CHAPTER VIII.—INDUSTRY GROUPS

INTRODUCTION

This chapter presents statistics for the 16 major industry groups into which the 326 industries were assembled at the Census of Manufactures for 1929. An explanation of the principles which govern the industry combinations is given in "General explanations—Classification by industry groups," page 4. It is pointed out there that the present 16-group arrangement of industries rests upon a tripartite base, whose members are (a) kind of materials consumed, (b) use of principal products, and (c) manufacturing process employed.

It will be noted that subgroups appear within 11 of the groups, as, for example, the distribution of the 32 industries in Group 1 (in which the classification is determined primarily by the use of the products) under the heads (a) "Animal products" and (b) "Vegetable products and beverages," the basis of the subgrouping being chiefly the type of materials used. Two bases, on the other hand, are employed for classifying the 20 industries of Group 3 into four subgroups. Two of these subgroups, established according to the stage of process employed, are (a) basic industries and (b) wood-reworking industries; and two, determined by the use of the products, are (c) woodencontainer industries, and (d) furniture and related industries.

The 16 groups differ widely in size as measured by "wage earners (average for the year)." The two groups "Textiles and their products" and "Machinery, not including transportation equipment" ranked first and second, respectively, in both 1919 and 1929 in number of wage earners, these two groups having registered increases during the decade despite a decrease of 1.8 per cent for all industries taken as an aggregate. The advance from fifth position in 1919 to third in 1929 of the group manufacturing "Iron and steel and their products, not including machinery" marked not only an increase in wage earners but also a large growth in volume of output, estimated to have been about 50 per cent. The two groups which outranked the iron and steel industries in number of wage earners in 1919 but which now hold fourth and sixth places, respectively, are "Forest products" and "Transportation equipment, air, land, and water." The former increased its number of wage earners during the decade, but not as much as did the iron and steel group. The transportation-equipment group, however, shows a decrease of 32 per cent. This, the most pronounced decline of all, was caused primarily by the postwar drop in production in the ship-building industry. While the group "Printing, publishing, and allied industries" ranked only ninth in respect of number of wage earners in 1929, its growth during the decade, amounting to 18.6 per cent and exceeding that of any other group, reflected the vigorous expansion both in book and job printing and in newspaper and periodical production during the period.

The ranking of the 16 groups on the wage-earner basis is as follows:

The ranking of the 16 groups according to "value added by manufacture" corresponds roughly to that according to wage earners. A comparison of the groups according to the percentage which value added is of the gross value of products sheds further light on the nature of manufacturing. It serves to divide those groups with high material cost (specifically, the combined cost of materials, containers for products, fuel, and purchased electric energy) from those in which the value-added item, comprising wages, salaries, miscellaneous expenses, and manufacturing profits, is the more important. In "Printing, publishing, and allied industries," for example, the proportion of the gross value of output represented by value added is 75.8 per cent, indicating that the work performed on the material, rather than the material itself, is the important contribution to the value of manufactured products. In the groups low in value added, on the other hand, such as "Food and kindred products" (28.2 per cent) and "Products of petroleum and coal" (30.2 per cent), the chief contribution is made by the materials. The order of the 16 groups as determined by the percentage which value added is of gross value of products is as follows:

Some of the groups consume very small quantities of materials in a crude, unprocessed state. In fact, a considerable number of the individual industries composing the groups use no raw materials whatsoever. The percentages of the gross values of products of the several groups which are represented by the cost of materials in the form of commodities partially manufactured in domestic industries are shown in the following table, together with percentages for the other items which, if added together, equal the gross value of manufactured products.

It should be borne in mind that 31.2 per cent, the cost of "Domestic semimanufactures" for "All groups, total," plus nearly 1 per cent of the gross value, covering expenditures for manufactured fuels, represented costs of purchased or transferred (interplant) materials and parts which certain manufacturers also reported as manufactured products. Duplications in the materials and value-of-products items are found also in each of the 16 groups. For further information concerning the nature and extent of the pyramiding of

materials and product values, see "General explanations—Duplication in cost of materials and value of products," and "General summary"—Table 7. This inflation does not, however, affect the relationship among the other component items, which are almost entirely free from such duplication.

GROUP 1.—FOOD AND KINDRED PRODUCTS

This group of industries embraces the manufacture of foods, beverages, and certain related products, including prepared feeds for animals and fowls. The manufacture of ice is also included, as well as that of chewing gum, but the tobacco-manufacturing industries are classified in the "Miscellaneous industries" group (No. 16). Measured by value of products, Group 1 outranks all others.

The food and kindred-products group comprises two subgroups. The first embraces establishments engaged in the production of butter, cheese, condensed milk, meat, and other animal products. The second is made up of establishments whose principal products are derived from vegetable and mineral sources; for example, bread and other bakery products, flour and other grain-mill products, feeds, confectionery, sugar, canned and preserved fruits and vegetables, beverages, and manufactured ice.

This group, as constituted at the censuses for 1925 and earlier years, included the "Poultry killing and dressing" industry, and as constituted at the census for 1929 it includes the "Poultry killing, dressing, and packing" industry. The figures for these two industries are not comparable, and neither was canvassed at the census for 1927; but, since the items for these industries are very small in comparison with the corresponding ones for the group as a whole, the comparableness of the group totals for different census years is not affected to any material extent. (The figures for the "Poultry killing and dressing" industry for 1925 and earlier years were excluded from the totals for the group as shown in the 1927 report but are included in the corresponding totals as given in the present report.)

Considerable duplication occurs in the statistics for the products of the industries in Group 1, because of the fact that to a great extent the products of certain industries are used as materials by others. For example, the products of flour mills and of sugar refineries become, in large measure, materials for bakeries and for candy factories, respectively. Thus the gross value of products for the group as a whole is considerably greater than the net value of its products in the form in which they reach the ultimate consumer.

The following table gives summary statistics for the group as a whole, for each of its subgroups—"Animal products" and "Vegetable products and beverages"— and for each industry separately.

GROUP 2.—TEXTILES AND THEIR PRODUCTS

This group of industries may be divided into three subgroups, namely: (1) The textile-mill industries, that is, those in which are performed one or more of the processes included in the manufacture of the fabric, such as spinning cotton, silk, wool, or other fiber, weaving the fabric from yarn, dyeing and finishing yarn or fabric, and other preparatory and finishing processes; (2) industries in which the establishments cut or manufacture wearing apparel from purchased fabrics; (3) industries in which other articles, such as awnings, tents, bags, horse blankets, flags, regalia, badges, floor coverings, etc., are made from purchased fabrics. In making use of the figures for cost of materials and value of products for the group as a whole, it must be borne in mind that they include a considerable amount of duplication due to the fact that industries making wearing apparel or other articles from purchased fabrics (subgroups 2 and 3) use the products of the textile mills (subgroup 1) as their principal materials. Even within a single industry considerable duplication of this kind sometimes occurs.

The textile group occupies second place among the 16 groups of industries as ranked according to value of products, being outranked only by the "Food and kindred products" group. (See Table, p. 196.) When the comparison is made on the basis of the average number of wage earners, however, the textile group leads all others.

The following table presents summary statistics for the group as a whole, for each of its subgroups, and for each industry separately.

GROUP 3.—FOREST PRODUCTS

The forest products group, which comprises the industries engaged in the manufacture of lumber and of the various classes of products made from lumber, embraces practically all the industries in which wood in some form is the principal material. Among the products of some of these industries are articles made from other materials than lumber. For example, the furniture industry includes the manufacture of metal furniture and metal store and office fixtures. Considering the industry as a whole, however, wood is the principal material, and therefore it has been included in this group.

This group has been changed slightly as compared with the corresponding one as constituted at the census for 1927, by the transfer to the "Furniture, including store and office fixtures" industry of establishments engaged primarily in the manufacture of sewingmachine cases, cabinets, and tables, formerly classified in the "Sewing machines, cases, and attachments" industry, in Group 13. The 1927 figures for the furniture industry and for the "Furniture and related industries" subgroup, and the 1927 aggregates for the group as a whole have been adjusted for comparison with 1929, but no adjustments have been made for 1925 or earlier years.

Summary statistics for the group and its component subgroups and industries are given in the table below.

GROUP 4.—PAPER AND ALLIED PRODUCTS

For census purposes establishments engaged primarily in the manufacture of paper and paperboard and of pulp (wood and other fiber) and those engaged primarily in the further manufacture of paper and paperboard into commodities such as boxes, bags, etc. (designated as "Converted paper products"), are assigned to separate subgroups in the major industry group "Paper and allied products." Although the manufacture of converted paper products is carried on to a considerable extent in paper mills, the establishments which are engaged solely or primarily in this line of manufacture purchase their principal materials—paper and paperboard—from paper mills. Thus the products of the first of these subgroups become the materials for the second, and as a result there is a large amount of duplication in the figures for cost of materials and value of products for the group as a whole.

At the census for 1929 "Paper patterns" was discontinued as an industry classification because it appeared that the production of paper patterns was so closely allied to lithographing and printing that it was impracticable to classify separately the establishments engaged in this line of production. Reports for such establishments were therefore transferred to the "Printing, publishing, and allied industries" group, and the figures for converted paper products given below have been adjusted accordingly.

GROUP 5.—PRINTING, PUBLISHING, AND ALLIED INDUSTRIES

For census purposes printing and publishing and the several allied activities specified below are classified together as one of the 16 major groups of industries covered by the Census of Manufactures, and the group is divided into two subgroups, namely, (1) Printing and publishing and (2) Allied industries. Summary statistics for the group, the two subgroups, and the individual industries are given in the table below.

Relationship of the industries.—The printing and publishing industries embrace all establishments engaged either in printing or in publishing. More or less closely allied to these industries are a number of others, namely, steel and copperplate engraving and plate printing, lithographing, bookbinding and blank-book making, wood engraving, photo-engraving, the manufacture of printing materials and of engravers' materials, stereotyping and electrotyping, type founding, and engraving, chasing, etching, and diesinking. Combined statistics for printing and publishing and these allied industries are given in the table below.

GROUP 6.—CHEMICALS AND ALLIED PRODUCTS

Group 6 includes not only the industries whose products are chemicals in the ordinary sense, but also those which employ to a large extent chemical processes in their manufacturing operations. The group is complex in character, and its several products differ widely, both in kind and in the uses to which they are put. Considerable duplication occurs in the aggregate cost of materials and the aggregate value of products for the group, because of the use of the products of certain industries as materials for others. This group differs slightly from the corresponding one as constituted at the census for 1927, the changes being as follows: (1) The combination of the "Sulphuric, nitric, and mixed acids" industry with the "Chemicals, not elsewhere classified" industry.

(2) The transfer of establishments engaged primarily in the manufacture of lubricating oils from the "Oils, not elsewhere classified" industry to the "Lubricating oils and greases, not made in petroleum refineries" industry, in Group 7.

GROUP 7.—PRODUCTS OF PETROLEUM AND COAL

This group comprises five industries, namely: "Coke, not including gas-house coke"; "Fuel, manufactured"; "Gas, manufactured, illuminating and heating"; "Lubricating oils and greases, not made in petroleum refineries"; and "Petroleum refining."

The "Lubricating oils and greases, not made in petroleum refineries" industry as at present constituted differs from the "Lubricating greases, not made in petroleum refineries" industry as constituted at the censuses for 1927 and prior years, in that it includes the manufacture of lubricating oils by establishments other than petroleum refineries, such establishments having formerly been assigned to the "Oils, not elsewhere classified " industry, in Group 6.

Summary statistics for the group, by industries, are given in the table below.

GROUP 8.—RUBBER PRODUCTS

This group comprises three industries, namely (1) Rubber tires and inner tubes; (2) Rubber boots and shoes; and (3) Rubber goods, other than tires, inner tubes, and boots and shoes. These industries embrace establishments using india rubber or guttapercha as an important constituent in the manufacture of their products of chief value.

Description of the industries.—The "Rubber tires and inner tubes" industry embraces those establishments which are engaged primarily in the manufacture of pneumatic tires, inner tubes, and solid and cushion rubber tires, for any class of vehicles.

The establishments assigned to the "Rubber boots and shoes" industry are those whose leading products are rubber boots, shoes, overshoes, and canvas rubbersoled shoes.

The principal products of the "Rubber goods, other than tires, inner tubes, and boots and shoes" industry are rubber belting and hose, rubber heels and soles, reclaimed rubber, rubberized fabrics, and hardrubber goods. (The rubber-goods industry does not include the manufacture of rubber-insulated wire and cable, which are treated as products of the "Electrical machinery, apparatus, and supplies" industry.) Changes in classification.—At censuses prior to that for 1921, all manufacturers of rubber products other than boots and shoes, belting, and hose were classified under a single industry designation, "Rubber tires, tubes, and rubber goods not elsewhere specified," but at the census for 1921 and subsequent censuses the manufacture of rubber tires and inner tubes has been treated as a separate industry.

The manufacture of rubber belting and hose, classified separately for 1921 and prior years, is now treated as a part of the "Rubber goods, other than tires, inner tubes, and boots and shoes" industry. This change was made because of the fact that considerable quantities of belting and hose are made as secondary products by establishments whose chief products are other classes of rubber goods, so that the total value of rubber belting and hose made either as primary or as secondary products by establishments in the several industries in the rubber group differs considerably from the total value of products reported by establishments engaged primarily in the manufacture of rubber belting and hose.

The leather group is made up of 10 industries, namely: (1) Leather—Tanned, curried, and finished; (2) Leather belting; (3) Boot and shoe cut stock, not made in boot and shoe factories; (4) Boot and shoe findings, not made in boot and shoe factories; (5) Boots and shoes, other than rubber; (6) Leather gloves and mittens; (7) Pocketbooks, purses, and cardcases; (8) Saddlery and harness; (9) Trunks, suitcases, and bags; (10) Leather goods, not elsewhere classified.

Duplication in group totals for cost of materials and value of products.—The cost-of-materials and value-ofproducts figures for the leather-industries group as a whole include a considerable amount of duplication resulting from the use of the products of establishments in certain industries as materials by establishments in other industries. In other words, the total value of products for the group includes not only the factory value of the finished products in the form in which they reach the final purchaser but also the value of the products of the "Leather: Tanned, curried, and finished" industry, which are used as materials in the

other leather industries, and the value of the products of the "Boot and shoe cut stock" and "Boot and shoe findings" industries, which are used as materials in the boot and shoe industry proper. Similarly, the total cost of materials for the group includes not only the cost of the hides and other basic raw materials produced outside the leather group and used as materials by tanneries but also the amounts paid for tannery products and for boot and shoe cut stock and boot and shoe findings by establishments which use these products as materials for further manufacture. Furthermore, reduplication occurs in the case of boot and shoe cut stock not made in boot and shoe factories; for the value of the leather used in making such stock appears three times in the total value of products for the group—once as reported by the tanneries, again as a part of the value of the cut stock, and still again as a part of the value of finished boots and shoes. Within any one of the industries, however, there is little duplication resulting from the use of the products of some establishments as materials by others.

GROUP 10.-STONE, CLAY, AND GLASS PRODUCTS

The industries in Group 10 derive their principal materials from the earth in the form of stone, clay, and sand, and the group is constituted on the basis of this similarity in regard to source of materials rather than upon any similarity in the character or uses of the finished products.

Certain of the industries in this group as formerly constituted-namely, "Grindstones, pulpstones, and millstones," "Hones, whetstones, and similar products," and "Minerals and earths, ground or otherwise treated"-were closely related to quarrying, and many of the establishments assigned to them were engaged primarily in quarrying and only incidentally in manufacturing. At the census for 1929, however, such establishments were excluded from the manufactures-census classification and assigned to the appropriate quarrying industries, which were canvassed at the Decennial Census of Mines and Quarries. As a result the production of grindstones, pulpstones, and millstones has been abandoned as a manufacturing industry and the present manufactures-census classifications for the other two industries in question have been restricted to those establishments which purchase their quarried materials. The figures for these industries for 1927 and prior census years are not, therefore, comparable with those for 1929.

In several of the other industries in this groupnamely, "Cement," "Clay products," "Lime," "Marble, granite, slate, and other stone products," and "Pottery"-both mining or quarrying operations and manufacturing are in some cases carried on by the same establishment. As such establishments usually keep only single sets of books, and as the same employees are sometimes engaged in both lines of work, it is impossible to separate the data for mining or quarrying from those for manufacturing.

This group has been divided into three subgroups, namely, (1) industries in which stone is the principal material; (2) those in which clay is the principal material; and (3) the glass industry and those industries which use glass as their principal material. The classification of a few industries is necessarily rather arbitrary. For example: Cement is one of the materials used in the manufacture of concrete products; and plaster as well as stone and clay are used in the manufacture of statuary and art goods.

The following table presents summary statistics for the group as a whole, by subgroups and industries.

GROUP 11-IRON AND STEEL AND THEIR PRODUCTS, NOT INCLUDING MACHINERY

Group 11 comprises two subgroups, namely: (1) Crude iron and steel and rolled products, and (2) other iron and steel products except those classified in Groups 13, 14, and 15. The industries in the second subgroup use as their principal materials the products of those in the first subgroup, and as a result the total cost of materials and the total value of products for the group as a whole include large amounts of duplication.

Establishments which roll iron and steel and operate departments for further processing the rolled products, such as wrought pipe, bolts and nuts, wire, and tin plate and terneplate, are assigned in their entirety to the "Steel works and rolling mills" industry, except that blast-furnace departments are classified separately. The several industries which constitute the subgroup "Other iron and steel products" embrace establishments operated entirely independently of rolling mills, although some of them are under the same ownership. Thus the statistics for certain of these industries by no means indicate the full extent of the manufacturing operations involved in the production of the various classes of commodities covered by the industry designations.

This group differs slightly from the corresponding one as constituted at the census for 1927, the changes being as follows:

(1) The former "Pens, steel and brass" industry, in Group 11, has been transferred to Group 16, in which it forms a part of the "Pens, fountain and stylographic; pen points, gold, steel, and brass" industry.

(2) Some of the establishments formerly classified in the "Tools, not including edge tools, machine tools, files, or saws" industry, in Group 11, have been transferred to "Machine-tool accessories and small metalworking tools," a new industry in Group 13.

The table below lists all industries in Group 11 and gives summary statistics for each, with comparative figures for earlier census years.

GROUP 12.—NONFERROUS METALS AND THEIR PRODUCTS

This group comprises industries engaged in the production of nonferrous metals from the ores or from scrap metals; in the refining or alloying of such metals; and in the manufacture, from these metals or alloys as basic materials, of finished products or products for use in further manufacturing processes.

The principal metals or ores which form the basic materials used in these industries are copper, lead, zinc, tin, gold, silver, and aluminum. It should be noted, however, that these same basic metals are used to a large extent in certain industries assigned to other groups; for example, "Electrical machinery, apparatus, and supplies" and other industries of the "Machinery, not including transportation equipment" group. A number of industries in Groups 11 and 16 also manufacture various commodities made wholly or in part from metals other than iron and steel.

Since the metals and alloys produced by the basic industries of Group 12 are used as materials by other industries in the group, there are considerable amounts of duplication in the total cost of materials and the total value of products for the group as a whole. (See GENERAL EXPLANATIONS—Duplication in Cost of Materials and Value of Products," p. 6.) The basic industries which extract the metals from the ore or refine or alloy them usually add relatively little to the value of the raw materials which they use, while the more highly elaborated manufacturing processes employed by the industries which use these metals and alloys as materials add very considerably to their value.

This group, as constituted at former censuses, included the "Pens, gold" industry, which now forms a part of the "Pens, fountain and stylographic; pen points, gold, steel, and brass" industry, in Group 16.

The former industry "Enameling and japanning," in Group 16, has been consolidated with "Stamped and enameled ware," in this group, under the new title "Stamped ware, enameled ware, and metal stamping, enameling, japanning, and lacquering."

The totals for the group, for 1927 and prior years, have been adjusted in accordance with the changes described in the preceding paragraphs, in order to make them fairly comparable with those for 1929.

Summary statistics for the group as a whole, by subgroups and industries, are presented in the table following.

GROUP 13.---MACHINERY, NOT INCLUDING TRANSPORTATION EQUIPMENT

This group comprises those industries whose primary products are machinery (not including transportation equipment) and special castings or parts for use in the manufacture of machinery.

Group 13 differs from the corresponding one as constituted at the census for 1927, the changes being as follows:

(1) Establishments whose principal products were sewing-machine cases, cabinets, and tables, formerly classified in the "Sewing machines, cases, and attachments" industry, in this group, have been transferred to the "Furniture, including store and office fixtures" industry, in Group 3, and the title of the first-named industry has been changed to "Sewing machines and attachments."

(2) Establishments engaged primarily in the manufacture of carbon paper and inked ribbons, formerly classified in the "Typewriters and supplies" industry, in this group, have been classified separately under the industry title "Carbon paper and inked ribbons" and transferred to Group 16; and the title of the former "Typewriters and supplies" industry has been changed to "Typewriters and parts."

(3) Establishments whose principal products are machine-tool accessories and small metal-working tools, some of which were formerly assigned to the "Foundry and machine-shop products, not elsewhere classified" industry, in this group, others to the "Machine tools" industry, also in this group, and still others to the "Tools, not including edge tools, machine tools, files, or saws" industry, in Group 11, are now classified in "Machine-tool accessories and small metal-working tools," a new industry in Group 13.

Summary statistics for the group as a whole and for each industry separately are presented in the table below.

GROUP 14.—TRANSPORTATION EQUIPMENT, AIR, LAND, AND WATER

This group embraces those industries which are engaged primarily in the manufacture of aircraft, vehicles for land transportation, locomotives, and water craft. The several classes of products are airplanes and seaplanes; automobiles, motor trucks, motor busses, and motorcycles; bicycles; carriages, wagons, sleighs, and sleds; baby carriages and other vehicles for children; wheelbarrows; locomotives, steam and electric; railway cars, steam and electric; and all types of ships and boats.

The repair shops of steam and electric railroads manufacture some cars and locomotives, but the greater part of their work consists in the repairing of cars and locomotives, and some of it has no connection with rolling stock. For these reasons, and because of the fact that the method of valuing their production differs from the methods employed in most other industries, railroad repair shops have been classified as separate industries, in Group 15.

The combined value of products for Groups 14 and 15 for 1929 amounts to \$7,317,126,229, which represents the manufacture of all classes of transportation equipment and the repair of all railroad rolling stock. The corresponding figures for earlier years are: 1927, \$5,983,666,764; 1925, \$6,784,432,512; 1923, \$6,853,-572,126; 1921, \$4,285,496,880; 1919, \$6,981,709,084; 1914, \$1,690,040,724.

The following table presents summary statistics for the group as a whole and for each industry separately.

GROUP 16.—MISCELLANEOUS INDUSTRIES

Some of the industries in this group can not be properly classified in any of the other groupings because of the varied character of materials used, and others because of the peculiar nature or use of the products made. To a large extent the industries in Group 16 are those which use as their materials the products of certain industries in other groups. This group includes a few industries, however, which use strictly raw materials, such as tobacco for the manufacture of cigars, cigarettes, and other tobacco products; bone and shell for making buttons, hairpins, and fancy articles; broomcorn for brooms; straw for straw hats; and sand for foundry supplies and sandpaper.

Group 16 includes also a class of industries whose manufacturing operations consist principally in processes or treatments which prepare commodities for the trade or the market but produce little change in their character. These industries include "Feathers, plumes, and manufactures thereof," "Furs, dressed," "Hair work," and "Lapidary work."

This group differs slightly from the corresponding one as constituted at the census for 1927, the changes being as follows:

(1) Establishments engaged solely or primarily in dental-laboratory work, formerly classified in the

"Dental goods, including dental-laboratory work" industry, are no longer canvassed. The title of the industry has accordingly been changed to "Dental goods and equipment."

(2) The former "Pens, steel and brass" industry, in Group 11, and the former "Pens, gold" industry, in Group 12, have been combined with the former "Pens, fountain, and stylographic," industry, in Group 16, under the title "Pens, fountain, and stylographic; pen points, gold, steel, and brass."

(3) Establishments engaged in the quarrying and crushing of stone for paving materials, formerly classified in the "Paving materials, not elsewhere classified" industry, have been transferred to the "Miscellaneous stone" industry, which is covered by the Decennial Census of Mines and Quarries, and are no longer treated as manufacturing establishments.

(4) Establishments whose principal products are carbon paper and inked ribbons, formerly assigned to the "Typewriters and supplies" industry, in Group 13, have been classified separately under the industry title "Carbon paper and inked ribbons," in Group 16.
