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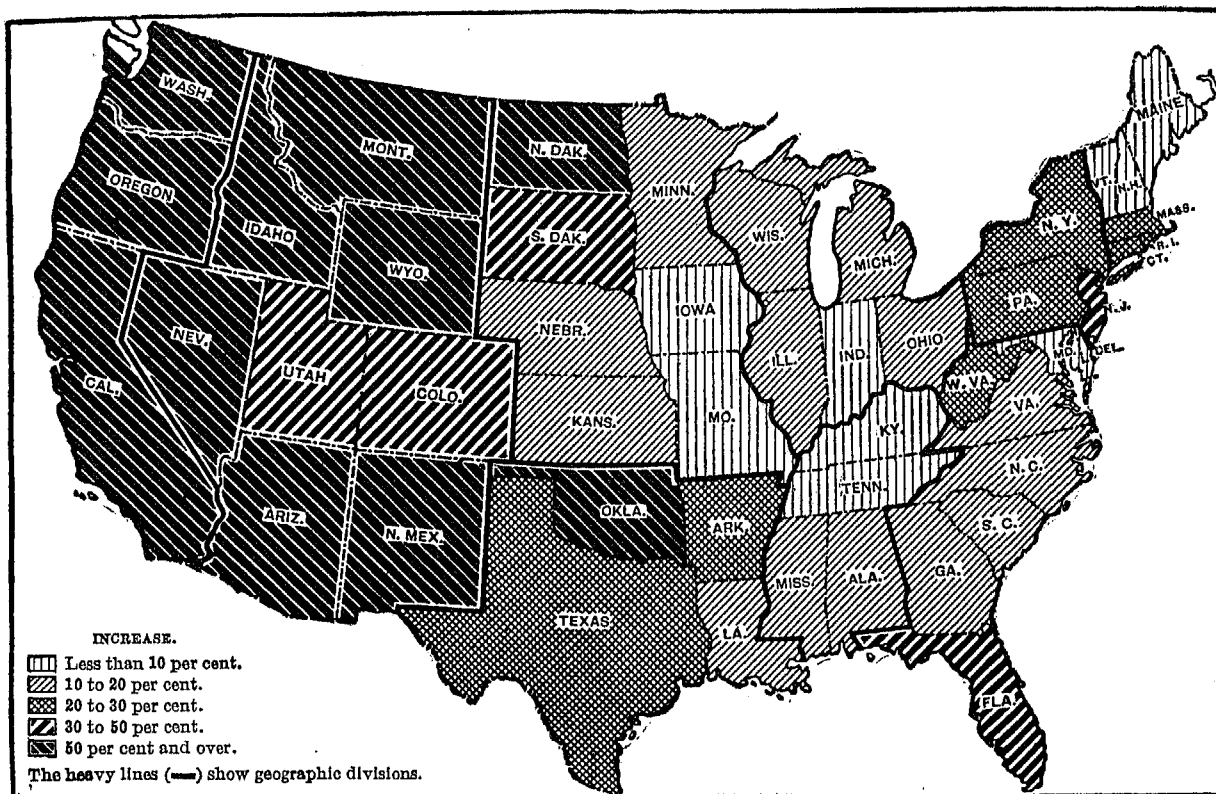

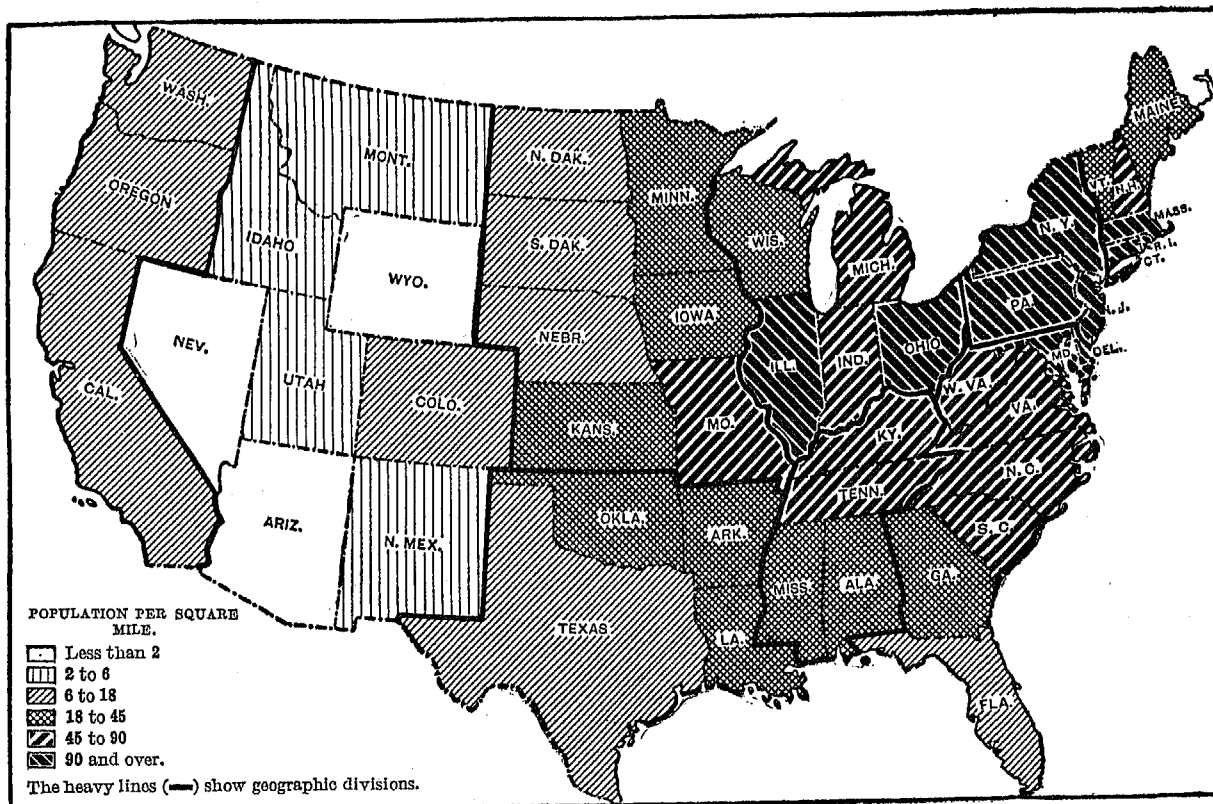

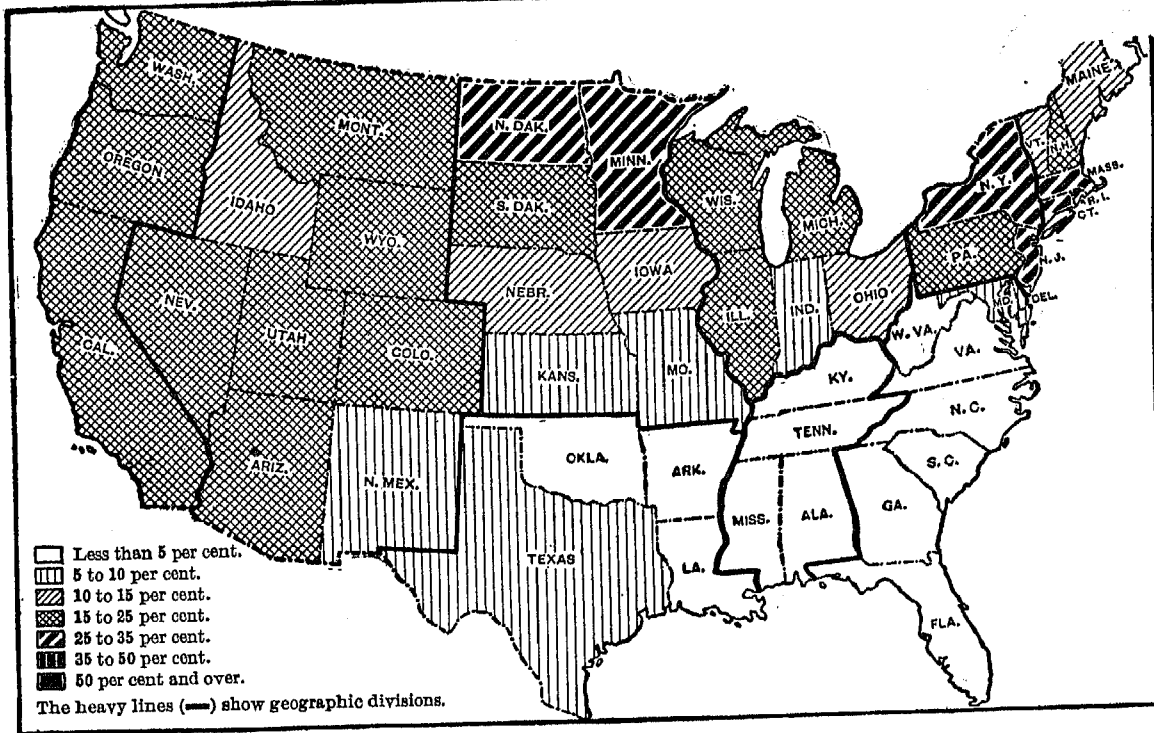
PER CENT OF INCREASE IN TOTAL POPULATION, BY STATES: 1900-1910.



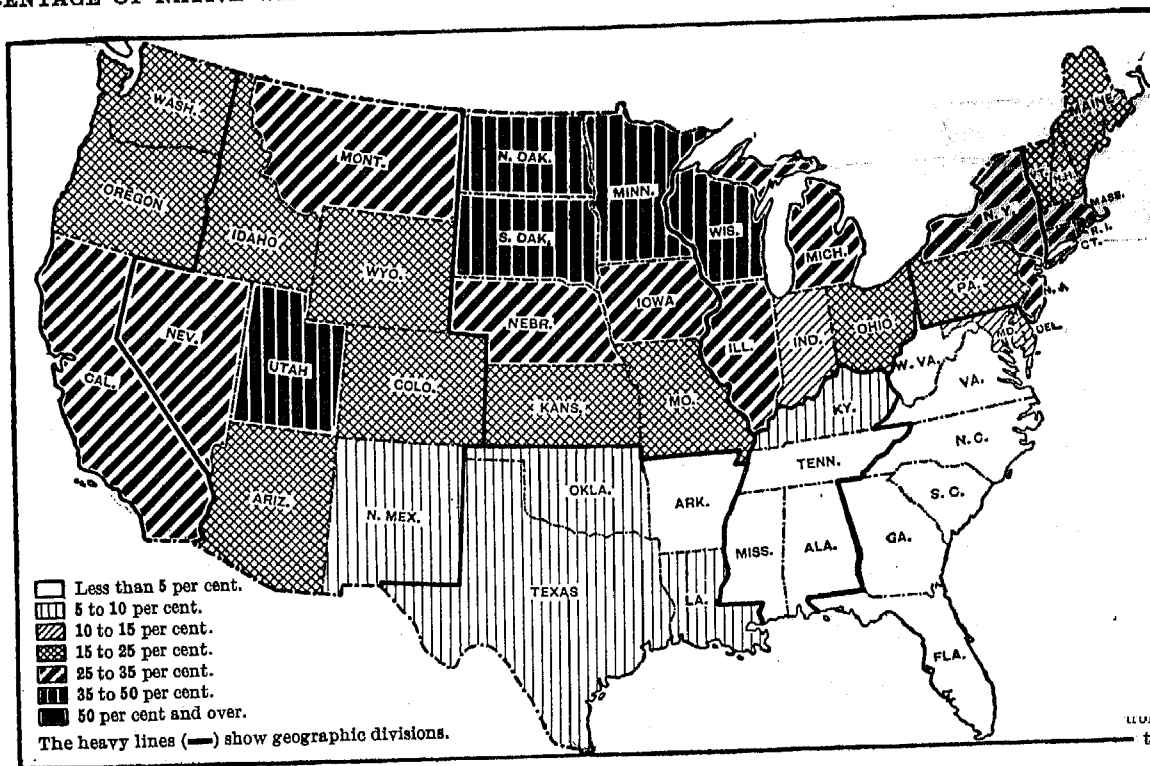
POPULATION PER SQUARE MILE, BY STATES: 1910.

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# NEBRASKA.

## CHAPTER 1.—NUMBER OF INHABITANTS.

**Introduction.**—This chapter gives the population of Nebraska, by counties and minor civil divisions, as enumerated at the Thirteenth Census, taken as of April 15, 1910, with comparative statements of population where possible, and a statement and discussion for the state as a whole of the population living in urban and in rural territory. The statistics are given in detail in two general tables.

Table 1 (p. 24) shows the population of Nebraska, distributed according to counties and minor civil divisions, at the last three censuses, namely, those of 1910, 1900, and 1890. The arrangement of counties and in general the arrangement of the primary divisions in each county is alphabetical. The figures for secondary divisions are printed in italics. The changes in boundaries, name, or form of organization that have taken place since 1900 are indicated in the footnotes to the table. For changes between 1890 and 1900 reference must be made to the census report of 1900.

Owing to the territorial changes that have been made in the minor civil divisions of certain counties since 1890 and to the fact that certain divisions returned separately at the last census were not so returned at one or both of the earlier censuses, comparisons of the population of the minor civil divisions in 1910 with that in 1900 and 1890 are in some instances impossible. For the same reasons county totals as given in Table 1 for 1900 and 1890 sometimes exceed the aggregate population of the minor civil divisions as shown in the table.

Table 2 (p. 39) shows the cities and incorporated towns and villages in Nebraska, alphabetically arranged, with their population in 1910, 1900, and 1890.

The population of Nebraska, by counties, at each of the last five censuses, from 1870 to 1910, inclusive; the

increase during the last two decades; the density of the total and the rural population at the census of 1910; and the distribution of the population at the last two censuses according to urban and rural districts, are given in Table I of Chapter 2.

The tables and text of the present chapter contain few technical expressions whose meaning is not apparent. The census usage in regard to certain terms is, however, explained below:

**Density of population.**—The density of population of a state or county is obtained by dividing its total population by the number of square miles in its land area. In calculating the density of rural population, the same divisor is used as it is not practicable to ascertain and deduct the exact area covered by the urban districts, and even if this could be done with accuracy the deduction of this area from the total land area would ordinarily make no appreciable difference in the resulting quotient.

**Minor civil divisions.**—The counties are divided generally into smaller political units which bear different designations in the different parts of the country, such as towns, townships, election precincts, etc. Of these minor civil divisions those which rank next to the county as geographic areas are termed primary divisions. In many instances, however, these primary divisions contain political units of still smaller area, such as cities, incorporated villages, towns, or boroughs. These smaller political units are referred to as secondary divisions.

**Urban and rural population defined.**—The Census Bureau, for purposes of discussion, has defined urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside of such incorporated places.

The comparisons of the urban and rural population in 1910 with that at earlier enumerations may be made either with respect to the varying proportions of the two classes at successive enumerations or with respect to the increase between enumerations. In order to contrast the *proportion* of the total population living in urban or rural territory at the census of 1910 with the *proportion* urban or rural at the preceding census, it is necessary to classify the territory according to the conditions *as they existed* at each census. In this comparison a place having less than 2,500 inhabitants in 1900 and over 2,500 in 1910 is classed with the rural population for 1900 and with the urban for 1910. On the other hand,

**HISTORICAL NOTE.**—This state takes its name from the Nebraska River, generally known as the Platte. The word is of Indian origin and signifies "shallow water."

The earliest recorded exploration in the region now constituting Nebraska was made in 1739 when Frenchmen followed the Platte to its Forks. In 1804 a United States Government expedition under Lewis and Clark passed up the Missouri River, which forms the eastern and northeastern boundary of the state, returning in 1806. The first settlement was made in 1807, when Emanuel Lisa, a fur trader, built Fort Lisa near the present site of Fort Calhoun. Other trading posts as well as military posts were established from time to time, but very few settlers came to this region until about the middle of the century.

The area now known as Nebraska was originally a part of the vast Louisiana region, which was ceded by France to Spain in 1762, retroceded to France in 1800, and purchased by the United States in 1803. The area now forming the state belonged successively to the district of Louisiana (1804-5), the territory of Louisiana (1805-1812), the territory of Missouri (1812-1834), and the "Indian Country" (1834-1854).

In 1854 the territory of Nebraska was organized from the section of the Indian

Country lying between the fortieth and forty-ninth parallels and extending from the Rocky Mountains to the Missouri and White Earth Rivers. It thus included, in addition to the area of the present state, territory now forming portions of North and South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, and Colorado. In 1861 the area of Nebraska was greatly reduced by the organization of Dakota territory, which extended westward to the Rocky Mountains, and of Colorado territory, in which was included what had been the southwestern corner of Nebraska. In the same year, however, territory was added to Nebraska by the extension of the western boundary to the thirty-third meridian from Washington (approximately the one hundred and tenth from Greenwich). In 1863 Idaho territory was organized with boundaries including that part of Nebraska lying west of the twenty-seventh meridian from Washington (approximately the one hundred and fourth from Greenwich) and the territory of Nebraska was left with substantially the same limits as the present state.

In March, 1867, Nebraska was admitted to the Union. In 1882 a small tract of land, formerly a part of Dakota, lying south of the forty-third parallel and between the Keyapaha and Missouri Rivers, was added to Nebraska, since which time there have been no changes in the boundaries of the state.



in order to present fairly the contrast between urban and rural communities, as regards their *rate of growth*, it is necessary to consider the changes in population for the *same* territory which have occurred from one decennial census to another. For this purpose the territory which in 1910 was urban or rural, as the case may be, is taken as the basis, and the population in 1900 for the same territory (so far as separately reported at that census) is presented, even though

part of the territory may, on the basis of its population at the earlier census, have then been in a different class. This avoids the disturbing effect on comparisons which would arise from the passage, for example, of communities formerly classed as rural into the urban group. These two distinct forms of comparison are made in Table I of Chapter 2 for the state as a whole and for each county separately for the last two censuses.

### TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

**Population of the state.**—The population of the state of Nebraska is 1,192,214. Compared with a population of 1,066,300 in 1900, this represents an increase during the last decade of 125,914, or 11.8 per cent. During the same period the total population of the United States increased 21 per cent. The rate of increase for the population of the state during the preceding

decade, 1890–1900, was only three-tenths of 1 per cent.

The following table shows the population of Nebraska at each census from 1860 to 1910, inclusive, together with the increase and per cent of increase during each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole.

Nebraska was organized as a territory in 1854 and was enumerated separately for the first time at the census of 1860. During the 30 years from 1860 to 1890 the growth of Nebraska was very rapid, although some doubt has been cast upon the accuracy of the figures returned for 1890. The population of the state increased more than fourfold during the decade 1860–1870, about three and two-thirds times during the decade 1870–1880, and a little more than two and one-third times during the decade 1880–1890. The absolute increase for this 30-year period was 1,033,815. During the 20 years since 1890 the population of the state, according to the census, has increased 129,558, or only 12.2 per cent.

During every decade from 1860 to 1890 the rates of increase for the state were very much higher than the rates of increase for the United States, the population of the state being more than thirty-six times as great in 1890 as it was in 1860, while that of the United States had about doubled. Since 1890, however, the population of the United States has increased much more rapidly than that of Nebraska, the rate of increase for the country as a whole during this period being 46.1 per cent, as against 12.2 per cent for the state.

**Principal cities.**—Nebraska has 82 cities, of which the largest, Omaha, has a population of 124,096, and Lincoln, the second city, a population of 43,973. South Omaha, with 26,259, and Grand Island, with 10,326 inhabitants, are the only other cities in the state having over 10,000 inhabitants. There are also

9 cities having from 5,000 to 10,000, 12 having from 2,500 to 5,000, and 57 having less than 2,500 inhabitants. The aggregate population of the 82 cities is 389,383, or 32.7 per cent of the total population of the state.

Table 2 shows the population in 1910 of all the cities of the state with comparative figures, where possible, for 1900 and 1890. The table on page 19 shows the population of the seven largest cities in the state in 1910, as reported at each census since their incorporation as cities, together with the increase during each decade.

Of the cities included in this table, Grand Island shows the highest rate of increase during the last decade, namely, 36.7 per cent, and South Omaha the lowest, 1 per cent.

**Counties.**—Nebraska has 92 counties. The population of these counties ranges from 981 in Hooker County to 168,546 in Douglas County.

The following territorial changes in the counties of Nebraska have been made since 1900: Part of Cheyenne County was taken in 1909 to form Morrill County; part of Deuel County was taken in 1910 to form Garden County; and part of Dakota County was ceded to Nebraska by the state of South Dakota in 1908.

Because of the organization of two new counties from parts of other counties since 1900, the comparison of increase or decrease in population is made for only 88 counties and two combinations of counties.

The combinations of counties are Garden with Deuel and Morrill with Cheyenne. In order to determine the actual rate of increase for these counties, it is necessary to add the population of the new county to that of the old county from which it was formed. Sixty-seven counties, including Dakota County, part of which was ceded to Nebraska by South Dakota in 1908, and the two combinations of counties have increased in population during the last decade. The rates of increase of the 67 counties range from nine-tenths of 1 per cent in Gage County to 377.8 per cent in McPherson County, and the absolute increases from 129 in Hamilton County to 27,956 in Douglas County. The combined counties of Garden and Deuel increased 2,694, or 102.4 per cent, while the combined counties of Morrill and Cheyenne increased 3,565, or 64 per cent. Twenty-one counties have decreased in population during the last decade, the rates of decrease ranging from less than one-tenth of 1 per cent in Clay County to 13.3 per cent in Otoe County, and the absolute decreases from 6 in Clay County to 2,965 in Otoe County. The aggregate increase of population from 1900 to 1910 in the 67 counties that show an increase and in the two combinations of counties is 142,241; the aggregate decrease of population in the 21 counties that show a decrease is 16,327. The difference, 125,914, is, of course, the total increase of population in the state.

The maps on page 22 show the increase or decrease in the total and the rural population, respectively, of each county of Nebraska during the last decade. In the counties shown in white the population decreased; for the other counties the different rates of increase are indicated by differences in shading.

**Density of population.**—The total land area of the state is 76,808 square miles. The average number of persons to the square mile in 1910 was 15.5; in 1900 and 1890 it was 13.9 and 13.8, respectively. The

average number per square mile for the United States as a whole in 1910 was 30.9.

The density of population is given by counties in Table I of Chapter 2 and in the maps on page 23, both for the entire population and for that living in rural territory, excluding in the latter case the population of places of 2,500 or more, but not excluding the land area of such places.

Cherry County, with 5,979 square miles, has the largest area, and Sarpy County, with 240 square miles, has the smallest area. Douglas County, containing Omaha city, has the highest density of any county, namely, 509.2 persons per square mile, and Hooker County, with 1.4 persons per square mile, has the lowest density.

**Minor civil divisions.**—The political divisions into which counties are subdivided are collectively termed "Minor civil divisions." In Nebraska the counties are divided into 1,399 primary divisions, comprising 927 election precincts, 453 townships, and 19 cities. There are also 435 secondary divisions, comprising 63 cities, 19 towns, and 353 villages. These secondary divisions usually form parts of their respective precincts or townships, but 10 cities and 1 village are coextensive with the election precincts or townships in which they are located. Besides these minor civil divisions there is one island in the state which is unorganized.

**Urban and rural population compared.**—The table on page 20 presents the population of Nebraska at the censuses of 1910, 1900, and 1890, respectively, distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population, together with the percentage of the total population contained in each group at each of the censuses named. The classification is based upon the population of each place as it existed at each census.

As shown by this table, the urban territory of the state in 1910—that is, the cities and incorporated villages of 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained

310,852 inhabitants, or 26.1 per cent of the total population, while 881,362 inhabitants, or 73.9 per cent, lived in rural territory. The urban territory as it existed in 1900—that is, the cities then having 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 252,702 inhabitants, or 23.7 per cent of the total population, while 813,598 inhabitants, or 76.3 per cent, lived in rural territory. There has thus been a slight increase in the proportion of urban population. During the decade 1890–1900 there was an apparent decrease in the proportion of urban population in the state, but this may have been due to an overcount of the population of certain cities in 1890. For the United States as a whole the urban population constituted 46.3 per cent of the total population in 1910 and 40.5 per cent of the total population in 1900.

In 1910, Omaha, the one city in the state having over 100,000 inhabitants, contributed 10.4 per cent of the total population of the state, which was a slight increase over its proportion in 1900. The proportion of the population of the state in the other urban places increased from 14.1 per cent in 1900 to 15.7 per cent in 1910. For reasons already suggested, comparisons with the figures of 1890 are of uncertain value.

The urban population of the state is contained in 25 cities and 2 villages, while that classed as rural is in 427 incorporated cities, towns, and villages of less than 2,500 inhabitants each and in unincorporated territory. The 427 places of less than 2,500 inhabitants each have an aggregate population of 243,292, or 20.4 per cent of the total population of the state. These places comprise 64 having from 1,000 to 2,500 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 95,295; 100 having from 500 to 1,000 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 69,450; and 263 having less than 500 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 78,547.

The above table shows further that in all incorporated places, including those of less than 2,500 inhabitants, there was in 1910 a population of 554,144

or 46.5 per cent of the population of the state. The population of all incorporated places, as they existed in 1900, was 441,657, or 41.4 per cent of the population of the state.

Table I of Chapter 2 shows that 14 counties had a larger proportion and 5 counties a smaller proportion of urban population in 1910 than in 1900. Three counties which were wholly rural in 1900 were partly urban in 1910, while 66 counties and the two combinations of counties were wholly rural at both censuses.

In order to compare the *rate of growth* in urban and rural communities it is necessary in each case, as previously explained, to consider the changes in population which have occurred in the *same* territory from one decennial census to another. With this end in view places classed as urban or rural according to their population in 1910 are taken as a basis and the aggregate population in 1910 and in 1900 of the same places is then compared. Thus, as shown in the table on the next page, the total population in 1910 of those places which at that time had 2,500 inhabitants or more was 310,852; in 1900 the total population of these same places (so far as separately reported) was 261,853. It may be noted that the latter figure exceeds the total population in 1900 of those places which at that time had over 2,500 inhabitants each, 252,702 (see table above) by 9,151. The difference is the result of the passage, since 1900, of certain communities from the rural to the urban class.

A comparison of the total population in 1910 of places having a population of not less than 2,500 each with the total population of the same places in 1900, as given in the next table, shows an increase of 18.7 per cent. This represents the rate of growth of urban communities as thus defined. During the same period the rural population, comprising that of the remainder of the state, increased 9.6 per cent. Urban population thus increased nearly twice as rapidly as that of the rural territory. For the United States as a whole urban population increased 34.8 per cent in the last

decade and rural population 11.2 per cent. As shown by Table I of Chapter 2, there are 28 counties in Nebraska in which the population living in rural territory decreased and 3 counties in which there was a decrease in urban population during the last decade. Cass and Otoe were the only counties that decreased in population in both rural and urban districts.

In the next table the population for the state as a whole is distributed so as to show, for 1910 and 1900, the population of the city of Omaha, the combined population of the other cities having, in 1910, 25,000 inhabitants or more, the combined population of cities and villages having in 1910 from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants, and the population of the remainder of the state.

From this table it appears that the city of Omaha increased in population during the last decade a little less than twice as rapidly, and the group of cities and villages having from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants increased a little more than twice as rapidly as the state

as a whole. The group of other cities outside of Omaha having 25,000 inhabitants or more increased almost one-half as rapidly as the state as a whole. The rate of increase in rural population was a little less than that for the state as a whole.

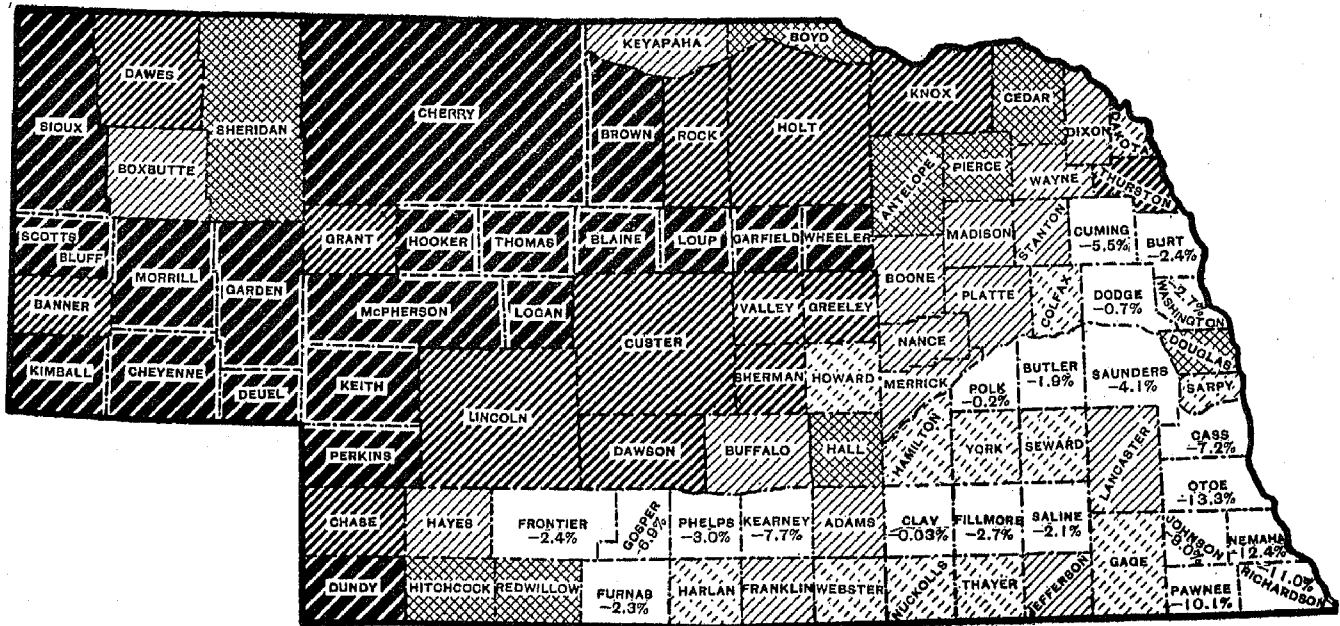

It will also be noticed from this table that of the total increase in the population of the state during the decade, namely, 125,914, a little more than three-fifths was in rural territory.

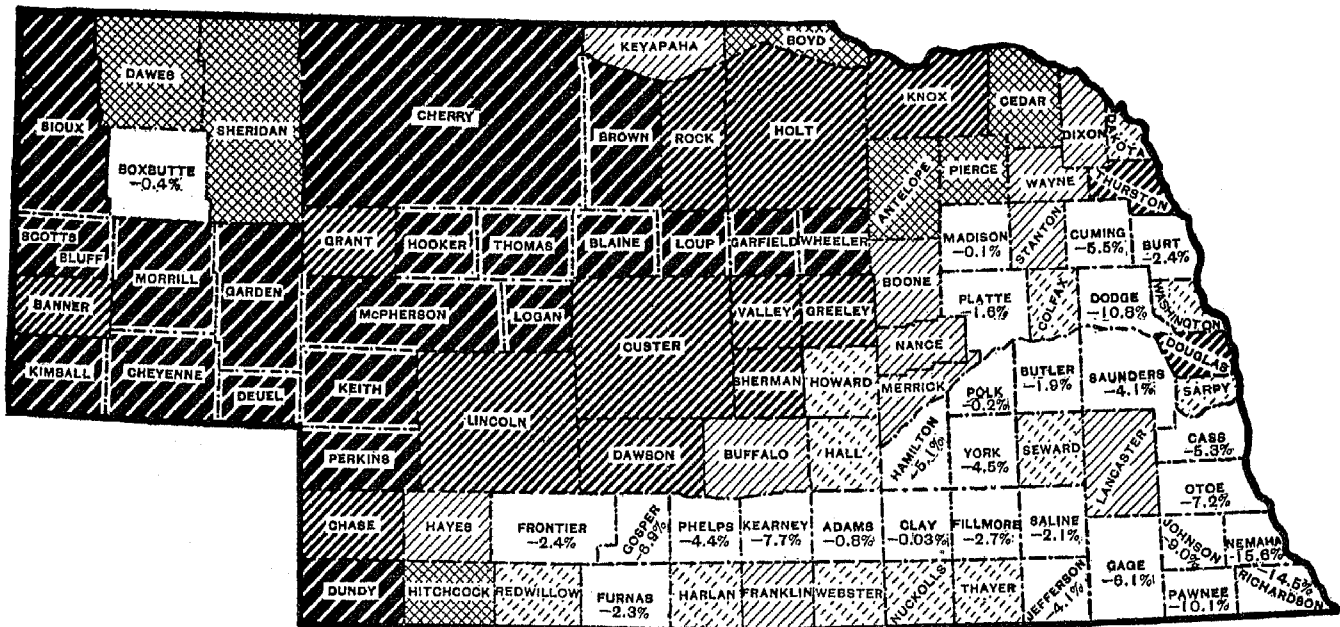
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF NEBRASKA, BY COUNTIES: 1900-1910.

RURAL POPULATION.



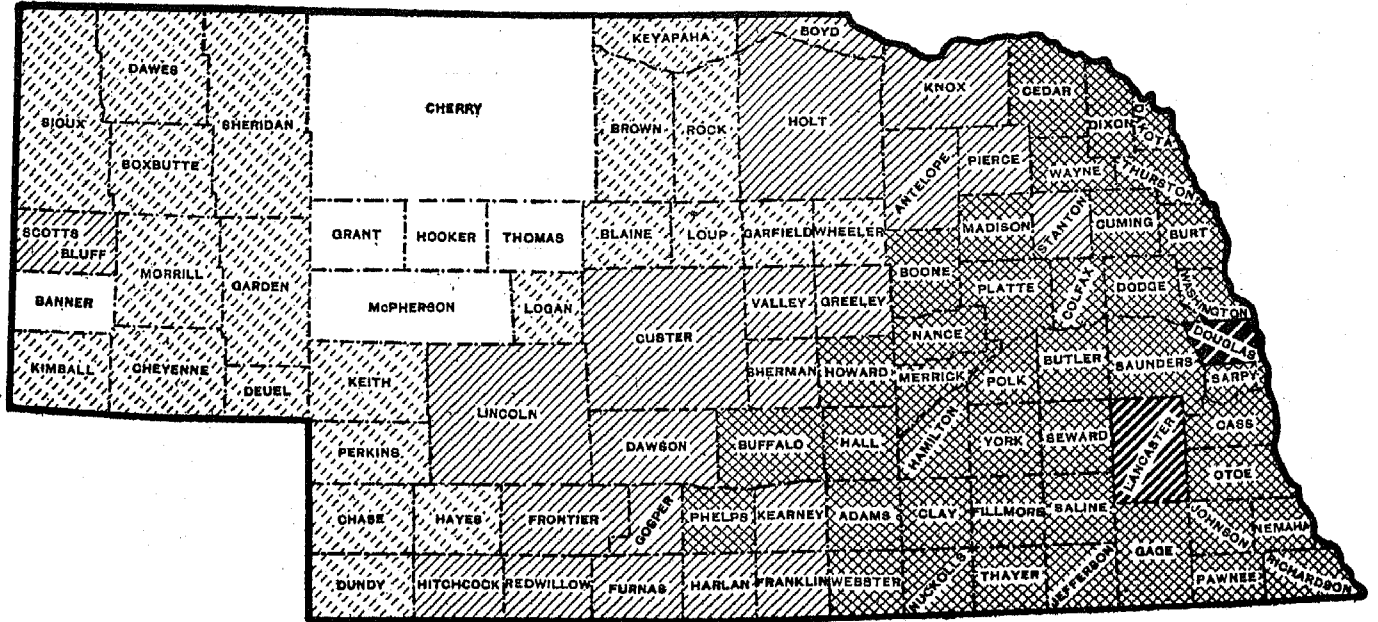

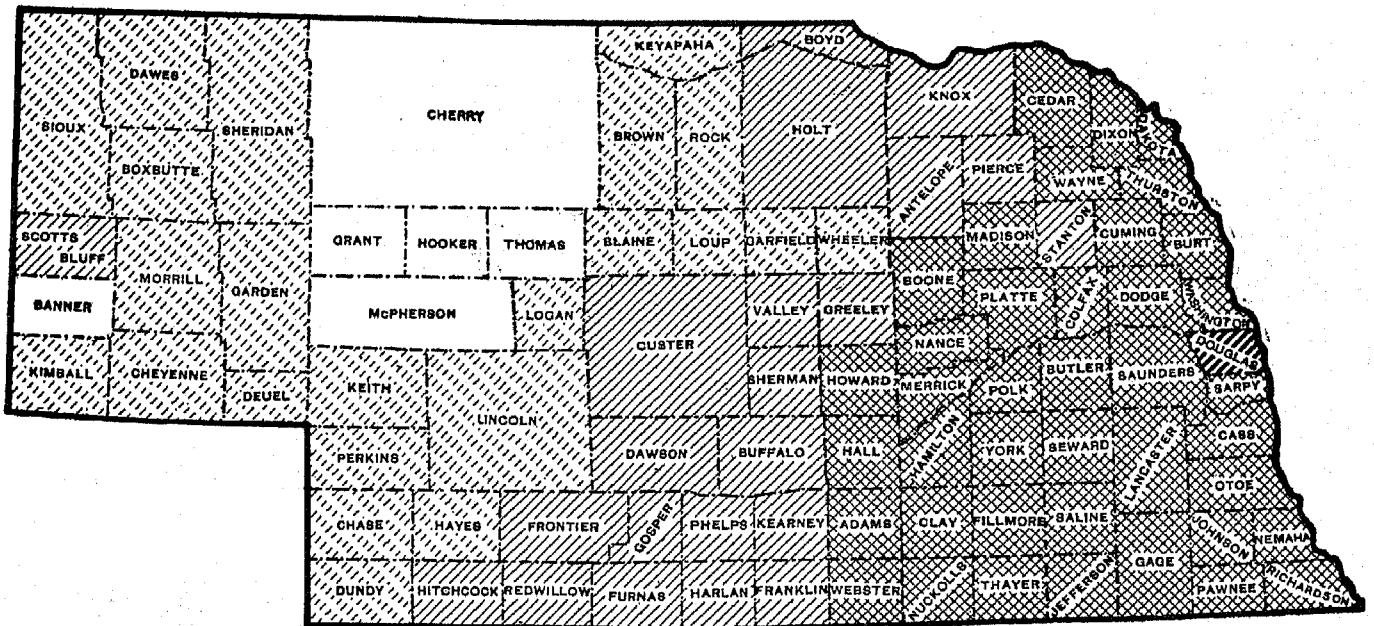

DENSITY OF POPULATION OF NEBRASKA, BY COUNTIES: 1910.

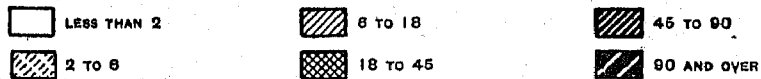

## CHAPTER 2.—COMPOSITION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION.

**Introduction.**—The first chapter having given the number of inhabitants of Nebraska by counties and minor civil divisions, the decennial increase and the density of population, and the proportions urban and rural, the present chapter deals with the composition and characteristics of the population. The two chapters cover all the principal topics of the population census except occupations and ownership of homes.

**Description of the tables.**—The greater part of this chapter consists of five general tables, which present statistics of color, nativity, parentage, sex, citizenship, illiteracy, school attendance, and dwellings and families, as follows: Table I for the state and counties; Table II for the three cities of more than 25,000 inhabitants; Table III for Grand Island, the only city of 10,000 to 25,000 inhabitants; Table IV for places of 2,500 to 10,000; and Table V for wards of Omaha, the only city of more than 50,000.

A series of summary tables (numbered 1 to 15) reproduces from the general tables the more important state and city totals, and presents also certain additional data relative to state of birth, age, and marital condition.

On account of the wide differences in characteristics among different classes of the population, the statistics on each subject are shown according to race, and for the whites according to nativity and parentage. Classification according to nativity and parentage is scarcely necessary for the other races, since nearly all negroes and Indians are native born of native parentage, and nearly all Chinese and Japanese either foreign born or of foreign parentage.

The white population is divided into four groups: (1) Native, native parentage—that is, having both parents born in the United States; (2) native, foreign parentage—having both parents born abroad; (3) native, mixed parentage—having one parent native and the other foreign born; (4) foreign born. As the second and third classes do not differ greatly in characteristics, they are combined in some of the tables; in a few cases all three native white classes are combined.

Since marked differences often exist between urban and rural communities with respect to the composition and characteristics of the population, the two classes are distinguished in connection with several of the subjects. Urban population, as defined by the Bureau of the Census, includes that of all incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, the remainder being classified as rural.

The census inquiry as to school attendance was merely as to whether the person enumerated had attended any kind of school at any time between September 1, 1909, and the date of enumeration, April 15, 1910. The Census Bureau classifies as illiterate any person 10 years of age or over who is unable to write, regardless of ability to read.

**Color and nativity** (Table 1).—Of the total population of Nebraska, 642,075, or 53.9 per cent, are native whites of native parentage; 362,353, or 30.4 per cent, are native whites of foreign or mixed parentage; 175,865, or 14.8 per cent, are foreign-born whites; and 7,689, or 0.6 per cent, are negroes. The corresponding percentages in 1900 were 51.9, 30.6, 16.6, and 0.6, respectively, the proportion of native whites of native parentage having increased somewhat during the decade.

In 7 of the 92 counties foreign-born whites constitute as much as one-fifth of the population, the proportion being highest (23.6 per cent) in Colfax County. In 54 counties, however, more than one-fourth of the population are native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, the maximum percentage (52.9) being that for Cuming County. (See also maps on page 72.)

Of the urban population, 51.8 per cent are native whites of native parentage; of the rural population, 54.6 per cent. The corresponding proportions for native whites of foreign or mixed parentage are 27.6 and 31.3 per cent, respectively. The percentage of foreign-born whites is 18.3 in the urban population and 13.5 in the rural; the percentage of negroes is 2.1 in the urban and 0.1 in the rural.

**Sex** (Table 2).—In the total population of the state there are 627,782 males and 564,432 females, or 111.2 males to 100 females. In 1900 the ratio was 112.5 to 100. Among native whites the ratio is 107.1 to 100; and among foreign-born whites, 136.7 to 100. In the urban population there are 106.3 males to 100 females, and in the rural, 113.

**State of birth** (Tables 3 and 4).—Of the native population—that is, population born in the United States—58.6 per cent were born in Nebraska and 41.4 per cent outside the state. Of the native white population, 41.1 per cent were born outside the state, and of the native negro, 78.2 per cent. Persons born outside the state constitute a much larger proportion of the native population in urban than in rural communities.

**Foreign nationalities** (Tables 5 and 12).—Of the foreign-born white population of Nebraska, persons born in Germany represent 32.6 per cent; Austria, 13.9; Sweden, 13.2; Denmark, 7.8; Russia, 7.4; Ireland, 4.6; England, 4.6; Canada, 4.2; Italy, 2.2; Greece, 2; all other countries, 7.9. Of the total white stock of foreign origin, which includes persons born abroad and also natives having one or both parents born abroad, Germany contributed 37.5 per cent; Austria, 11.7; Sweden, 10.9; Ireland, 7; Denmark, 6; England, 5.7; Russia, 4.6; Canada, 4.5; Scotland, 1.6; Norway, 1.4; Switzerland, 1.2.

**Voting and militia ages** (Table 6).—The total number of males 21 years of age and over is 353,626, representing 29.7 per cent of the population. Of such males, 47.7 per cent are native whites of native parentage, 24.3 per cent native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 26.7 per cent foreign-born whites, and 0.9 per cent negroes. Of the 94,345 foreign-born white males of voting age, 57,270, or 60.7 per cent, are naturalized. Males of militia age—18 to 44 years—number 267,497.

**Age** (Tables 7, 8, and 13).—Of the total population, 11.8 per cent are under 5 years of age, 20.9 per cent from 5 to 14 years, inclusive, 20.7 per cent from 15 to 24, 27.7 per cent from 25 to 44, and 18.7 per cent 45 years of age and over. The foreign-born white population comprises comparatively few children, only 3.4 per cent of this class being under 15 years of age, while 86.5 per cent are 25 years of age and over. Of the native whites of foreign or mixed parentage only 35.8 per cent are 25 and over, and of the native whites of native parentage, only 41.1 per cent.

The urban population shows a smaller proportion of children than the rural and a larger proportion of persons in the prime of life. Migration to the city explains this at least in part. Of the urban population, 32.7 per cent are from 25 to 44 years of age, inclusive, and of the rural population, 25.9 per cent.

**School attendance** (Table 9).—The total number of persons of school age—that is, from 6 to 20 years, inclusive—is 373,868, of whom 261,219, or 69.9 per cent, attended school. In addition to these, 9,077 persons under 6 and 5,533 of 21 and over attended school. For boys from 6 to 20 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 69.6; for girls, 70.2. For children from 6 to 14 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 90.2. The percentage for children of this age among native whites of foreign or mixed parentage was 90.8; among native whites of native parentage, 90.1; among negroes, 87.9; and among foreign-born whites, 85.1. (See Table I.) The percentage attending school for children from 6 to 14 was 91.9 in the urban communities, and 89.7 in the rural; for persons from 15 to 20, the percentages were 37.2 and 40.6, respectively.

**Illiteracy** (Table 10).—There are 18,009 illiterates in the state, representing 1.9 per cent of the total population 10 years of age and over, as compared with 2.3 per cent in 1900. The percentage of illiteracy is 7.1

among foreign-born whites, 0.6 among native whites, and 7.2 among negroes.

For all classes combined the percentage of illiterates is 2.6 in urban communities and 1.7 in rural. For each of the native white classes the rural percentage exceeds the urban, although the differences are inconsiderable; for the foreign-born whites, however, the urban percentage (10.1) exceeds the rural (5.7).

For persons from 10 to 20 years of age, inclusive, whose literacy depends largely upon present school facilities and school attendance, the percentage of illiteracy is very slight, only 0.5. (See Table I.)

**Marital condition** (Tables 11 and 14).—In the population 15 years of age and over, 40.9 per cent of the males are single and 29.4 per cent of the females. The percentage married is 54.2 for males and 61.9 for females; and the percentage widowed 3.8 and 7.8, respectively. The percentages of those reported as divorced, 0.6 both for males and for females, are believed to be too small, because of the probability that many divorced persons class themselves as single or widowed.

That the percentage single is so much smaller for women than for men is due partly to the excess of males in the population and partly to the fact that women marry younger. Thus 9.1 per cent of the females from 15 to 19 years of age are married, as compared with 0.5 per cent of the males; and 48.9 per cent of the females from 20 to 24 years are married, as compared with 19.1 per cent of the males. For those from 25 to 34 years the percentages are 78.5 and 60.6, respectively, while those from 35 to 44 are 86.6 and 79.2. Among those 45 and over the percentage married is higher for males than for females. That there is a larger proportion of widows than of widowers may indicate that men more often remarry than women, but, since husbands are generally older than their wives, the marriage relationship is more often broken by death of the husband than by death of the wife.

For the main elements of the population the percentages of married persons among those 15 years of age and over are as follows: Foreign-born whites, 66.6 for males and 74.5 for females; native whites of native parentage, 54.2 and 61.8, respectively; native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 44.2 and 54; negroes, 48.1 and 59.2; Indians, 60.3 and 65.5.

These percentages by no means indicate the relative tendency of the several classes as regards marriage. To determine that, the comparison should be made by age periods, since the proportion married in any class is determined largely by the proportion who have reached the marrying age. Similarly, the proportion widowed depends largely on the proportion past middle life. The percentage married for males is slightly higher, and for females decidedly higher, in the rural than in the urban population.

**Dwellings and families.**—The total number of dwellings in Nebraska is 258,967, and the total number of families 265,549, indicating that in comparatively few cases does more than one family occupy a dwelling. (See Table I.) The average number of persons per dwelling is 4.6, and the average number per family, 4.5.

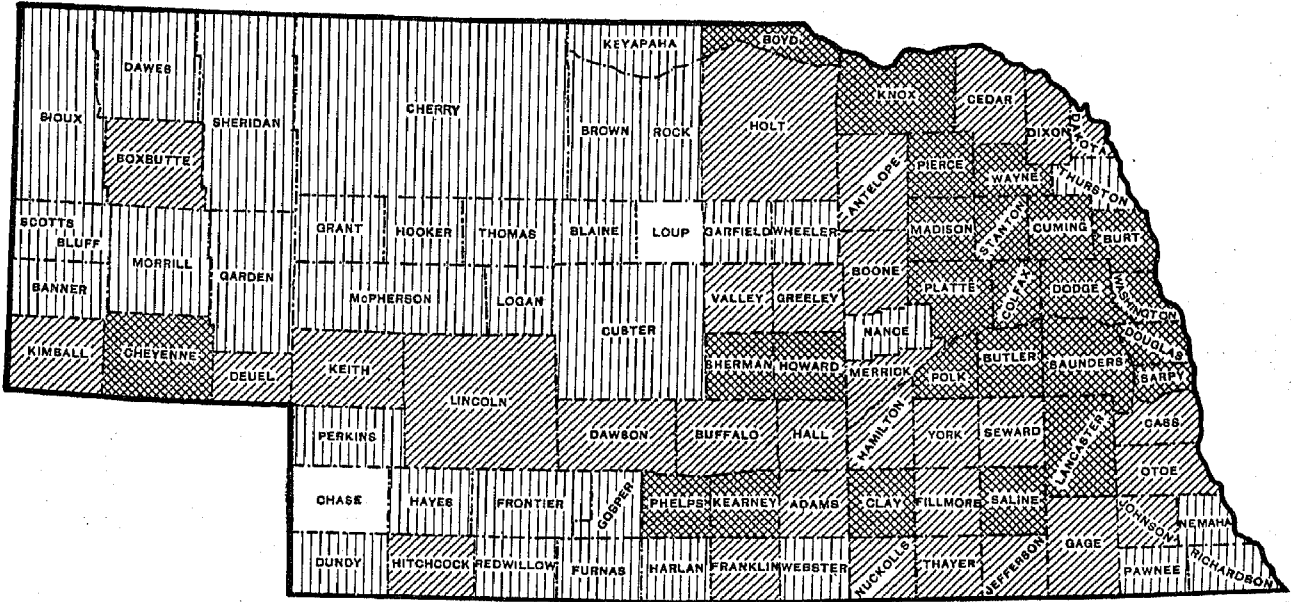

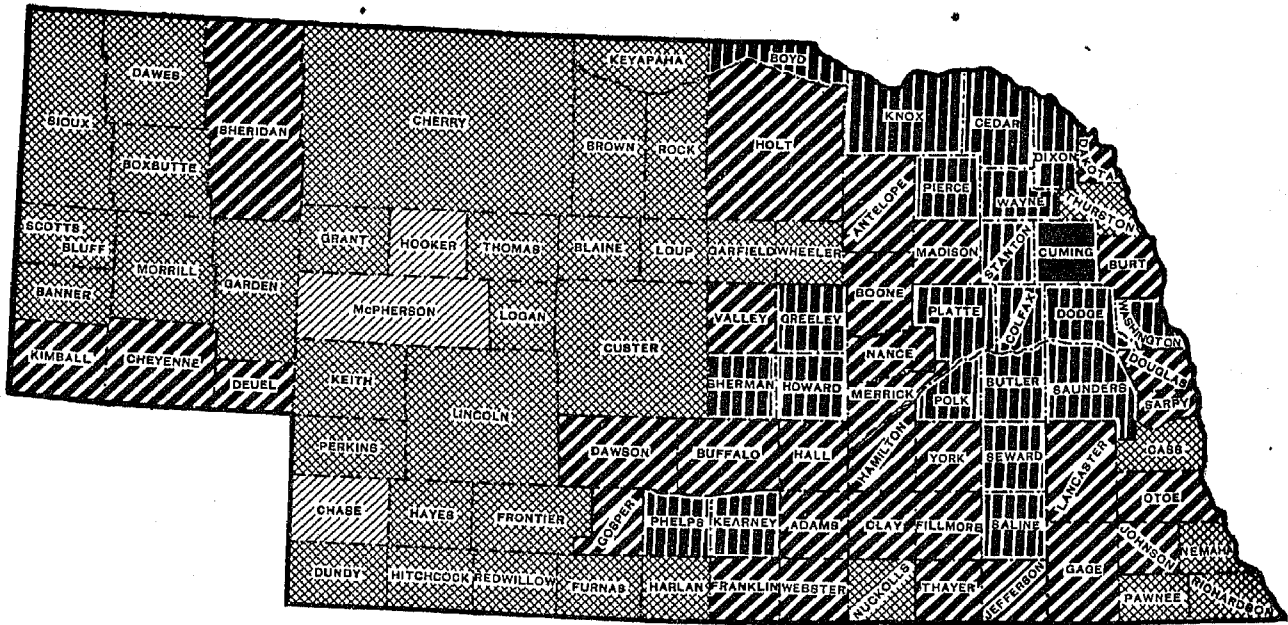




# NEVADA.

## CHAPTER 1.—NUMBER OF INHABITANTS.

**Introduction.**—This chapter gives the population of Nevada, by counties and minor civil divisions, as enumerated at the Thirteenth Census, taken as of April 15, 1910, with comparative statements of population where possible, and a statement and discussion for the state as a whole of the population living in urban and in rural territory. The statistics are given in detail in two general tables.

Table 1 (p. 78) shows the population of Nevada, distributed according to counties and minor civil divisions, at the last three censuses, namely, those of 1910, 1900, and 1890. The arrangement of counties and of the primary divisions in each county is alphabetical. The figures for secondary divisions are printed in italics. The changes in boundaries, name, or form of organization that have taken place since 1900 are indicated in the footnotes to the table. For changes between 1890 and 1900 reference must be made to the census report of 1900.

It may be noticed from Table 1 that the county totals for 1900 in eight counties exceed the aggregate population of the minor civil divisions as shown in the table. This is for the most part due to the fact that some of the minor civil divisions existing in these counties in 1900 have been abolished, their territory having been annexed to other divisions or taken to form new divisions. Duck Valley Indian Reservation, which lies partly in Nevada and partly in Idaho, was enumerated independently in 1900 as a division lying entirely in Nevada.

In 1890 population was not returned for minor civil divisions, except for Virginia City, Carson City, and Reno. Virginia City is the only minor civil division in Storey County for which population was separately reported in 1900, and for five other counties comparisons by minor civil divisions for 1900 with 1910 can not be made. This is because of the organization of one new

county, the redistricting of three old ones, and numerous changes in the minor civil divisions of another. In the remaining nine counties of the state comparisons by minor civil divisions for 1910 and 1900 are made for all divisions existing in 1910, except those organized since 1900 and one precinct for which no population was reported in 1910.

Table 2 (p. 80) shows the cities and the one incorporated town in Nevada, alphabetically arranged, with their population in 1910, 1900, and 1890.

The population of Nevada, by counties, at each of the last five censuses, from 1870 to 1910, inclusive; the increase during the last two decades; the density of the total and the rural population at the census of 1910; and the distribution of the population at the last two censuses according to urban and rural districts, are given in Table I of Chapter 2.

The tables and text of the present chapter contain few technical expressions whose meaning is not apparent. The census usage in regard to certain terms is, however, explained below:

**Density of population.**—The density of population of a state or county is obtained by dividing its total population by the number of square miles in its land area. In calculating the density of rural population, the same divisor is used as it is not practicable to ascertain and deduct the exact area covered by the urban districts, and even if this could be done with accuracy the deduction of this area from the total land area would ordinarily make no appreciable difference in the resulting quotient.

**Minor civil divisions.**—The counties are divided generally into smaller political units which bear different designations in the different parts of the country, such as towns, townships, election precincts, etc. Of these minor civil divisions those which rank next to the county as geographic areas are termed primary divisions. In many instances, however, these primary divisions contain political units of still smaller area, such as cities, incorporated villages, towns, or boroughs. These smaller political units are referred to as secondary divisions.

**HISTORICAL NOTE.**—This state takes its name from the Sierra Nevada Mountains, which lie just beyond its western and southwestern borders. Nevada is a Spanish word signifying "snow clad" or "white as snow."

The first white man to enter the region now constituting Nevada was probably Francisco Garcés, a Franciscan friar, who passed through the southern part in 1775 on his way from Sonora to California. Other friars followed him, but no settlements were made. In 1825 the Humboldt River was discovered by Peter S. Ogden, an employe of the Hudson Bay Company. In 1849 a trading post was founded on or near the present site of Genoa for the purpose of furnishing supplies to gold seekers on their way to California. Although many such emigrants passed through the region now included within the limits of Nevada, it had very few inhabitants until the discovery of the famous Comstock Lode in 1859, after which miners and prospectors came in large numbers.

This region formed a part of the Spanish possessions in America until the Mexican revolution in 1821, after which it became a part of Mexico. By the treaty of Guadalupe-Hidalgo, in 1848, at the close of the war with Mexico, that country ceded to the

United States its claims to territory north of the Rio Grande and Gila Rivers and extending westward to the Pacific Ocean.

In 1850 the area between California and Texas was organized into the territories of Utah and New Mexico, and the greater part of what is now Nevada was included in the former territory, while that portion lying south of the thirty-seventh parallel (the northern boundary of New Mexico) was made a part of the latter. In March, 1861, that part of Utah lying west of the thirty-ninth meridian from Washington (approximately the one hundred and sixteenth from Greenwich) was organized as Nevada territory.

In 1864, under authority of an enabling act passed by Congress in the same year, a state constitution was adopted, and in October of that year Nevada, with eastern boundary at longitude 38° west from Washington, was admitted to the Union. Two years later the thirty-seventh meridian from Washington was made the eastern boundary, and at the same time the area lying south of the thirty-seventh parallel and extending from California to the Colorado River and the thirty-seventh meridian from Washington was taken from the territory of Arizona and added to Nevada.

**Urban and rural population defined.**—The Census Bureau, for purposes of discussion, has defined urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside of such incorporated places.

The comparisons of the urban and rural population in 1910 with that at earlier enumerations may be made either with respect to the varying proportions of the two classes at successive enumerations or with respect to the increase between enumerations. In order to contrast the *proportion* of the total population living in urban or rural territory at the census of 1910 with the proportion urban or rural at the preceding census, it is necessary to classify the territory according to the conditions *as they existed* at each census. In this comparison a place having less than 2,500 inhabitants in 1900 and over 2,500 in 1910 is classed with the rural population for 1900 and

with the urban for 1910. On the other hand, in order to present fairly the contrast between urban and rural communities, as regards their *rate of growth*, it is necessary to consider the changes in population for the *same* territory which have occurred from one decennial census to another. For this purpose the territory which in 1910 was urban or rural, as the case may be, is taken as the basis, and the population in 1900 for the same territory (so far as separately reported at that census) is presented, even though part of the territory may, on the basis of its population at the earlier census, have then been in a different class. This avoids the disturbing effect on comparisons which would arise from the passage, for example, of communities formerly classed as rural into the urban group. These two distinct forms of comparison are made in Table I of Chapter 2 for the state as a whole and for each county separately for the last two censuses.

### TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

**Population of the state.**—The population of Nevada is 81,875. Compared with a population of 42,335 in 1900, this represents an increase during the last decade of 39,540, or 93.4 per cent. During the same period the total population of the United States increased 21 per cent. During the two preceding decades, 1880–1890 and 1890–1900, the population of the

state decreased 23.9 per cent and 10.6 per cent, respectively.

The following table shows the population of Nevada at each census from 1860 to 1910, inclusive, together with the increase and per cent of increase during each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole.

Nevada was organized as a territory in 1861. The population of the territory now constituting the state was enumerated for the first time at the census of 1860. During the 20 years from 1860 to 1880 the population of Nevada increased 55,409, and was in 1880 nine times as great as in 1860. Each of the following two decades showed decreases. In the last decade, however, the increase was enormous, and in 1910 the population of Nevada was almost twice as great as in 1900.

A comparison of the rates of increase for the state with those for the United States, as given in the preceding table, shows that during the two decades 1860–1870 and 1870–1880 the rates for the state were greater than those for the country as a whole. From 1880 to 1900 the population of the state decreased 32 per cent, while that of the United States increased 51.5 per cent. During the last decade the rate of increase for the state was about four and one-half times as great as the rate for the United States.

**Principal cities.**—Nevada has seven cities. Reno, the largest, has a population of 10,867, and Search-

light, the smallest city, a population of 387. The aggregate population of the seven cities is 19,698, or 24.1 per cent of the total population of the state. The population in 1910 of these cities, with comparative figures where possible, for 1900 and 1890, is given in Table 2.

**Counties.**—Nevada has 15 counties. The population of these counties ranges from 1,786 in Lander County to 17,434 in Washoe County.

The following territorial change has been made since 1900: Part of Lincoln County was taken in 1909 to form Clark County.

Owing to the organization of this new county from part of another county, the comparison of increase or decrease in population is made for only 13 counties and for one combination of counties. The counties combined are Lincoln and Clark. In order to determine the actual rate of increase for these counties, it is necessary to compare their combined population at the time of the 1910 census with the population of Lincoln County in 1900. Eleven counties and the one combination of counties have increased in population during the last decade. The rates of increase

of the 11 counties range from 16.4 per cent in Lander County to 559 per cent in Nye County, and the absolute increases range from 252 in Lander County to 8,293 in Washoe County. The one combination of counties, Lincoln with Clark, increased 3,526, or 107.4 per cent. Eureka and Storey Counties decreased in population 6.3 per cent and 17.1 per cent, respectively. The aggregate increase of population from 1900 to 1910 in the one combination of counties and in the 11 counties that showed an increase was 40,292; the aggregate decrease of population in the two counties that showed a decrease was 752. The difference, 39,540, is, of course, the total increase of population in the state.

The maps on page 76 show the increase or decrease in the total and the rural population, respectively, of each county of Nevada during the last decade. In the counties shown in white the population decreased; for the other counties the different rates of increase are indicated by differences in shading.

**Density of population.**—The total land area of the state is 109,821 square miles. The average number of persons to the square mile in 1910 was 0.7; in both 1900 and 1890 it was 0.4. The average number per square mile for the United States as a whole in 1910 was 30.9. Nevada has a lower density of population than any other state of the United States.

The density of population is given by counties in Table I of Chapter 2 and in the maps on page 77, both for the entire population and for that living in rural territory, excluding in the latter case the popu-

lation of places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, but not excluding the land area of such places.

Nye County, with 18,294 square miles, has the largest area. Ormsby County, with 156 square miles and 21.9 persons per square mile, has the smallest area and the highest density. Douglas, Esmeralda, Lyon, Storey, and Washoe are the only other counties averaging more than 1 person per square mile.

**Minor civil divisions.**—The political divisions into which counties are subdivided are collectively termed "Minor civil divisions." In Nevada the counties are divided into 243 primary divisions, comprising 240 election precincts, 2 townships, and 1 district. There are also 8 secondary divisions, comprising 7 cities and 1 town. Of these divisions, 5 cities form parts of the precincts in which they are located. One city and the 1 town are coextensive with the precincts in which they are located, while the remaining city comprises 1 precinct and parts of several others. Besides these minor civil divisions there are 4 Indian reservations and part of another in the state, 2 unincorporated cities, and 1 unincorporated town.

**Urban and rural population compared.**—The following table presents the population of Nevada at the censuses of 1910, 1900, and 1890, respectively, distributed between urban and rural territory, together with the percentage of the total population contained in each class at each of the censuses named. The classification is based upon the population of each place as it existed at each census.

The urban population comprised in 1910 that of Reno and Sparks; in 1900, that of Reno and Virginia City; and in 1890, that of Reno, Virginia City, and Carson City. Virginia City had a population of over 2,500 in 1900 and 1890; although unincorporated it was, at these censuses, considered as urban territory. The rural population included that living in the remainder of the state.

As shown by the above table, there was a decrease in the proportion of urban population from 33.8 per cent in 1890 to 17 per cent in 1900 and to 16.3 per cent in 1910. For the United States as a whole the urban population constituted 46.3 per cent of the total population in 1910 and 40.5 per cent of the total population in 1900.

Table I of Chapter 2 shows that Washoe, the only county having urban population both in 1900 and 1910,

had a larger proportion in 1910 than in 1900. One county which was partly urban in 1900 was wholly rural in 1910, while 11 counties and the one combination of counties were wholly rural at both censuses.

In the following table the population for the state as a whole is distributed so as to show, for 1910 and 1900, the combined population of cities having, in 1910, 2,500 inhabitants or more and the population of the remainder of the state.

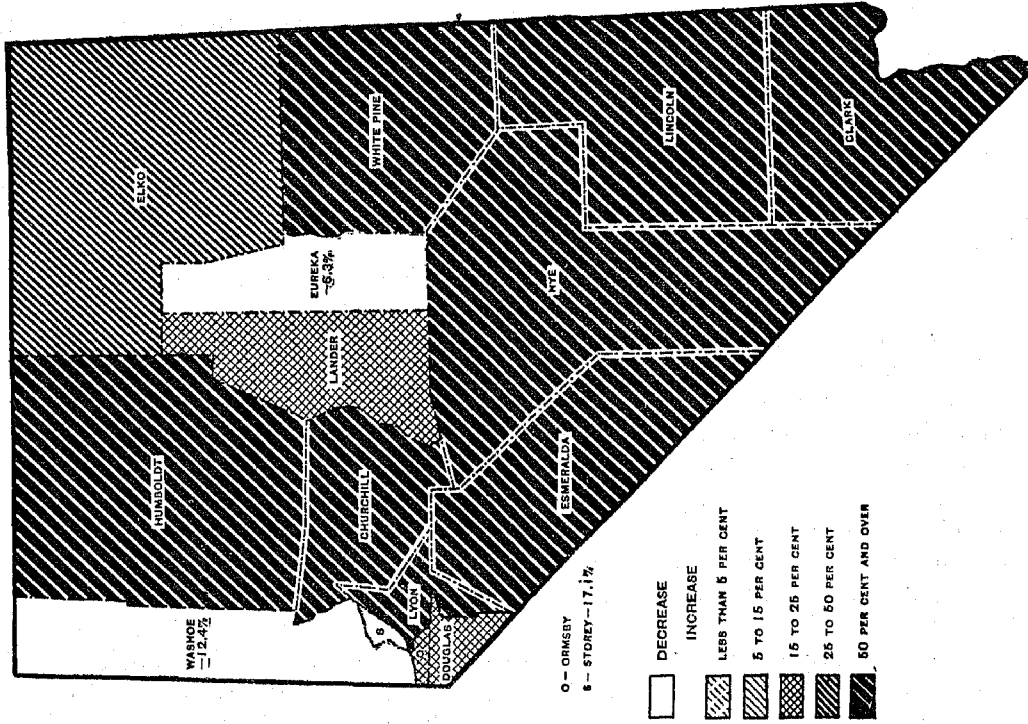
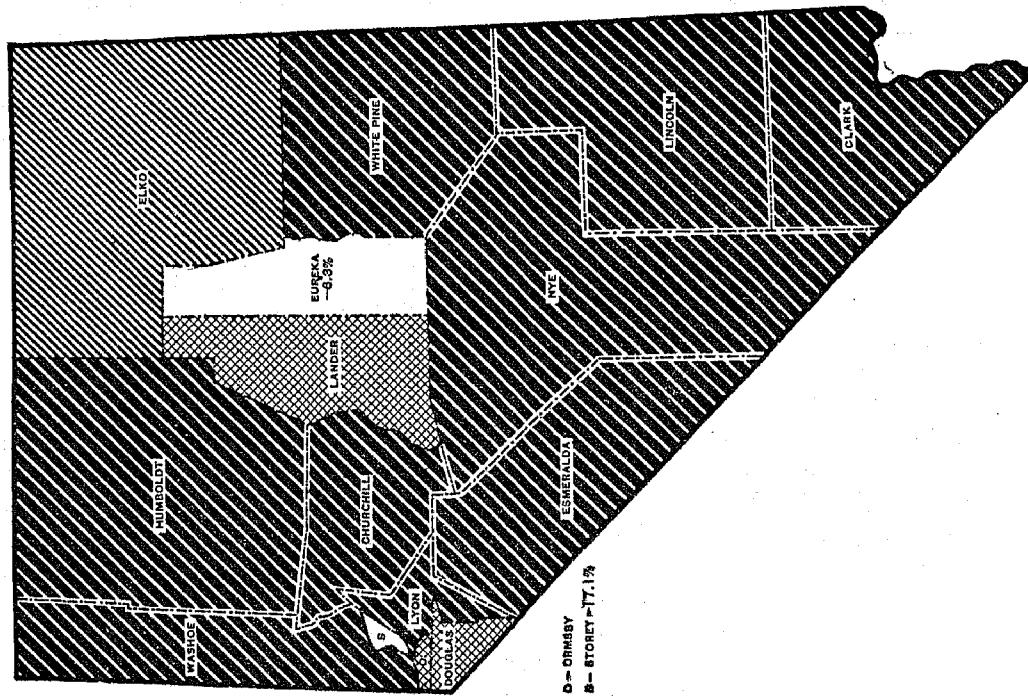

TOTAL POPULATION.

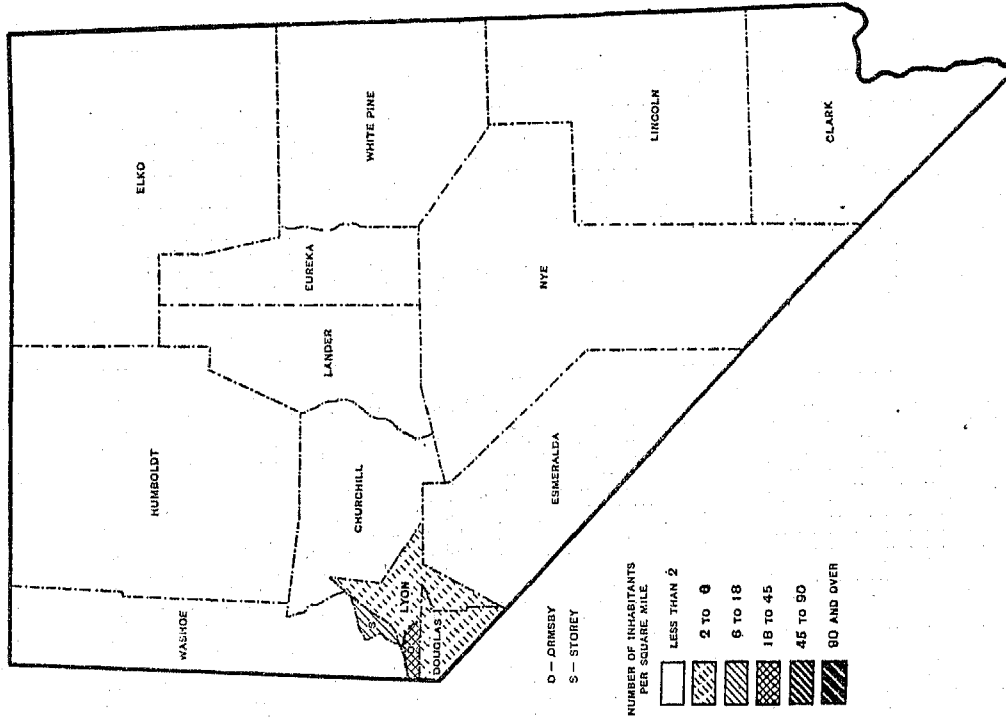
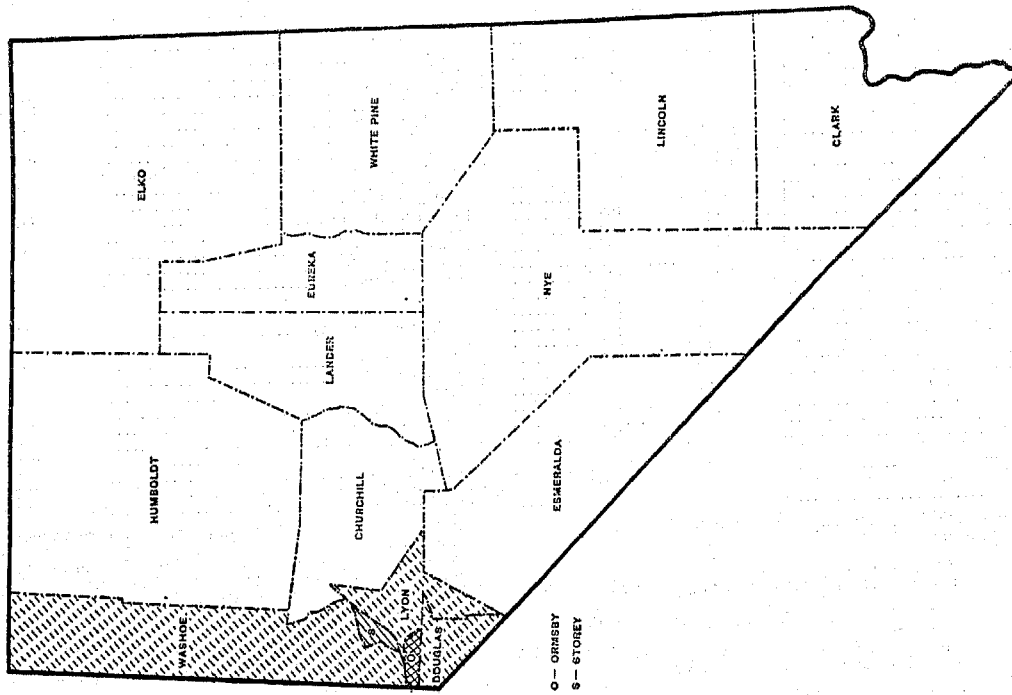
RURAL POPULATION.

## CHAPTER 2.—COMPOSITION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION.

**Introduction.**—The first chapter having given the number of inhabitants of Nevada by counties and minor civil divisions, the decennial increase and the density of population, and the proportions urban and rural, the present chapter deals with the composition and characteristics of the population. The two chapters cover all the principal topics of the population census except occupations and ownership of homes.

**Description of the tables.**—The greater part of this chapter consists of three general tables, which present statistics of color, nativity, parentage, sex, citizenship, illiteracy, school attendance, and dwellings and families, as follows: Table I for the state and counties; Table II for Reno, the only city of more than 10,000 inhabitants; and Table III for Sparks, a city of 2,500 inhabitants.

A series of summary tables (numbered 1 to 12) reproduces from the general tables the more important state totals, and presents also certain additional data relative to state of birth, age, and marital condition.

On account of the wide differences in characteristics among the different classes of the population, the statistics on each subject are shown according to race, and for the whites according to nativity and parentage. Classification according to nativity and parentage is scarcely necessary for the other races, since nearly all negroes and Indians are native born of native parentage, and nearly all Chinese and Japanese either foreign born or of foreign parentage.

The white population is divided into four groups: (1) Native, native parentage—that is, having both parents born in the United States; (2) native, foreign parentage—having both parents born abroad; (3) native, mixed parentage—having one parent native and the other foreign born; (4) foreign born. As the second and third classes do not differ greatly in characteristics, they are combined in some of the tables; in a few cases all three native white classes are combined.

Since marked differences often exist between urban and rural communities with respect to the composition and characteristics of the population, the two classes are distinguished in connection with several of the subjects. Urban population, as defined by the Bureau of the Census, includes that of all incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, the remainder being classified as rural.

The census inquiry as to school attendance was merely as to whether the person enumerated had at-

tended any kind of school at any time between September 1, 1909, and the date of enumeration, April 15, 1910.

The Census Bureau classifies as illiterate any person 10 years of age or over who is unable to write, regardless of ability to read.

**Color and nativity (Table 1).**—Of the total population of Nevada, 35,326, or 43.1 per cent, are native whites of native parentage; 20,951, or 25.5 per cent, are native whites of foreign or mixed parentage; 17,999, or 22 per cent, are foreign-born whites; and 5,240, or 6.4 per cent, are Indians. The corresponding percentages in 1900 were 35.7, 27.7, 20.3, and 12.3, the proportion of native whites of native parentage having increased during the decade. In 1910 Chinese and Japanese each constituted 1.1 per cent of the population and negroes 0.6 per cent. By counties the percentage of foreign-born whites ranges from 12.9 in Churchill to 30.1 in White Pine, and the percentage of native whites of foreign or mixed parentage from 18.4 in Churchill to 41.3 in Storey. (See maps on page 87.)

Of the urban population, 49.8 per cent, approximately one-half, are native whites of native parentage; of the rural population, a smaller proportion, 41.8 per cent. The percentage of native whites of foreign or mixed parentage is 26 in the urban population and 25.4 in the rural; of foreign-born whites, 19.3 in the urban and 22.5 in the rural; all other classes combined, comprising negroes, Indians, Chinese, and Japanese, 4.8 in the urban and 10.2 in the rural.

**Sex (Table 2).**—In the total population of the state there are 52,551 males and 29,324 females, or 179.2 males to 100 females. In 1900 the ratio was 153 to 100. Among native whites the ratio is 153.4 to 100 and among foreign-born whites 331.4 to 100. In the urban population there are 133.1 males to 100 females, and in the rural, 190.4.

**State of birth (Tables 3 and 4).**—Of the total native population—that is, population born in the United States—34.8 per cent were born in Nevada and 65.2 per cent outside the state; of the native white population, 70.2 per cent were born outside the state; of the native Indian, 9.3 per cent; and of the native negro, 91.1 per cent.

**Foreign nationalities (Table 5).**—Of the foreign-born white population of Nevada, persons born in Italy represent 15.7 per cent; Germany, 10.6; Canada,

10.2; England, 10; Ireland, 9.5; Greece, 5.8; Austria, 4.6; Spain, 4.3; Mexico, 4; Sweden, 3.9; France, 3.6; Denmark, 3.4; all other countries, 14.3. Of the total white stock of foreign origin, which includes persons born abroad and also natives having one or both parents born abroad, Ireland contributed 15.4 per cent; Germany, 13.7; England, 12.9; Canada, 10.5; Italy, 10.3; Scotland, 3.6; Denmark, 3.4; Sweden, 3.1; Greece, 2.7; Austria, 2.7; France, 2.6; Spain, 2.3.

**Voting and militia ages** (Table 6).—The total number of males 21 years of age and over is 40,026, representing 48.9 per cent of the population. Of such males, 38 per cent are native whites of native parentage, 21.6 per cent native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, and 31.9 per cent foreign-born whites, while 8.5 per cent are in all other classes combined, comprising negroes, Indians, Chinese, and Japanese. Of the 12,767 foreign-born white males of voting age, 5,606, or 43.9 per cent, are naturalized. Males of militia age—18 to 44—number 29,383.

**Age** (Tables 7 and 8).—Of the total population, 7.8 per cent are under 5 years of age, 12.9 per cent from 5 to 14 years, inclusive, 16.2 per cent from 15 to 24, 41.2 per cent from 25 to 44, and 21.2 per cent 45 years of age and over. The foreign-born white population comprises comparatively few children, only 1.9 per cent of this class being under 15 years of age, while more than four-fifths (82 per cent) are 25 years of age and over. Of the native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 57.9 per cent are 25 and over, and of the native whites of native parentage, 55.6 per cent.

The age composition of the urban population does not differ materially from that of the rural. Of the urban population, 41.1 per cent are from 25 to 44 years of age, inclusive, and of the rural population, 41.2 per cent.

**School attendance** (Table 9).—The total number of persons of school age—that is, from 6 to 20 years, inclusive—is 16,132, of whom 10,141, or 62.9 per cent, attended school. In addition to these, 196 children under 6 and 220 persons 21 and over attended school. For boys from 6 to 20 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 59.3; for girls, 66.9. For children from 6 to 14 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 83.2. The percentage for children of this age among native whites of native parentage was 86.3; among native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 88.8; among foreign-born whites, 76.7. (See Table I.) The percentage attending school for children from 6 to 14 was 85.6 in the urban population and 82.8 in the rural; for persons from 15 to 20 the corresponding percentages were 43.3 and 32.4, respectively.

**Illiteracy** (Table 10).—There are 4,702 illiterates in the state, representing 6.7 per cent of the total population 10 years of age and over, as compared with 13.3 per cent in 1900. The percentage of illiteracy is 0.4

among native whites, 7.6 among foreign-born whites, 71.7 among Indians, and 5.5 among negroes.

For all classes combined, the percentage of illiterates is 2.6 in the urban population and 7.5 in the rural. For each class separately, except the Indians, the percentage is higher in rural communities than in urban.

For persons from 10 to 20 years, inclusive, whose literacy depends largely upon present school facilities and school attendance, the percentage of illiteracy is 6.2. (See Table I.)

**Marital condition** (Table 11).—In the population 15 years of age and over, 51.3 per cent of the males are single and 21 per cent of the females. The percentage married is 41.4 for males and 67.1 for females, and the percentage widowed 4.6 and 10.1, respectively. The percentages of those reported as divorced, 1.4 and 1.3, respectively, are believed to be too small, because of the probability that many divorced persons class themselves as single or widowed.

That the percentage single is so much smaller for women than for men is due partly to the excess of males in the total population and partly to the fact that women marry younger. Thus 13.4 per cent of the females from 15 to 19 years of age are married, as compared with 0.6 per cent of the males, and 58.2 per cent of the females from 20 to 24 years of age are married, as compared with 12.7 per cent of the males. In the next age group, 25 to 34 years, the percentages are 80.9 and 39.4, respectively; in the age group 35 to 44 they are 84.7 and 55.6; and for persons 45 and over, they are 63.9 and 54.4. That there is a larger proportion of widows than of widowers may indicate that men more often remarry than women, but, since husbands are generally older than their wives, the marriage relationship is more often broken by death of the husband than by death of the wife.

For the main elements of the population the percentages of married persons among those 15 years of age and over are as follows: Foreign-born whites, 38.5 for males and 71.2 for females; native whites of native parentage, 42.6 and 67, respectively; native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 39.9 and 65.4; Indians, 61.9 and 67.1; negroes, 44.5 and 45.5.

These percentages by no means indicate the relative tendency of the several classes as regards marriage. To determine that, the comparison should be made by age periods, since the proportion married in any class is determined largely by the proportion who have reached the marrying age. Similarly, the proportion widowed depends largely on the proportion past middle life. The percentage married for males is higher in the urban population than in the rural, but for females it is higher in the rural.

**Dwellings and families.**—The total number of dwellings in Nevada is 23,044, and the total number of families 23,677, indicating that in comparatively few cases does more than one family occupy a dwelling. (See Table I.) The average number of persons per dwelling is 3.6, and the average number per family, 3.5.

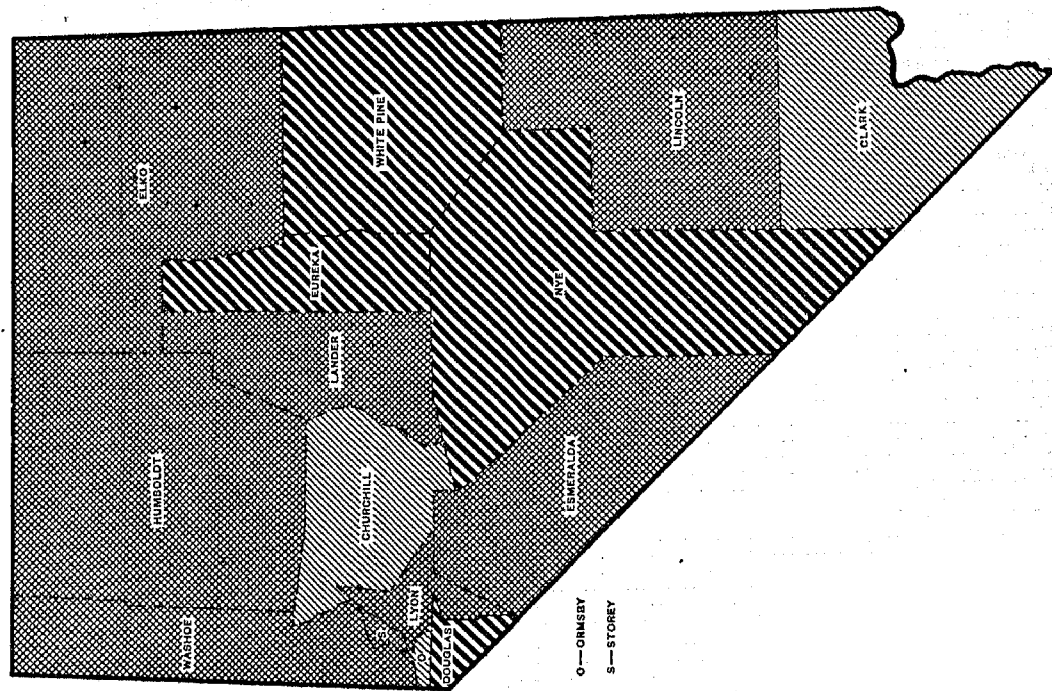

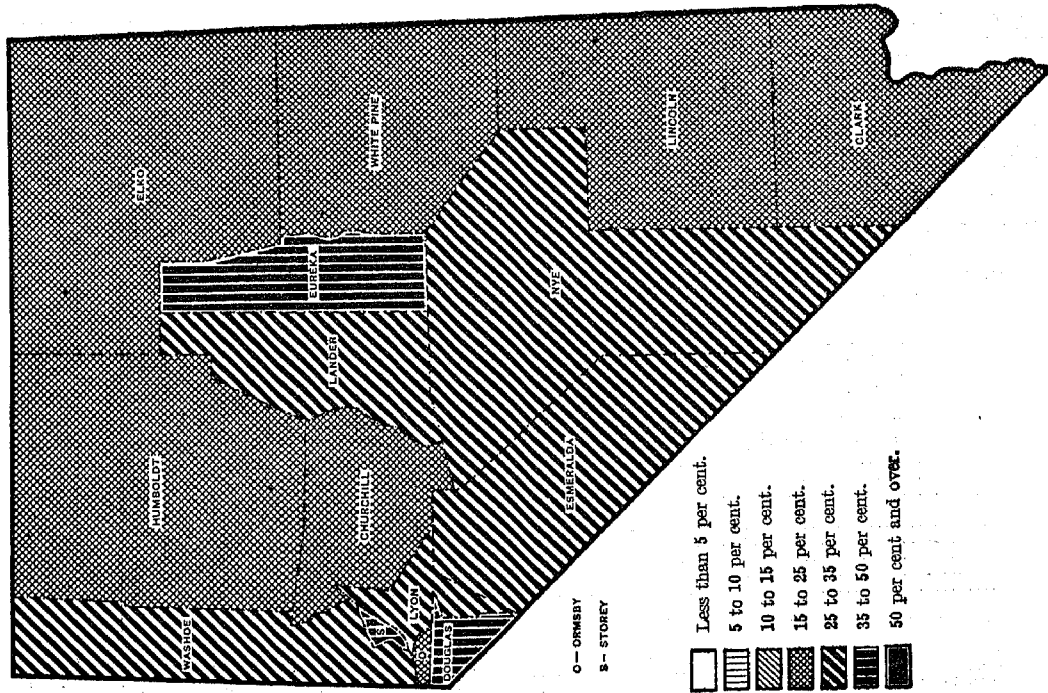

# NEW HAMPSHIRE.

## CHAPTER 1.—NUMBER OF INHABITANTS.

**Introduction.**—This chapter gives the population of New Hampshire, by counties and minor civil divisions, as enumerated at the Thirteenth Census, taken as of April 15, 1910, with comparative statements of population where possible, and a statement and discussion for the state as a whole of the population living in urban and in rural territory. The statistics are given in detail in two general tables.

Table 1 (p. 100) shows the population of New Hampshire, distributed according to counties and minor civil divisions, at the last three censuses, namely, those of 1910, 1900, and 1890. The arrangement of counties and of the primary divisions in each county is alphabetical. The figures for the two secondary divisions are printed in italics. With two exceptions the minor civil divisions as reported in 1910 are the same as in 1900. For changes in boundaries, name, or form of organization between 1890 and 1900 reference must be made to the census report of 1900.

Table 2 (p. 101) shows all cities, the towns having in 1910 over 2,500 inhabitants, and the incorporated villages of New Hampshire, alphabetically arranged, with their population in 1910, 1900, and 1890.

The population of New Hampshire, by counties, at each of the last five censuses, from 1870 to 1910, inclusive; the increase during the last two decades; the density of population at the census of 1910; and the distribution of the population at the last two censuses according to urban and rural districts, are given in Table I of Chapter 2.

The census usage in regard to certain terms is explained as follows:

**Density of population.**—The density of population of a state or county is obtained by dividing its total population by the number of square miles in its land area.

**Minor civil divisions.**—The counties are divided generally into smaller political units, which bear different designations in the

different parts of the country, such as towns, townships, election precincts, etc. Of these minor civil divisions, those which rank next to the county as geographic areas are termed primary divisions. In many instances, however, these primary divisions contain political units of still smaller area, such as cities, incorporated villages, or boroughs. These smaller political units are referred to as secondary divisions.

**Urban and rural population defined.**—The Census Bureau, for purposes of discussion, has defined urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more. In the New England States, in addition to cities having this population, all towns having a population of 2,500 or more have also been classed as urban, without regard to the population of the villages (whether incorporated as such or not) which they may contain. The result is that the "urban areas" in New England include some population which in other sections of the United States would be segregated as "rural." This departure from the general rule, rendered necessary by local conditions in New England, probably makes no great change in the proportions of urban and rural population in those sections where population is dense and generally devoted to manufacturing. In other sections a considerable variation doubtless results, but there is no reason to suppose that it materially affects the distinguishing characteristics of urban and rural population as defined by census statistics.

Urban population being thus defined, the remainder of the state or county is classed as rural. In the New England States, therefore, the rural population consists of the population outside of towns and cities having 2,500 inhabitants or more.

The comparisons of the urban and rural population in 1910 with that at earlier enumerations may be made either with respect to the varying proportions of the two classes at successive enumerations or with respect to the increase between enumerations. In order to contrast the *proportion* of the total population living in urban or rural territory at the census of 1910 with the proportion urban or rural at the preceding census, it is necessary to classify the territory according to the conditions *as they existed* at each census. In this comparison a place having less than 2,500 inhabitants in 1900 and over 2,500 in 1910 is classed with the rural population for 1900 and with the urban for 1910. On the other hand, in order to present fairly the contrast between urban and rural communities, as regards their *rate of growth*, it is necessary to consider the changes in population for the *same* territory which have occurred from one decennial census to another. For this purpose the territory

**HISTORICAL NOTE.**—New Hampshire takes its name from the county of Hampshire in England, which was the home of Capt. John Mason, one of the early proprietors of what is now the eastern portion of the state.

It is not certain whether the first European to visit the territory now constituting New Hampshire was Martin Pring, who is believed by some to have sailed up the Piscataqua River in 1603 as far as what is now Dover, or Capt. John Smith, who explored the coast to some extent in his voyage to New England in 1614. This region was included in the grants made by James I of England to the Plymouth Company in 1606 and 1620. In 1622 the Council for New England, as the Plymouth Company was usually known, granted to Capt. John Mason and Sir Ferdinando Gorges all the land lying along the seacoast and for 60 miles inland between the Merrimac and Kennebec Rivers with all the islands adjacent. In 1629 Mason received from the Council for New England an individual grant of that part of this territory which lay west of the Piscataqua River (the lower course of which now forms a portion of the boundary between New Hampshire and Maine), which he named New Hampshire. In the same year Mason and Gorges received the patent for Laconia, a much larger tract which may have extended to Lake Champlain.

In 1623 the first settlement was made at what is now Little Harbor in the town of Rye by David Thomson. Dover was also settled before 1628. Portsmouth was founded about 1630, Exeter in 1638, and Hampton in 1638 or 1639. At first the scattered settlements were practically independent and without much organized government, but in 1641 the towns on the Piscataqua and its branches submitted to the jurisdiction of Massachusetts Bay and in 1643 Exeter petitioned to join the

union. Hampton appears to have been considered from the date of its settlement as coming under the jurisdiction of Massachusetts Bay.

In 1679 New Hampshire was made a royal province. In 1690, subsequent to the fall of Andros, a number of the citizens petitioned Massachusetts to assume the government again, and accordingly the revolutionary provisional government of Massachusetts took charge of New Hampshire. In 1692, however, New Hampshire was once more made a separate province.

In 1740 the eastern and southern limits of New Hampshire were established, substantially as they now exist, by royal decree.

From 1749 the territory west of the Connecticut River (now Vermont) had been a subject of controversy between New Hampshire and New York, but in 1764 the claim of the latter colony was sustained by royal decree. Nevertheless, the "New Hampshire Grants" (as this region was then called) remained in dispute between New Hampshire and New York until 1782, when a compromise was made recognizing the independence of Vermont, which had already been proclaimed by a convention at Westminster in 1777.

New Hampshire was one of the original thirteen states.

According to estimates and censuses taken prior to the first Federal census, in 1790, the population of the colony of New Hampshire at different dates was as follows: 1641 (estimate), 1,000; 1675 (estimate), 4,000; 1689 (estimate), 6,000; 1710 (estimate), 9,000; 1721 (estimate), 9,500; 1732 (estimate), 12,500; 1742 (estimate), 24,000; 1749 (estimate), 30,000; 1761 (estimate), 38,000; 1767 (census), 52,700; 1773 (census), 72,092; 1775 (census), 81,000; 1788 (census), 95,755.

which in 1910 was urban or rural, as the case may be, is taken as the basis, and the population in 1900 for the same territory (so far as separately reported at that census) is presented, even though part of the territory may, on the basis of its population at the earlier census, have then been in a different class. This avoids the disturb-

ing effect on comparisons which would arise from the passage, for example, of communities formerly classed as rural into the urban group. These two distinct forms of comparison are made in Table I of Chapter 2 for the state as a whole and for each county separately for the last two censuses.

### TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

**Population of the state.**—The population of New Hampshire is 430,572. Compared with a population of 411,588 in 1900, this represents an increase during the last decade of 18,984, or 4.6 per cent. During the same period the total population of the United States increased 21 per cent. The rate of increase for the state was only about one-half the rate

for the preceding decade, 1890–1900, when it was 9.3 per cent.

The following table shows the population of New Hampshire at each census from 1790 to 1910, inclusive, together with the increase and per cent of increase during each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole.

It will be noticed from this table that the most rapid increase in the population of the state was during the early decades. During the 60 years from 1790 to 1850 the absolute increase in population was 176,091, or 124.1 per cent, while during the 60 years since 1850 the increase has been 112,596, or 35.4 per cent. The largest increase in population, both absolute and relative, was during the decade 1790–1800. After 1800, except during the decade 1840–1850, the rate of increase fell off rapidly, until during the decade 1860–1870 there was an actual decrease in the population of the state amounting to 2.4 per cent. From 1870 to 1910, however, the growth of the state was continuous, the increase for this 40-year period being 112,272, or 35.3 per cent.

A comparison of the rates of increase for the state with those for the United States, as given in the preceding table, shows that the rate during each decade has been much lower for the state than for the country as a whole. During one decade, as already pointed out, the population of the state decreased, while there has been a continuous increase in the population of the United States. The population of the state in 1910 was only a little more than three times as large as in 1790, when the First Census was taken, while the population of the United States in 1910 was more than twenty-three times that in 1790.

In 1790 New Hampshire had 14.1 per cent of the total population of New England, which was 1,009,408. This proportion, slightly increased, was maintained at

each census until 1820. By 1830, however, it had decreased to 13.8 per cent and since that time it has decreased steadily at each census until in 1910, in an aggregate population of 6,552,681 in the New England States, New Hampshire was represented by only 6.6 per cent. In the years that have elapsed since the First Census was taken, the population of the New England States has increased more than six times, while that of New Hampshire has increased only a little more than three times.

**Principal cities.**—New Hampshire has 11 cities, of which the largest, Manchester, has a population of 70,063, and the next largest, Nashua, a population of 26,005. There are 6 cities having from 10,000 to 25,000 inhabitants, and 3 from 5,000 to 10,000 inhabitants. The aggregate population of the 11 cities is 195,816, or 45.5 per cent of the total population of the state.

The table on page 97 shows the population of the 8 cities having in 1910 over 10,000 inhabitants, as reported at each census since their organization as towns, so far as figures are available, together with the increase during each decade.

Of the cities included in this table, Berlin shows the highest percentage of increase during the last decade, namely, 32.6 per cent, and Dover the lowest, three-tenths of 1 per cent. The increase in the population of Manchester amounted to 22.9 per cent, which is the lowest rate of increase shown for this city for any decade since 1870.

**Counties.**—New Hampshire has 10 counties. The population of these counties ranges from 16,316 in Carroll County to 126,072 in Hillsborough County.

There have been no changes in the territorial boundaries of the counties since 1900.

Seven counties have increased in population during the last decade, the percentages of increase ranging from 1.7 per cent in Merrimack County to 11.9 per cent in Hillsborough County, and the absolute increases from 808 in Grafton County to 13,432 in Hillsborough County. Three counties show a larger percentage of increase than is shown for the state as a whole, which, as before stated, was 4.6 per cent. Three counties have decreased in population during the last decade, the highest percentage of decrease being in Carroll County, namely, 3.4 per cent. The aggregate increase of population in the seven counties that show an increase is 20,611; the aggregate decrease of population in the three counties that show a decrease is 1,627. The difference, 18,984, is, of course, the total increase of population in the state.

A map on page 99 shows the increase or decrease in the total population of each county of New Hamp-

shire during the last decade. In the counties shown in white the population decreased; for the other counties the different rates of increase are indicated by differences in shading.

**Density of population.**—The total land area of the state is 9,031 square miles. The average number of persons to the square mile in 1910 was 47.7; in 1900 and 1890 it was 45.6 and 41.7, respectively. The average number per square mile for the United States as a whole in 1910 was 30.9. In density of population New Hampshire ranks nineteenth among the states and territories.

The density of population is given by counties in Table I of Chapter 2 and in a map on page 99.

Coos County, with 1,798 square miles, has the largest area, and Strafford County, with 379 square miles, the smallest area. Hillsborough County has the highest density of any county, namely, 140.9 persons per square mile, while Carroll County and Coos County, each with 17.1 persons per square mile, have the lowest density.

**Minor civil divisions.**—The political divisions into which counties are subdivided are collectively termed "Minor civil divisions." In New Hampshire the

counties are divided into 258 primary divisions, comprising 224 towns, 11 cities, 4 townships, 9 grants, 4 locations, and 6 purchases. For 1 township, 4 grants, 1 location, and 3 purchases no population was reported at any of the last three censuses. There are also 2 secondary divisions, both of which are villages. These incorporated villages are not independent minor civil divisions, but form parts of the towns in which they are located.

Urban and rural population compared.—The following table presents the population of New Hampshire at the censuses of 1910, 1900, and 1890, respectively, distributed among cities and towns grouped according to specified limits of population, together with the percentage of the total population contained in each group at each of the censuses named. The classification is based upon the population of each place as it existed at each census.

The urban territory of the state in 1910—that is, cities and towns of 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 255,099 inhabitants, or 59.2 per cent of the total population, while 175,473 inhabitants, or 40.8 per cent, lived in rural territory. The urban territory as it existed in 1900—that is, cities and towns then having 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 226,269 inhabitants, or 55 per cent of the total population, while 185,319 inhabitants, or 45 per cent, lived in rural territory. There has thus been a considerable increase in the proportion of urban population. For the United States as a whole the urban population constituted 46.3 per cent of the total population in 1910 and 40.5 per cent of the total population in 1900. Table I of Chapter 2 shows that in every county in the state a larger proportion of the population lived in urban territory in 1910 than in 1900.

In order to compare the *rate of growth* in urban and rural communities it is necessary in each case, as previously explained, to consider the changes in population which have occurred in the *same* territory from one decennial census to another. With this end in view places classed as urban or rural according to their population in 1910 are taken as a basis and the aggregate population in 1910 and in 1900 of the same places is then compared. Thus, as shown in the next table, the total population in 1910 of those cities and towns which at that time had 2,500 inhabitants or more was 255,099; in 1900 the total population of these same places was 226,007. It may be noted that the latter figure is less than the total population in 1900 of those places which at that time had over 2,500 inhabitants each, 226,269 (see table above), by 262. The difference is the net result of the passage, since 1900, of a community from the rural to the urban class and vice versa.

The comparison of the total population in 1910 of places having a population of not less than 2,500 each with the total population of the same places in 1900, as given in the following table, shows an increase of 12.9 per cent. During the same period the rural population, comprising the remainder of the state, has decreased 5.4 per cent. The population of urban areas thus increased nearly three times as rapidly as that of the state as a whole, while the population of rural territory decreased. For the United States as a whole urban population increased 34.8 per cent in the last decade and rural population 11.2 per cent. As shown by Table I of Chapter 2, there was a decrease in the population living in rural territory and an increase in the population living in urban territory in every county in New Hampshire.

For the state as a whole urban population is still further distributed in the following table, which shows the combined population in 1910 and 1900 of the places having, in 1910, 25,000 inhabitants or more, the combined population of places having, in 1910, from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants, and the population of the remainder of the state.

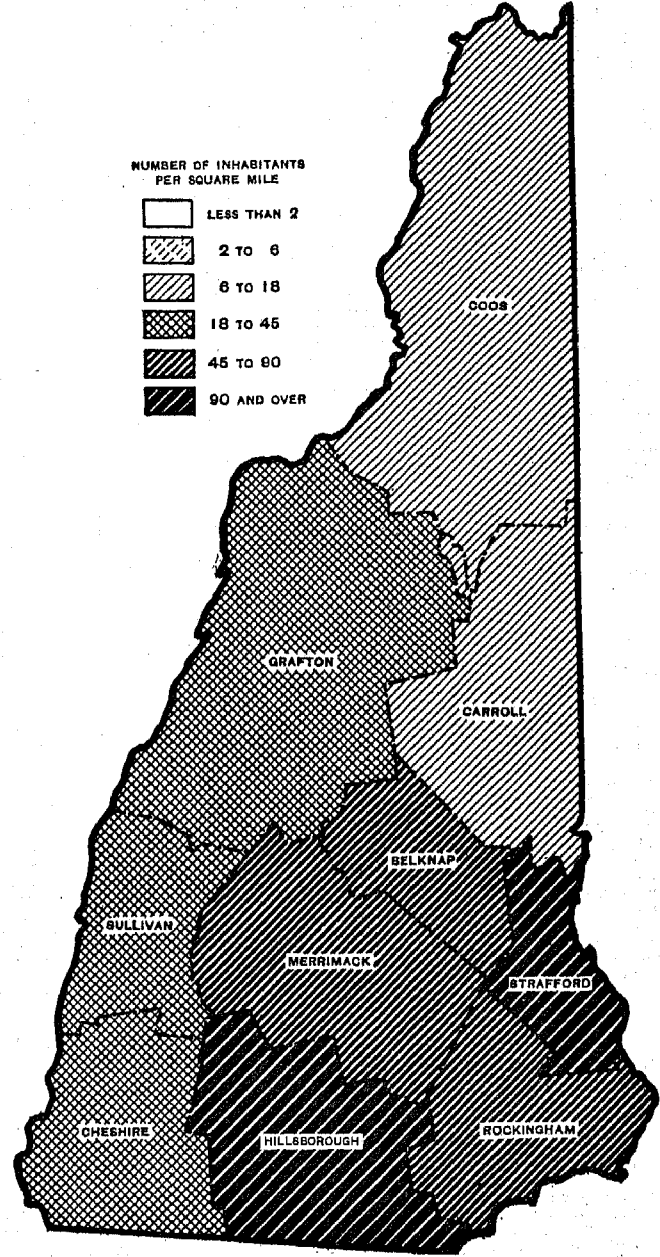
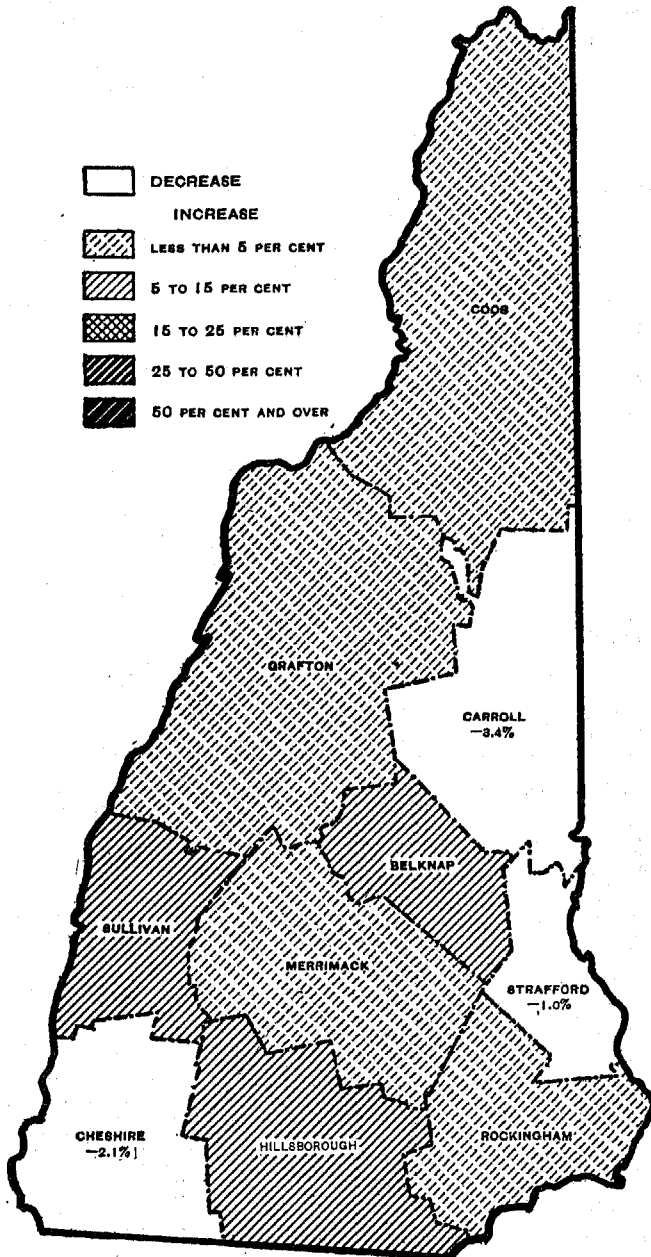
From this table it appears that both groups of urban communities increased in population during the last decade much more rapidly than the state as a whole.

## CHAPTER 2.—COMPOSITION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION.

**Introduction.**—The first chapter having given the number of inhabitants of New Hampshire by counties and minor civil divisions, the decennial increase and the density of population, and the proportions urban and rural, the present chapter deals with the composition and characteristics of the population. The two chapters cover all the principal topics of the population census except occupations and ownership of homes.

**Description of the tables.**—The greater part of this chapter consists of five general tables, which present statistics of color, nativity, parentage, sex, citizenship, illiteracy, school attendance, and dwellings and families, as follows: Table I for the state and counties; Table II for the two cities of more than 25,000 inhabitants; Table III for cities of 10,000 to 25,000; Table IV for cities and towns of 2,500 to 10,000; and Table V for wards of Manchester, the only city of more than 50,000 inhabitants.

A series of summary tables (numbered 1 to 14) reproduces from the general tables the more important state and city totals, and presents also certain additional data relative to state of birth, age, and marital condition.

On account of the wide differences in characteristics among the different classes of the population, the statistics on each subject are shown according to race, and for the whites according to nativity and parentage. Classification according to nativity and parentage is scarcely necessary for the other races, since nearly all negroes and Indians are native born of native parentage, and nearly all Chinese and Japanese either foreign born or of foreign parentage.

The white population is divided into four groups: (1) Native, native parentage—that is, having both parents born in the United States; (2) native, foreign parentage—having both parents born abroad; (3) native, mixed parentage—having one parent native and the other foreign born; (4) foreign born. As the second and third classes do not differ greatly in characteristics, they are combined in some of the tables; in a few cases all three native white classes are combined.

Since marked differences often exist between urban and rural communities with respect to the composition and characteristics of the population, it is desirable that the two classes be distinguished in presenting census data. The Bureau of the Census has undertaken to do this by classifying as urban the population of all incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more. In New England, however, where many villages of considerable size are not separately incorporated, it was deemed best to classify also towns of 2,500 inhabit-

ants or more as urban, although this classification is not very satisfactory because such towns generally include more or less population that is essentially rural.

The census inquiry as to school attendance was merely as to whether the person enumerated had attended any kind of school at any time between September 1, 1909, and the date of enumeration, April 15, 1910.

The Census Bureau classifies as illiterate any person 10 years of age or over who is unable to write, regardless of ability to read.

**Color and nativity** (Table 1).—Of the total population of New Hampshire, 230,231, or 53.5 per cent, are native whites of native parentage; 103,117, or 23.9 per cent, are native whites of foreign or mixed parentage; 96,558, or 22.4 per cent, are foreign-born whites; and 564, or 0.1 per cent, are negroes. The corresponding percentages in 1900 were 58.9, 19.5, 21.4, and 0.2, respectively, the proportion of native whites of native parentage having decreased during the decade. The percentage of foreign-born whites in the different counties ranges from 8.2 in Carroll to 27.5 in Coos and 34.4 in Hillsborough. (See maps on page 109.)

Of the urban population, 41 per cent are native whites of native parentage; of the rural, 71.5 per cent. The corresponding proportions for native whites of foreign or mixed parentage are 29.3 and 16.1 per cent, respectively. The percentage of foreign-born whites is 29.5 in the urban population and 12.2 in the rural.

**Sex** (Table 2).—In the total population of the state there are 216,290 males and 214,282 females, or 100.9 males to 100 females. In 1900 the ratio was 99.6 to 100. Among native whites the ratio is 98.3 to 100; among foreign-born whites, 110.4 to 100. In the urban population there are 96.8 males to 100 females, and in the rural, 107.2.

**State of birth** (Tables 3 and 4).—Of the native population—that is, population born in the United States—74.5 per cent were born in New Hampshire and 25.5 per cent outside the state. Persons born outside the state constitute a slightly larger proportion of the native population in urban than in rural communities.

**Foreign nationalities** (Table 5).—Of the foreign-born white population of New Hampshire, persons born in Canada represent 59.9 per cent (those of French parentage, 42.3, and all others, 17.6); Ireland, 11; England, 5; Russia, 4.5; Greece, 2.7; Austria, 2.5; Italy, 2.1; Sweden, 2.1; Germany, 2.1; all other countries, 7.9. Of the total white stock of foreign origin, which includes persons born abroad and also natives having one or both parents born abroad, Canada con-

tributed 59.2 per cent (French stock, 40.7, and all others, 18.5); Ireland, 15.3; England, 5.7; Russia, 3; Germany, 2.3; Scotland, 2.2; Sweden, 1.8; Austria, 1.7.

**Voting and militia ages** (Table 6).—The total number of males 21 years of age and over is 136,668, representing 31.7 per cent of the population. Of such males, 56.1 per cent are native whites of native parentage, 13 per cent native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 30.7 per cent foreign-born whites, and 0.1 per cent negroes. Of the 41,956 foreign-born white males of voting age, 16,415, or 39.1 per cent, are naturalized. Males of militia age—18 to 44—number 90,357.

**Age** (Tables 7, 8, and 12).—Of the total population, 9.2 per cent are under 5 years of age, 17 per cent from 5 to 14 years, inclusive, 17.4 per cent from 15 to 24, 29.2 per cent from 25 to 44, and 27.1 per cent 45 years of age and over. The foreign-born white population comprises comparatively few children, only 7.1 per cent of this class being under 15 years of age, while 73.1 per cent are 25 years of age and over. Of the native whites of native parentage, 61.5 per cent are 25 and over; of the native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, however, only 28.9 per cent are 25 and over, while practically one-half (49.8 per cent) are children under 15. As compared with rural population, the urban shows a larger proportion of persons in the prime of life, 30.3 per cent of urban and 27.5 per cent of rural being in the age groups 25 to 44 years. There is also a slightly higher percentage of children in urban communities than in rural (26.9 as compared with 25.1).

**School attendance** (Table 9).—The total number of persons of school age—that is, from 6 to 20 years, inclusive—is 111,634, of whom 73,487, or 65.8 per cent, attended school. In addition to these, 2,935 persons under 6 and 1,128 of 21 and over attended school. For boys from 6 to 20 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 64.9; for girls, 66.8. For children from 6 to 14 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 91.2. The percentage for children of this age among native whites of native parentage was 92.2; among native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 91.3; and among foreign-born whites, 85.5. (See Table I.) There is little difference between urban population and rural as regards school attendance for children from 6 to 14 years of age, but of those from 15 to 20 years, 35.4 per cent in rural communities, as against 26 per cent in urban, were reported as attending school.

**Illiteracy** (Table 10).—There are 16,386 illiterates in the state, representing 4.6 per cent of the total population 10 years of age and over, as compared with 6.2 per cent in 1900. The percentage of illiteracy is 14.5 among foreign-born whites and 1.1 among native whites.

For all classes combined, the percentage of illiterates in urban communities (5.6) is decidedly higher than that in rural (3.2), but the percentage for foreign-born whites is higher in rural communities than in urban communities, while the percentage for native whites is the same in each case.

For persons from 10 to 20 years of age, inclusive, whose literacy depends largely upon present school facilities and school attendance, the percentage of illiteracy is only 1.8. (See Table I.)

**Marital condition** (Tables 11 and 13).—In the population 15 years of age and over, 35.7 per cent of the males are single and 29.7 per cent of the females. The percentage married is 56.9 for males and 56.6 for females, and the percentage widowed 6.1 and 12.6, respectively. The percentages of those reported as divorced, 1 per cent both for males and for females, are believed to be too small, because of the probability that many divorced persons class themselves as single or widowed.

That the percentage single is so much smaller for women than for men is due largely to the fact that women marry younger. Thus 7.4 per cent of the females from 15 to 19 years of age are married, as compared with 1 per cent of the males, and 42.7 per cent of the females from 20 to 24 years are married, as compared with 22.3 per cent of the males. In the next age group, 25 to 34 years, the difference is not so great, the percentages being 70.3 for females and 60.9 for males, while in the age group 35 to 44 the difference practically disappears. That there is a larger proportion of widows than of widowers may indicate that men more often remarry than women, but, since husbands are generally older than their wives, the marriage relationship is more often broken by death of the husband than by death of the wife.

For the main elements of the population the percentages of married persons among those 15 years of age and over are as follows: Native whites of native parentage, 60.1 for males and 56.9 for females; foreign-born whites, 59.7 and 63.1, respectively; and native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 40.6 and 45.2.

These percentages by no means indicate the relative tendency of the several classes as regards marriage. To determine that, the comparison should be made by age periods, since the proportion married in any class is determined largely by the proportion who have reached the marrying age. Similarly, the proportion widowed depends largely on the proportion past middle life. The percentage married, both for males and for females, is higher in rural than in urban communities.

**Dwellings and families.**—The total number of dwellings in New Hampshire is 88,871, and the total number of families 103,156, there being 116.1 families to each 100 dwellings. (See Table I.) The average number of persons per dwelling is 4.8, and the average number per family, 4.2.

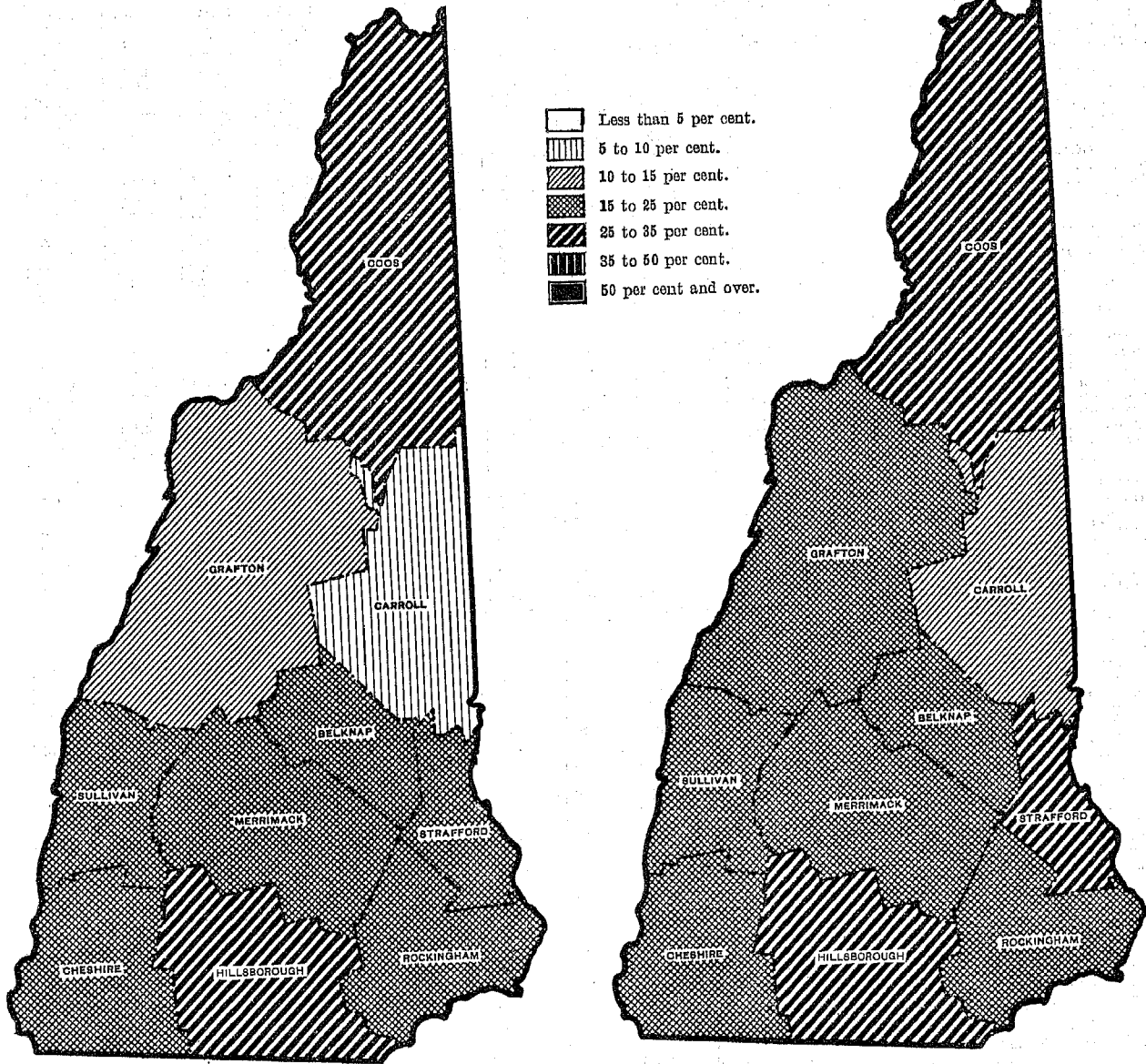

# NEW JERSEY.

## CHAPTER 1.—NUMBER OF INHABITANTS.

**Introduction.**—This chapter gives the population of New Jersey, by counties and minor civil divisions, as enumerated at the Thirteenth Census, taken as of April 15, 1910, with comparative statements of population where possible, and a statement and discussion for the state as a whole of the population living in urban and in rural territory. The statistics are given in detail in two general tables.

Table 1 (p. 124) shows the population of New Jersey, distributed according to counties and minor civil divisions, at the last three censuses, namely, those of 1910, 1900, and 1890. The arrangement of counties and of the primary divisions in each county is alphabetical. The figures for the one secondary division are printed in italics. The changes in boundaries, name, or form of organization that have taken place since 1900 are indicated in the footnotes to the table. For changes between 1890 and 1900 reference must be made to the census report of 1900.

It may be noticed that the county totals as given in Table 1 for 1900 and 1890 sometimes exceed the aggregate population of the minor civil divisions as shown in the table. This is due to the fact that some of the minor civil divisions of 1890 and 1900 had gone out of existence by 1910, or had undergone such changes in territory that it was impossible to present strictly comparable figures.

Table 2 (p. 129) shows the cities, the incorporated towns and boroughs, and the incorporated villages in New Jersey, alphabetically arranged, with their population in 1910, 1900, and 1890.

The population of New Jersey, by counties, at each of the last five censuses, from 1870 to 1910, inclusive;

the increase during the last two decades; the density of the total and the rural population at the census of 1910; and the distribution of the population at the last two censuses according to urban and rural districts, are given in Table I of Chapter 2.

The tables and text of the present chapter contain few technical expressions whose meaning is not apparent. The census usage in regard to certain terms is, however, explained below:

**Density of population.**—The density of population of a state or county is obtained by dividing its total population by the number of square miles in its land area. In calculating the density of rural population, the same divisor is used as it is not practicable to ascertain and deduct the exact area covered by the urban districts, and even if this could be done with accuracy the deduction of this area from the total land area would ordinarily make no appreciable difference in the resulting quotient.

**Minor civil divisions.**—The counties are divided generally into smaller political units which bear different designations in the different parts of the country, such as towns, townships, election precincts, etc. Of these minor civil divisions those which rank next to the county as geographic areas are termed primary divisions. In many instances, however, these primary divisions contain political units of still smaller area, such as cities, incorporated villages, towns, or boroughs. These smaller political units are referred to as secondary divisions.

**Urban and rural population defined.**—The Census Bureau, for purposes of discussion, has defined urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside of such incorporated places.

The comparisons of the urban and rural population in 1910 with that at earlier enumerations may be made either with respect to the varying proportions of the two classes at successive enumerations or with respect to the increase between enumerations. In order to contrast the *proportion* of the total population living in urban or rural territory at the census of 1910 with the proportion urban or

**HISTORICAL NOTE.**—New Jersey takes its name from the island of Jersey, in the English Channel, and was so named in honor of Sir George Carteret, one of the early proprietors of the province, who had distinguished himself as governor of that island.

The region now constituting New Jersey was included in the grant conveyed by the first charter of Virginia (1606); and its northern portion was embraced in the grant to the Plymouth Company in 1620.

The English title was based on the discoveries of John Cabot, who had visited the coasts of Newfoundland and the mainland in 1497. In 1609 Henry Hudson, sailing under the Dutch flag, coasted the shores of what is now New Jersey. The Dutch claimed the region as a part of New Netherland (now New York), and in about the year 1620 made settlements along the west shore of the lower Hudson; in 1623 they built Fort Nassau, near Gloucester. Swedes also settled on the Delaware River, but were brought under the jurisdiction of the Dutch by the governor of New Netherland.

In 1664 New Netherland, including the present area of New Jersey, passed into the hands of the English and was granted by Charles II to the Duke of York. Before the latter took possession he conveyed to Lord Berkeley and Sir George Carteret the territory lying between the Hudson and the Delaware and limited on the north by a line differing somewhat, but not greatly, from the present boundary between New Jersey and New York.

The first permanent English settlement was probably that made at Elizabethtown about 1664. Not long after taking possession of the province, Berkeley and Carteret established a government which included a popular assembly.

In 1673 New York (formerly New Netherland) and New Jersey were surrendered to the Dutch, in whose possession they remained until early in the following year, when both provinces were again transferred to the English.

In 1673 Berkeley sold his interest in New Jersey to two Quakers, who in the following year sold it to William Penn and others. In July, 1676, was executed the "Quintipartite deed," by which the province was divided by a line drawn from Little Egg Harbor (about 15 miles north of Atlantic City) to the most northerly boundary point on the Delaware. Carteret retained the eastern part, known as East New Jersey, while the Quakers took the western portion, called West New Jersey. In 1682 East New Jersey was sold to William Penn (who in the preceding year had obtained a royal grant of Pennsylvania) and other Quakers. In 1702 the proprietors of both colonies ceded their right of government to the English Crown, and East and West New Jersey were united and placed under the governor of New York, New Jersey retaining its separate assembly. In 1738 the colony was given a separate governor.

The present boundary between New Jersey and New York was established in 1772 or 1773.

New Jersey was one of the original thirteen states.

According to estimates and censuses prior to the first Federal census, in 1790, the population of the colony of New Jersey at different periods was said to be as follows: 1702 (estimate), 15,000; 1726 (census), 32,442; 1737 (census), 47,369; 1745 (census), 61,383; 1749 (estimate), 60,000; 1754 (estimate), 78,500; 1774 (estimate), 120,000; 1784 (estimate), 149,434.

rural at the preceding census, it is necessary to classify the territory according to the conditions as they existed at each census. In this comparison a place having less than 2,500 inhabitants in 1900 and over 2,500 in 1910 is classed with the rural population for 1900 and with the urban for 1910. On the other hand, in order to present fairly the contrast between urban and rural communities, as regards their *rate of growth*, it is necessary to consider the changes in population for the *same* territory which have occurred from one decennial census to another. For this purpose the territory which in

1910 was urban or rural, as the case may be, is taken as the basis, and the population in 1900 for the same territory (so far as separately reported at that census), is presented, even though part of the territory may, on the basis of its population at the earlier census, have then been in a different class. This avoids the disturbing effect on comparisons which would arise from the passage, for example, of communities formerly classed as rural into the urban group. These two distinct forms of comparison are made in Table I of Chapter 2 for the state as a whole and for each county separately for the last two censuses.

### TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

**Population of the state.**—The population of New Jersey is 2,537,167. Compared with a population of 1,883,669 in 1900, this represents an increase during the last decade of 653,498, or 34.7 per cent. During the same period the total population of the United States increased 21 per cent. The growth of the state was somewhat more rapid than during the

preceding decade, 1890–1900, when it was 30.4 per cent.

The following table shows the population of New Jersey at each census from 1790 to 1910, inclusive, together with the increase and per cent of increase during each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole.

It will be noticed from this table that from 1790 to 1840 the growth of the state was slow, although steady, the rate of increase for the several decades ranging from 13 per cent to 16.4 per cent. Since 1840 the increase has been much larger, the lowest rate being 24.8 per cent, from 1870 to 1880, and the highest, 37.3 per cent, from 1850 to 1860. The numerical increase for the first decade, 1790–1800, was 27,010, and for the last decade, 1900–1910, 653,498, the increase during the last period being more than three and one-half times the entire population of the state in 1790.

A comparison of the rates of increase for the state with those for the United States, as given in the preceding table, shows that from 1790 to 1840 the increase during each decade was much less for the state than for the whole country. From 1840 to 1850 the increase in the population of the state was almost equal to that of the United States. Since 1850 the rate of increase for the state has exceeded that for the United States in every decade except 1870 to 1880. The population of the state in 1910 is nearly fourteen times as large as in 1790, when the First Census was taken, while the population of the

United States in 1910 is more than twenty-three times that in 1790.

**Principal cities.**—New Jersey has 41 cities. Newark, the largest, has a population of 347,469, and Jersey City, the second city, a population of 267,779. There are 11 other cities and 1 town (West Hoboken) having over 25,000 inhabitants. There are 6 cities having from 10,000 to 25,000, 7 having from 5,000 to 10,000, 3 having from 2,500 to 5,000, and 12 having less than 2,500 inhabitants.

Table 2 shows the population in 1910 of all the cities of the state with comparative figures, where possible, for 1900 and 1890. The table on the next page shows the population of the 13 cities and of the 1 town having in 1910 over 25,000 inhabitants, as reported at each census since their incorporation either as cities or towns, together with the increase during each decade.

Of the cities given in this table, Passaic shows the highest percentage of increase during the last decade, namely, 97.2 per cent, and Hoboken the lowest, 18.5 per cent.

Newark's growth has been steady and substantial, more than 100,000 having been added to its population during the last decade.

Counties.—New Jersey has 21 counties. The population of these counties ranges from 537,231 in Hudson County to 19,745 in Cape May County.

There have been no changes in the territorial boundaries of the counties since 1900.

Hudson County, which contains Jersey City, is the largest county of the state in population and has had a very large and constant growth.

The increase in population from 1900 to 1910 in Essex County, 153,833, and the increase in Hudson County, 151,183, are each more than the entire population of any other county in the state except Passaic. Naturally the counties showing the largest growth are those lying nearest to New York City.

Bergen and Atlantic Counties, showing increases of 75.9 and 54.9 per cent, respectively, are the only two counties which increased more than 50 per cent during the last decade. In eight counties the percentage of increase exceeded that for the state as a whole, which, as before stated, was 34.7 per cent.

Hunterdon is the only county which lost in population during the last decade, the decrease being 2.7 per cent. This county also decreased 2.4 per cent in population from 1890 to 1900. Burlington County showed a decrease of one-half of 1 per cent from 1890 to 1900, but an increase of 14.3 per cent from 1900 to 1910.

The maps on page 122 show the increase or decrease in the total and rural population, respectively, of each county of New Jersey during the last decade. In the counties shown in white the population decreased; for the other counties the different rates of increase are indicated by differences in shading.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 7,514 square miles. The average number of persons to the square mile in 1910 was 337.7; in 1900 and 1890 it was 250.7 and 192.3, respectively. The average number per square mile for the United States as a whole in 1910 was 30.9.

In density of population New Jersey ranks third among the states, being preceded only by Rhode Island and Massachusetts.

The density of population is given by counties in Table I of Chapter 2 and in the maps on page 123, both for the entire population and for that living in rural territory, excluding in the latter case the population of places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, but not excluding the land area of such places.

Hudson County has the highest density of any county, namely, 12,493.7 persons per square mile, and Ocean County the lowest, namely, 33.5. Burlington County, with 815 square miles, has the largest area, and Hudson County, with 43 square miles, has the smallest area.

**Minor civil divisions.**—The political divisions into which counties are subdivided are collectively termed "Minor civil divisions." In New Jersey the counties are divided into 476 primary divisions, comprising 240 townships, 38 cities, 24 towns, 173 boroughs, and 1 village. These subdivisions, with one exception, Flemington village, in Hunterdon County, are all independent of one another. There are also 3 cities, 1 town, and 1 village which are coextensive with the townships in which they are located, and 1 village which forms part of the township in which located.

**Incorporated places.**—New Jersey has 242 incorporated places, comprising 41 cities, 25 towns, 173 bor-

oughs, and 3 villages, with an aggregate population in 1910 of 2,057,515, or 81.1 per cent of the total population of the state.

**Urban and rural population compared.**—The following table presents the population of New Jersey at the censuses of 1910, 1900, and 1890, respectively, distributed among cities, villages, boroughs, and towns grouped according to specified limits of population, together with the percentage of the total population contained in each group at each of the censuses named. The classification is based upon the population of each place as it existed at each census.

As shown by this table, the urban territory of the state in 1910—that is, the cities and incorporated villages, towns, and boroughs of 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 1,907,210 inhabitants, or 75.2 per cent of the total population, while 629,957 inhabitants, or 24.8 per cent, lived in rural territory. The urban territory, as it existed in 1900—that is, cities and incorporated villages, towns, and boroughs then having 2,500 inhabitants or more—contained 1,329,162 inhabitants, or 70.6 per cent of the total population, while 554,507 inhabitants, or 29.4 per cent, lived in rural territory. There has thus been a considerable increase in the proportion of urban population. For the United States as a whole the urban population constituted 46.3 per cent of the total population in 1910 and 40.5 per cent of the total population in 1900.

From this table it also appears that the 3 places which in 1910 had each more than 100,000 inhabitants comprised 29.2 per cent of the total population of the state. The 14 places of 25,000 or more inhabitants had a combined population in 1910 of 1,363,927, or 53.8 per cent of the aggregate population of the state. Of the total population, 24.8 per cent is classed as rural, 5.9 per cent being contained in 154 incorporated places of less than 2,500 each and 18.9 per cent in unincorporated territory.

The 154 places of less than 2,500 have an aggregate of 150,305 inhabitants. These places comprise 64 having from 1,000 to 2,500 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 105,102; 44 having from 500 to 1,000 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 31,383; and 46 having less than 500 inhabitants each, with a combined population of 13,820.

A comparison of the figures for 1910, 1900, and 1890, as given in the above table, shows an increase in the proportion of the population in each of the urban groups, and a decrease in the proportion in rural territory.

Table I of Chapter 2 shows 14 counties having a larger proportion and 4 counties a smaller proportion of urban population in 1910 than in 1900, while for 1 county the proportion is the same, and 2 counties are wholly rural. In Essex County 94.8 per cent of the population in 1910 live in places of over 2,500 inhabitants, and in Hudson County 95 per cent. Cape May and Ocean Counties are wholly rural.

In order to compare the *rate of growth* in urban and rural communities it is necessary in each case, as previously explained, to consider the changes in population which have occurred in the *same* territory from one decennial census to another. With this end in view places classed as urban or rural according to their population in 1910 are taken as a basis and the aggregate population in 1910 and 1900 of the same places is then compared. Thus, as shown in the next table, the total population in 1910 of the cities, villages, towns, and boroughs which at that time had 2,500 inhabitants or more was 1,907,210; in 1900 the total population of these same places (so far as separately reported) was 1,363,653. It may be noted that the latter figure exceeds the total population in 1900 of the cities, villages, towns, and boroughs which at that time had over 2,500 each, 1,329,162 (see table above), by 34,491. The difference is the result of the passage, since 1900, of certain communities from the rural to the urban class.

A comparison of the total population in 1910 of the cities, villages, towns, and boroughs having a population of not less than 2,500 each with the total population of the same places in 1900, as given in the next table, shows an increase of 39.9 per cent. This represents the rate of growth of urban communities as thus defined. During the same period the rural population, comprising that of the remainder of the state, increased 21.1 per cent. Urban population thus increased a little less than twice as fast as rural. For the United States as a whole urban population increased 34.8 per cent in the last decade and rural population 11.2 per cent.

As shown by Table I of Chapter 2 there were two counties in New Jersey in which the population living in rural territory decreased, but none in which there was a decrease in urban population.

In the following table the population for the state as a whole is distributed so as to show, for 1910 and 1900, the combined population of the cities having, in 1910, 100,000 inhabitants or more, the combined population of the cities, villages, towns, and boroughs

having, in 1910, from 25,000 to 100,000 and from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants, respectively, and the population of the remainder of the state.

From this table it appears that two of the three urban groups increased in population more rapidly than the state as a whole, the rate of increase for places from 2,500 to 25,000 inhabitants being particularly large, while the rate of increase in rural territory was but little more than half the rate for the state.

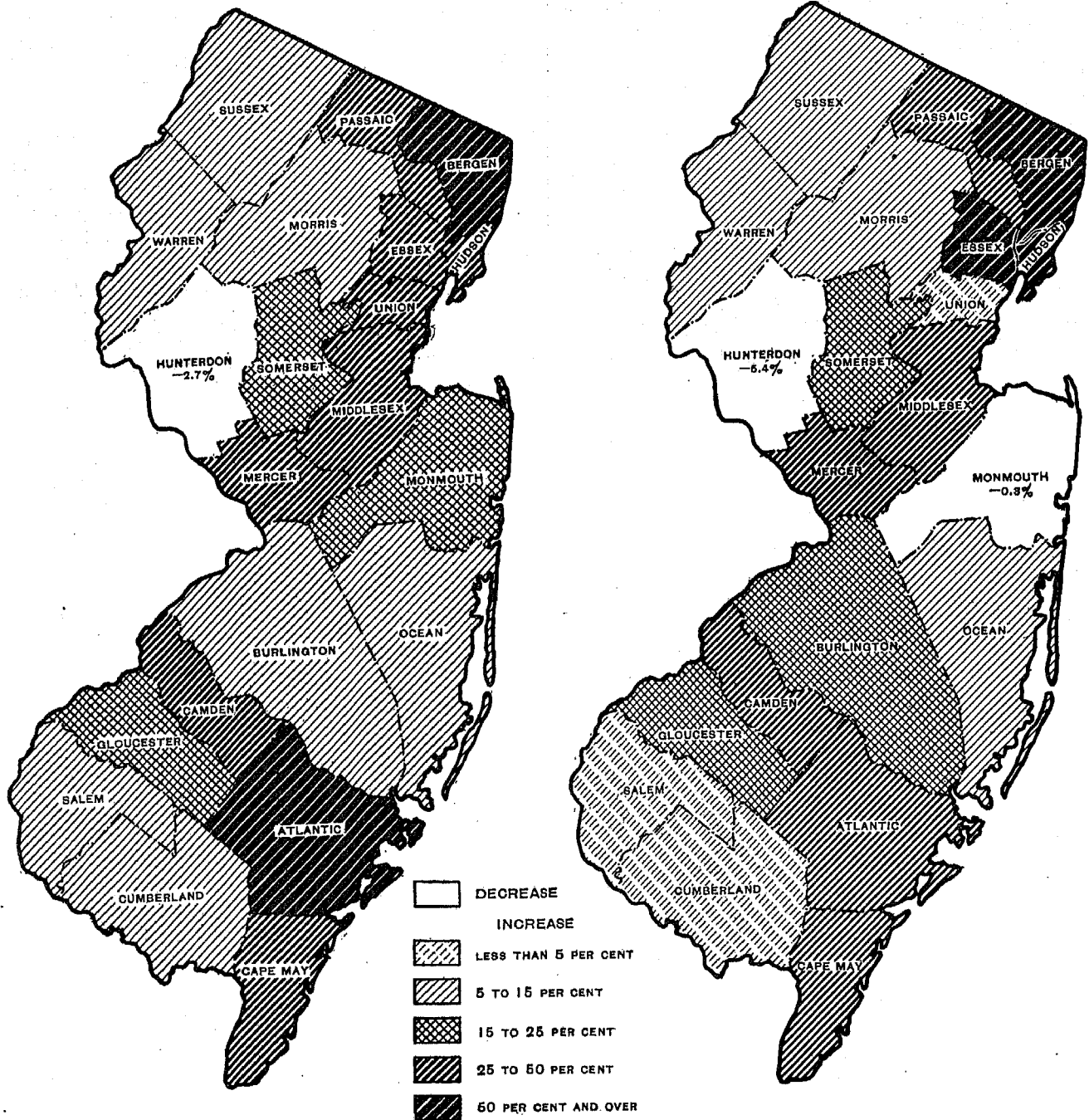
It also appears from this table that of the decennial increase in population, namely, 653,498, a little more than one-sixth was in rural territory and more than one-half was in places of over 25,000 inhabitants.

RURAL POPULATION.

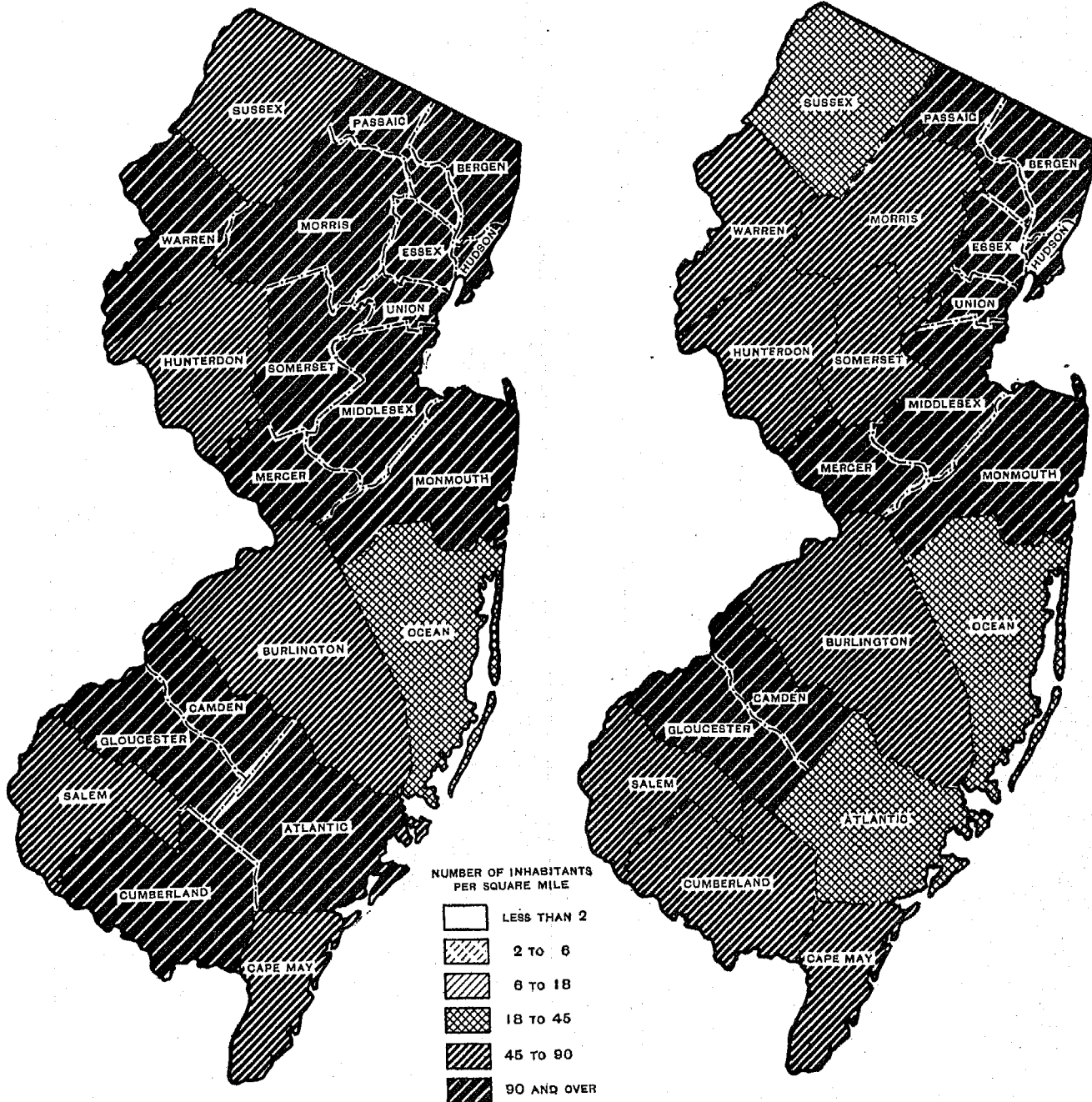

## CHAPTER 2.—COMPOSITION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION.

**Introduction.**—The first chapter having given the number of inhabitants of New Jersey by counties and minor civil divisions, the decennial increase and the density of population, and the proportions urban and rural, the present chapter deals with the composition and characteristics of the population. The two chapters cover all the principal topics of the population census except occupations and ownership of homes.

**Description of the tables.**—The greater part of this chapter consists of five general tables, which present statistics of color, nativity, parentage, sex, citizenship, illiteracy, school attendance, and dwellings and families, as follows: Table I for the state and counties; Table II for cities of more than 25,000 inhabitants; Table III for places of 10,000 to 25,000; Table IV for places of 2,500 to 10,000; and Table V for wards of cities of more than 50,000.

A series of summary tables (numbered 1 to 16) reproduces from the general tables the more important state and city totals, and presents also certain additional data relative to state of birth, age, and marital condition.

On account of the wide differences in characteristics among the different classes of the population, the statistics on each subject are shown according to race, and for the whites according to nativity and parentage. Classification according to nativity and parentage is scarcely necessary for the other races, since nearly all negroes and Indians are native born of native parentage, and nearly all Chinese and Japanese either foreign born or of foreign parentage.

The white population is divided into four groups: (1) Native, native parentage—that is, having both parents born in the United States; (2) native, foreign parentage—having both parents born abroad; (3) native, mixed parentage—having one parent native and the other foreign born; (4) foreign born. As the second and third classes do not differ greatly in characteristics, they are combined in some of the tables; in a few cases all three native white classes are combined.

Since marked differences often exist between urban and rural communities with respect to the composition and characteristics of the population, the two classes are distinguished in connection with several of the subjects. Urban population, as defined by the Bureau of the Census, includes that of all incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, the remainder being classified as rural.

The census inquiry as to school attendance was merely as to whether the person enumerated had attended any kind of school at any time between September 1, 1909, and the date of enumeration, April 15, 1910.

The Census Bureau classifies as illiterate any person 10 years of age or over who is unable to write, regardless of ability to read.

**Color and nativity** (Table 1).—Of the total population of New Jersey, 1,009,909, or 39.8 per cent, are native whites of native parentage; 777,797, or 30.7 per cent, are native whites of foreign or mixed parentage; 658,188, or 25.9 per cent, are foreign-born whites; and 89,760, or 3.5 per cent, are negroes. The corresponding percentages in 1900 were 43.8, 29.5, 22.8, and 3.7, respectively, the proportion of foreign-born whites having increased during the decade. By counties the proportion of foreign-born whites ranges from 6.1 per cent in Salem County to 39.3 per cent in Passaic, and the proportion of native whites of foreign or mixed parentage from 8.1 per cent in Salem to 41.4 per cent in Hudson County. (See maps on page 155.)

Of the urban population, 33.6 per cent are native whites of native parentage; of the rural, 58.7 per cent. The corresponding proportions for native whites of foreign or mixed parentage are 34.1 and 20.1 per cent, respectively. The percentage of foreign-born whites is 28.8 in the urban population and 17.3 in the rural; the percentage of negroes is 3.4 in the urban and 3.9 in the rural.

**Sex** (Tables 2 and 13).—In the total population of the state there are 1,286,463 males and 1,250,704 females, or 102.9 males to 100 females. In 1900 the sexes were nearly equal. Among native whites the ratio of males to females is 98 to 100 and among foreign-born whites 118.2 to 100. In the urban population there are 101 males to 100 females, and in the rural, 108.8.

**State of birth** (Tables 3 and 4).—Of the total native population—that is, population born in the United States—71.6 per cent were born in New Jersey and 28.4 per cent outside the state; of the native white population, 26.9 per cent were born outside the state, and of the native negro, 58.1 per cent. Persons born outside the state constitute a larger proportion of the native population in urban than in rural communities.

**Foreign nationalities** (Tables 5 and 12).—Of the foreign-born white population of New Jersey, persons born in Germany represent 18.7 per cent; Italy, 17.5;

Russia, 14.2; Ireland, 12.6; Austria, 8.6; England, 7.6; Hungary, 7.2; Scotland, 2.7; Holland, 1.9; Sweden, 1.6; all other countries, 7.1 per cent. Of the total white stock of foreign origin, which includes persons born abroad and also natives having one or both parents born abroad, Germany contributed 23.2 per cent; Ireland, 18.1; Italy, 13.4; Russia, 10.2; England, 8.5; Austria, 6.1; Hungary, 4.8; Scotland, 2.7; Holland, 1.9; Canada, 1.4; Sweden, 1.3 per cent.

**Voting and militia ages** (Table 6).—The total number of males 21 years of age and over is 774,702, representing 30.5 per cent of the population. Of such males, 36.3 per cent are native whites of native parentage, 19.9 per cent native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 40 per cent foreign-born whites, and 3.7 per cent negroes. Of the 309,648 foreign-born white males of voting age, 128,438, or 41.5 per cent, are naturalized. Males of militia age—18 to 44—number 597,513.

**Age** (Tables 7, 8, and 14).—Of the total population, 10.5 per cent are under 5 years of age, 18.5 per cent from 5 to 14 years, inclusive, 19.2 per cent from 15 to 24, 32.1 per cent from 25 to 44, and 19.4 per cent 45 years of age and over. The foreign-born white population comprises comparatively few children, only 6.3 per cent of this class being under 15 years of age, while more than three-fourths (75.6 per cent) are 25 years of age and over. Of the native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 34.2 per cent are 25 and over, and of the native whites of native parentage, 49 per cent.

The urban population shows a somewhat larger proportion of persons in the prime of life than the rural, and a smaller proportion in the advanced ages. Migration to the city explains this at least in part. Of the urban population, 32.9 per cent are from 25 to 44 years of age, inclusive, and of the rural population, 30 per cent.

**School attendance** (Table 9).—The total number of persons of school age—that is, from 6 to 20 years, inclusive—is 708,525, of whom 440,903, or 62.2 per cent, attended school. In addition to these, 21,433 children under 6 and 6,936 persons 21 and over attended school. For boys from 6 to 20 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 62.9; for girls, 61.6. For children from 6 to 14 years, inclusive, the percentage attending school was 88.6. The percentage for children of this age among native whites of native parentage was 89.6; among native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 88.7; among negroes, 85.7; and among foreign-born whites, 83.8. (See Table I.) There is little difference between urban and rural communities as regards the percentage attending school for children of that age; for persons from 15 to 20 the percentage is 22.4 in the urban population and 27.9 in the rural.

**Illiteracy** (Table 10).—There are 113,502 illiterates in the state, representing 5.6 per cent of the total population 10 years of age and over, as compared with

5.9 per cent in 1900. The percentage of illiteracy is 14.7 among foreign-born whites, 9.9 among negroes, and 0.9 among native whites.

For all classes combined, the percentage of illiterates is 5.8 in urban communities and 5 in rural. For each class separately, however, the percentage of illiteracy in the rural population exceeds that in the urban.

For persons from 10 to 20 years of age, inclusive, whose literacy depends largely upon present school facilities and school attendance, the percentage of illiteracy is 2.4. (See Table I.)

**Marital condition** (Tables 11 and 15).—In the population 15 years of age and over, 37.9 per cent of the males are single and 31.6 per cent of the females. The percentage married is 57.3 for both males and females, and the percentage widowed 4.4 and 10.7, respectively. The percentages of those reported as divorced, 0.2 for both sexes, are believed to be too small, because of the probability that many divorced persons class themselves as single or widowed.

That the percentage single is so much smaller for women than for men is due largely to the fact that women marry younger. Thus 6.8 per cent of the females from 15 to 19 years of age are married, as compared with 0.7 per cent of the males, and 44.3 per cent of the females from 20 to 24 years of age are married, as compared with 21.5 per cent of the males. In the next age group, 25 to 34 years, the difference is not so great, the percentages being 73.2 for females and 63.7 for males, while in the next two age groups the percentage married is higher among the males. That there is a larger proportion of widows than of widowers may indicate that men more often remarry than women, but, since husbands are generally older than their wives, the marriage relationship is more often broken by death of the husband than by death of the wife.

For the main elements of the population the percentages of married persons among those 15 years of age and over are as follows: Foreign-born whites, 65.4 for males and 67.1 for females; native whites of native parentage, 56.9 and 55.3, respectively; native whites of foreign or mixed parentage, 44.9 and 48.2; negroes, 56.8 and 55.2.

These percentages by no means indicate the relative tendency of the several classes as regards marriage. To determine that, the comparison should be made by age periods, since the proportion married in any class is determined largely by the proportion who have reached the marrying age. Similarly, the proportion widowed depends largely on the proportion past middle life. The percentage married, for males and for females, is higher in rural than in urban communities.

**Dwellings and families**.—The total number of dwellings in New Jersey is 407,295, and the total number of families 558,202, there being 137.1 families to each 100 dwellings. (See Table I.) The average number of persons per dwelling is 6.2, and the average number per family, 4.5.
