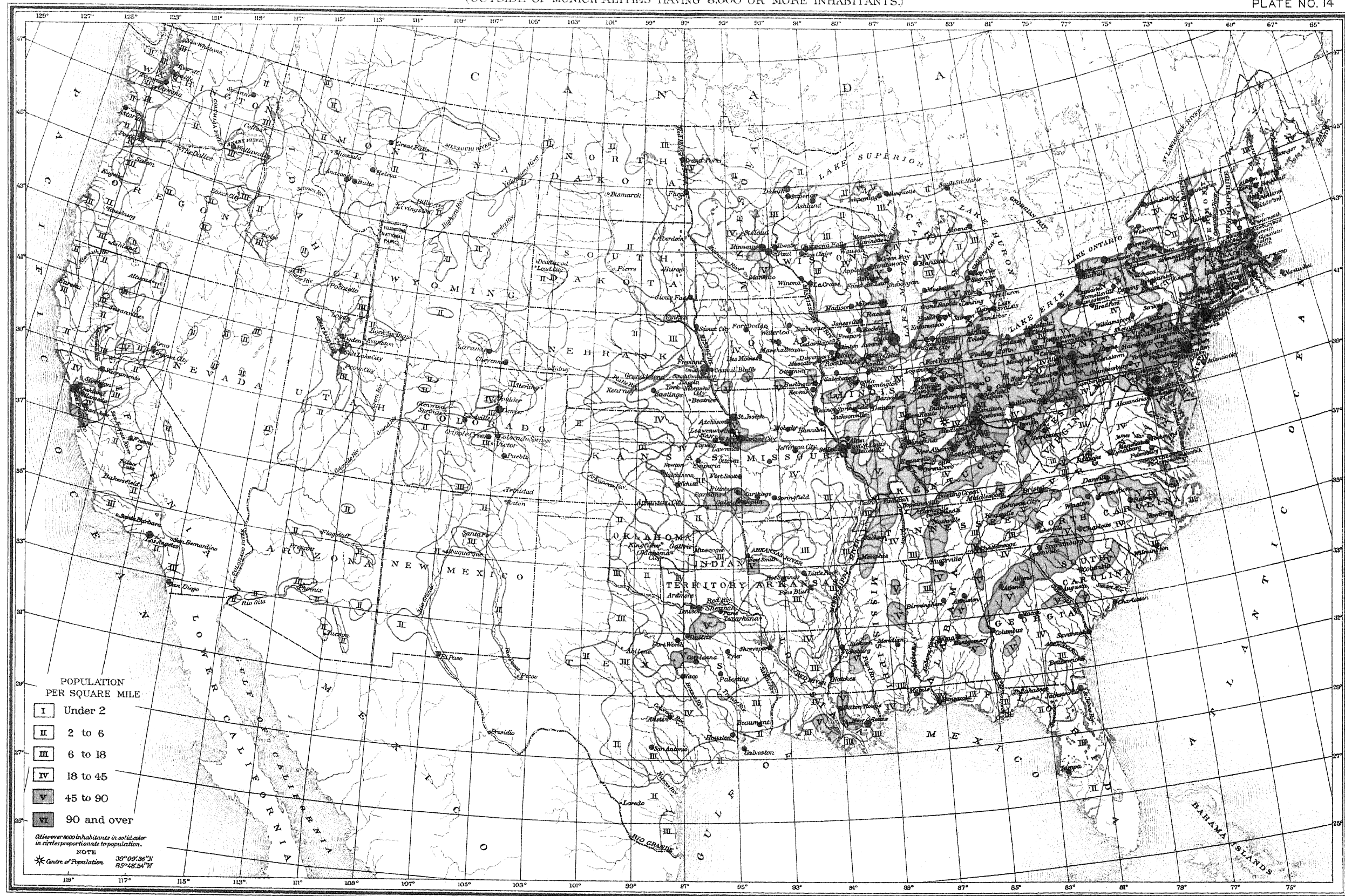
DISTRIBUTION OF THE RURAL POPULATION (EXCLUDING INDIANS NOT TAXED): 1880.

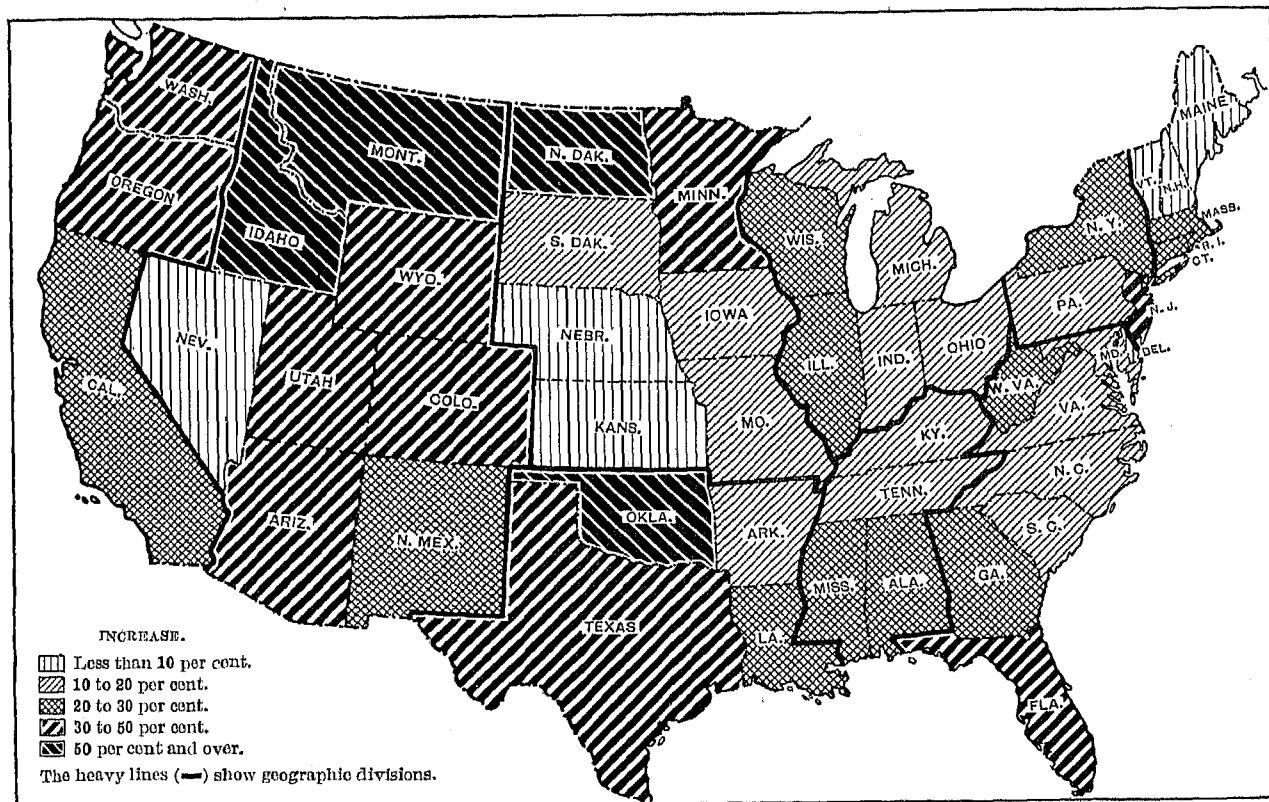




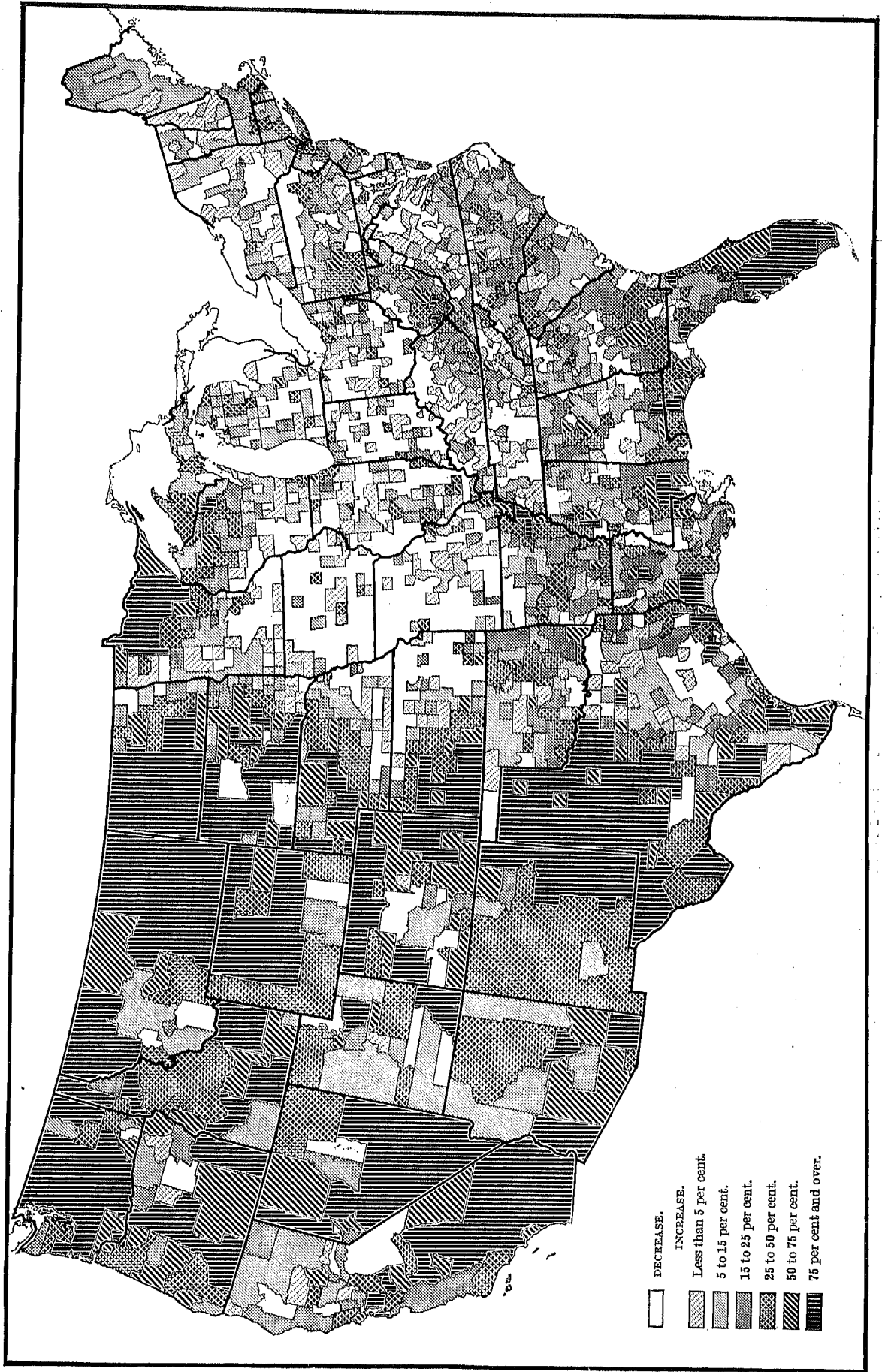
1. PER CENT OF INCREASE IN TOTAL POPULATION, BY STATES: 1900-1910



2. PER CENT OF INCREASE IN TOTAL POPULATION, BY STATES: 1890-1900



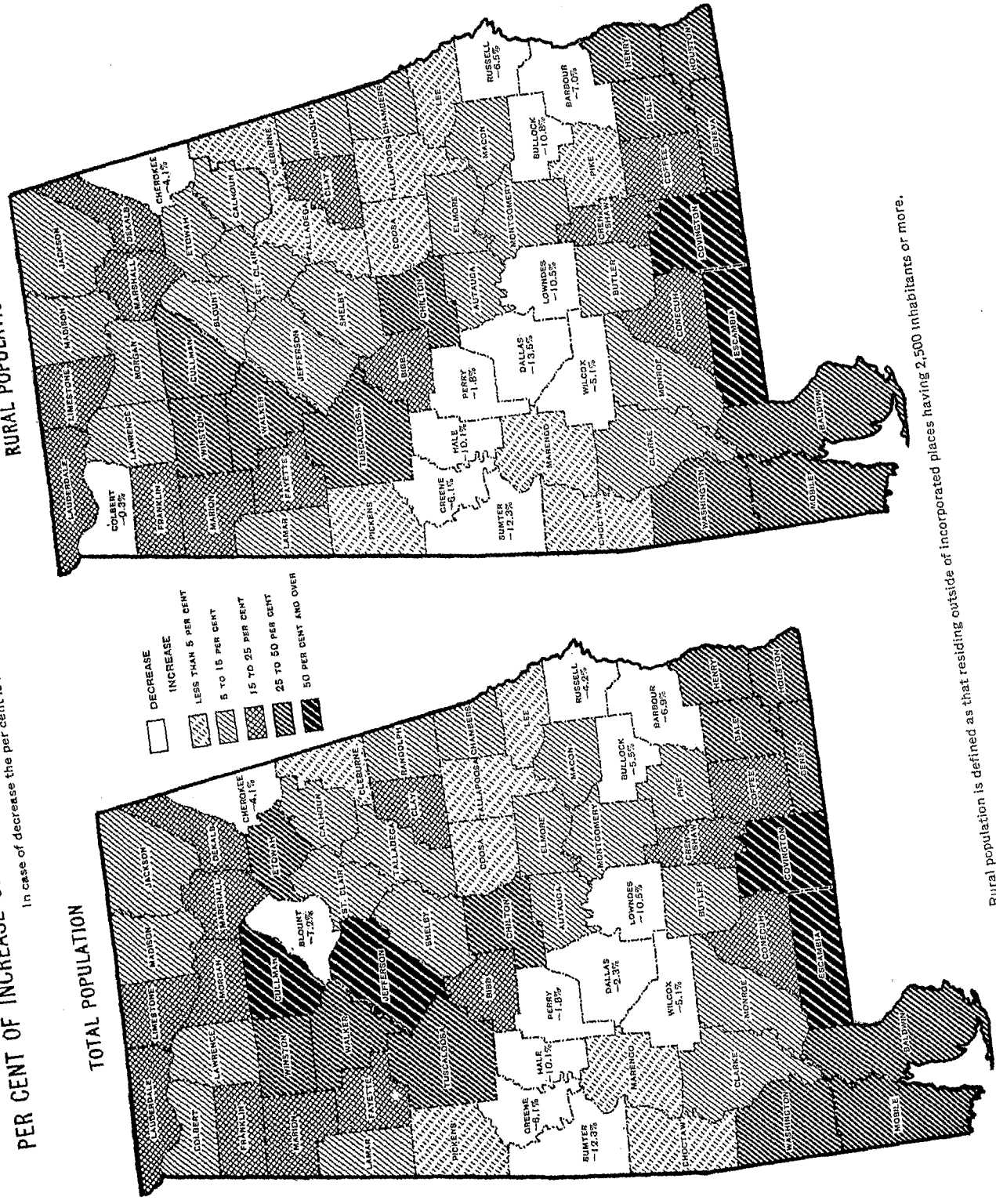
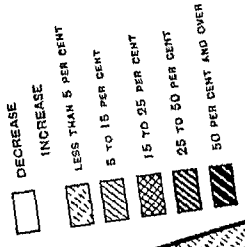
PER CENT OF INCREASE IN TOTAL POPULATION, BY COUNTIES: 1900-1910

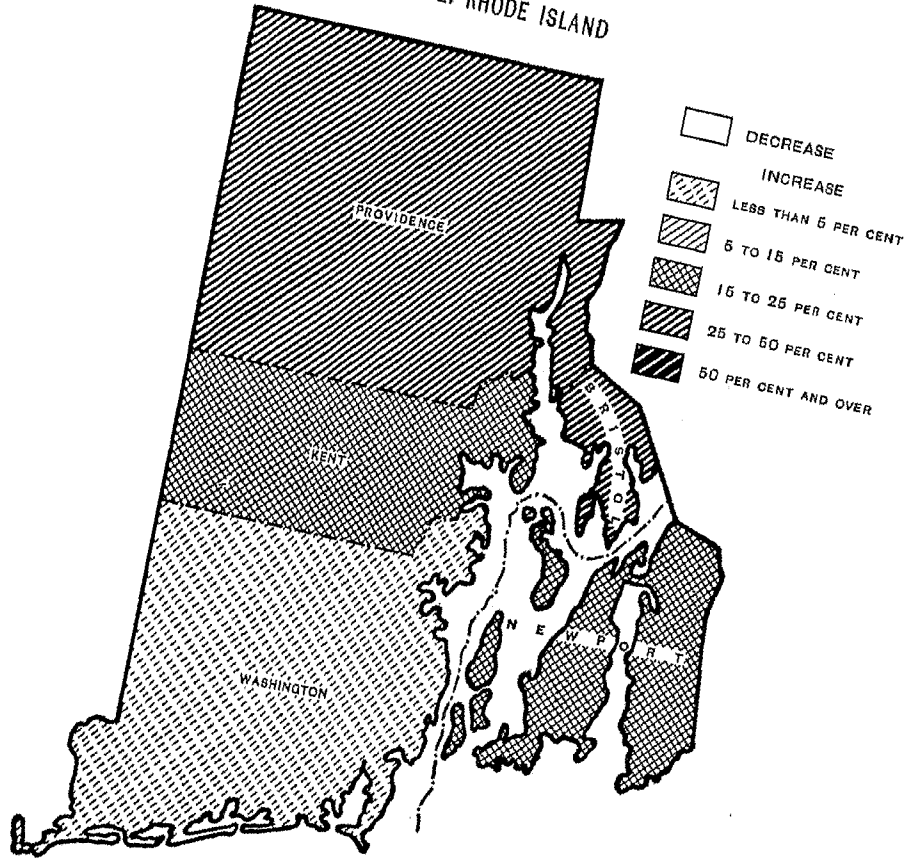
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF CONNECTICUT AND RHODE ISLAND

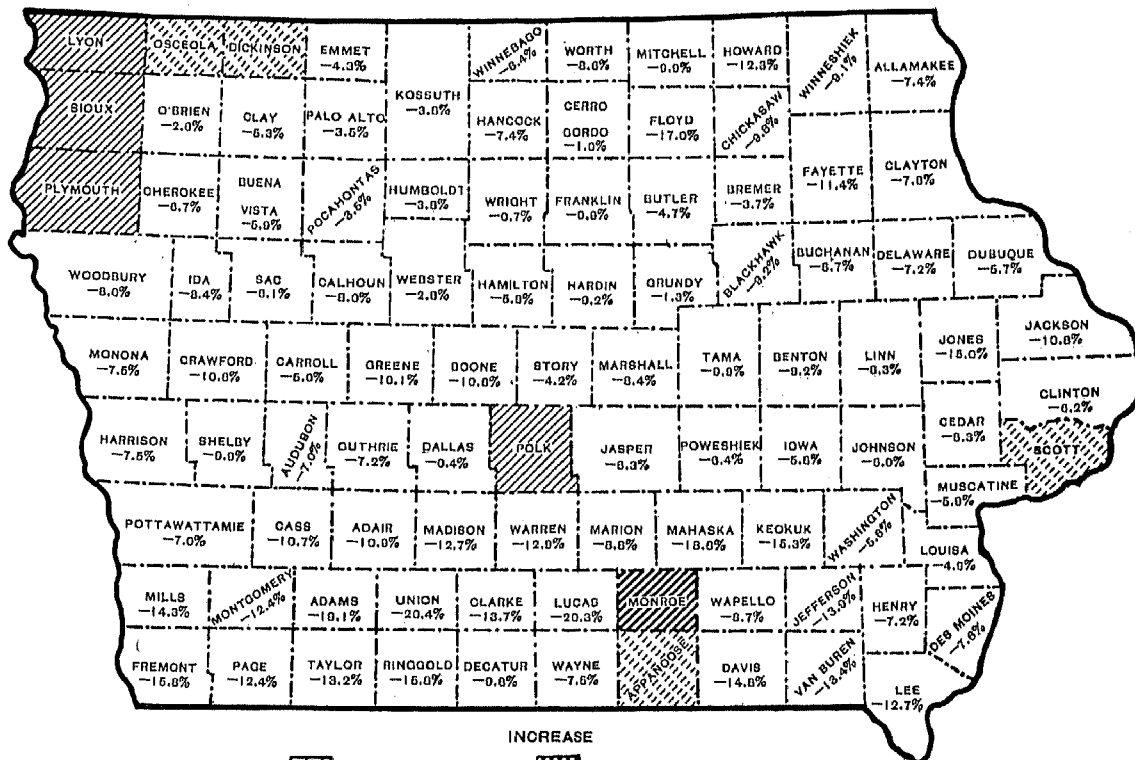
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF IOWA, BY COUNTIES; 1900-1910

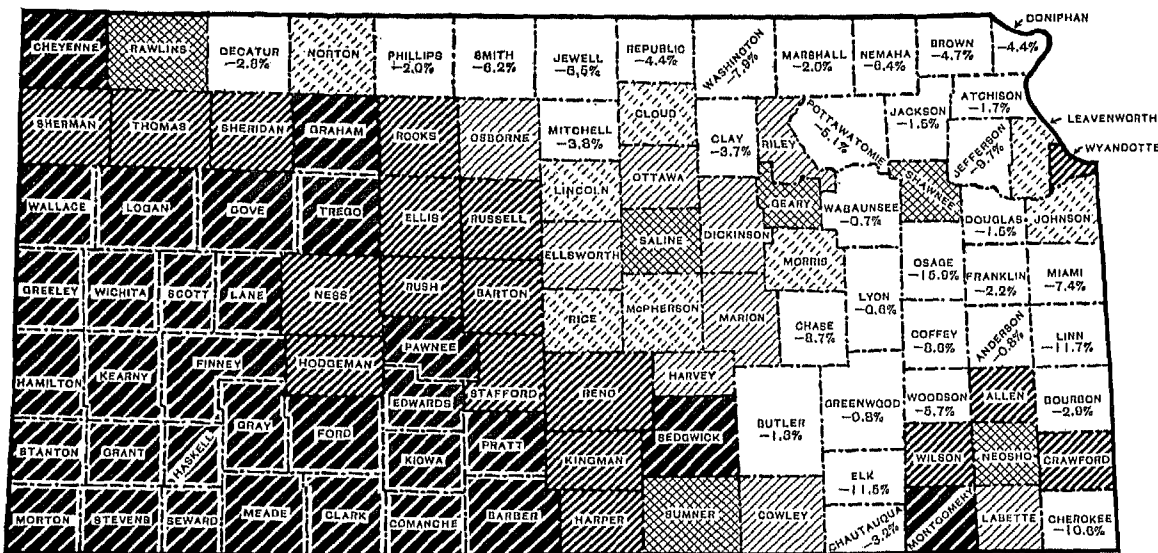

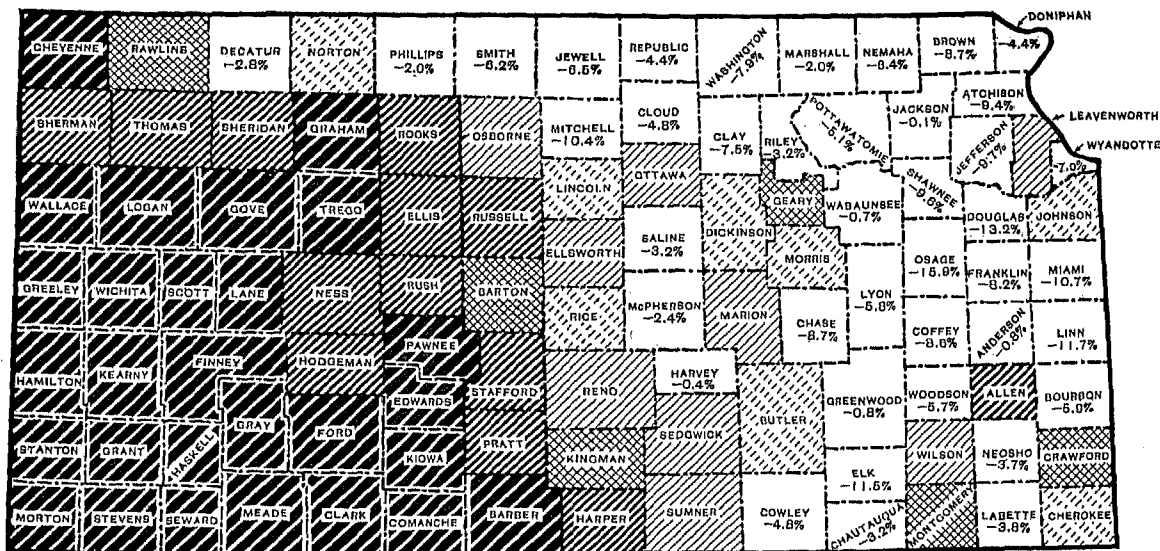
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF KANSAS, BY COUNTIES: 1900-1910

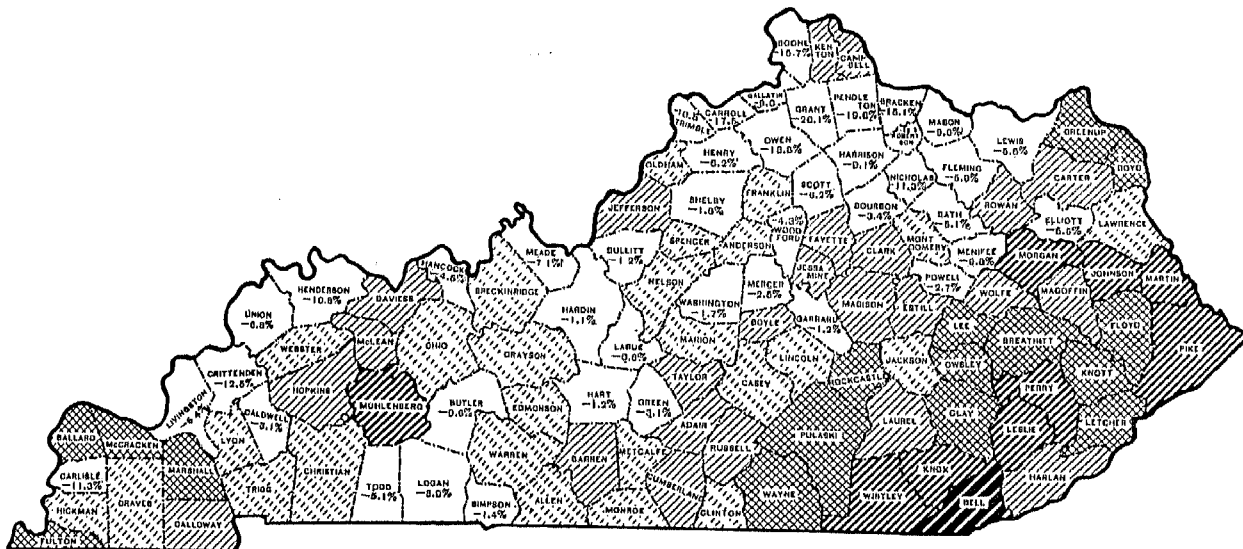

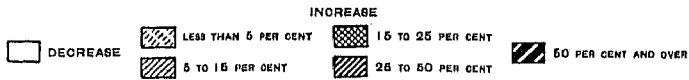
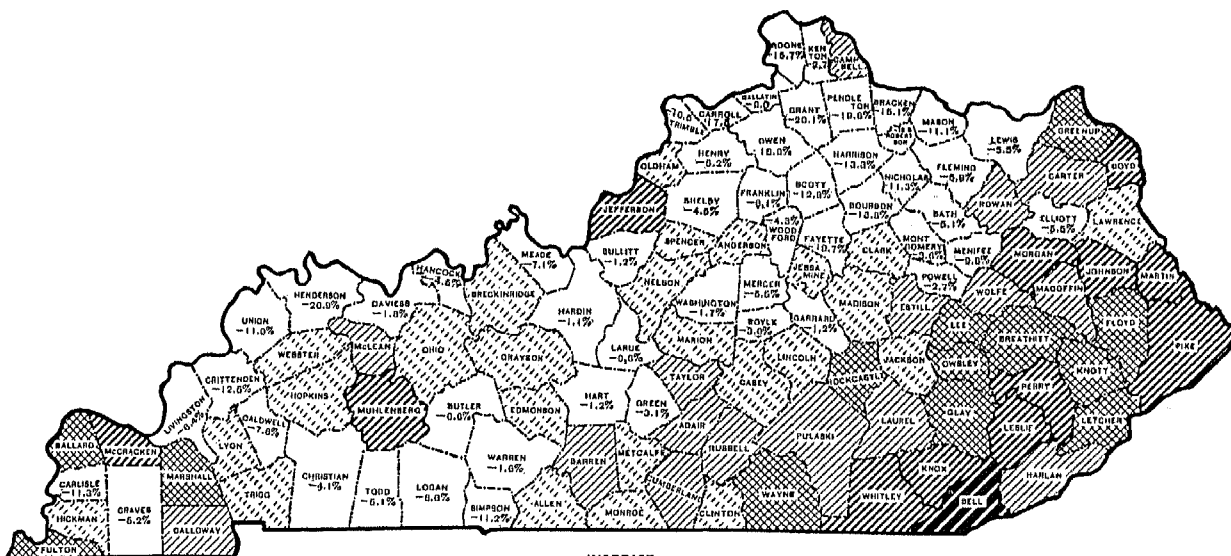
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF KENTUCKY, BY COUNTIES: 1900-1910

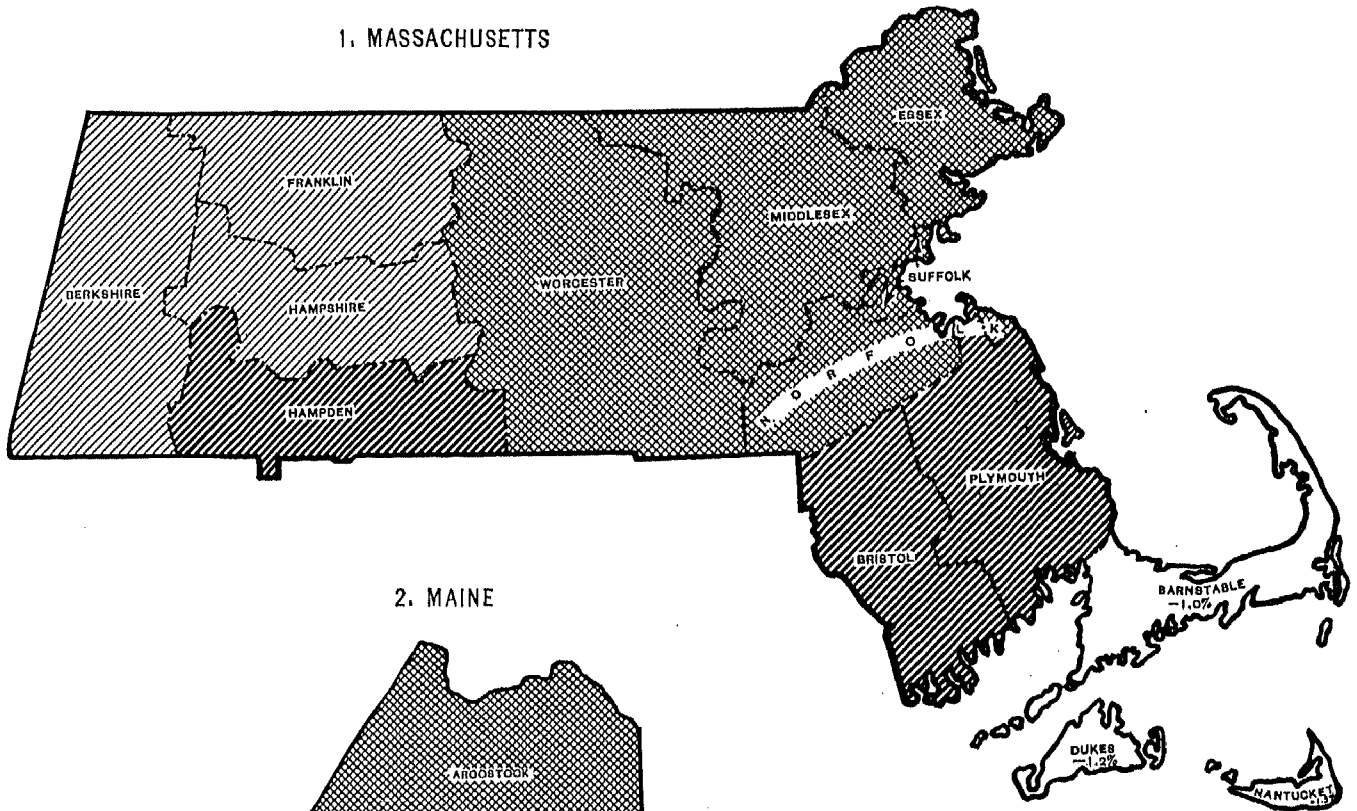

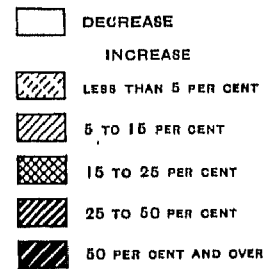
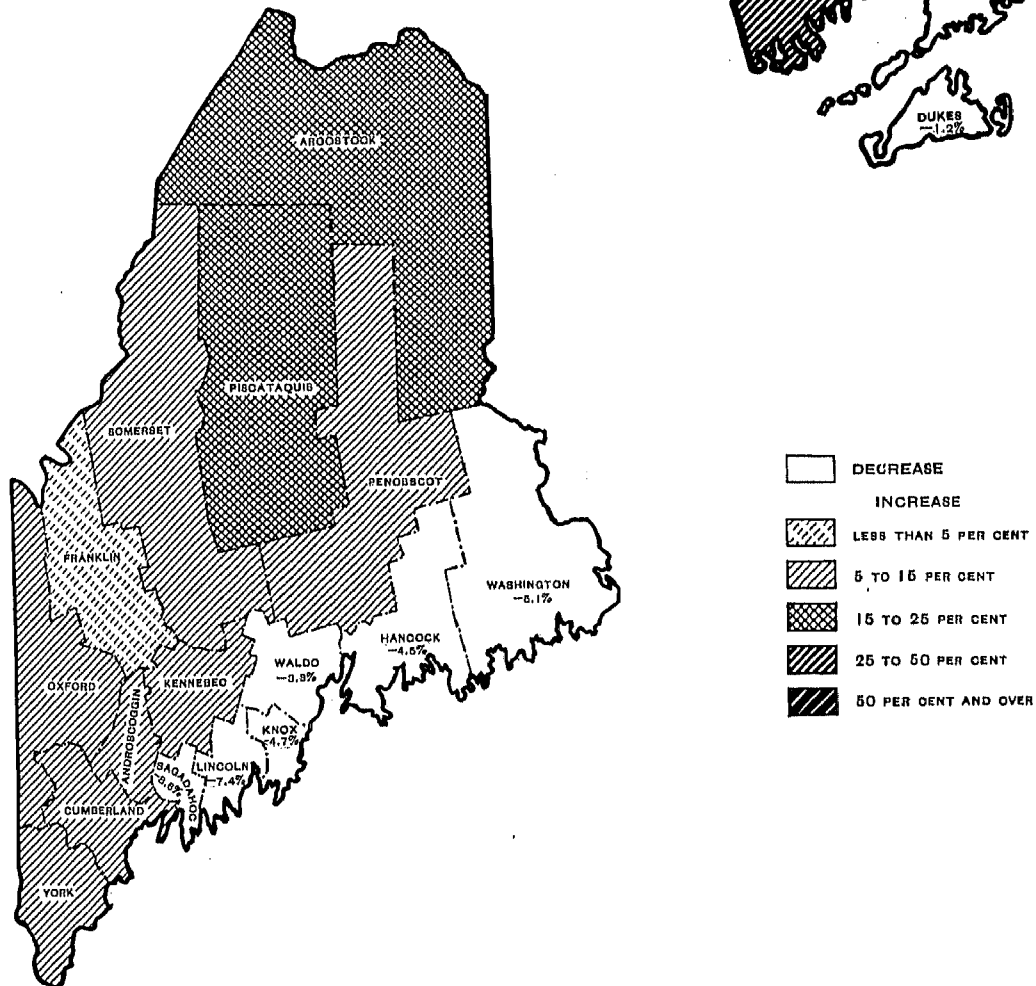
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF MAINE AND MASSACHUSETTS,

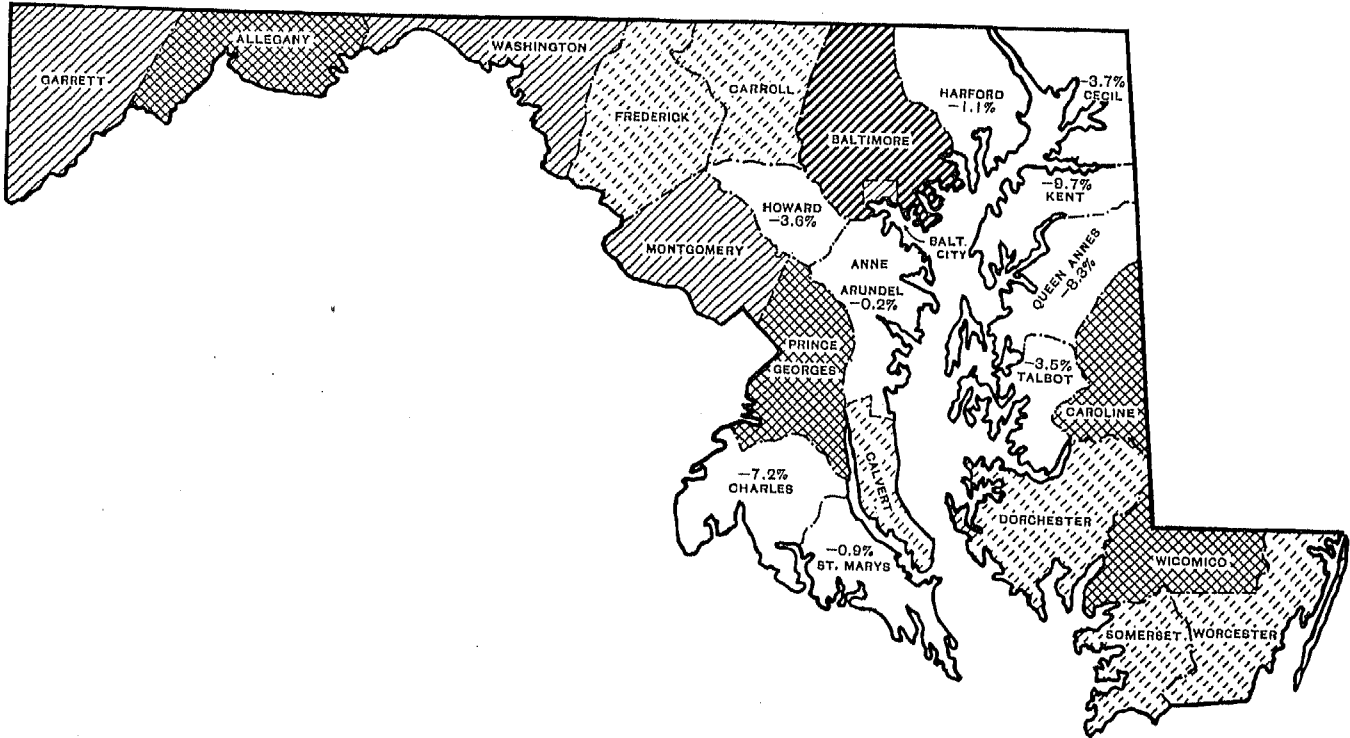

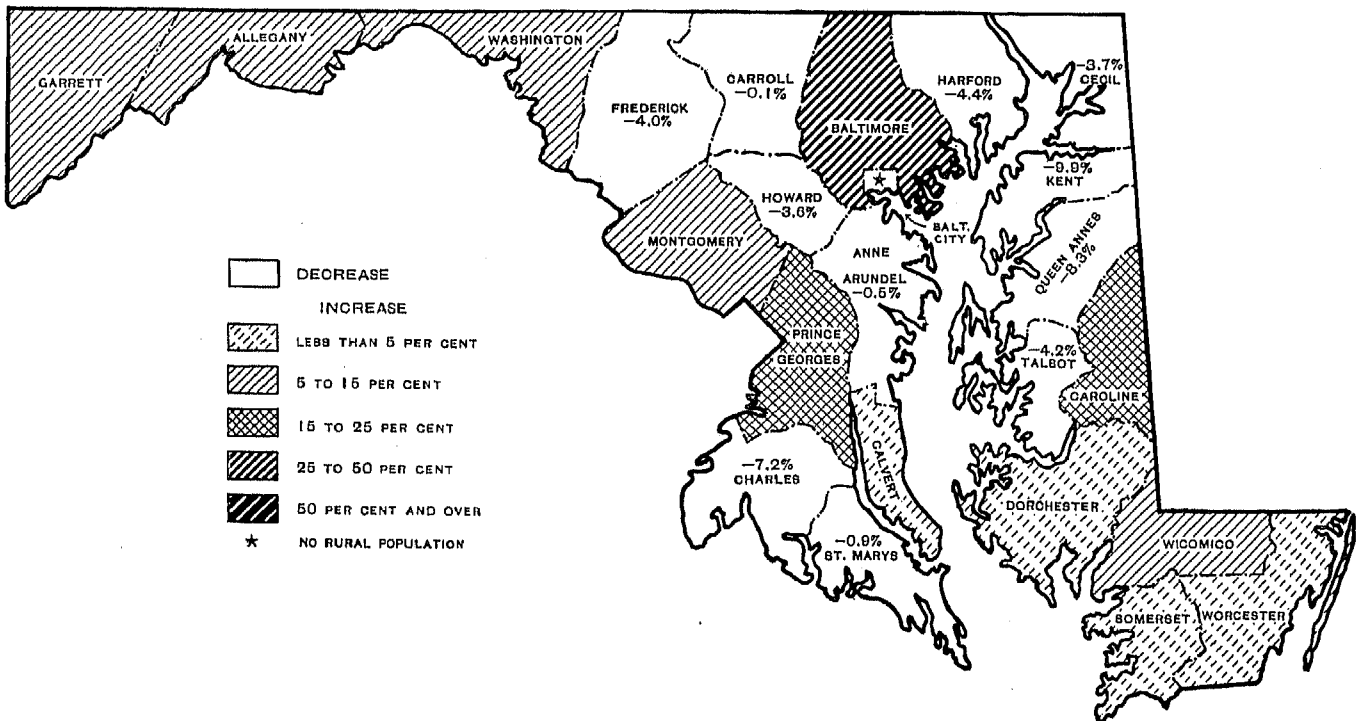
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF MARYLAND, BY COUNTIES: 1900-1910

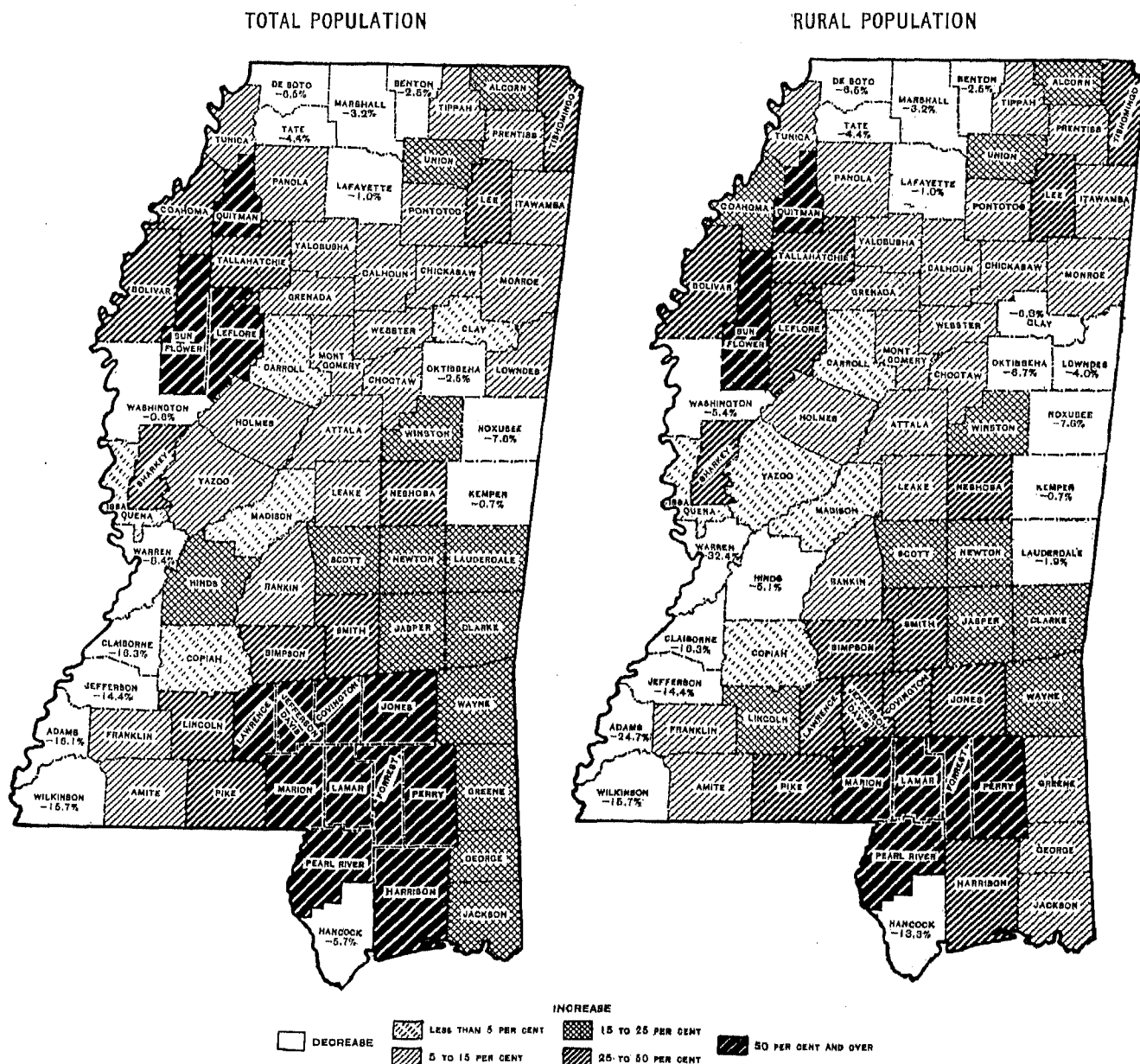

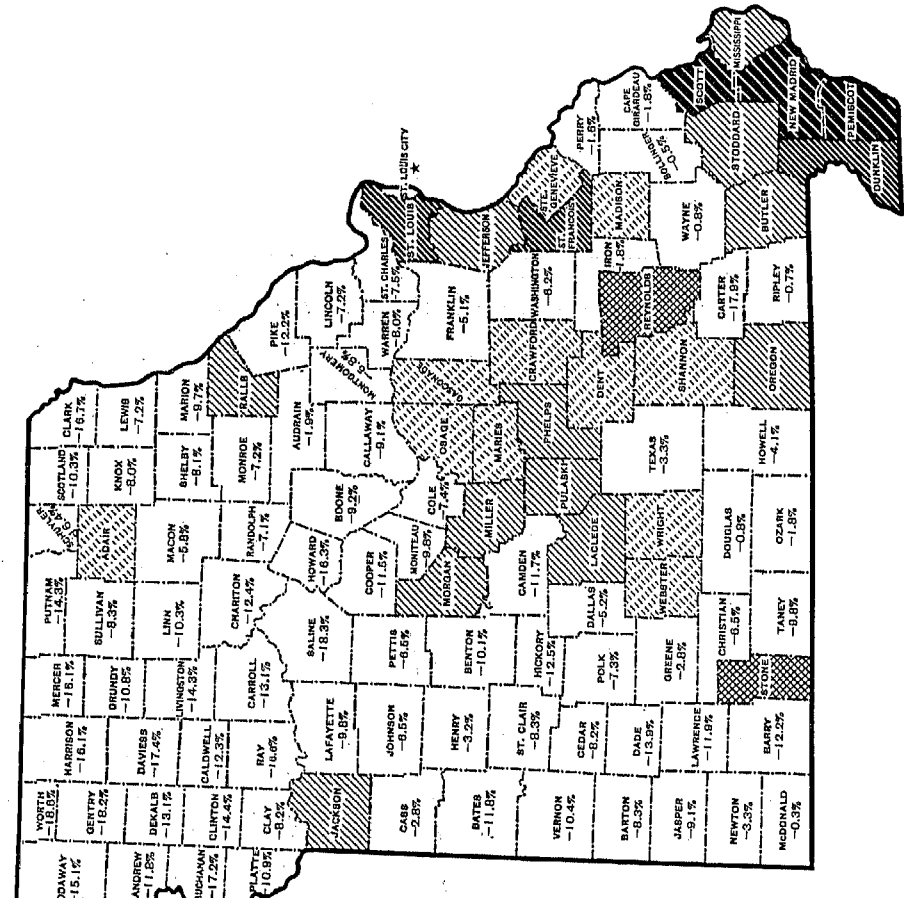
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF MISSOURI, BY COUNTIES; 1900-1910

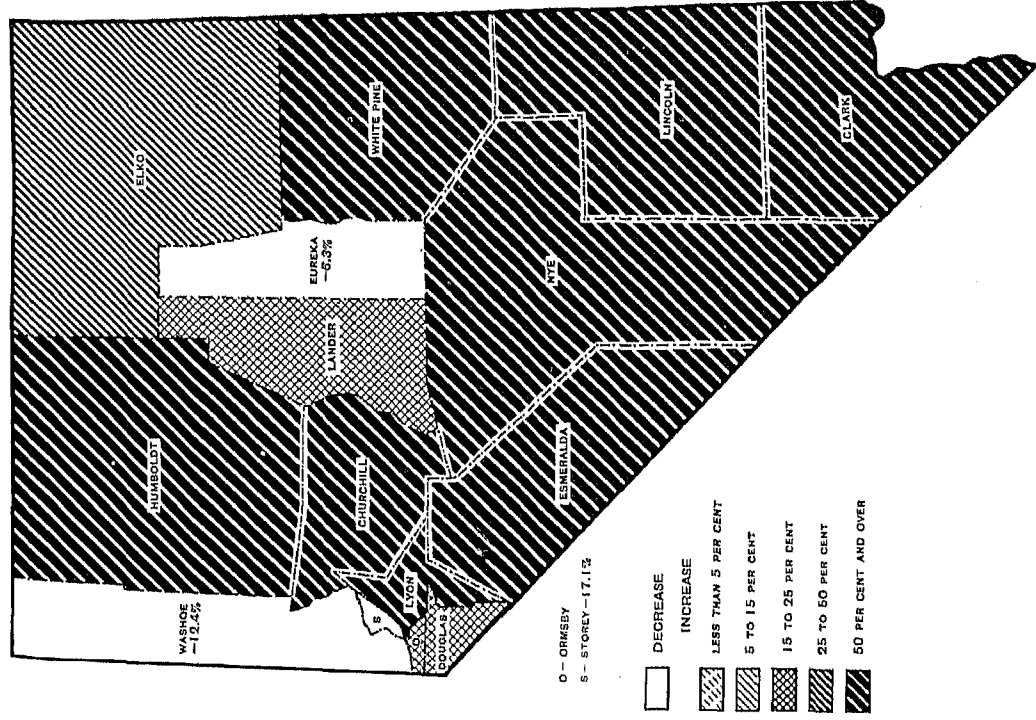
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF NEVADA, BY COUNTIES; 1900-1910

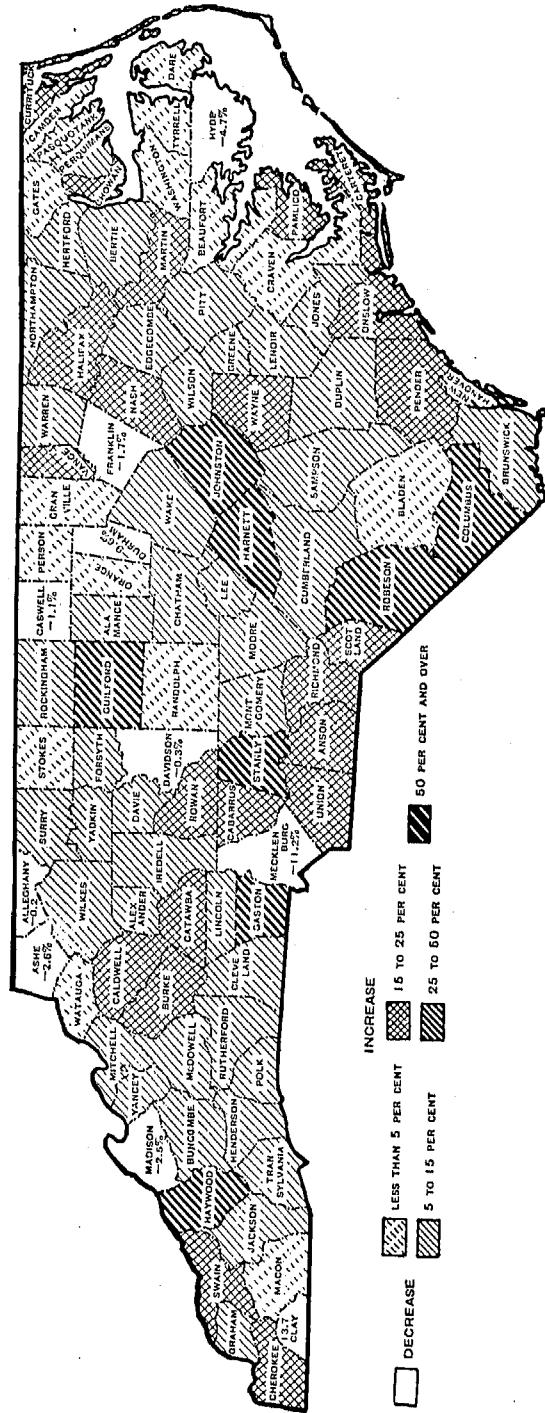
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF NORTH CAROLINA, BY COUNTIES; 1900-1910

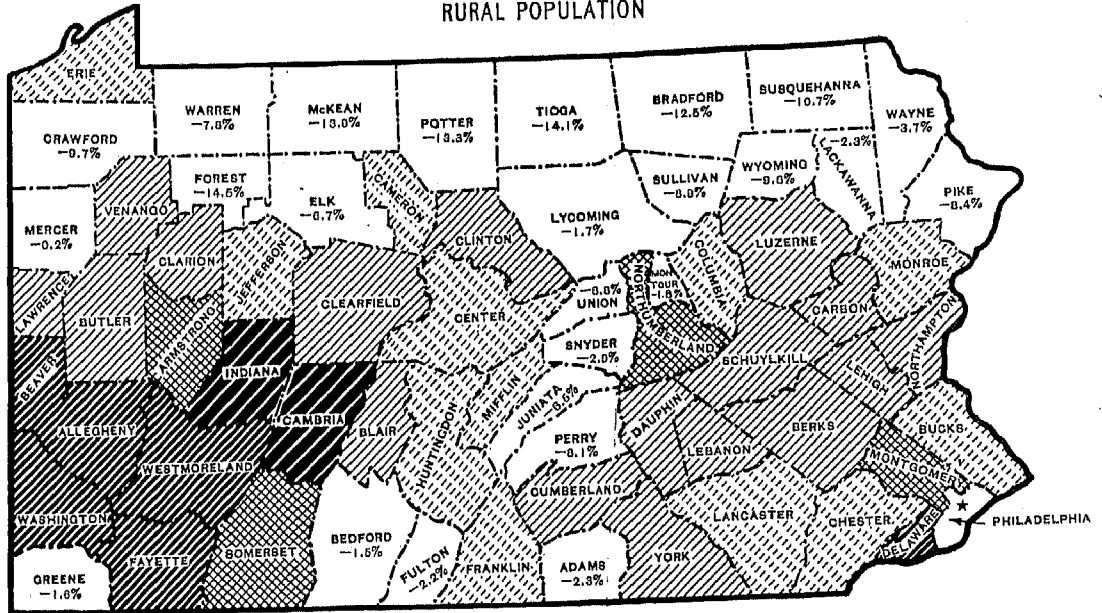
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF PENNSYLVANIA, BY COUNTIES: 1900-1910

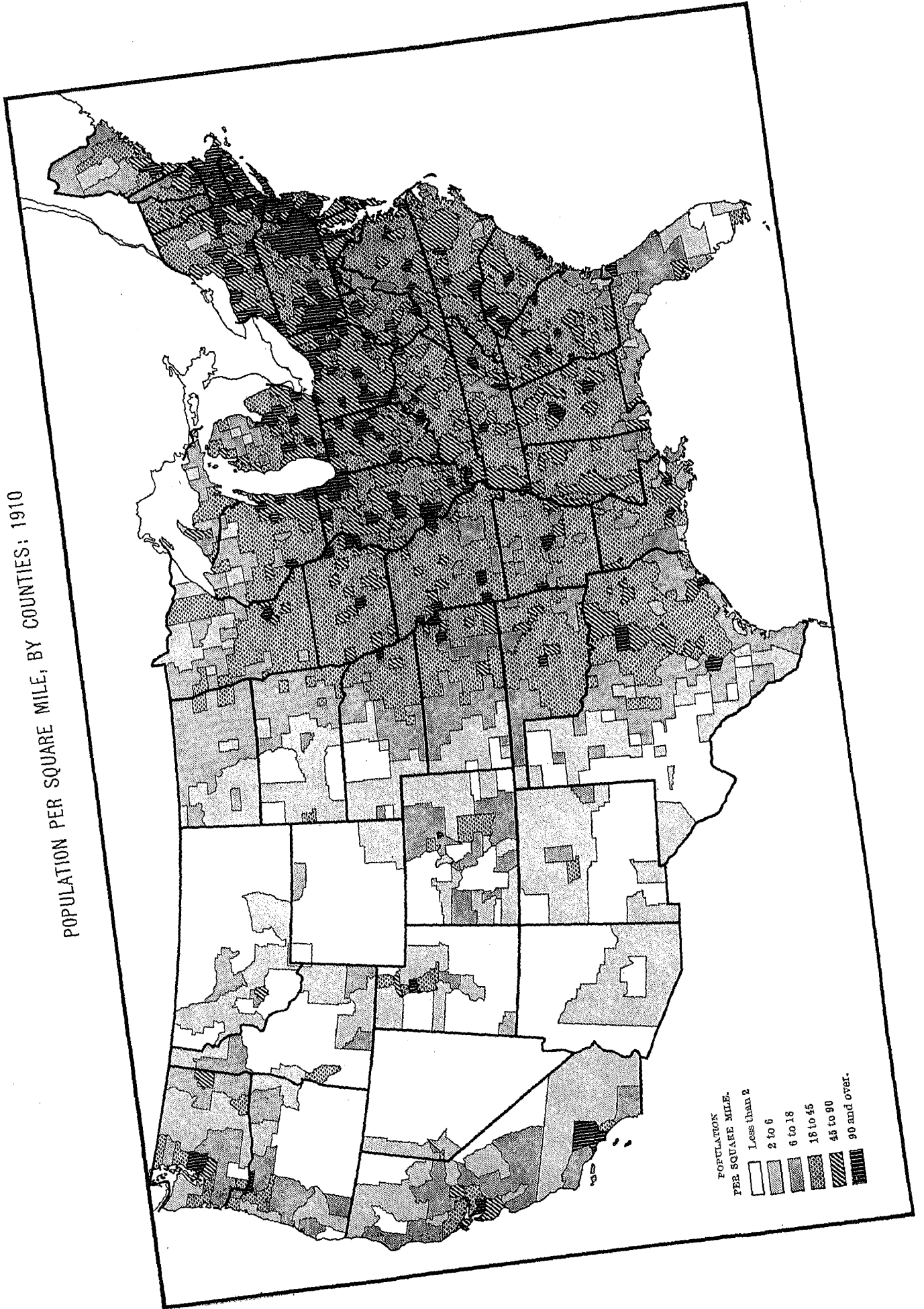
1. POPULATION PER SQUARE MILE, BY STATES: 1910



2. POPULATION PER SQUARE MILE, BY STATES: 1900

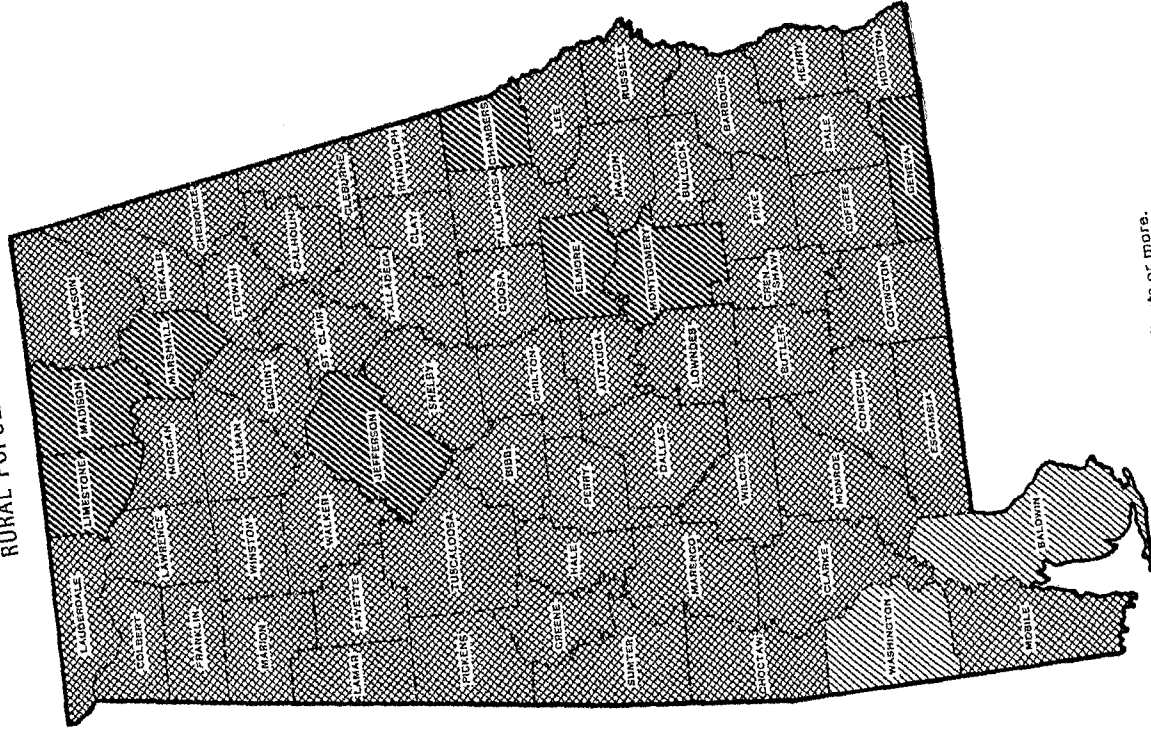


POPULATION PER SQUARE MILE, BY COUNTIES: 1910

DENSITY OF POPULATION OF HAWAII, BY COUNTIES: 1910

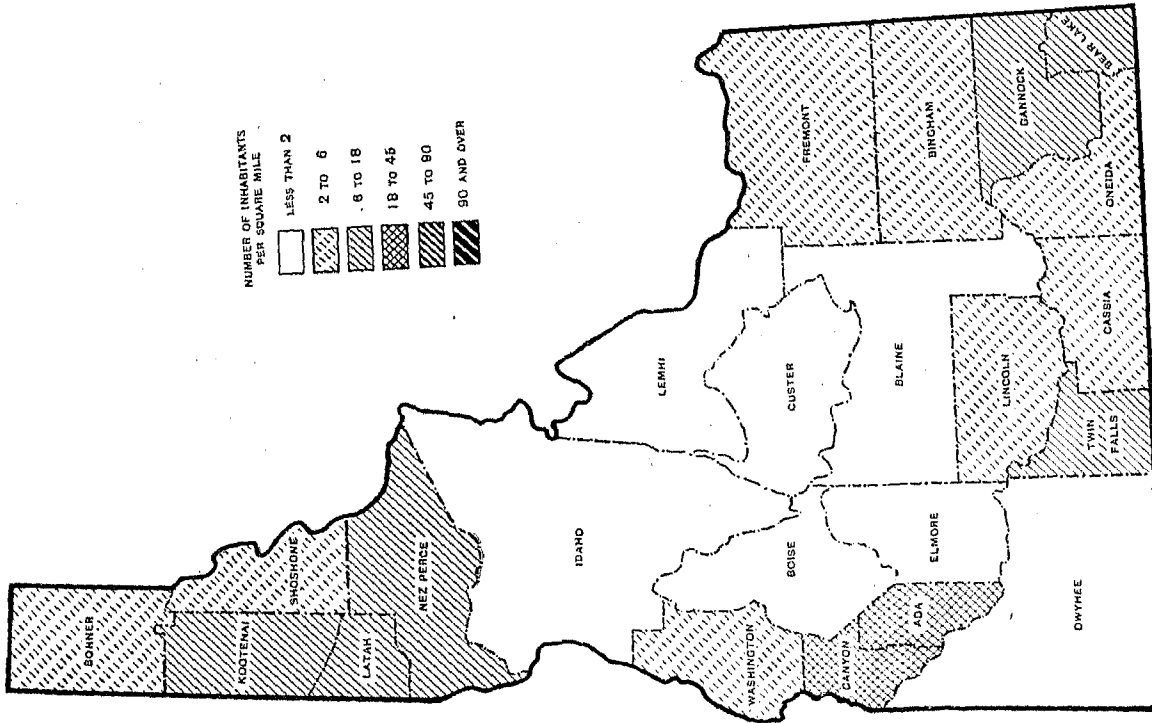

DENSITY OF POPULATION OF IOWA, BY COUNTIES: 1910

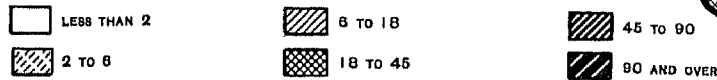
