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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Alabama was organized as a territory in March, 1817, and was admitted to the Union as the twenty-second state in December, 1819. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 2,348,174, which represents an increase of 210,081, or 9.8 per cent, since 1910. During the same period the population of

the United States increased by 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Alabama from 1820 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Alabama has 67 counties, of which 46 show increases and 21 decreases as compared with 1910. There have been no changes in county boundaries during the last decade. (See Table 1.)

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 51,279 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 45.8 (see Table 1), as against 41.7 in 1910 and 35.7 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the Alabama counties are the election precincts, which

number 1,318 (including 1 precinct for which no population was returned in 1920 and several for which the population was not returned separately), and also the independent city of Mobile. The secondary divisions are 294 in number, comprising 53 cities and 241 towns, including 3 towns for which the population was not returned separately. Each of three cities and one town is coextensive with the precinct in which located, and each of five cities and four towns comprises two or more precincts or parts of precincts. (See Table 2.)

POPULATION—ALABAMA.

Cities.—Alabama has 53 cities, of which Birmingham, with a population of 178,806, is the largest. Mobile, with 60,777, is the only other city in the state having more than 50,000 inhabitants. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The following summary shows, for each city having 10,000 or more inhabitants in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the population

of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Alabama living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 11.9 per cent in 1900 to 17.3 per cent in 1910 and to 21.7 per cent in 1920.

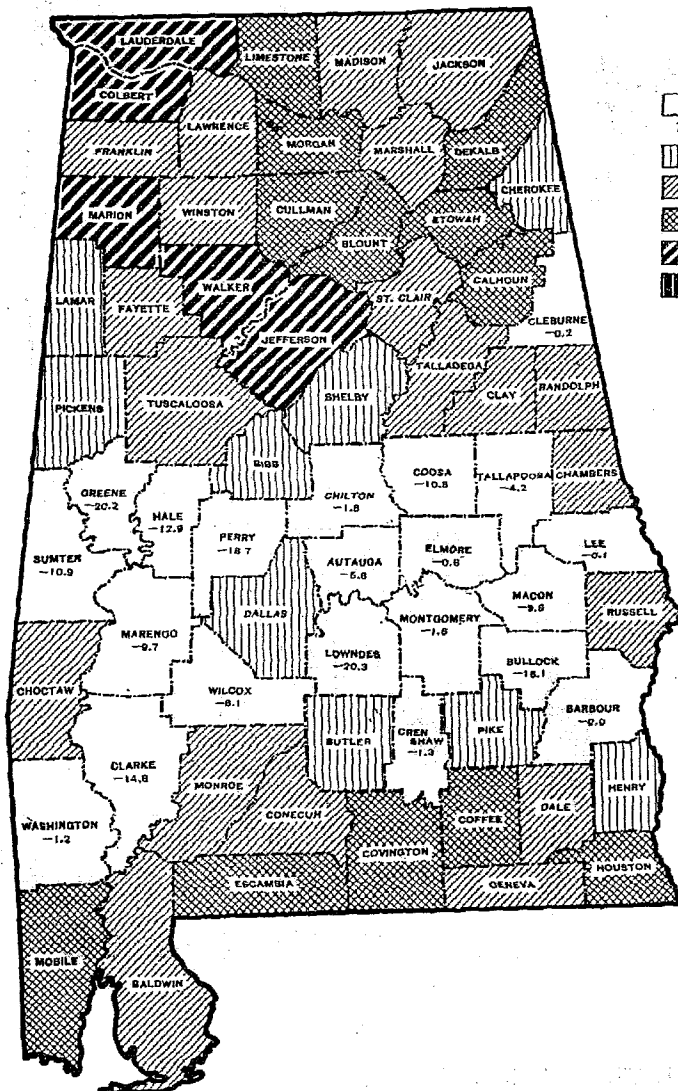

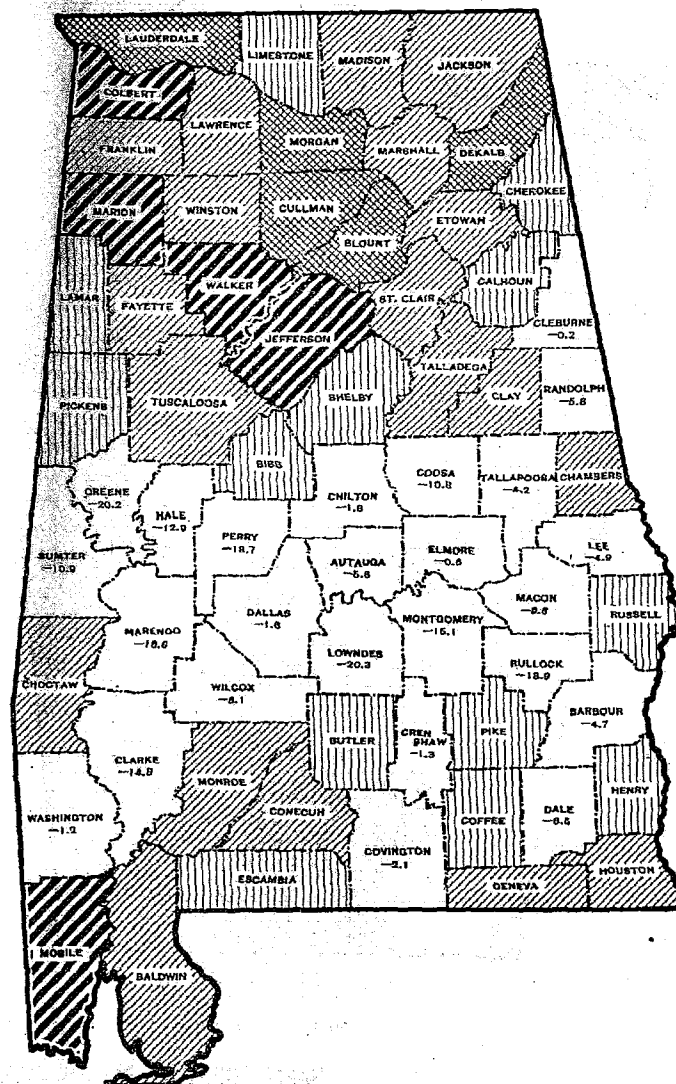
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF ALABAMA, BY COUNTIES: 1910-1920.

BULLOCK.—Part of Montgomery annexed in 1877.

CALHOUN.—Name changed from Fenton in 1858; part of Cleburne annexed and part annexed to Cleburne in 1907.

CHILTON.—Name changed from Baker between 1870 and 1880; part of Dallas annexed in 1875.

CLAY.—Part annexed to Talladega in 1877; part of Talladega annexed in 1895.

CLEBURNE.—Part of Calhoun annexed and part annexed to Calhoun in 1907.

COLBERT.—Part annexed to Franklin between 1890 and 1900; part of Lawrence annexed between 1890 and 1900.

CULLMAN.—Organized from parts of Blount, Marshall, Morgan, and Winston in 1877, and parts of Blount annexed between 1880 and 1890 and in 1901.

FRANKLIN.—Part of Colbert annexed between 1890 and 1900.

GENEVA.—Part taken to form part of Houston in 1903.

HENRY.—Part taken to form part of Houston in 1903.

HOUSTON.—Organized from parts of Dale, Geneva, and Henry in 1903.

JEFFERSON.—Part of Shelby annexed between 1880 and 1890; part annexed to Walker between 1890 and 1900.

LAMAR.—Name changed from Sanford between 1870 and 1880.

LAWRENCE.—Part annexed to Colbert between 1890 and 1900.

MARSHALL.—Part taken to form part of Cullman in 1877.

MONTGOMERY.—Parts annexed to Bullock and Elmore in 1877.

MORGAN.—Part taken to form part of Cullman in 1877.

PERCY.—Part annexed to Jefferson between 1880 and 1890.

SHELBY.—Part of Clay annexed in 1877; part annexed to Clay in 1895.

TALLADEGA.—Part of Jefferson annexed between 1890 and 1900.

WALKER.—Part taken to form part of Cullman in 1877.

WINSTON.—Part taken to form part of Cullman in 1877.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Arizona was organized as a territory in 1863 and was admitted to the Union as the forty-eighth state in February, 1912. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 334,162, which represents an increase of 129,808, or 63.5 per cent, over the population in 1910. During the same period the rate of increase for the United States was 14.9 per cent.

The following summary shows the population of Arizona from 1870 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole. The population in 1860 of Arizona County, N. Mex., comprising the area now constituting the state of Arizona and a small part of Nevada, was 6,482.

Counties.—Arizona has 14 counties. (See Table 1.) One new county, Greenlee, was organized from part of Graham in 1911. It has been necessary, therefore, in preparing the maps showing rates of increase in total and rural population, to combine these two counties.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 113,810 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 2.9 (see Table 1), as against 1.8 in 1910 and 1.1 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The counties of Arizona

are made up of 427 primary divisions, comprising 355 election precincts, 24 school districts, 40 unorganized townships, 1 unincorporated city, 6 unincorporated towns, and 1 unincorporated village. There are also 31 secondary divisions, comprising 10 cities, 20 towns, and 1 unincorporated town. In a number of cases a city or other incorporated place comprises an entire precinct or two or more precincts or parts of two or more precincts. Eleven Indian reservations and parts of three others are located within the state. These, although independent of the county organizations, are shown in the table as parts of the counties in which they are wholly or partially located. The population not included in any of the specified

divisions is shown under the title "Remainder of county." (See Table 2.)

Cities.—Arizona has 10 incorporated cities, of which Phoenix, with a population of 29,053, is the largest. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The following summary shows, for each of the principal cities and towns in the state, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the popu-

lation of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Arizona living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 15.9 per cent in 1900 to 31 per cent in 1910 and to 35.2 per cent in 1920.

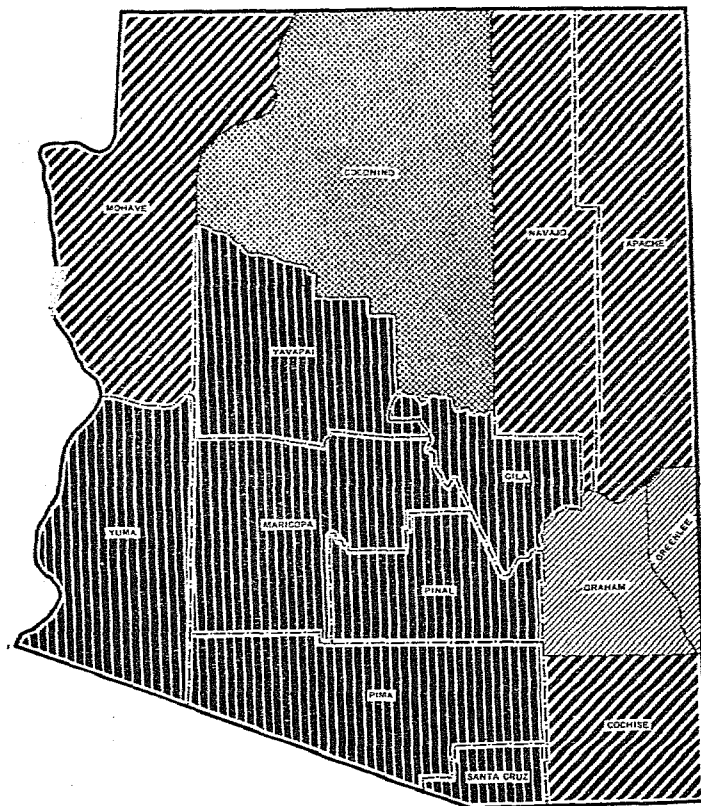

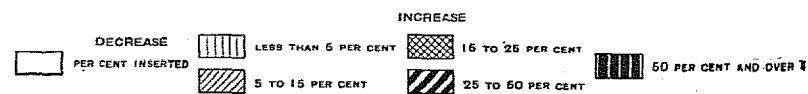
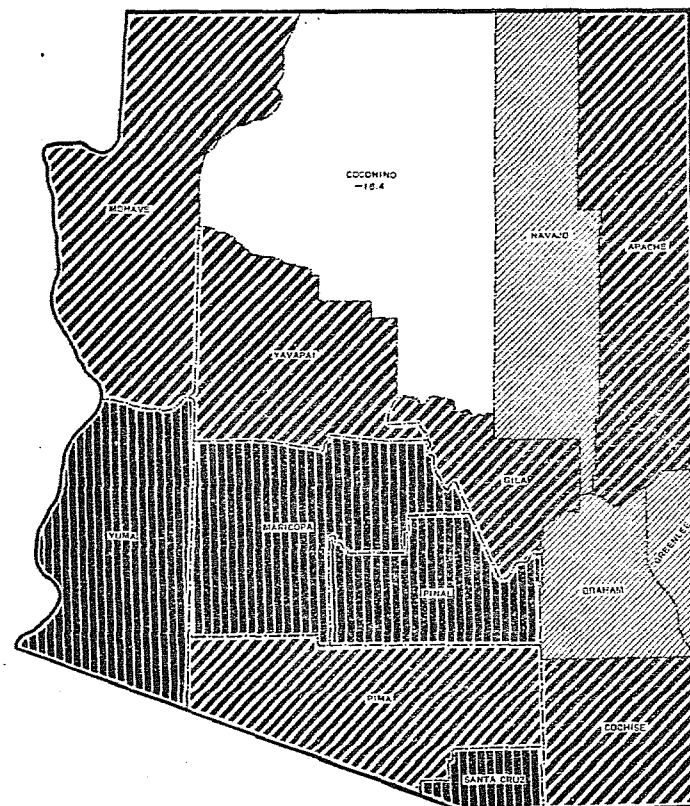
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF ARIZONA, BY COUNTIES: 1910-1920.

TOTAL POPULATION.



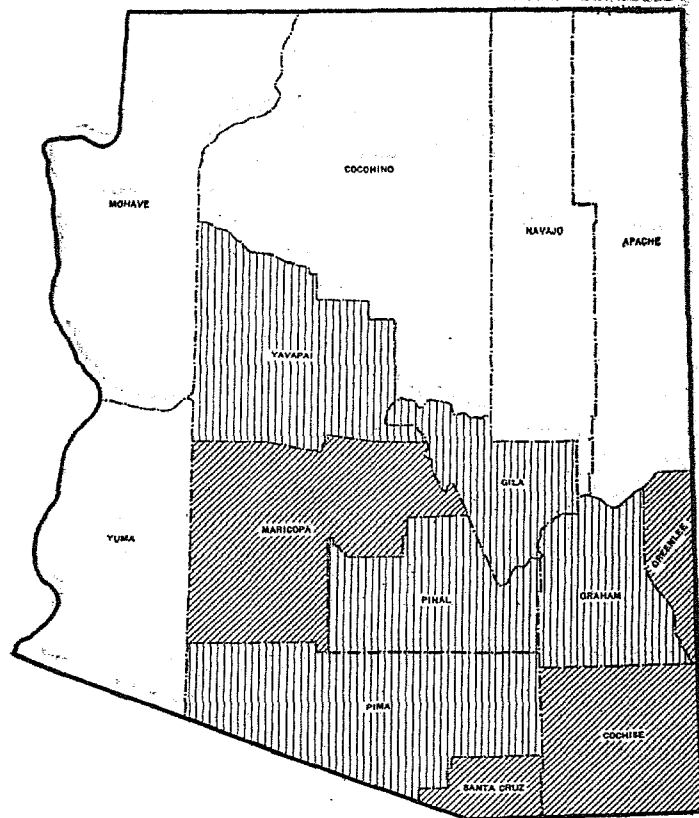
RURAL POPULATION.



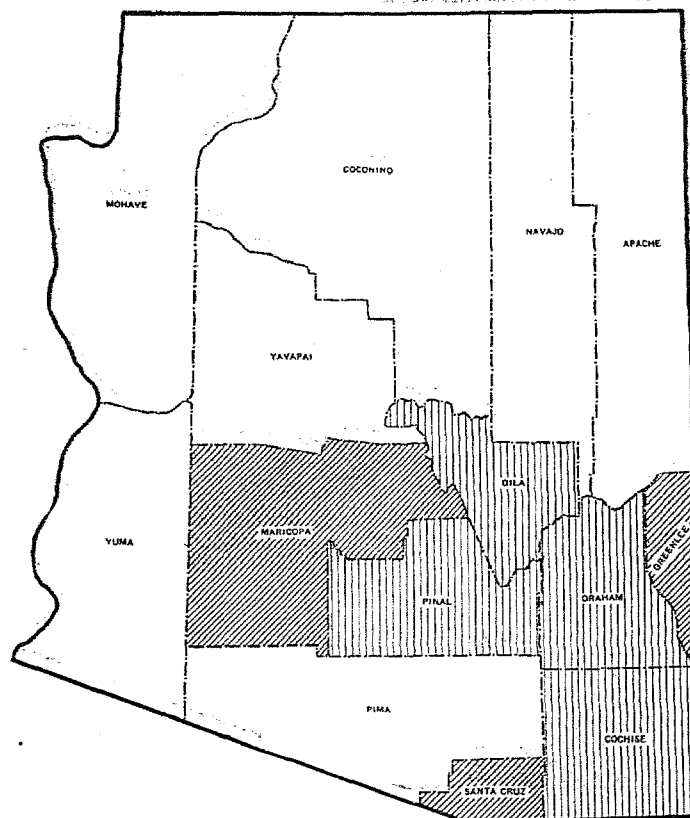
DENSITY OF POPULATION OF ARIZONA, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

Rural population is defined as that residing outside of incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more.

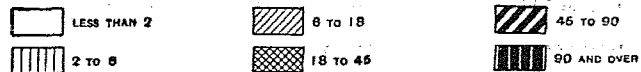
TOTAL POPULATION.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Arkansas was organized as a territory in March, 1819, and was admitted to the Union as the twenty-fifth state in June, 1836. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 1,752,204, which represents an increase of 177,755, or 11.3 per cent, over the 1910 figure. During the same period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent.

The following summary shows the population of Arkansas from 1810 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole. The population shown for 1810 is that of the area now constituting Arkansas but then forming a part of the territory of Louisiana.

Counties.—Arkansas has 75 counties, of which 50 show increases and 25 decreases as compared with 1910. The following annexations to counties have been made since 1910: Part of Montgomery annexed to Garland, and part of Saline annexed to Pulaski. (See Table 1.)

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 52,525 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 33.4 (see Table 1), as against 30 in 1910 and 25 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the Arkansas counties are the townships, which number 1,441. There are also 349 secondary divisions, comprising 32 cities, 316 towns (including 3 for which the population was not returned separately), and 1 village. These secondary divisions form parts of the townships in which they are located. (See Table 2.)

POPULATION—ARKANSAS.

Cities.—Arkansas has 32 cities, of which Little Rock, with a population of 65,142, is the largest. Fort Smith, with 28,870, is the only other city with more than 25,000 inhabitants. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The following summary shows, for the leading cities, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the popu-

lation of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Arkansas living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 8.5 per cent in 1900 to 12.9 per cent in 1910 and to 16.6 per cent in 1920.

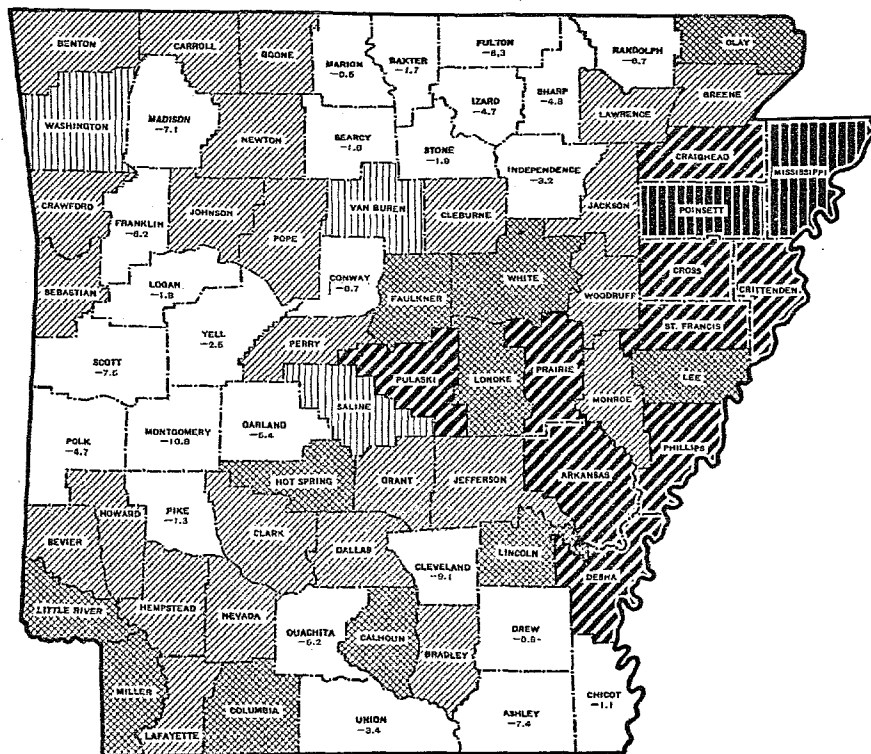

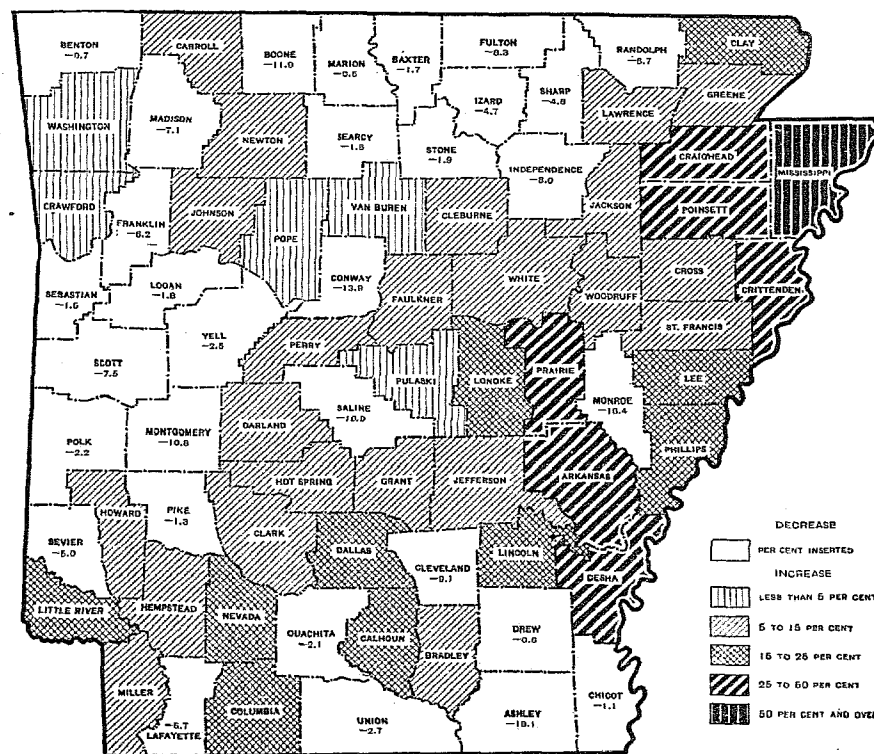
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF ARKANSAS, BY COUNTIES: 1910-1920.

TOTAL POPULATION.



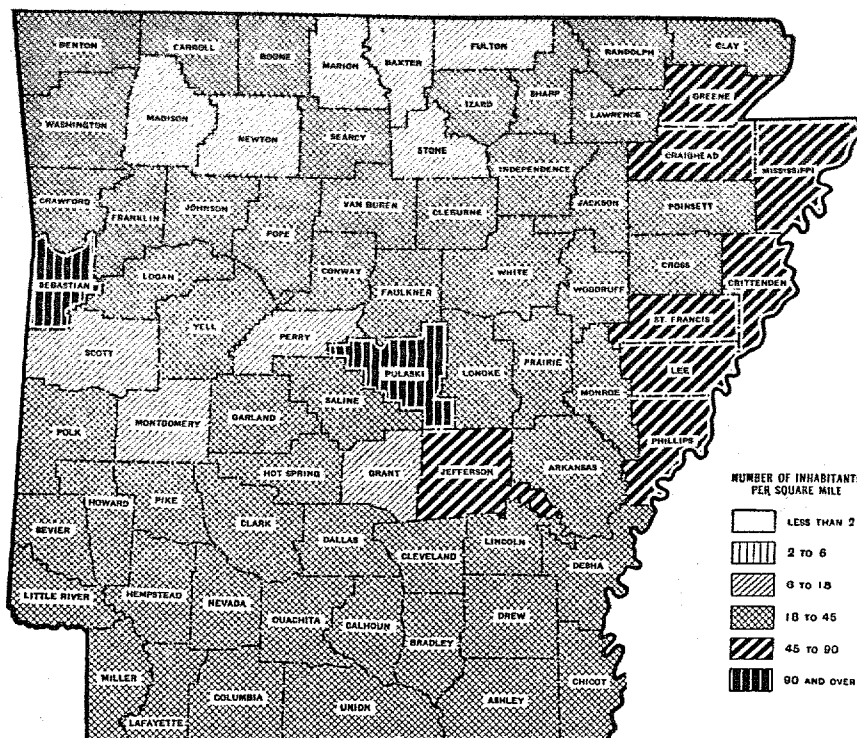
RURAL POPULATION.



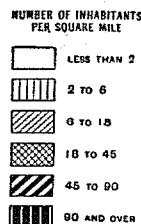
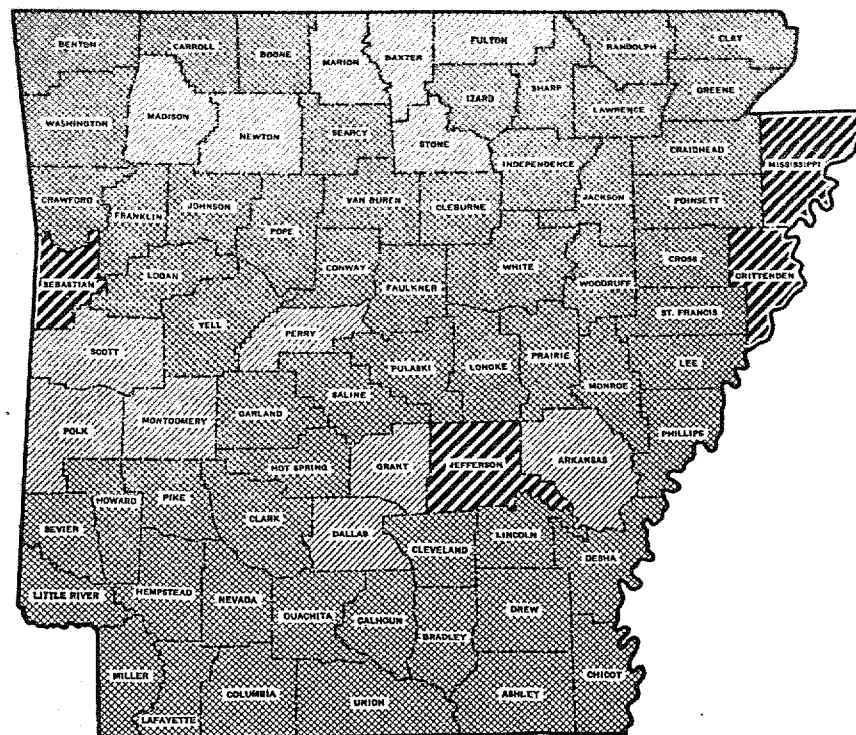
DENSITY OF POPULATION OF ARKANSAS, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

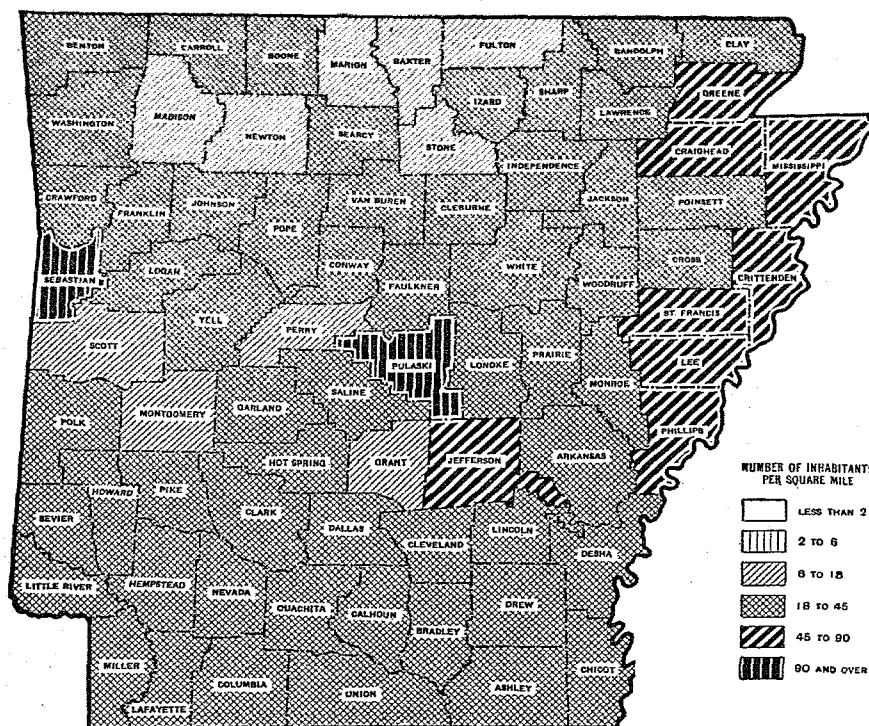

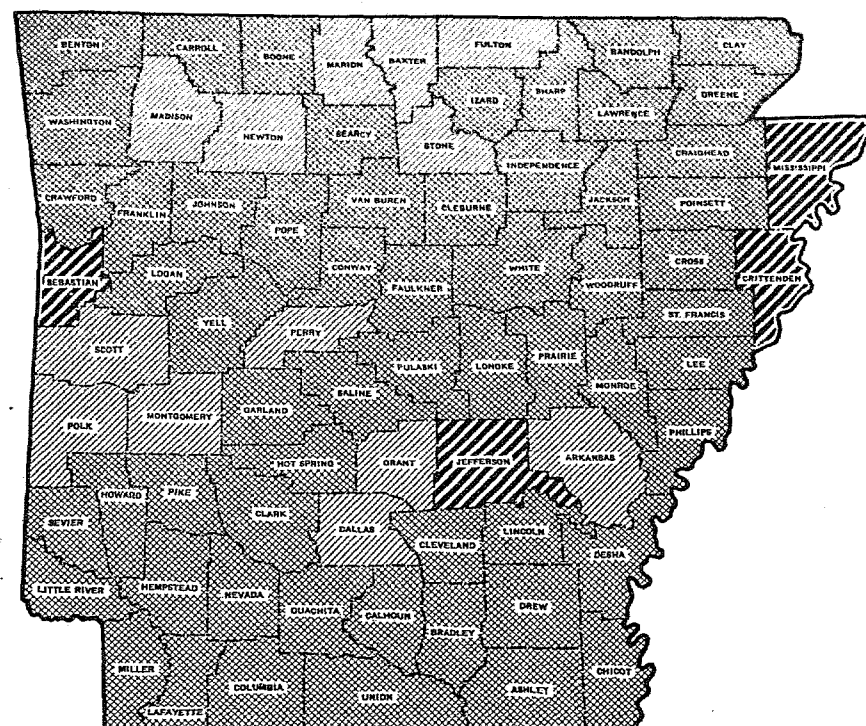
DENSITY OF POPULATION OF ARKANSAS, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—California, originally a part of Mexico, revolted against that country in 1846, and was under military and provisional rule by the United States from 1846 to 1849, the Mexican Government having formally relinquished its claims in February, 1848, at the close of the Mexican War. In September, 1850, California was admitted to the Union as the thirty-first state. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its popula-

tion is 3,426,861, which represents an increase of 1,049,312, or 44.1 per cent, since 1910. During the same period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent.

The following summary shows the population of the state from 1850 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—California has 58 counties, of which 44 show increases and 14 decreases as compared with 1910. (See Table 1.) Annexations of territory from one county to another since 1910 have resulted in changes in the boundaries of Butte, Eldorado, Glenn, Kern, Lake, Los Angeles, Mendocino, Placer, Riverside, San Bernardino, Sonoma, and Ventura Counties.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 155,652 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 22 (see Table 1), as against 15.3 in 1910 and 9.5 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed

“minor civil divisions.” San Francisco County is coextensive with San Francisco city. In the remaining 57 counties of the state the primary divisions are the judicial townships, 580 in number, for which the population is presented separately in Table 2. The secondary divisions are 253 in number, comprising 184 cities and 69 towns. Each of 10 cities and 2 towns is coextensive with the township in which located, and each of 8 cities comprises 2 or more townships or parts of townships. In addition to these primary and secondary divisions, there are 10 Indian reservations in the state. Although these reservations are independent of the county organizations, the population of each is

reated as a part of the total population of the county in which it is located. (See Table 2.)

Cities.—California has 185 cities, of which Los Angeles, with a population of 576,673, is the largest. San Francisco, with 506,676, and Oakland, with 216,261, are the only other cities having more than

100,000 inhabitants. (See Tables 3 and 4.) The following summary shows, for each city having 25,000 or more inhabitants in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the population

of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of California living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 52.4 per cent in 1900 to 61.8 per cent in 1910 and to 68 per cent in 1920.

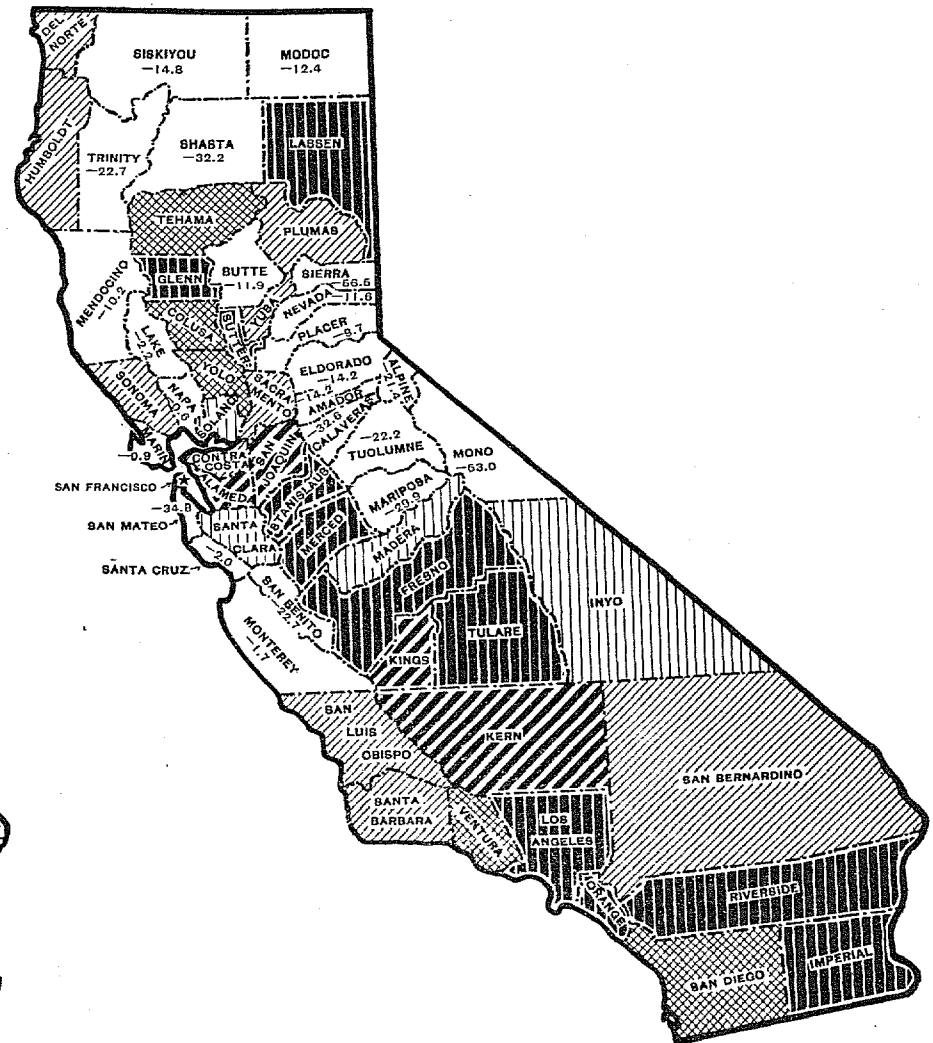
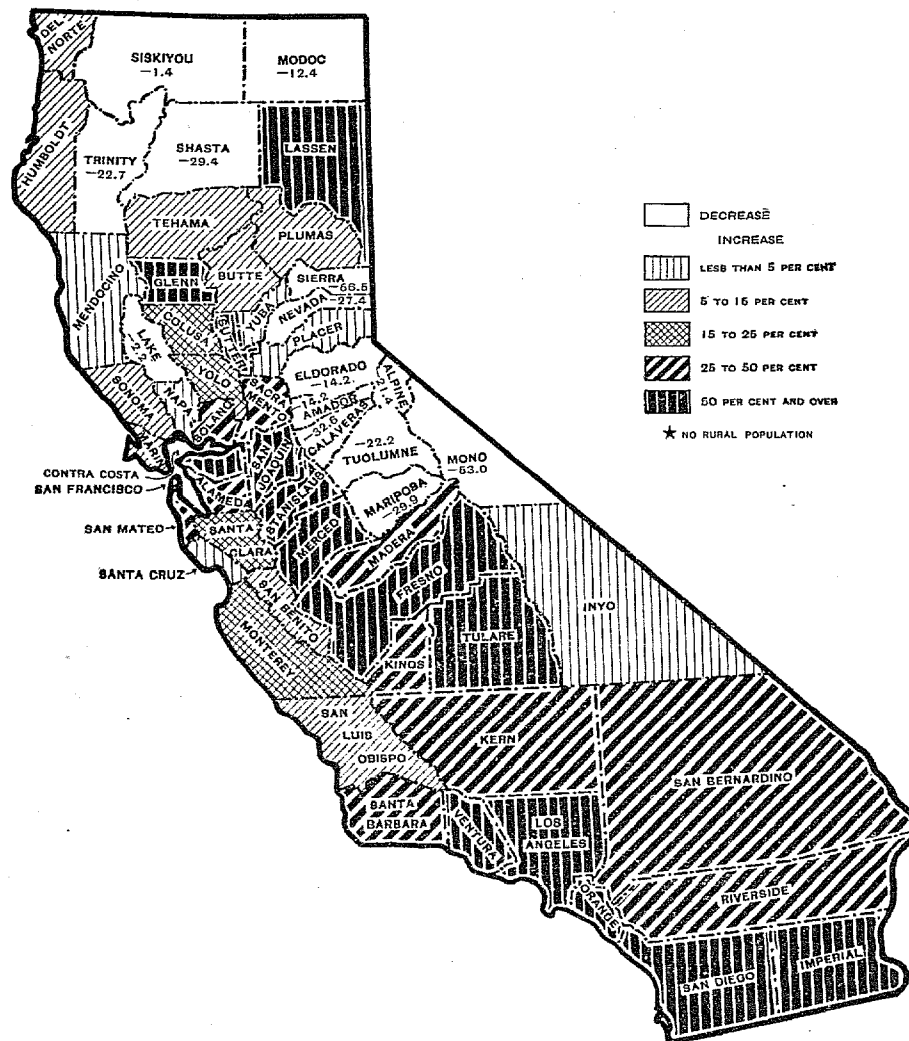

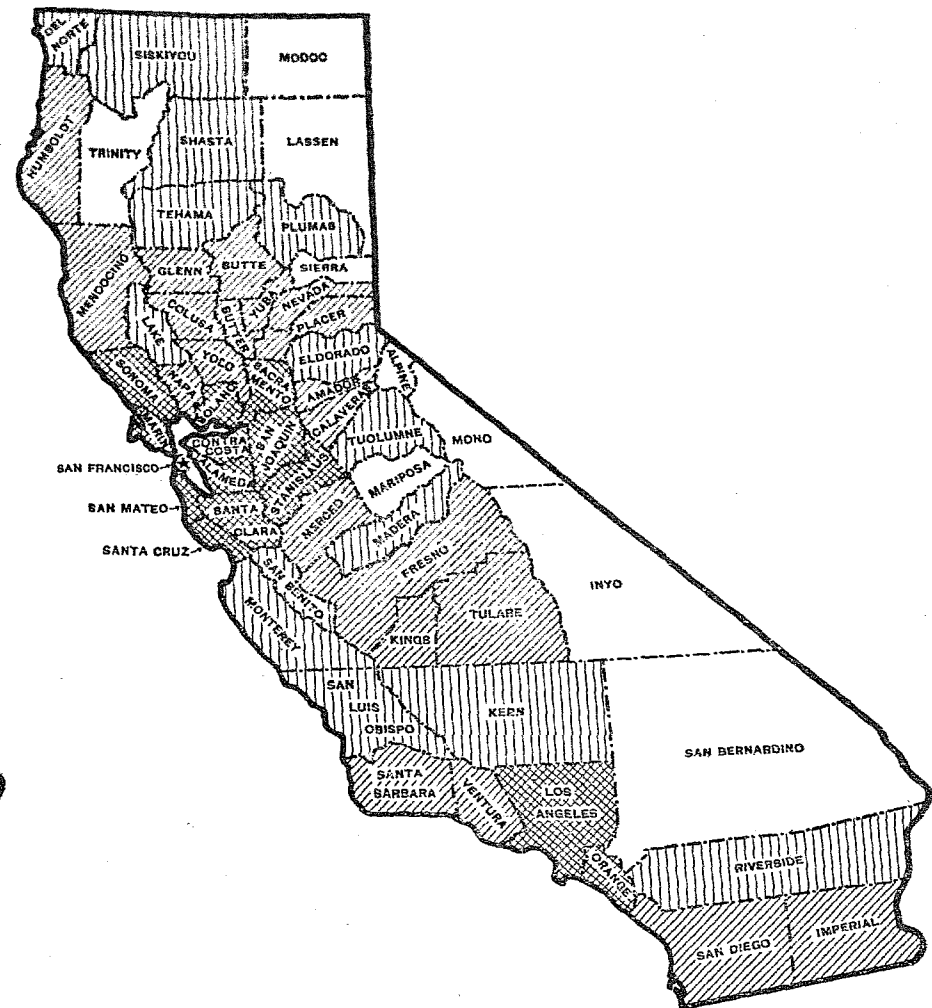
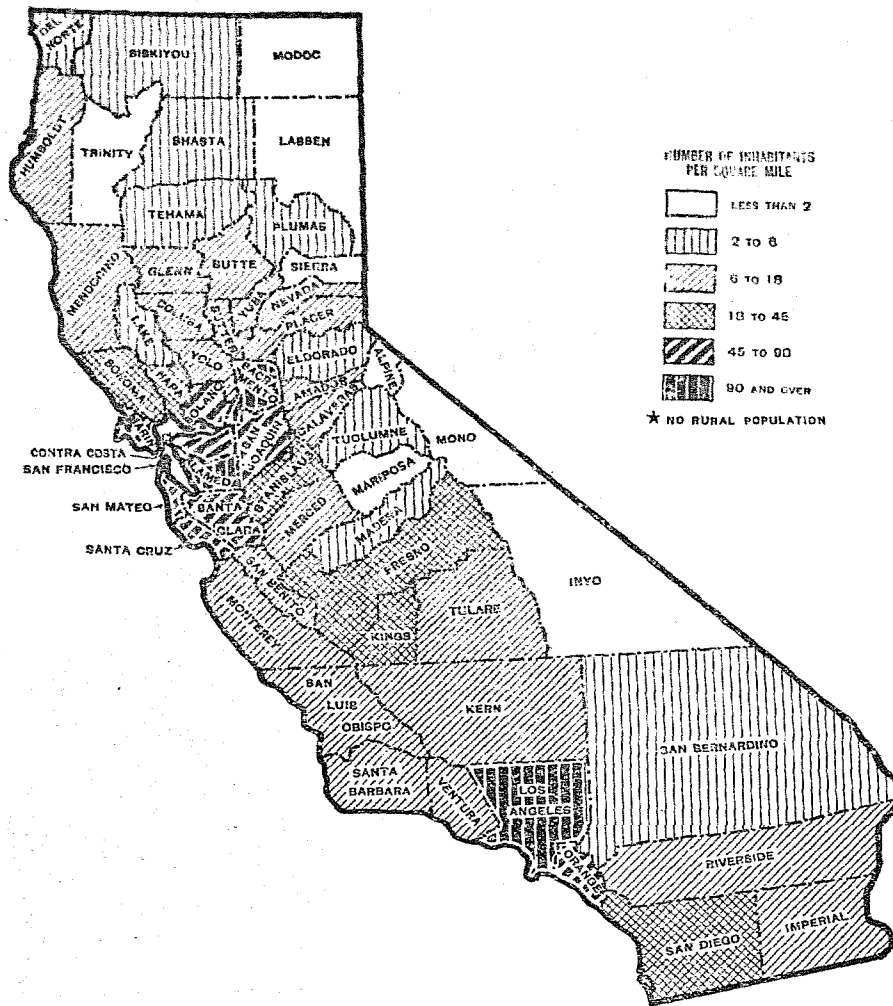


DENSITY OF POPULATION OF CALIFORNIA, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Colorado was organized as a territory in February, 1861, and in August, 1876, was admitted to the Union as the thirty-eighth state. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 939,629, which represents an increase of 140,605, or 17.6 per cent, over the 1910 figure. During the same period

the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent.

The following summary shows the population of Colorado from 1860 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase in each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Colorado has 63 counties, of which 17 show decreases in population since 1910. (See Table 1.) The following changes have been made in the boundaries of the counties since 1910: Parts of Conejos and Costilla Counties were taken to form Alamosa County, part of Otero County was taken to form Crowley County, part of Routt County was taken to form Moffat County, part of Jefferson County was annexed to Gilpin County, parts of Montrose and San Miguel Counties were annexed to Ouray County, and part of Ouray County was annexed to Montrose County. Because of the formation of the three new counties it has been necessary, in preparing the maps on page 3, which show the rates of increase or decrease in total

and rural population since 1910, to combine Alamosa, Conejos, and Costilla Counties, to combine Crowley and Otero Counties, and to combine Moffat and Routt Counties.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 103,658 square miles. The average number of persons to the square mile in 1920 is 9.1 (see Table 1), as against 7.7 in 1910 and 5.2 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The 63 counties of Colorado are made up of 1,213 primary divisions, comprising 1,207 election precincts, for which the population is presented so far as reported separately, and 6 cities. (See

Table 2.) There are also 223 secondary divisions of the counties, comprising 35 cities and 188 towns. In a number of cases a city or other incorporated place comprises an entire precinct or two or more precincts or parts of two or more precincts. The city of Denver is coextensive with the county of the same name. Besides these primary and secondary divisions there is one Indian reservation, which, though independent of any county organization, is returned as a part of the county in which it is located.

Cities.—Colorado has 41 cities, of which Denver, with a population of 256,491, is the largest. Pueblo, with 43,050, and Colorado Springs, with 30,105, are the only other cities having more than 25,000 inhabitants. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The following summary shows, for the 6 Colorado cities having 10,000 inhabitants or more in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase during the preceding decade:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the population of the various places as shown by the returns of that

census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Colorado living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 48.3 per cent in 1900 to 50.3 per cent in 1910, but decreased to 48.2 per cent in 1920, practically the same proportion as shown for 1900.

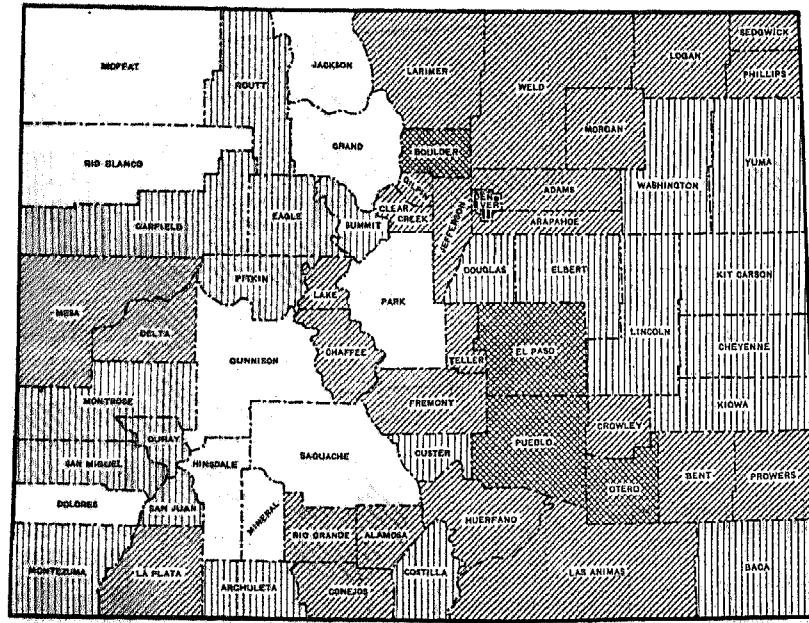

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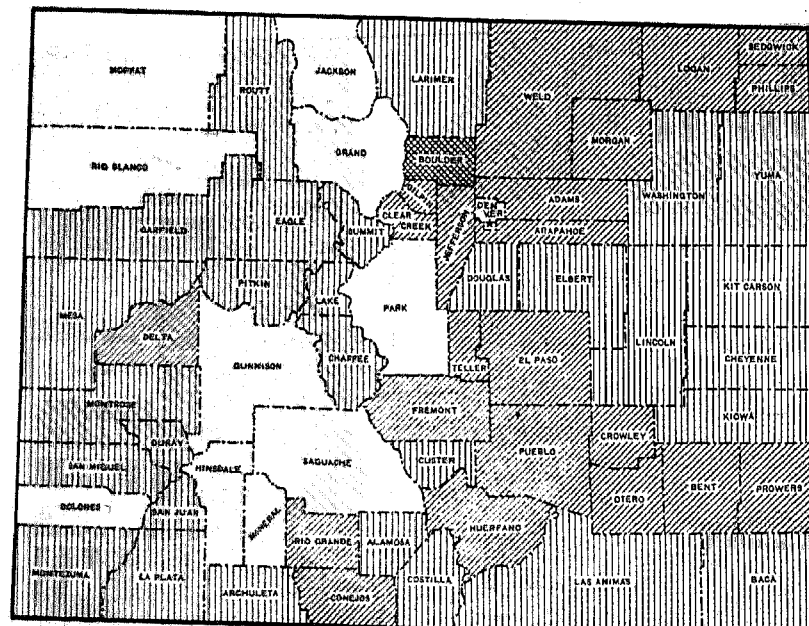
DENSITY OF POPULATION OF COLORADO, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

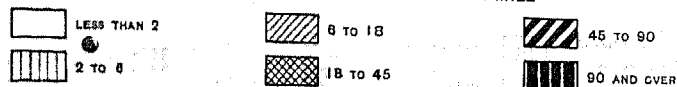
TOTAL POPULATION.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Connecticut was one of the original thirteen states. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 1,380,631, which represents an increase of 265,875, or 23.9 per cent, over the population in 1910. During the same period the population of the United

States increased 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Connecticut from 1790, the first Federal census year, to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase in each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Connecticut has 8 counties, each of which increased in population during the last two decades (see Table 1). There have been no changes in county boundaries since 1910.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 4,820 square miles, and the average number of persons to the square mile in 1920 is 286.4 (see Table 1); in 1910 and 1900 the averages were 231.3 and 188.5, respectively.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which counties are divided are collectively termed

"minor civil divisions." In Connecticut the primary division of the county is the town, and in 1920 these number 168. There are also 20 cities and 22 incorporated boroughs in the state which are not independent minor civil divisions but form parts of the towns in which they are located. Eleven of the cities and one borough, however, are coextensive with the towns in which they are located. (See Table 2.) One borough (Fair Haven East), which forms part of New Haven city and part of East Haven town, is not shown separately in Table 3.

POPULATION—CONNECTICUT.

Cities.—Connecticut has 3 cities of over 100,000 inhabitants—New Haven (162,537), Bridgeport (143,555), and Hartford (138,036). (See Tables 3 and 4.) The following summary shows, for each city or borough

having 20,000 inhabitants or more in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during each decade.

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the population of the various places as shown by the

returns of that census. As a result, the figures for each census covered by the table do not relate to exactly the same urban and rural territory, respectively, as those for the other two censuses, since certain territory which was rural in 1900 was urban in 1910 and 1920 and certain other territory which was rural in 1900 and 1910 is urban in 1920. The proportion of the population of Connecticut living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 59.9 per cent in 1900 to 65.6 per cent in 1910 and to 67.8 per cent in 1920.

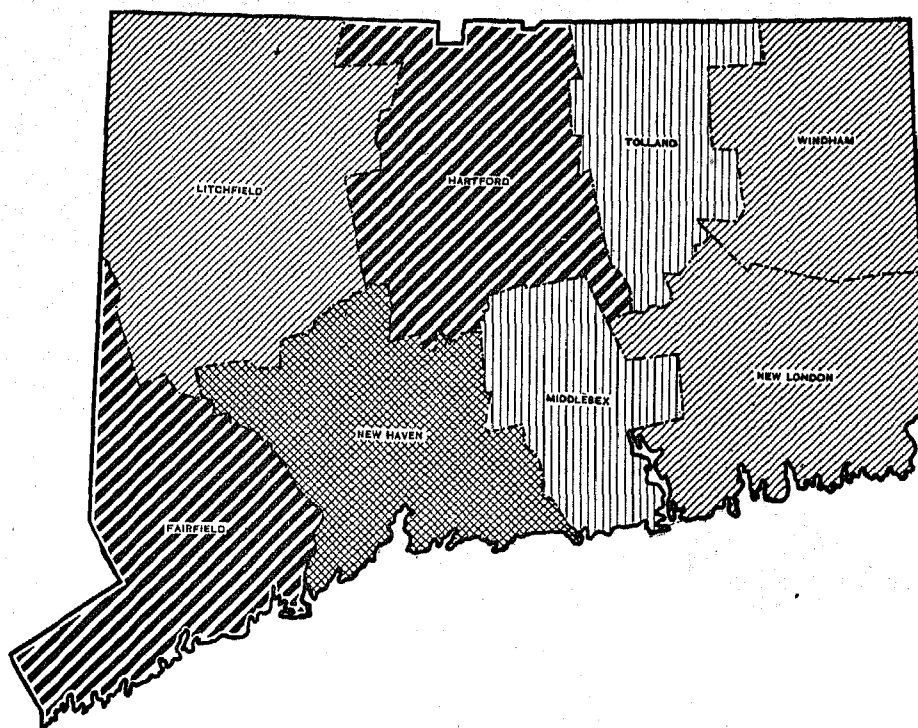

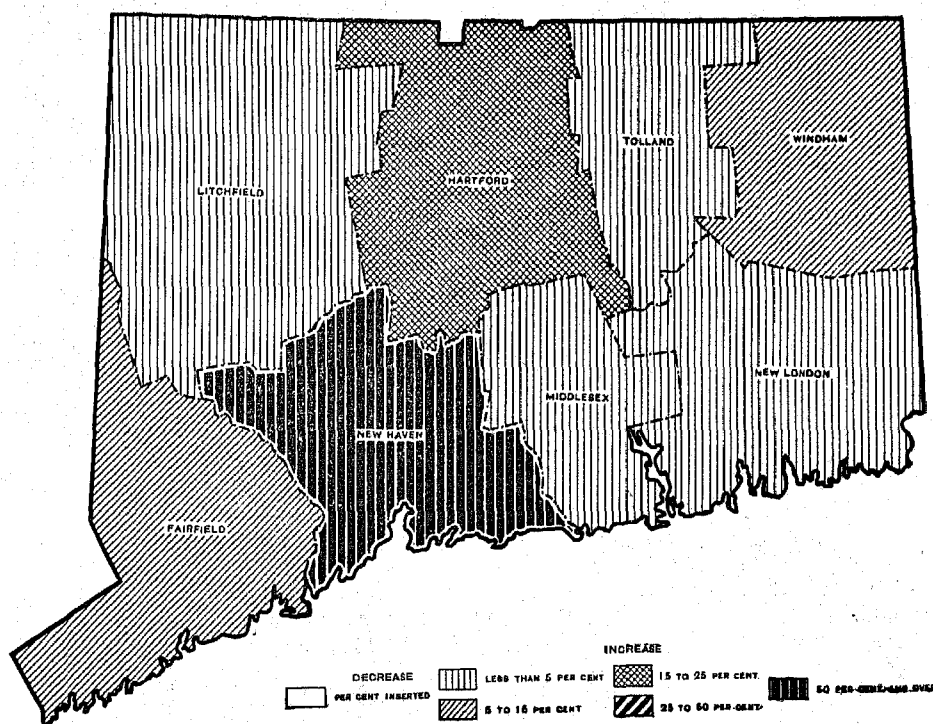
PER CENT OF INCREASE OF POPULATION OF CONNECTICUT, BY COUNTIES: 1910-1920.

TOTAL POPULATION.



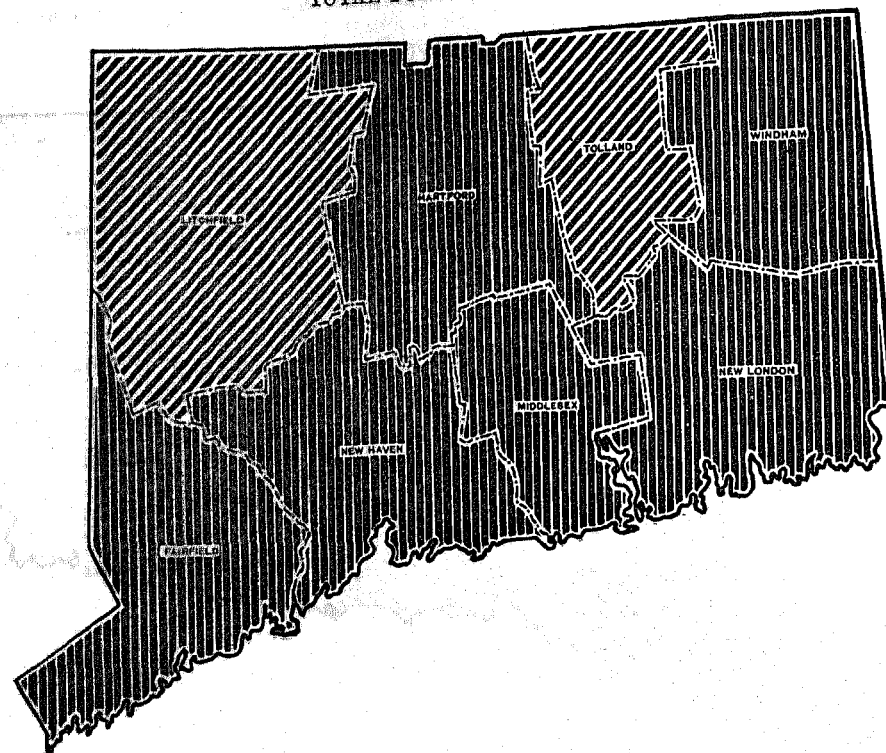
RURAL POPULATION.



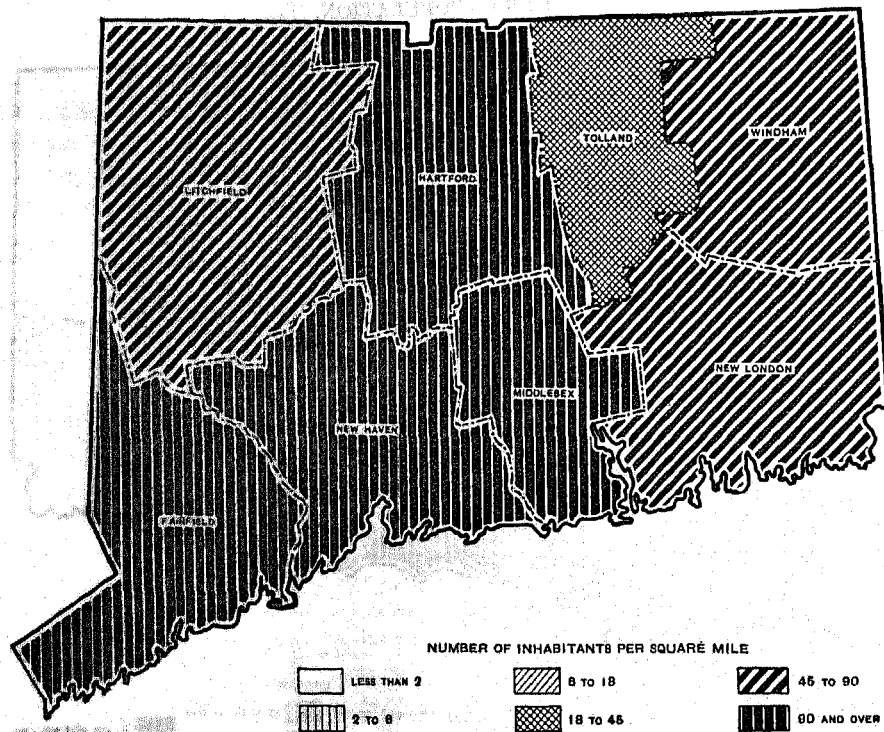
DENSITY OF POPULATION OF CONNECTICUT, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Delaware was one of the original thirteen states. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 223,003, which represents an increase of 20,681, or 10.2 per cent, over the population in 1910. During the same period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent.

The following summary shows the population of Delaware from 1790, the year to which the first Federal census related, to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole.

Counties.—Delaware has three counties, of which only one, New Castle, shows an increase as compared with 1910. There have been no changes in the boundaries of the counties since 1910. (See Table 1.)

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 1,965 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 113.5 (see Table 1), as against 103 in 1910 and 94 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties of Delaware are the representative districts, 35 in number, which serve as local taxation units. There are also 50 secondary divisions, of which 2 are cities and 48 are incorporated towns. The city of Wilmington comprises five representative districts. (See Table 2.)

POPULATION—DELAWARE.

Cities and towns.—Delaware has 2 cities and 48 incorporated towns. Of these 50 incorporated places, Wilmington city, with 110,168 inhabitants, is the largest. (See Table 3.)

The following summary shows the population of Wilmington at each census since its incorporation, together with the increase during each decade. The population of the city by wards is given in Table 4.

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the population of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Delaware living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 46.4 per cent in 1900 to 48 per cent in 1910 and to 54.2 per cent in 1920.

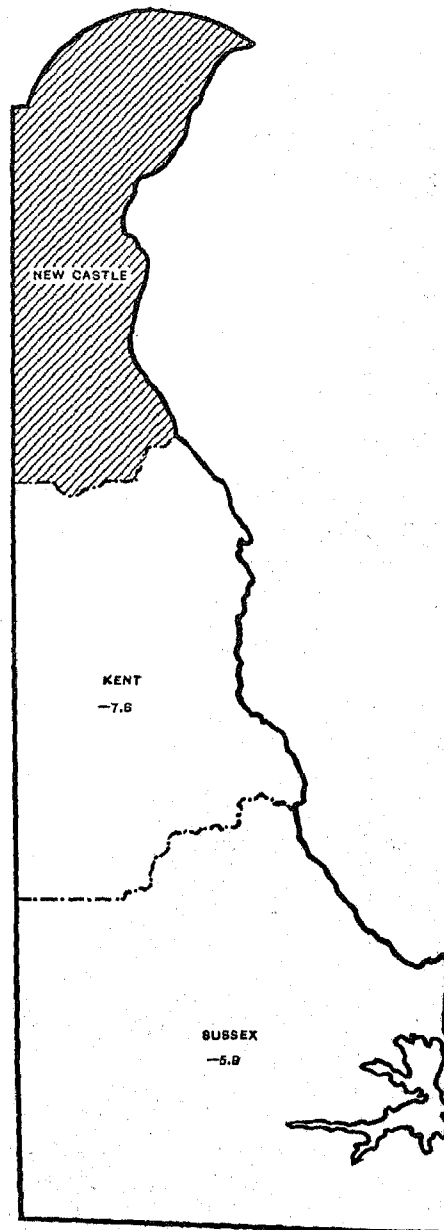
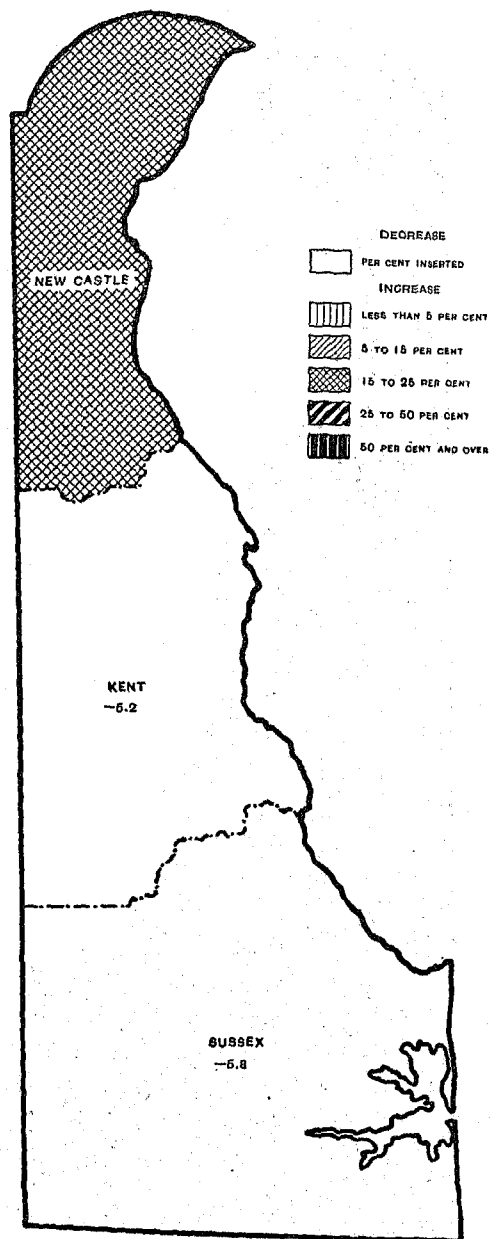

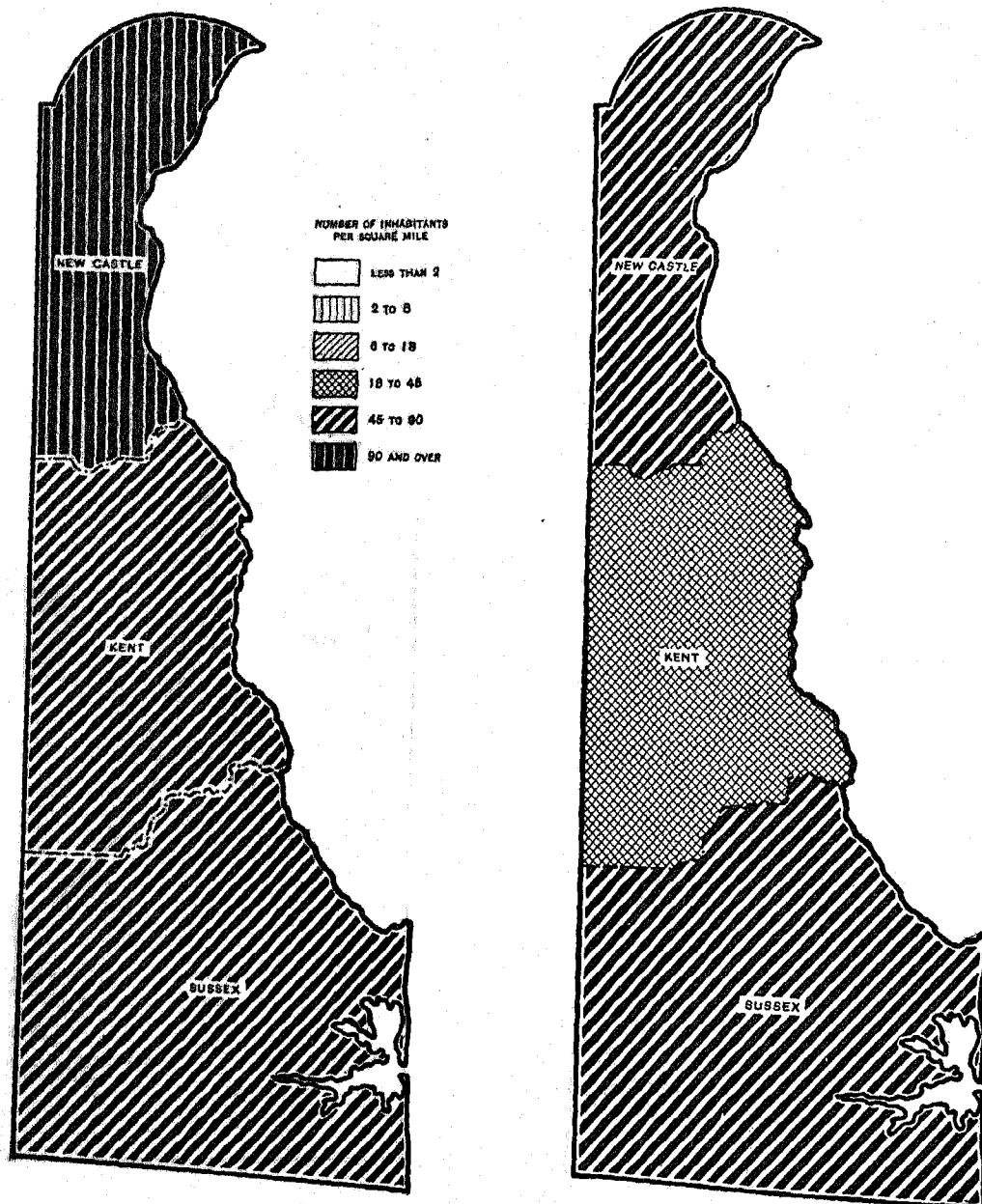


DENSITY OF POPULATION OF DELAWARE, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of District.—The establishment of the District of Columbia as the seat of the Federal Government was authorized by acts of Congress passed in 1790 and 1791. Congress first met in the District in 1800, and assumed jurisdiction over it in 1801. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, the population of the District of Columbia is 437,571, which represents an increase of 106,502, or 32.2 per cent, over the population in 1910. During the same period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent.

Table 1 shows the population of the District of

Columbia from 1800 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase in each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole.

The figures for the censuses prior to 1850 include the population of about 30 square miles south of the Potomac River, originally a part of the District but retroceded to Virginia in 1846.

Density of population.—The total land area of the District is 60 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 was 7,292.9, as against 5,517.8 in 1910 and 4,645.3 in 1900.

Divisions and districts.—The city of Washington has been coextensive with the District of Columbia since February 11, 1895, when, by act of Congress, Georgetown was made a part of Washington. Its population is essentially urban or suburban in character, and no attempt has been made to define the

small areas which might be classed as rural. Table 2 shows the population of the District of Columbia at the censuses of 1920, 1910, and 1900, respectively, distributed among the three divisions recognized before the county government of the District was abolished in 1874.

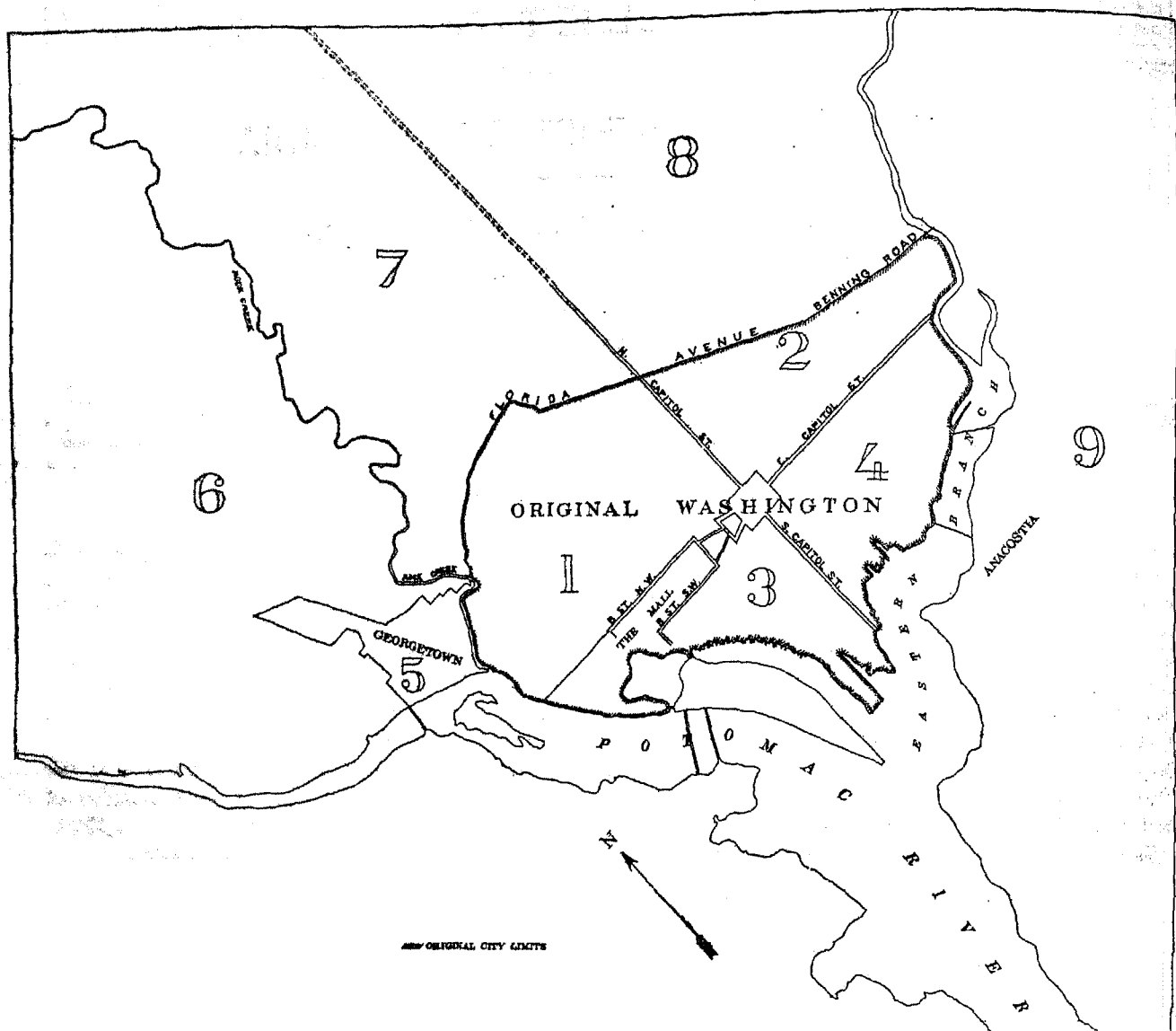

In order to show the growth by smaller areas, the Bureau of the Census has further distributed the population of the District in 1920, 1910, and 1900, respectively, according to nine districts, which are shown on the accompanying map. These districts are as follows:

WASHINGTON (ORIGINAL LIMITS).

District 1, Northwest.—The area south of Florida Avenue between North Capitol Street and Rock Creek, north of the Mall and the Capitol Grounds.

District 2, Northeast.—The area between the Anacostia River (Eastern Branch) and North Capitol Street, north of East Capitol Street and south of Florida Avenue and Benning Road.

District 3, Southwest.—The area south of the Mall and the Capitol Grounds, west of South Capitol Street and north of the Potomac River.

District 4, Southeast.—The area south of East Capitol Street, east of South Capitol Street, and north of the Anacostia River (Eastern Branch).

GEORGETOWN (ORIGINAL LIMITS).

District 5.—The area comprising what was formerly known as Georgetown.

REMAINDER OF DISTRICT.

District 6.—The area west of Rock Creek, exclusive of Georgetown.

District 7.—The area between North Capitol Street extended and Rock Creek, north of Florida Avenue.

POPULATION—DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

Precinct 9.—The area bounded by the District line, Bowen Road, Ridge Road, Anacostia Road, East Capitol Street extended and East Capitol Street, First Street NE., Union Station, Second Street NE., K Street, First Street NE., Florida Avenue, line drawn from intersection of Third Street and Florida Avenue NE., to intersection of Brentwood Road and Seventh Street NE., Brentwood Road, Eighteenth Street NE., and Queens Chapel Road.

Precinct 10.—The area bounded by the District line, Queens Chapel Road, Eighteenth Street, Brentwood Road, T Street, First Street NW., Channing Street, College Street extended, College Street, Barry Place extended, Barry Place, Florida Avenue, Q Street, and Rock Creek.

Precinct 11.—The area bounded by East Capitol Street extended, Anacostia Road, Ridge Road, Bowen Road, District line, Potomac River, and Anacostia River.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Florida was organized as a territory in 1822 and was admitted to the Union as the twenty-seventh state in March, 1845. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 968,470, which represents an increase of 215,851, or 28.7 per cent, over the population in

1910. During the same period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Florida from 1830 to 1920, inclusive, together with the increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Florida has 54 counties, of which 29 show increases and 18 decreases as compared with 1910. (See Table 1.) The remaining 7 counties have been organized since 1910. Because of the resultant changes in county boundaries it has been necessary, in preparing the maps on page 3, showing rates of increase and decrease in total and rural population of counties between 1910 and 1920, to make the following combinations: Bay and Washington; Broward, Okeechobee, Dade, Palm Beach, Osceola, and St. Lucie; Flagler, St. Johns, and Volusia; Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, and Walton; Pinellas and Hillsborough; Seminole and Orange.

Density of population.—The total land area of the

state is 54,861 square miles, and the average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 17.7 (see Table 1), as against 13.7 in 1910 and 9.6 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the Florida counties are the election precincts, which number 967, including 2 precincts—precinct 13, Cross Bayou, in Pinellas County, and precinct 6, Broadmoore, in St. Lucie County—for which no population was returned, and 2 military reservations. There are also 202 secondary divisions, comprising 48 cities, 152 towns, and 2 villages. One city and 2 towns are each coextensive with the precincts in which located, and

each of 23 cities and 5 towns comprises 2 or more precincts or parts of precincts. (See Table 2.)

Cities.—Florida has 48 cities, of which Jacksonville, with a population of 91,558, is the largest. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The following summary shows, for each city having 10,000 or more inhabitants in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the popu-

lation of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Florida living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 20.3 per cent in 1900 to 29.1 per cent in 1910 and to 36.7 per cent in 1920.

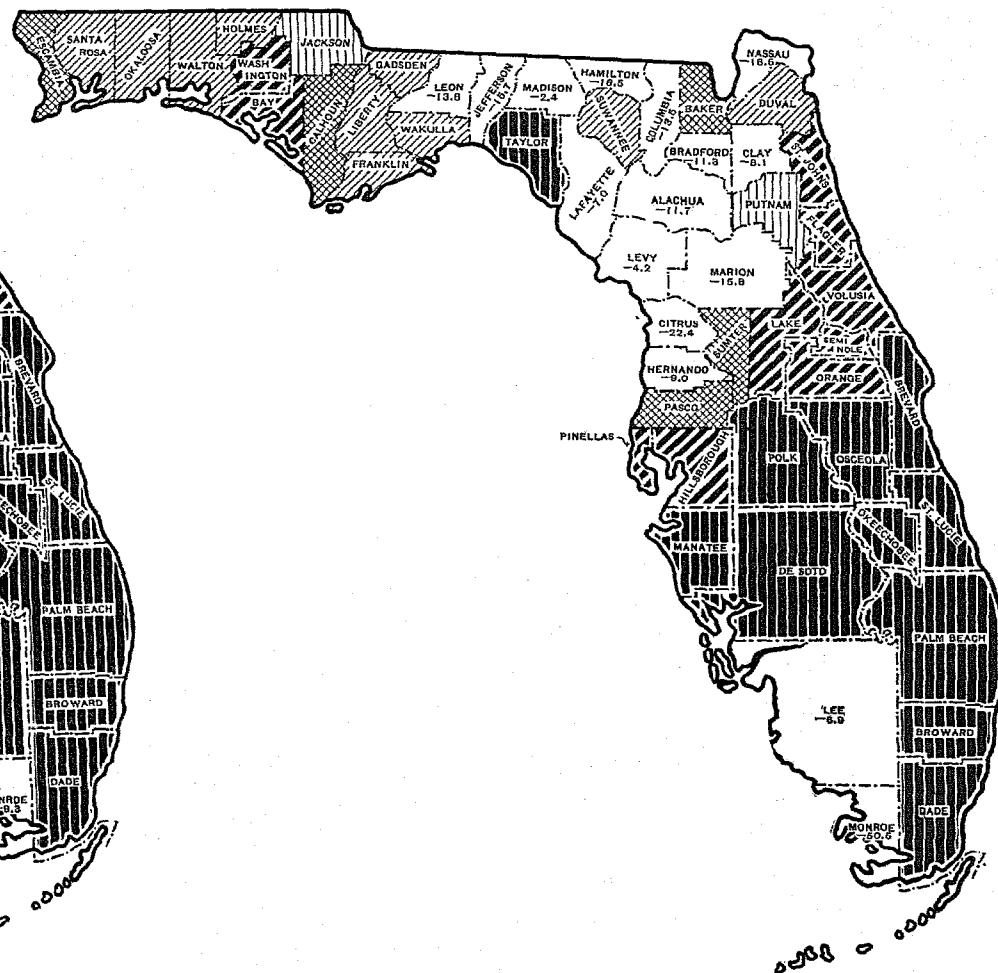

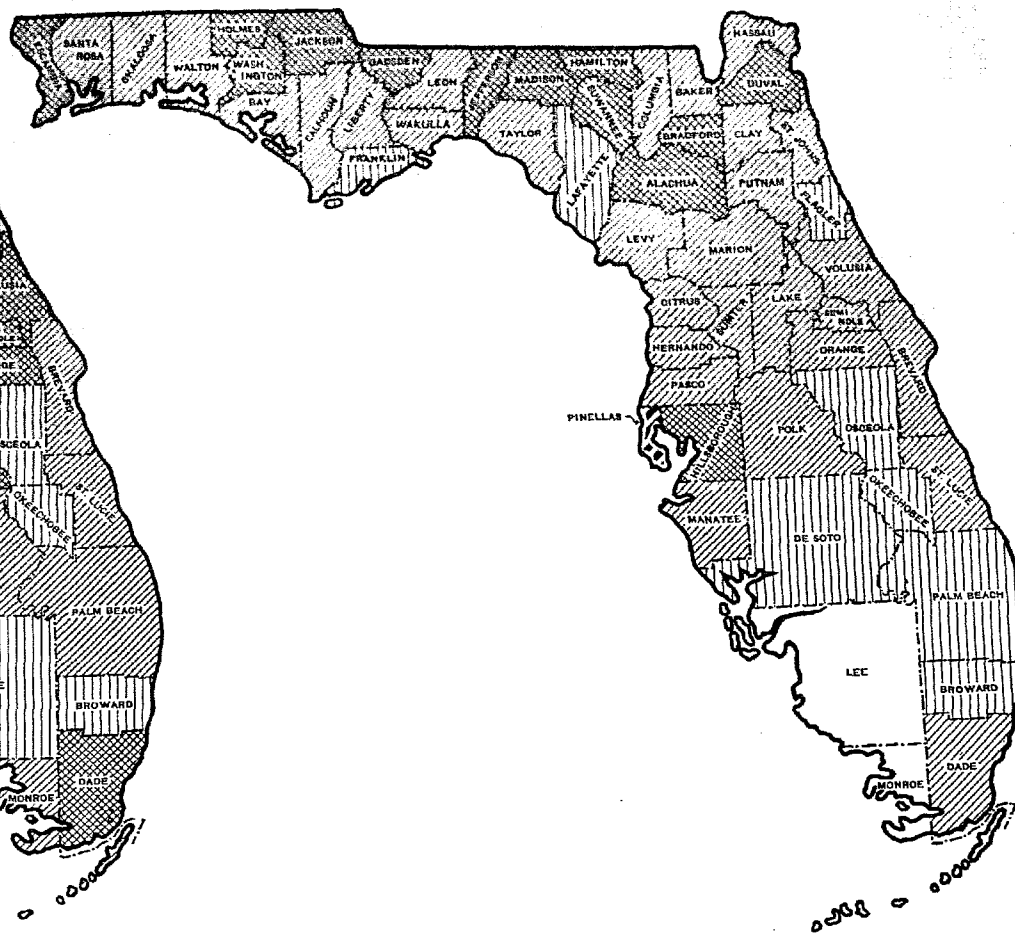
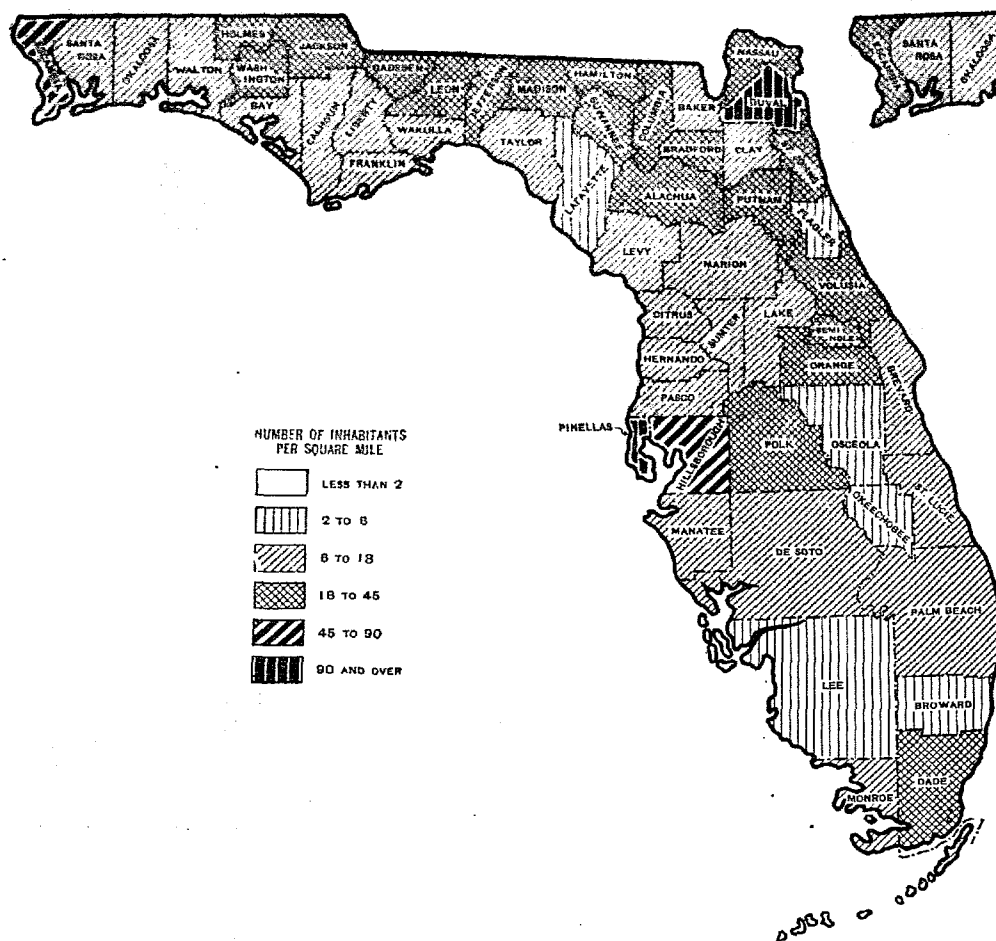


DENSITY OF POPULATION OF FLORIDA, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Georgia was one of the thirteen original states. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 2,895,832, which represents an increase of 286,711, or 11 per cent, as compared with 1910. During the same period the population of the United States increased

by 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Georgia from 1790, the first Federal census year, to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Georgia has 155 counties, 9 of which—Atkinson, Bacon, Barrow, Bleckley, Candler, Cook, Evans, Treutlen, and Wheeler—have been organized since 1910. Because of the territorial changes resulting from the organization of these new counties (see footnotes, Table 1) it has been necessary, in preparing the maps on page 3, showing rates of increase or decrease in total and rural population of counties, to make the following combinations: Atkinson, Clinch, and Coffee; Bacon, Appling, Pierce, and Ware; Barrow, Gwinnett, Jackson, and Walton; Bleckley and Pulaski; Candler, Evans, Treutlen, Wheeler, Bulloch, Emanuel, Montgomery, and Tattnall; and Cook, Berrien, and Lowndes.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 58,725 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 49.3 (see Table 1), as against 44.4 in 1910 and 37.7 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The counties of Georgia are made up of 1,629 primary divisions, comprising 1,628 militia districts, 1 tract not located in any military district, and the city of Atlanta. (See Table 2.) In addition, there are 584 secondary divisions, comprising 123 cities (not including Atlanta), 445 towns, and 16 villages. (See Table 3.) Each of 8 cities, 22 towns, and 1 village comprises 2 or more militia districts

or parts of districts, and each of 3 cities and 2 towns is coextensive with the militia district in which located.

Cities.—Georgia has 124 cities, of which Atlanta, with a population of 200,616, is the largest. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The following summary shows, for each city having 20,000 or more inhabitants in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the population

of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Georgia living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 15.6 per cent in 1900 to 20.6 per cent in 1910 and to 25.1 per cent in 1920.

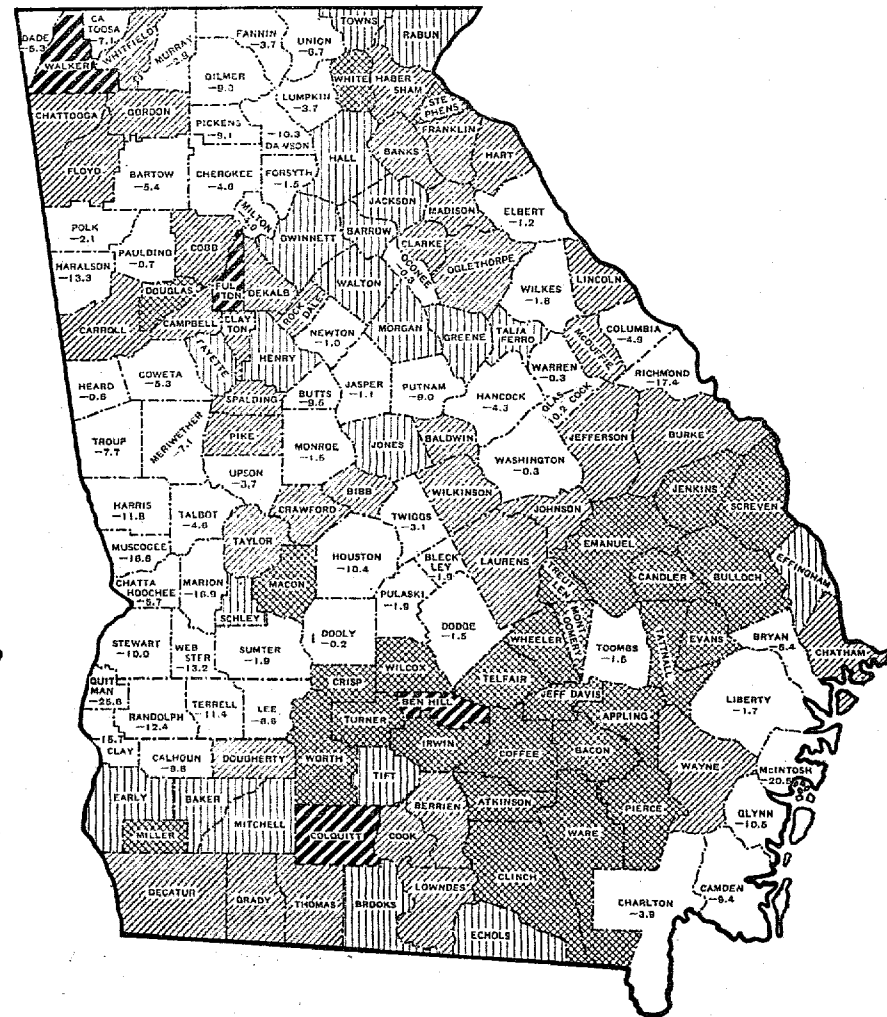
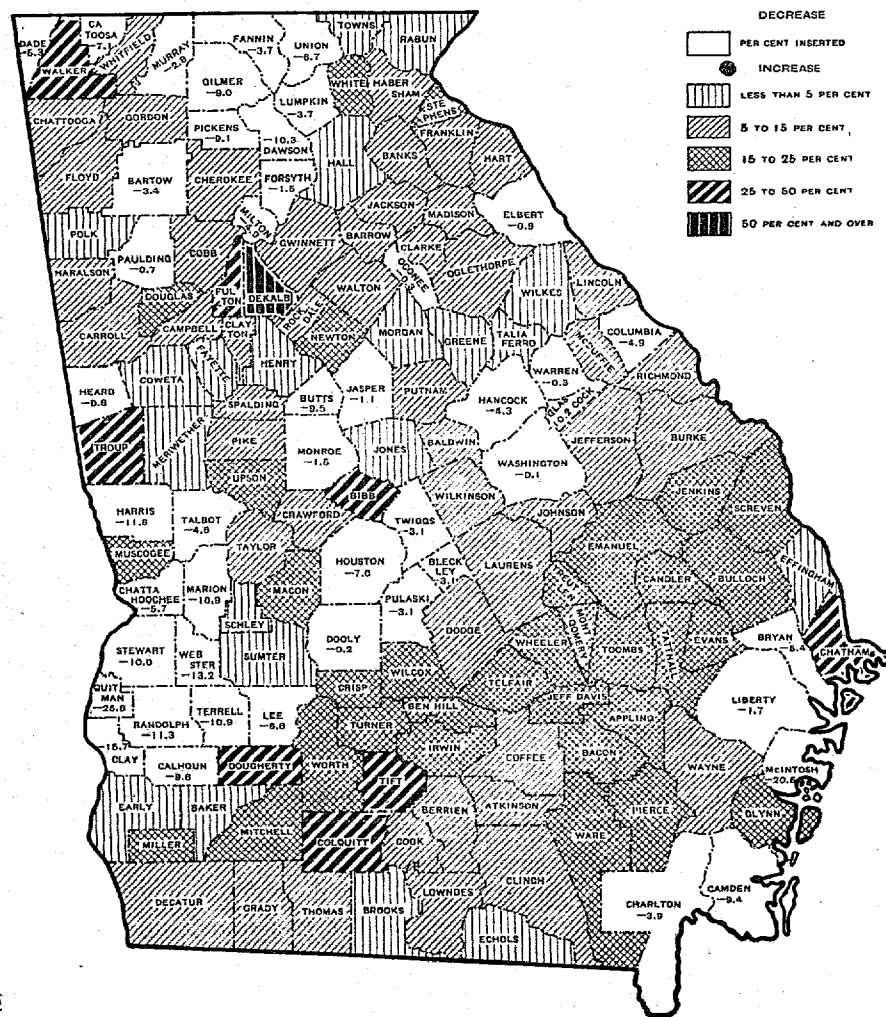

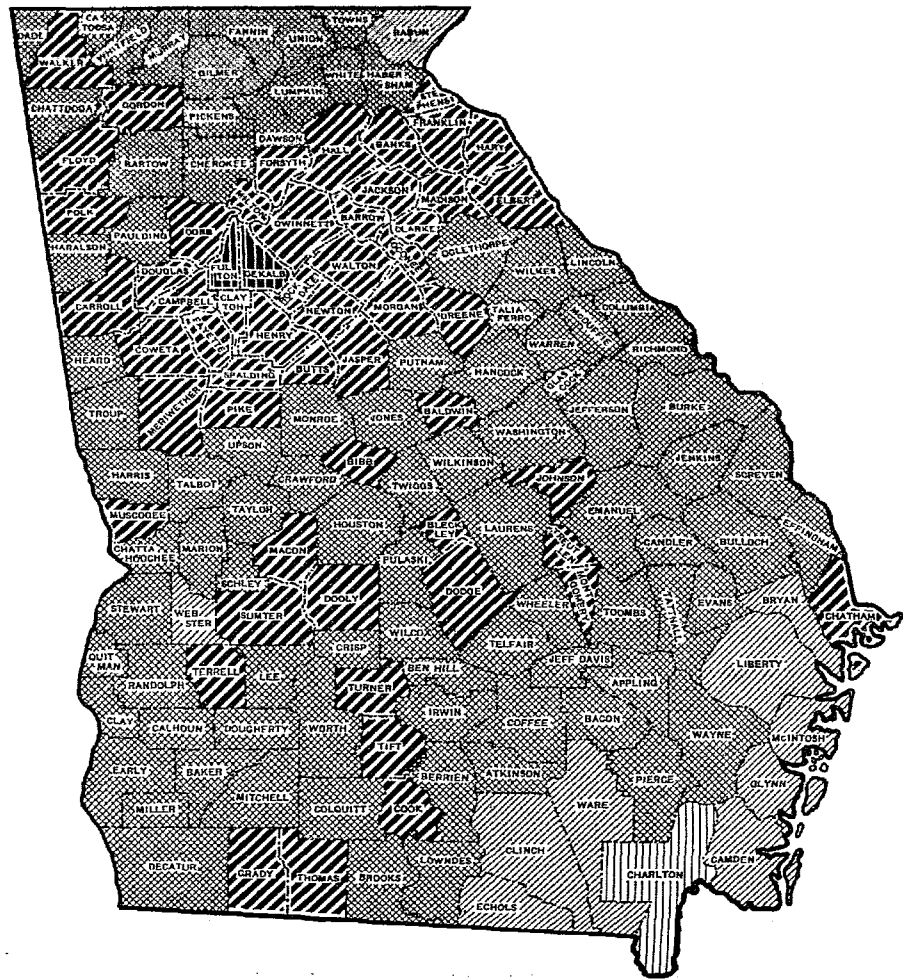
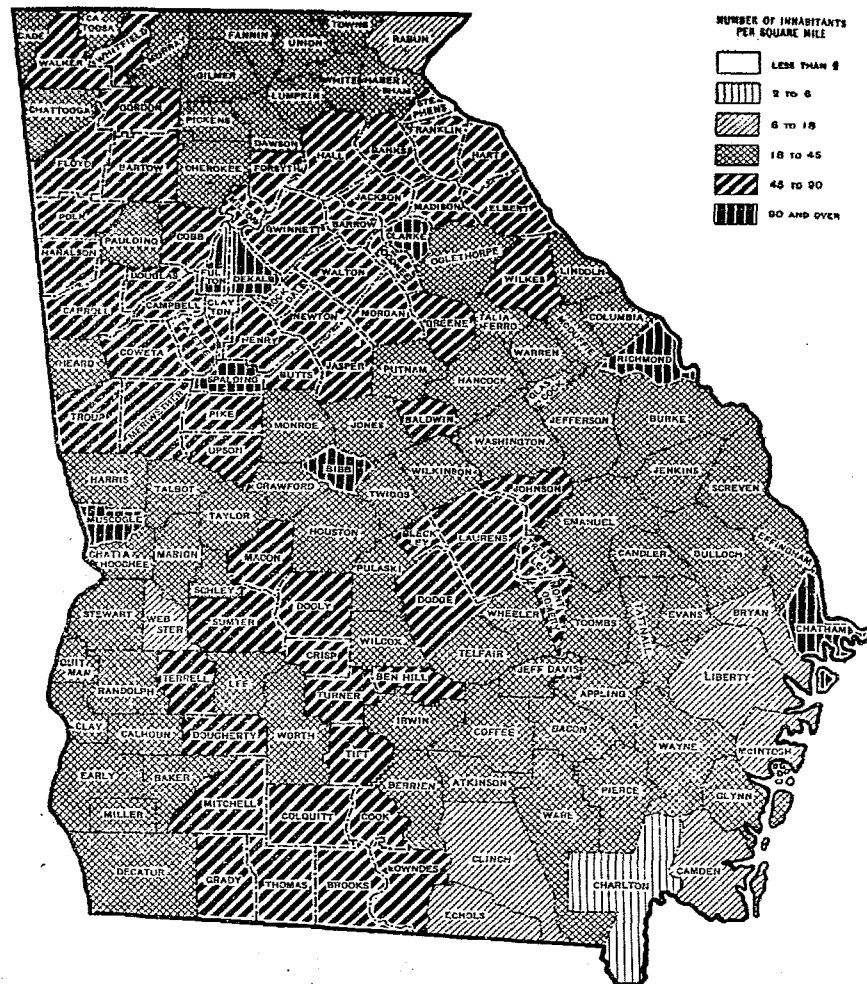


DENSITY OF POPULATION OF GEORGIA, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Idaho was organized as a territory in 1863 and was admitted to the Union as the forty-third state in 1890. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 431,866, which represents an increase of 106,272, or 32.6 per cent, over the 1910 figure. During

the same period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Idaho from 1870 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Idaho has 44 counties. Twenty-one of these counties have been organized since 1910, and annexations have been made to 5 counties, resulting in many changes in boundaries. (See Table 1.) Because of the formation of the new counties it has been necessary, in preparing the maps on page 3, showing the rates of increase in total and rural population since 1910, to make the following combinations: Bannock and Caribou; Nez Perce, Clearwater, and Lewis; Washington and Adams; Kootenai and Benewah; Bonner and Boundary; Boise, Canyon, Idaho, Gem, Payette, and Valley; Lincoln, Gooding, Jerome, and Minidoka; Bingham, Blaine, Cassia, Fremont, Oneida, Bonneville, Butte, Camas, Clark, Franklin, Jefferson, Madison, Power, and Teton.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 83,354 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 5.2 (see Table 1), as against 3.9 in 1910 and 1.9 in 1900. (A small portion of Yellowstone National Park, 36 square miles in area, is located in Idaho, but the total population of the park has been returned as residing in Wyoming.)

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the Idaho counties are the election precincts, 785 in number, for which the population is presented, so far as reported, separately. There are also 148 secondary divisions, comprising 36 cities, 109 villages, and 3

towns. In a number of cases a city or other incorporated place comprises an entire precinct or two or more precincts or parts of two or more precincts. In addition to these divisions there are one Indian reservation and part of another, which, though independent of any county organization, are returned as parts of the counties in which they are located; a section of Valley County belonging to the public domain; and a portion of Jerome County, unorganized, for which no population was returned. (See Table 2.)

Cities.—Idaho has 36 cities, of which Boise, with a population of 21,393, is the largest. Pocatello, with 15,001 inhabitants, is the only other city with a population of over 10,000. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The following summary shows, for each city having 5,000 or more inhabitants in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the population

of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Idaho living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 6.2 per cent in 1900 to 21.5 per cent in 1910 and to 27.6 per cent in 1920.

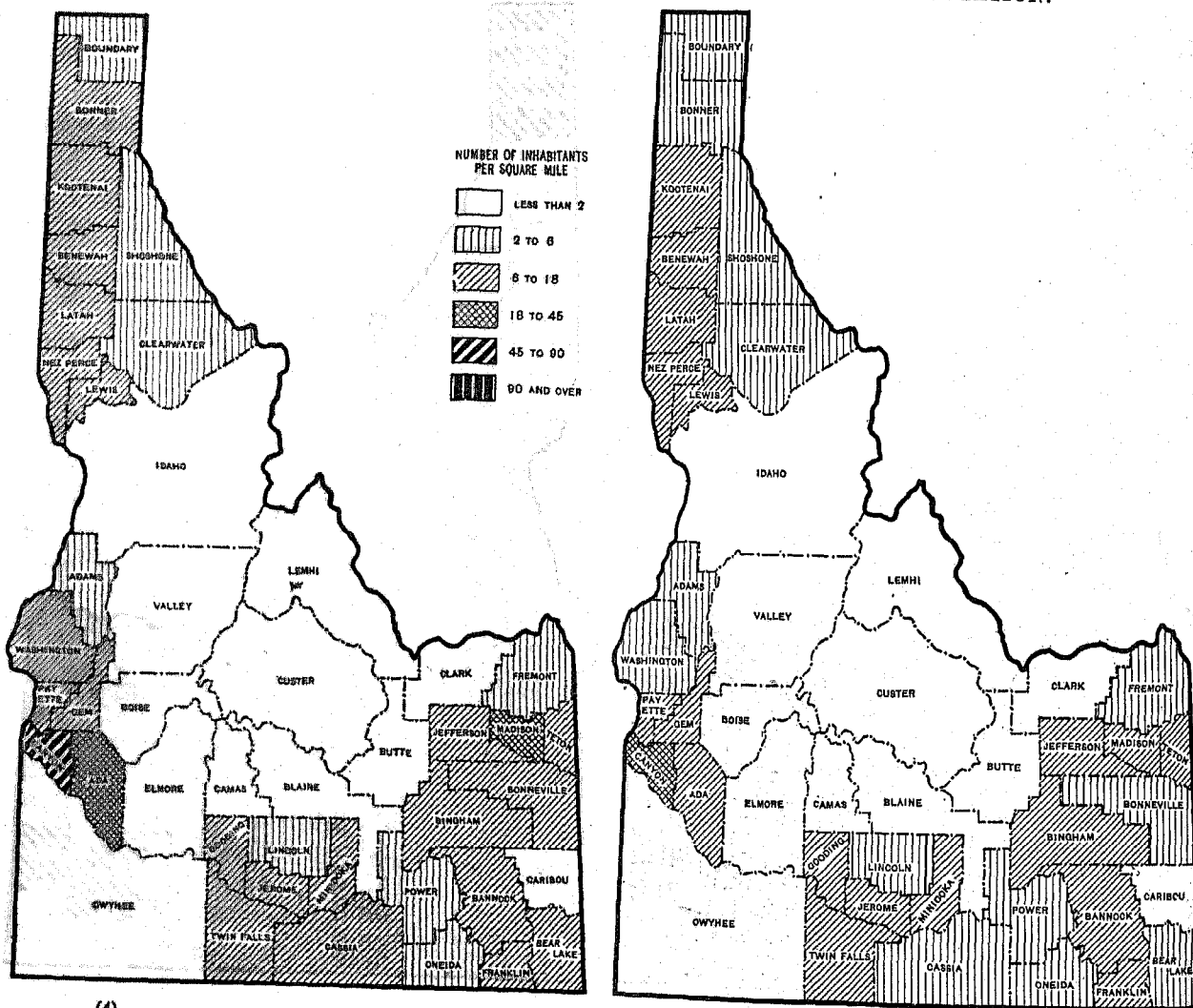
