

Chapter IX.—EXPENDITURES FOR PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

INTRODUCTION

The Census of Manufactures for 1939 was the first in which manufacturers were asked to report their capital expenditures for plant and equipment. The inquiry covered three classes of expenditures, as follows:

Total expenditures for plant, equipment, and real estate during the year—

1. Expenditures for new construction or major alterations of buildings and other fixed plant and structures (buildings, docks, tracks, etc.), including elevators, heating and ventilating equipment, etc., essentially a part of buildings or other fixed structures.

2. Expenditures for new machinery and operating equipment, including all new motors, lathes, punch presses, cranes, automobiles, trucks, railroad rolling stock, office fixtures, furniture, typewriters, billing machines, cash registers, and other movable equipment.

3. Expenditures for plant and equipment acquired in a "used" condition from other owners, and expenditures for land.

As is to be expected when such an inquiry is formulated for the first time, it was found, when the returns were examined, that the definitions of the three classes of expenditures had not been made sufficiently explicit and that they left room for considerable latitude in interpretation. For example, it was not stated specifically that a multiple-unit organization should report only expenditures pertaining to individual plants and should not include expenditures chargeable to the organization as a whole. Furthermore, it was not explained whether expenditures reported for a plant should cover the cost of office, warehouse, and residential construction on land located elsewhere than at the plant, nor whether they should cover the construction or the purchase of a branch plant at a different location. Expenditures of this character by multiple-unit organ-

izations, although essential to manufacturing operations, in many cases are not allocable to any one individual plant, as they relate also to other plants of the concern, sometimes in two or more industries. It is believed that the returns included no considerable overlaps of this character, but the extent to which they may have occurred is uncertain. The use of the term "real estate" in the inquiry may have suggested the inclusion of costs having no direct relation to plant alteration or expansion. It should be remembered, furthermore, that differences in accounting methods introduce another element of uncertainty.

The inquiry was uniform on the questionnaires for all industries, and this may have resulted in uncertainty in some cases as to what expenditures were to be reported, especially where the terminology of the inquiry did not appear to relate to the particular industry.

In view of these factors, it is obvious that although the statistics may be accepted as substantially accurate, allowance must be made for a margin of possible error.

The expenditures for plant and equipment comprise only expenditures reported by establishments engaged in active production during the year 1939. They do not include expenditures by inactive establishments or for plants under construction in 1939 but not completed and actually in use within that year. Supplementary study indicates that substantial expenditures of this character were made in 1939. As expenditures for buildings and machinery which are leased from others by manufacturing concerns are not chargeable to these concerns' capital accounts, no data for such expenditures are included in this report; nor does the report cover the large expenditures for new equipment, such as tools, jigs, and dies, which many manufacturers, particularly in the automobile industry, charge directly to current manufacturing expense rather than to capital depreciation accounts.
