

# RETAIL TRADE—1939

## MONTHLY EMPLOYMENT AND SEX OF EMPLOYEES

This report presents monthly employment statistics and data on sex of employees as reported for 1939 by retail stores and is based upon results obtained in the 1939 Census of Business. Reports were obtained for each retail place of business in every State, county, and city in the United States. A retail store is, for census purposes, the place where the business is conducted, readily recognizable as a place of business. The Census of Business covered retail trade, wholesale trade, the distribution of manufacturers' sales, the construction industry, service establishments, hotels, laundries, cleaning and dyeing plants, tourist courts and tourist camps, motion-picture theaters and other places of amusement, and a mail canvass of sales finance companies.

### The Monthly Employment Inquiry

Each retail establishment was asked to report the "number of all paid employees on pay roll for period ended nearest 15th of each month." The schedule provided for reporting a segregation of full-time and part-time monthly employment. Retail establishments were also asked to report the total number of male employees and the number of female employees for one pay roll in October (full-time and part-time combined).

The statistics for monthly employment and sex of employees, which were obtained from the answers to these questions, are presented in this report. While monthly employment was reported by each establishment, it was not possible to secure data on sex of employees in every case and the information on sex of employees is thus based on a sample. The method of compiling these data is explained below.

Copies of the Retail Schedules, Form 20 and Form 21, are reproduced in the appendix to this report.

### Method of Presenting the Data

The monthly employment data presented in table 6 are aggregates of the number of employees reported for the specified month by the establishments in the State or in the kind-of-business classification.

The average number of employees is obtained by aggregating the number of employees for each month in each kind-of-business classification, and dividing the total by 12. This calculation was made separately for full-time and part-time employees. The number of employees indicated in this "average number" column conforms to the total employment, full-time and part-time, reported in table 2 of part 3, volume I, Retail Trade.

The percentages in the column headed "Percent of women" under sex of employees are computed from the information supplied on this question by fewer than the total of all stores. However, this is unimportant as practically all stores reported employees by sex.

The number of men and women shown in the columns under "Sex of employees" are computed by applying the percentages (or their complements) in the "Percent of women" column to the total of full-time and part-time employees shown in the column "Average number." It should be noted, in using the data on number of men and women, that the percentages are based on employment in the month of October, and then applied

to an average of employment in 12 months. Secondly, the percentages are based on full-time and part-time employment combined in the month of October, in which month the proportion of part-time employment in some kinds of business may vary from the average for 12 months. This qualification may be important if one sex or the other predominated in full-time or part-time employment.

The percentages are not presented for classifications with fewer than 50 employees, although the calculated data for these classifications are presented.

### Description of Tables

This report contains seven tables presenting employment data. Five of these tables are in the table 6 series, each of which presents monthly employment and sex of employees data. The other two tables are tables 2A and 2B which are reprinted in this report, for reference purposes, from part 3, volume I, Retail Trade.

**Table 6A.**—This table is a United States summary showing, for each kind of business, the number of active proprietors of unincorporated businesses; the number of male employees, the number of female employees, and the percentage of total employees that are females; the average number of employees, full-time and part-time; and number of employees, full-time and part-time, in each month.

**Table 6B.**—This table presents totals for each State, the information in each column consisting of the same items as in table 6A; namely, the number of proprietors of unincorporated businesses, sex of employees, and monthly employment.

**Table 6C.**—This table is a comparative table presenting 1935 and 1939 data for each kind of business, the information for each year consisting of the number of proprietors of unincorporated businesses and the total number of employees, monthly and average for 12 months, full-time and part-time combined. The number of men and women employees is shown for 1939 and the percent women for 1935 and 1939.

**Table 6D.**—This table is a comparative table presenting 1935 and 1939 totals for each State, the information for each year consisting of the number of proprietors of unincorporated businesses and the total monthly employment, full-time and part-time combined. The number of men and women employees is shown for 1939 and the percent women for 1935 and 1939.

**Table 2A.**—This table is a summary for the United States showing, for each kind of business, stores, sales, proprietors, employees, pay roll, and merchandise stocks.

**Table 2B.**—This table presents the State totals for each State, the information given for each State consisting of stores, sales, proprietors, employees, pay roll, and merchandise stocks.

The employment statistics presented in this report will be published in part 1, volume I, Retail Trade, along with a United States summary and other tables which show types of operation, size of business, and credit. The retail trade census will be printed in volume I, parts 1, 2, and 3. The area tables (1, 2, 15, 16, and 17) have been assembled and printed as part 3. The commodity statistics (table 18) will be assembled and printed as part 2.



### Limitations of the Employment Data

The employment data presented in this report should be interpreted within the limits of several qualifications. The schedule for reporting these data allowed each establishment to report the number of employees on the pay roll for any pay roll period nearest the 15th of each month. It is possible that differing pay roll practices among retail establishments resulted in some variations in reporting.

Several other qualifications of the employment data were mentioned in the description of the method of presenting the data. It was pointed out that the average employment was computed from the 12 monthly employment figures, and that the number of male and female employees was computed by applying this percentage to the average of the monthly employment. The sample upon which the sex of employee data are based varies in size from State to State and within kinds of business. For the United States as a whole, over 95 percent of total employment was classified by sex of employees in the census schedules submitted by retail establishments.

The schedule, which is described above, provided space for reporting full-time and part-time employees separately. It is probable that in a small number of cases full-time and part-time employees were reported in a total and the total entered on the line for "full-time employees," either due to the fact that the establishment did not keep a separate record of full-time and part-time employment or due to misinterpretation of the instructions.

Figures on employment of paid employees in retail stores do not include the members of proprietors' families who work full time or part time in the store but to whom no stated salary is paid. Information on this item will be provided in part 1, volume I, Retail Trade.

### Previous Retail Trade Censuses

The first census of retail trade was taken as a part of the Census of Distribution of 1929, which followed a trial census of 11 cities in 1926. The second retail census was taken as part of the Census of American Business of 1933, and the third as a part of the Census of Business of 1935.

The schedule used in obtaining 1929 employment data requested employment as of four specified dates; namely, the 15th of April, July, October, and December. Reporting on both this item and sex of employees was incomplete. The data on seasonal variation in employment and sex of employees were presented only in terms of ratios and percentages.

The schedule used in obtaining 1935 employment data requested monthly employment totals, full time and part time combined. Summaries of these data are reproduced in this report in the comparative tables 6C and 6D.

In the 1935 volume, the figures on the number of employees in the sex of employees table are the reported number and do not represent total employment. These sample data are therefore not directly comparable with the 1939 figures on number of employees, which represent total employment and are computed as described above. Because of the lack of comparability, the 1935 data on the number of men and women are not presented in tables 6C and 6D.

### Definitions and Explanation of Terms

Retail trade as covered in this census includes establishments primarily engaged in selling mer-

chandise for personal or household consumption or utilization, and rendering service incidental to the sale of goods.

The major portion of the sales or receipts must be from retail sales in order to classify an establishment, for census purposes, as a retail establishment. It must also operate as an established place of business open to the general public; thus peddlers or itinerant vendors are excluded. Also excluded are places of business connected with institutions which are open only to their members or personnel, such as restaurants and bars operated by country clubs, school cafeterias, and cafeterias operated by industrial plants for their employees.

A retail store or establishment is, for census purposes, the place where the business is conducted, readily recognizable as a place of business. Each separate place of business is counted as a separate store. It includes only those retail establishments which are found to be doing more than one-half of their business at retail. When an establishment is primarily engaged in service or wholesale trade, it is so classified even though it may be, in part, engaged in retail trade. The number of stores in any one classification is not equal to the number of "outlets" for any one commodity since the store is counted only in its major classification. Each store is thus classified in one and only one kind-of-business classification.

Kind-of-business classifications are described in the appendix to this report. A more detailed description of these classifications appears in the appendix of part 3, volume I, Retail Trade. Part 3 also contains a complete explanation of terms appearing in tables 2A and 2B, such as sales, pay roll, and merchandise stocks.

**Active proprietors of unincorporated businesses.**—The number of active proprietors includes owners or partners of unincorporated businesses devoting the major portion of their time to the operation of the business. They are not included in the count of employees nor is their compensation included in pay roll. Salaried officers of corporations and executives are classified as employees, not as proprietors or firm members, and their compensation is therefore included in pay roll.

**Employees.**—This term represents the number of full-time and part-time paid employees, including salaried officers of corporations and executives. The number of employees shown is an average for the year; this average was obtained by totaling the number reported monthly (full time and part time separately) for the period ended nearest the 15th of each month, and dividing the sum by 12.

**Full-time and part-time employees.**—Full-time employees are those who work or are paid for the full number of hours of the workweek. Also reported as full-time employees are extras and contingents who worked the full number of hours during the particular week for which employment data were requested. All other employees were reported as part-time employees.

**Percent women.**—This percentage is based on a "sample" or part of all stores, the sample consisting of the stores that reported the number of male and female employees for a representative pay roll (full time and part time combined) in October 1939.

**Average number.**—The data in this column are computed from the monthly employment figures. The method of computation is described in the section above, "Method of presenting the data."
