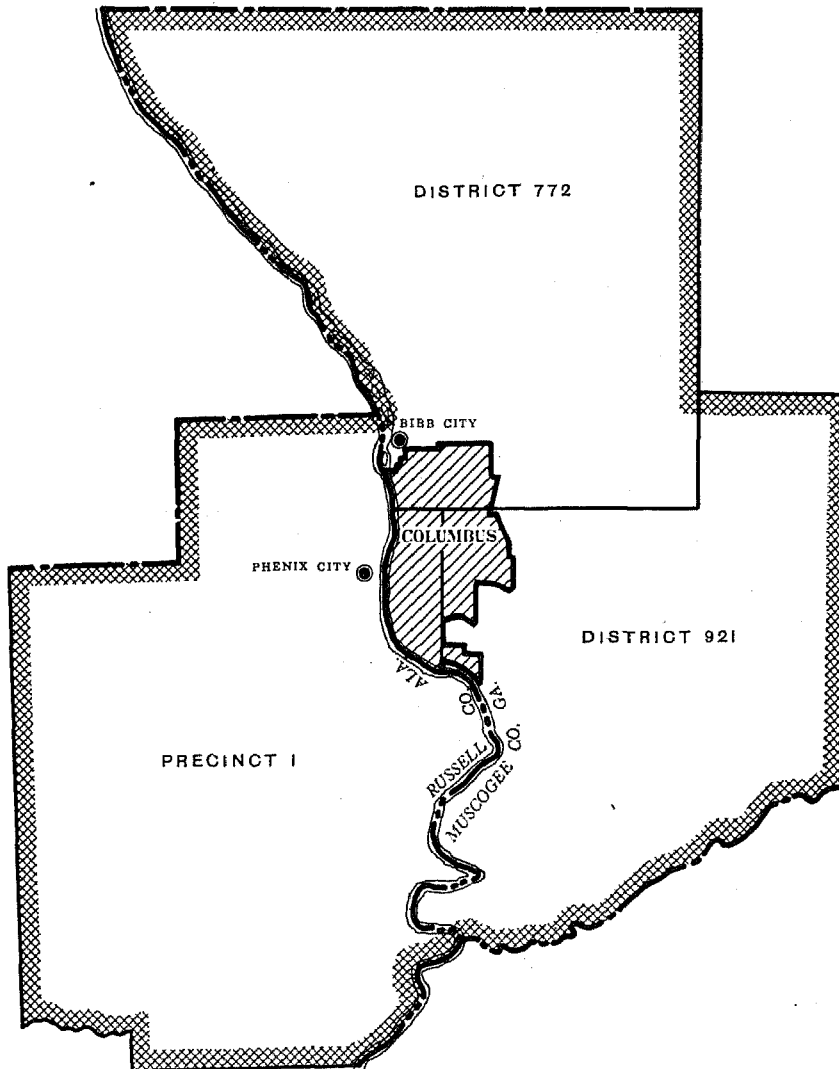

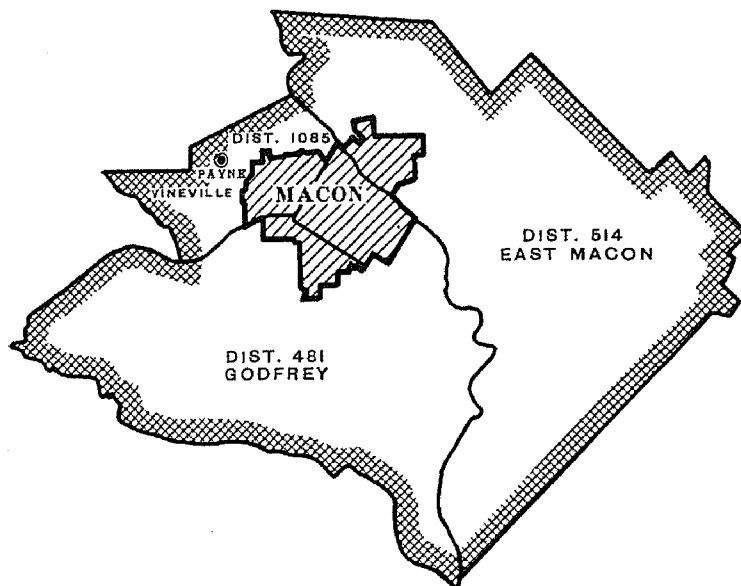


COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN DISTRICT
