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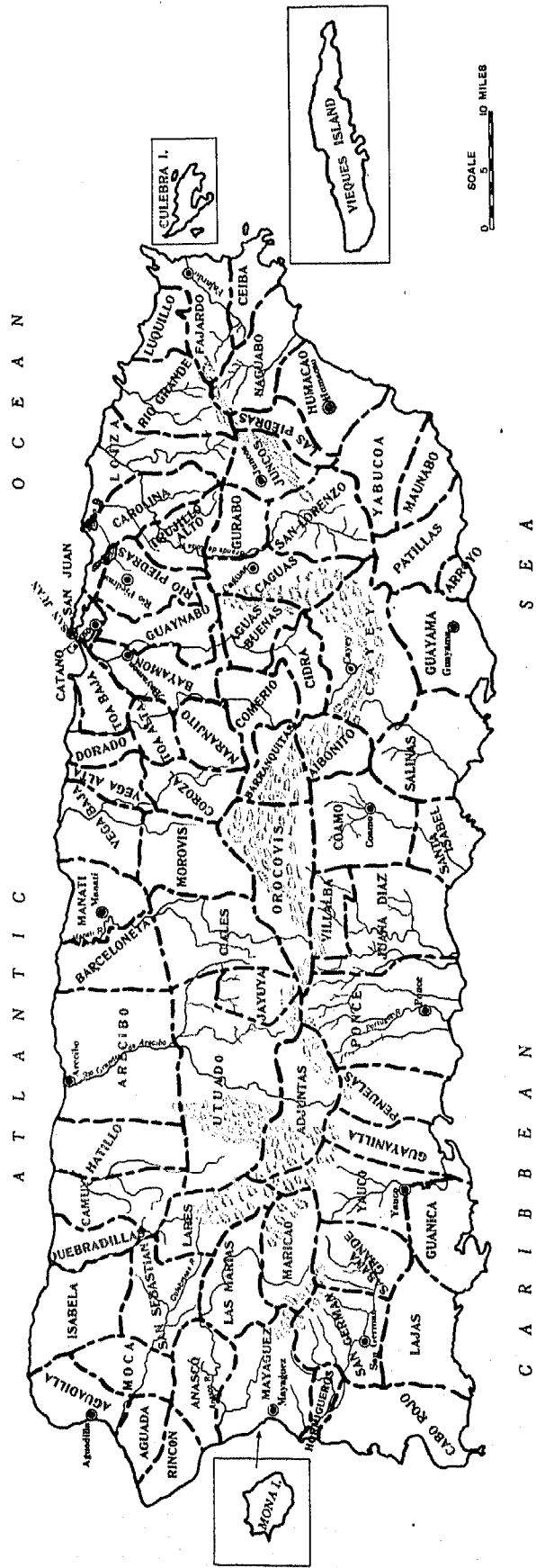

# POPULATION—PUERTO RICO

## NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF INHABITANTS

**Total population.**—The island of Puerto Rico was formally surrendered by Spain to the United States in October, 1898, and by the treaty of Paris, signed December 10 of the same year, at the close of the Spanish-American War, was ceded to the United States, together with Vieques, Culebra, and other small adjacent islands.

According to the Fifteenth Census, taken as of April 1, 1930, the population of Puerto Rico is 1,543,913,

which represents an increase of 244,104, or 18.8 per cent, since 1920.

The following summary shows the population of Puerto Rico as enumerated at the Federal decennial censuses of 1930, 1920, and 1910, at the special census taken under the direction of the War Department in 1899, and at nine earlier censuses taken at irregular intervals between 1765 and 1887:

**Municipalities.**—Puerto Rico is divided, for the purpose of local government, into 77 districts, called municipalities. Each of the islands of Culebra and Vieques constitutes an entire municipality, and the remaining small adjacent islands form parts of municipalities. (See Table 3.) Of these 77 municipalities, only one (Catano) has been organized from part of another since 1920.

**Density of population.**—The gross area of Puerto Rico, land and water, including the adjacent and dependent islands, is 3,435 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1930 was 449.5 as against 378.4 in 1920 and 325.5 in 1910.

**Minor civil divisions.**—The political units into which Puerto Rico's municipalities are divided are the barrios. Cities and towns, which occupy the closely settled area, have no form of government distinct from that of the municipality to which they belong. In the municipality of San Juan all the barrios are urban in character, the city being coextensive with the municipality. In most of the smaller municipalities, a single barrio, usually designated as "pueblo," constitutes the

town settlement. In other municipalities the town is composed of two or more barrios.

In addition to the above-mentioned minor civil divisions, there are in the municipality of San Juan one military reserve and one naval reserve (radio station), and a naval radio station is located in the municipality of Cayey.

Table 4 shows the population of Puerto Rico by municipalities and barrios. Under the name of each municipality is first given that of the town from which the municipality is named, together with the names of the barrios, if more than one, which it comprises. The remaining barrios follow in alphabetical order.

**Principal places.**—Puerto Rico has two cities, of which San Juan, with a population of 114,715, ranks first, and Ponce, with 53,430 inhabitants, is second in size. In addition there are 75 towns. (See Table 5, p. 132.)

Table 2, on page 124, shows for each city or town having a population of 5,000 or more inhabitants in 1930, the population at each of the last three censuses and the percentage of increase.

## COMPOSITION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION, AND UNEMPLOYMENT

**Introduction.**—In this section the population of Puerto Rico is classified by sex, color, nativity, age, marital condition, mother tongue, and place of birth. Also, items are shown relating to ability to speak English, illiteracy, school attendance, dwellings and families, tenure of homes, occupations by industrial groups, and unemployment. These statistics are given in more or less detail for all the areas shown in the preceding tables except barrios, and the towns having less than 2,500 inhabitants. The distinction

between urban and rural population is carried through most of the classifications.

**Urban and rural areas.**—Urban population of Puerto Rico, as defined by the Census Bureau, is in general that residing in cities and towns or urban places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, the remainder being classified as rural.

Table 1 shows the population of Puerto Rico in 1930 in various urban groups, together with the rural population, and with comparative figures for earlier censuses.

**Color, nativity, and sex.**—In Table 2 are presented the population statistics for Puerto Rico for the last three censuses, with classification by color and sex for the entire population and by nativity and parentage for the white population. The divisions of the population by color or race are: White; colored (comprising Negroes and persons of mixed white and Negro blood); and other races, including Chinese, Japanese, Filipinos, Mexicans, and Indians. Persons reported as black or mulatto at the censuses of 1920 and 1910 were returned as “colored” at the census of 1930. The white population is divided primarily into three groups: (1) Natives of native parentage—that is, having both parents born in continental United States or in Puerto Rico or other United States Territory or possession; (2) natives of foreign or mixed parentage—that is, having one or both parents born abroad; and (3) foreign born. In Table 2, and also in the tables

for municipalities and the more important urban places, the second group is divided into two parts, namely, (a) natives of foreign parentage—that is, having both parents born abroad, and (b) natives of mixed parentage—that is, having one parent native and the other foreign born. It has not been thought necessary to take space for the nativity and parentage classification of the nonwhite groups, since nearly all “colored” are natives of native parentage, and nearly all Chinese and Japanese are either foreign born or of foreign parentage. Statistics of the population classified by color, nativity, and sex are presented by municipalities in Tables 18 and 19, and for urban places in Tables 20 and 21.

**Citizenship.**—The foreign-born white population is distributed in Table 2 by citizenship. This classification comprises four groups: (1) Naturalized; (2) having first papers—that is, having made formal declara-

tion of intention to become a citizen of the United States; (3) alien; (4) unknown—that is, with status as to citizenship not reported. Citizenship is also shown for foreign-born white persons 21 years of age and over in Table 4.

Under the act of March 2, 1917, all persons born in Puerto Rico are treated as citizens of the United States unless they (or their parents in case of minors) have declared their intention to retain Puerto Rican citizenship, Spanish citizenship, or citizenship of other countries. At the census of 1930 there were 2,567 males and 3,681 females who, although natives of Puerto Rico and included in the native population shown in Table 2, were reported as having taken advantage of the provisions of this act and retained their allegiance to Spain or other foreign countries; while 5 males were returned as citizens of Puerto Rico. Included in the female population referred to above are women who have become aliens through marriage.

**Age.**—The age classification in the census returns is based on age at last birthday, that is, age in completed years. The age statistics are presented for Puerto Rico as a whole in Table 3, for municipalities in Table 16, and for urban places of 10,000 or more in Table 17. In these tables the age classification is presented not only for the total population but also for the more important population classes (native white, foreign-born white, colored, etc.), by sex. Table 3 shows the distribution of the population by specified age periods, and by single years of age for persons under 25. The age classification of the total population also is given in the tables for the smaller urban places.

Table 4 shows the population 21 years of age and over classified by color, nativity, and sex, with data for the foreign-born white by citizenship.

Statistics for males of militia age (18 to 44 years) are presented by color and nativity in Table 5.

**School attendance.**—The school-attendance tabulation is based on the replies to the enumerator's inquiry as to whether the person had attended school or college of any kind since September 1, 1929. The totals for Puerto Rico are presented in Table 6 for the principal population groups separated into significant age periods. School attendance is shown by municipalities in Table 18 and for urban places of 10,000 or more in Table 20.

**Illiteracy.**—The census defines as illiterate any person 10 years of age or over who is unable to read and write. The classification is based on the answers given to the enumerator in response to the question "Whether able to read and write." No specific test of ability to read and write was prescribed, but the enumerators were instructed not to return the answer "Yes" (which would classify the person as literate) simply because a person was able to write his or her name. The statistics of illiteracy are presented for Puerto Rico as a whole in Tables 7 and 8, and for municipalities and urban places in Tables 18, 19, 20, and 21.

**Inability to speak English.**—Table 9 shows, by color, nativity, and sex, the number of persons 10 years of age and over who were reported as unable to speak the English language.

**Marital condition.**—The census classification with respect to marital condition for Puerto Rico covers five groups, namely, single, married, consensually married (living together as husband and wife by mutual consent), widowed, and divorced. This classification is presented for the population 15 years of age and over by sex, color, and nativity in Table 10 for Puerto Rico as a whole, and by sex only in Tables 18, 19, 20, and 21 for municipalities and urban places. In Table 11 statistics of the marital condition of the entire population are presented by color, nativity, and sex, separated into significant age periods.

**Foreign white stock by country of origin.**—The foreign white stock, as defined by the Census Bureau, is composed of two distinct elements, the foreign-born white and the native white of foreign or mixed parentage. The foreign-born white are classified according to country of birth; the native white of foreign or mixed parentage are classified according to country of birth of father, except where the father is native and the mother foreign born, and then according to country of birth of mother. All classifications of the 1930 population according to country of birth, so far as they relate to European stock, are based on the present political boundaries of European countries. Comparative figures for 1920 are presented for the foreign born only. In addition to the summary for Puerto Rico as a whole presented in Table 12, statistics for the foreign-born white by country of birth are presented for municipalities and for urban places of 10,000 or more in Table 23, and statistics for the native white of foreign or mixed parentage by country of birth of parents are presented in Table 24 for the same areas.

**Year of immigration.**—In the distribution of the foreign-born population by year of immigration the calendar year is the basis of the classification, and the date given is the year of immigration to the United States or to any of its Territories or possessions, not necessarily the year of arrival in Puerto Rico. In Table 13 are presented statistics of the foreign-born population of Puerto Rico by color and year of immigration.

**Mother tongue.**—Information as to mother tongue was secured for all persons of foreign birth. By mother tongue is meant the language usually spoken in the home of the person before coming to the United States or to any of its Territories or possessions. This inquiry and that of country of birth are so closely related that it is possible that the enumerators in some instances reported the nationality of the person rather than the mother tongue. In Table 14 are presented statistics of the mother tongue of the foreign-born white population by principal countries of birth.

**Place of birth of native population.**—The term "native population" as ordinarily used by the Census



Bureau comprises all persons born in continental United States or any of its Territories or possessions, persons born at sea under the United States flag, and persons of native parentage born abroad and designated as "American citizens born abroad." The place of birth of the native population is shown in Table 15.

**Dwellings and families and tenure of homes.**—A dwelling, for census purposes, is a structure in which one or more persons regularly sleep. It need not be a house in the usual sense of the word. A boat, a tent, a freight car, or a room in a factory, store, or office building, although occupied by only one person, is also counted as a dwelling. On the other hand, an apartment house, although containing many families, constitutes but one dwelling. The term "family" as used in the census signifies a group of persons, whether related by blood or not, who live together as one household, usually sharing the same table. Also, one person living alone is counted a family. On the other hand, all the occupants and employees of a hotel, boarding house, or lodging house, if that is their usual place of abode, and all the inmates of an institution, however numerous, are treated as constituting a single family. Thus the census family in some cases differs greatly from the natural family. The structure or part of a structure occupied by each census family is considered a "home," and the number of families shown in Table 25 is therefore equal to the total number of homes for which data as to tenure are given. In Table 25 are presented for Puerto Rico as a whole, for each municipality, and for urban places of 10,000 or more, statistics relating to dwellings and families and tenure of homes for 1930, with comparative figures for 1920 for the total population and for the urban places of 10,000 or more.

**Gainful workers by industry groups.**—Table 26 shows the population 10 years of age and over engaged in gainful occupations classified into about 50 industrial groups. (Persons usually working at a gainful occupation but temporarily unemployed at the time of the census are included in the number of gainful workers.)

Specific occupations in the agricultural group (farmers, farm laborers, etc.) are shown separately. The other classifications are strictly industry or service groups, with no attempt to show specific occupations. Separate figures are presented for males and females and also for white and colored workers. Similar figures, though with a somewhat condensed list of industry groups, are presented by municipalities and for urban places of 25,000 or more in Table 27. Table 26 shows the complete list of industry groups as tabulated, without regard to their importance in Puerto Rico. Small numbers of workers may be shown in this table for industries not carried on in Puerto Rico, these representing persons who usually work in the specified industries elsewhere. In Table 27 the smaller groups have been consolidated and only the more important ones are shown by municipalities. The specific make-up of any of these consolidated groups can be found by referring to Table 26.

**Unemployment.**—The purpose of the inquiry on unemployment was to ascertain the amount of enforced unemployment of persons who wanted work and could not find it. The census enumerator was instructed to report as unemployed all persons out of a job on the day of enumeration who ordinarily were employed and who were able to work. All persons who were on strike, voluntarily idle, incapacitated for work, or who were on sick leave or on vacation were not reported as unemployed. School teachers, who are often unemployed during a portion of the year, were not considered as out of a job in the sense in which the term is used for census purposes. In Puerto Rico the unemployment inquiry covered all persons who usually work at a gainful occupation for salary, wages, or on commission. Table 28 shows, by industry groups for Puerto Rico as a whole, the number of all such persons who were unemployed on the day of enumeration. Statistics of unemployment by age, color, and period of idleness are shown in Table 29. Statistics by municipalities and for urban places of 10,000 or more are presented in Table 30.

# OCCUPATION STATISTICS—PUERTO RICO

Introduction.—With the great present-day interest in those problems in which occupation is a prime factor, it would be impossible to present, in limited space, all the occupation statistics for which students, statisticians, business men, and others may have need. In this section, the aim has been to make such a selection of occupation tables that the chief statistical facts relating to the occupations of the people of Puerto Rico will be shown, in one table or another, and in such form that many of the statistical facts of less importance can be derived from them easily.

The statistics of occupations presented relate to gainful workers 10 years old and over. The term "gainful workers," in census usage, includes all persons who usually follow a gainful occupation, although they may not have been employed when the census was

taken. It does not include women doing housework in their own homes, without wages, and having no other employment, or children working at home, merely on general household work, on chores, or at odd times on other work.

No attempt has been made to analyze the statistics here presented. The purpose has been to include only the explanatory text necessary to the proper interpretation of the statistics. The statistics relate to the number, sex, color, nativity, age, and occupations of all gainful workers, and to the marital condition of gainfully occupied women. Statistics relating to children in gainful occupations are presented in separate tables. For comparative purposes, certain of the tables include statistics for preceding censuses, so far as available.

**Sex and occupation of gainful workers.**—The statistics relating to gainful workers by sex show the number and proportion of persons gainfully occupied (Tables 1 and 2), the number and proportion of occupied persons in the general divisions of occupations (Table 3), and the number of males and of females in each specified occupation (Tables 4 and 5). Table 4 shows for Puerto Rico and for San Juan the number of males and of females in each specified occupation. In Table 5 the occupations shown in Table 4 are combined into main occupations and occupation groups and these groups are presented, by sex, for each city of 25,000 to 100,000 inhabitants. Small numbers of workers shown in an occupation not pursued in the specified area represent persons who live in the area but work elsewhere.

In general, in Tables 4 and 5, all the workers in a given specified occupation are grouped together without regard to the different industries in which the

occupation is pursued; and each occupation, excepting clerical occupations, is classified in that part of the industrial field in which the occupation is most commonly pursued. For example, all electricians are grouped together and are classified under "Manufacturing and mechanical industries," though electricians are employed in almost every industry. Clerical occupations, which can scarcely be said to be more common in one part of the industrial field than in another, are made a separate class.

In so far as it was practicable to make it such, the classification of occupations in Tables 4 and 5 is occupational rather than industrial. In this respect it is quite different from the industrial classification presented in Tables 26 and 27, pages 170 and 171 of this volume. In that classification, the workers are grouped by industry, but, excepting agricultural workers, they are not grouped by occupation.

From the foregoing, it is quite evident that the number of workers in the respective general divisions of occupations—agriculture, forestry and fishing, extraction of minerals, etc.—shown in the occupation statistics presented in this section, will not exactly agree with the number shown in the industry statistics presented in the preceding section. For example, the industry statistics for "Manufacturing and mechanical industries," presented in the preceding section, include all the workers in each manufacturing industry, while the occupation statistics for "Manufacturing and mechanical industries," here presented, do not include the clerical workers in the manufacturing industries, nor the workers in other occupations—such as teamsters, lawyers, technical engineers, etc.—not peculiar to, or not most commonly pursued in, manufacturing industries. On the other hand, the occupation statistics for "Manufacturing and mechanical industries" include all blacksmiths, carpenters, electricians, and other followers of skilled hand trades, wherever employed, while in the industry statistics many of the workers in these occupations are included in other general divisions of industry.

Since the industry figures referred to were compiled from a preliminary count—a count by sex and industry only—there was no opportunity to correct errors of occupation, sex, age, color, and nativity, which errors developed only when the workers in each occupation were later counted by age, color, and nativity. As a result of the correction of these errors, even the area totals in this section may differ slightly from the corresponding totals in the preceding section.

**Color and nativity of gainful workers.**—Statistics relative to the color and nativity of the total gainful workers, in 1930, are presented for Puerto Rico and for San Juan in Table 6, and for each city of 25,000 to 100,000 inhabitants in Table 7. Statistics showing for males and for females the color and nativity of the workers in each of the more important occupations pursued in the area are presented for Puerto Rico in Table 11 and for San Juan in Table 12. In each of these tables, four color and nativity classes are distinguished, as follows: Native white, foreign-born white, colored, and other races.

**Age of gainful workers.**—The age classification in census statistics is based on age at last birthday, that is, age in completed years. Statistics relating to the age of the gainful workers, in 1930, are presented in Tables 8 to 12. These tables show for Puerto Rico and for San Juan the number and proportion of persons gainfully occupied by age and sex (Table 8); a distribution of the total gainful workers by age, color, nativity, and sex (Table 9); and a distribution of the workers in each of the more important occupations of the area by age and sex (Tables 11 and 12). For each city of 25,000 to 100,000 inhabitants, the statistics show a distribution of the total workers by age and sex (Table 10).

There is a growing interest in those problems in which occupation by age is a leading factor—the problems of child labor, woman labor, occupational mortality, unemployment, unemployment insurance, etc. Because of the rapidly increasing importance of age as a factor in occupation statistics, the 1930 statistics are presented in much greater age detail than were those of any preceding census. In tables 8 and 9 the workers are distributed into 18 age groups. These 18 age groups are reduced, by combination, to 11 in Table 10, and to 9 in Tables 11 and 12.

**Males and females in selected occupations.**—It is impracticable to present, in separate tables, statistics distributing the gainful workers in each occupation, first, by color and nativity, and, second, by age. To save space, therefore, the statistics distributing the workers in each selected occupation by color and nativity and the statistics distributing them by age are presented in the same table (Table 11 for Puerto Rico and Table 12 for San Juan). In general, only the more important occupations have been selected for presentation in Tables 11 and 12, that is, those occupations shown in Table 4 which for Puerto Rico or for the city are of most importance. Frequently, however, a main occupation group is shown, rather than the specific occupations which comprise it. Thus, the group "Retail dealers" is shown, rather than the several classes of retail dealers.

**Marital condition of gainfully occupied women.**—Marital status, always an important factor in the life of a woman, is particularly significant in the life of a working woman, for, quite commonly, her marital status determines whether she will be a breadwinner only or both a breadwinner and a home maker. Since marital status in relation to occupation is so much more significant in the case of female workers than in the case of male workers, the Fifteenth Census statistics relating to the marital condition of gainful workers have been limited to statistics for females.

The statistics relating to the marital condition of gainfully occupied women, presented in Tables 13 to 18, are limited, as to persons, to women 15 years old and over, and, as to areas, to Puerto Rico and San Juan. These statistics show, for Puerto Rico alone, the marital condition of gainfully occupied women in 1930 and in 1920 (Table 13), and the number and proportion of the married women gainfully occupied for the same years (Table 14). For Puerto Rico and for San Juan the statistics show, for 1930, the number and proportion of women gainfully occupied, by marital condition, for each color or nativity class (Table 15); the marital condition of the gainfully occupied women of each color or nativity class, with a distribution of the single (including those of unknown marital condition) and of the married by age (Table 16); and the marital condition of the women in each of the more important occupations for women, with a distribution of the single (including those of unknown

marital condition) and of the married by age (Tables 17 and 18). The occupations shown in Table 17 are the same as those shown for females in Table 11, and the occupations shown in Table 18 are the same as those shown for females in Table 12.

While the age distribution of the gainfully occupied widowed and divorced women is not given in Tables 16 to 18, it is possible to compute this distribution, by color and nativity, by adding, by age groups, in Table 16, the single and unknown and the married, and then subtracting the total for each age group from the total of all gainfully occupied women of the same color, nativity, and age, as shown in Table 9.

Statistics showing, for each city of 25,000 to 100,000 inhabitants, the marital condition of the gainfully occupied females 10 years old and over are presented in Table 7 with the color and nativity statistics for these cities.

Children in gainful occupations.—Because of the present-day interest in child workers and in the problems connected with their employment, statistics relating to the occupations of children are presented in separate tables. For Puerto Rico and for San Juan these statistics show, by sex, the number and proportion of children 10 to 15 years old gainfully occu-

pied in 1930, with comparative statistics for preceding censuses (Table 19); the number and proportion of children 10 to 17 years old gainfully occupied by years of age (Table 20); the number and proportion of children 10 to 15 years old gainfully occupied in each color or nativity class (Table 21); the number of children 10 to 17 years old gainfully occupied in each color or nativity class by years of age (Table 22); and the number of children 10 to 17 years old in each of the more important occupations for children by years of age (Tables 23 and 24).

In general, in Table 23 and in Table 24, all specific occupations which gave employment to 25 or more children, and all general occupations—such as the laborers or the operatives in a given industry—which gave employment to 50 or more children in the area were selected for presentation. Frequently, however, a main occupation group is shown rather than the specific occupations which comprise it.

For each city of 25,000 to 100,000 inhabitants the statistics show, by sex, the number and proportion of children 10 to 15 years old gainfully occupied (Table 19), and the number in each of the more important occupations for children (Table 25).

## AGRICULTURE—PUERTO RICO

### NUMBER OF FARMS, ACREAGE, TENURE, VALUE, MORTGAGE DEBT, PRODUCTION, AND LIVESTOCK

This section presents statistics for acreage and value of farms, livestock and livestock products, acreage and production of crops, number of fruit trees and plants with production, proportion of tenancy, mortgage debt, expenditures, machinery, and farm facilities.

**Census dates.**—The census of 1930 relates to April 1 of that year, the date of the Fifteenth Census of the United States, and to the crop of 1929. The censuses of 1920 and 1910 relate to January 1 and April 15 of those years and the crop years 1919 and 1909, respectively.

**Farm.**—A "farm," for census purposes, is all the land which is directly farmed by one person, either by his own labor alone or with the assistance of members of his household or hired employees. The land operated by a partnership is likewise considered a farm. A "farm" may consist of a single tract of land, or of a number of separate tracts, and these several tracts may be held under different tenures, as when one tract is owned by the farmer and another tract is rented by him. When a landowner has one or more tenants, renters, or managers, the land operated by each is considered a farm. Thus on a plantation the land operated by each cropper or tenant was reported as a separate farm, and the land operated by the owner or manager by means of wage hands likewise was reported as a separate farm.

The enumerators were instructed not to report as a farm any tract of land of less than 3 acres, unless its agricultural products in 1929 were valued at \$100 or more, or unless it required the continuous services of at least one person.

**Farm operator.**—A "farm operator," according to the census definition, is a person who operates a farm, either performing the labor himself or directly supervising it.

**Color of farm operators.**—Farm operators are classified as white and colored, the colored including Negroes and persons of mixed white and Negro blood, and all other nonwhite races.

**Tenure.**—Farm operators are classified, according to the tenure under which they operate their farms, into four general classes, as follows:

**Full owners** are farm operators who own all the land which they operate.

**Part owners** are farm operators who own part of the land which they operate, and rent and operate additional land. Part owners, therefore, have some of the characteristics of full owners and some of the characteristics of tenants.

**Managers** are farm operators who operate farms or ranches for the owners, receiving wages or salaries for their services.

**Tenants** are farm operators who operate hired land only.

**Land in farms.**—The acreage designated as "All land in farms" includes considerable areas of land not actually under cultivation and some not even used for pasture, since each farmer was asked to report as a unit all the land under his control, or rather all the land which he thought of as a part of his farm. Isolated tracts of timberland and other areas not connected with the farm were not included. The following classes of farm land are shown separately:

**1. Improved land.**—Under this heading are reported all land regularly tilled or mowed; land in pastures that has been cleared or tilled; land lying fallow; land in gardens and orchards; and land occupied by buildings, yards, and barnyards.

**2. Woodland.**—Under this heading are reported all farm woodlots, natural or planted, and cut-over land with young growth.

**3. Unimproved land.**—Under this heading is reported all land not improved or in woodland.

**Farm values.**—The farmer was asked to report, first, the total value of his farm (land and buildings), including all the land which he operated, both owned and hired, whether operated for himself or managed for others. He was asked to give the current market value—that is, the amount for which the farm would sell under normal conditions, not at forced sale. The tabulated results of this inquiry are shown as value of "Land and buildings" and represent the total value of farm real estate.

The farmer was also asked to report the value of all farm buildings on his farm. These values were necessarily estimated, and the figures obtained are probably somewhat less satisfactory than the figures for the total real-estate value.

In comparing the values of farm properties as reported at the census of 1930 with those reported in 1920, the variations in the purchasing power of the dollar should be kept in mind.

The value of farm implements and machinery is the combined value of automobiles, trucks, tractors, tools, wagons, harnesses, dairy equipment, and all other farm machinery. The enumerators were instructed to omit the value of commercial mills and factories located on the farm. The value of buildings, implements, and machinery of sugar centrals, as well as labor connected therewith, was also omitted as far as possible.

**Mortgage debt.**—Mortgage-debt figures are given only for farm owners, the number of mortgaged farms.

being given for full owners and part owners combined, while the amount of the mortgage debt is shown for full owners only.

**Farm expenditures** comprise amounts expended by farm operators during the year 1929, for selected items defined on the schedules, as follows:

**Feed** includes hay, grain, mill feed, and other products ("not raised on this farm") for use as feed for domestic animals and poultry.

**Fertilizer**, including commercial fertilizer and manure.

**Farm labor**, amount expended in cash for farm labor (exclusive of housework).

**Livestock.**—In this section statistics are presented for nine classes of livestock on farms, namely, horses, mules, asses and burros, cattle, sheep, goats, swine, chickens, and bees. Cattle are divided into four classes—calves under 1 year old; cows and heifers 2 years old and over, kept mainly for milk production; work oxen; and all other cattle, under which are reported beef cattle, etc.

In the tables presenting statistics for livestock not on farms eight classes are shown, namely, horses, mules, asses and burros, cattle, sheep, goats, swine, and bees. Statistics are also presented for four classes of pure-bred animals on farms—horses, cattle, swine, and sheep.

**Livestock products.**—Statistics are presented showing the number of cows milked, and the milk produced and sold; also the number of chickens raised, and chicken eggs produced and sold.

**Acreage and production of crops.**—The acreage and production for all crops secured in the census of 1930 relate to the crop year 1929. The acreage shown for crops represents the acreage harvested, which is sometimes less than the acreage planted. The production represents the quantity harvested in the form indicated. The acreage of vegetables harvested for sale is shown, also the value of all vegetables sold, and the value of vegetables grown for home use.

The low production of coffee in 1929 is mainly due to the cyclone which swept the island in September, 1928. In Municipality Table VII where statistics are presented for farms reporting coffee production, figures are also given for farms reporting coffee land with no production or with production of less than one pound per acre in 1929.

**Fruits and nuts.**—Data with regard to fruits and nuts are presented. The production and the number of trees and plants are shown, together with the total value of all fruits and nuts sold. The low production of many fruits and nuts in 1929 is largely accounted for by the cyclone of 1928.

**Value of crops, livestock, and livestock products.**—The values shown in this section for crops, livestock, and livestock products were obtained by multiplying the unit values by the number of units in each class. These unit values were obtained from the Department of Agriculture and Commerce of Puerto Rico.
