In this volume are presented the more important characteristics of the population as returned in the 1940 census, for the States, arranged alphabetically, from New York to Oregon. The data for the States from Alabama to the District of Columbia are contained in Part 1 of Volume II of the Sixteenth Census Reports on Population, which includes also a summary for the United States as a whole. The data for the remaining States are contained in other parts of this volume as follows: Part 2, Florida to Iowa; Part 3, Kansas to Michigan; Part 4, Minnesota to New Mexico; Part 6, Pennsylvania to Texas; and Part 7, Utah to Wyoming. The material was first published in a series of State bulletins, each entitled "Population, Second Series, Characteristics of the Population." There was also issued a United States Summary Bulletin in which the more important data for the several States were brought together. These bulletins, with a few minor corrections, have been assembled and bound together as sections of the present volume.
