#### LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE,

BUREAU OF THE CENSUS,

Washington, D. C., June 20, 1914.

SIR:

I have the honor to transmit herewith Volume IV of the Reports of the Thirteenth Decennial Census,

relating to population.

The census of population was taken in conformity with "An act to provide for the Thirteenth and subsequent decennial censuses," approved July 2, 1909. The statistics were collected as of date April 15, 1910. The work of collecting the statistics was done by enumerators under the direction of supervisors of the census, except in the outlying territory, where it was done by special agents working under the direction of a supervisor of census in the case of Porto Rico and of chief special agents in the case of Alaska and Hawaii.

The results of the population census are contained in four volumes, constituting Volumes I, II, III, and IV of the Reports of the Thirteenth Decennial Census. Volume I contains a summarization of the statistics of population by subjects, with a general analysis and discussion. Volumes II and III contain a separate report on the population of each state and of the District of Columbia, Alaska, Hawaii, and Porto Rico, each such report having previously been issued in the form of two bulletins. Volume IV, the present volume, relates to occupations and presents statistics concerning persons gainfully employed, for the United States, states, and principal cities.

The scope of the inquiry with respect to occupations at the Thirteenth Census was very much broadened, as compared with preceding censuses, and a new classification of occupations also was adopted. In compliance with the recommendation of a special advisory committee on the work of the census, the present report is somewhat limited in scope and does not contain, as originally contemplated, statistics for the gainful workers with respect to unemployment, marital condition, country of birth, and class of worker; but these subjects will be covered by a special report on occupations to be published later.

The collection and compilation of the statistics of population have been under the supervision of William C. Hunt, chief statistician for population. The chiefs of division under Mr. Hunt during the Thirteenth Census

period were William H. Jarvis, Edward W. Koch, Arthur E. Seymour, and William B. Cragg.

The text of this report was written by Alba M Edwards, expert special agent, who also outlined the new occupation classification and assisted in the tabulation of the statistics relating to occupations.
