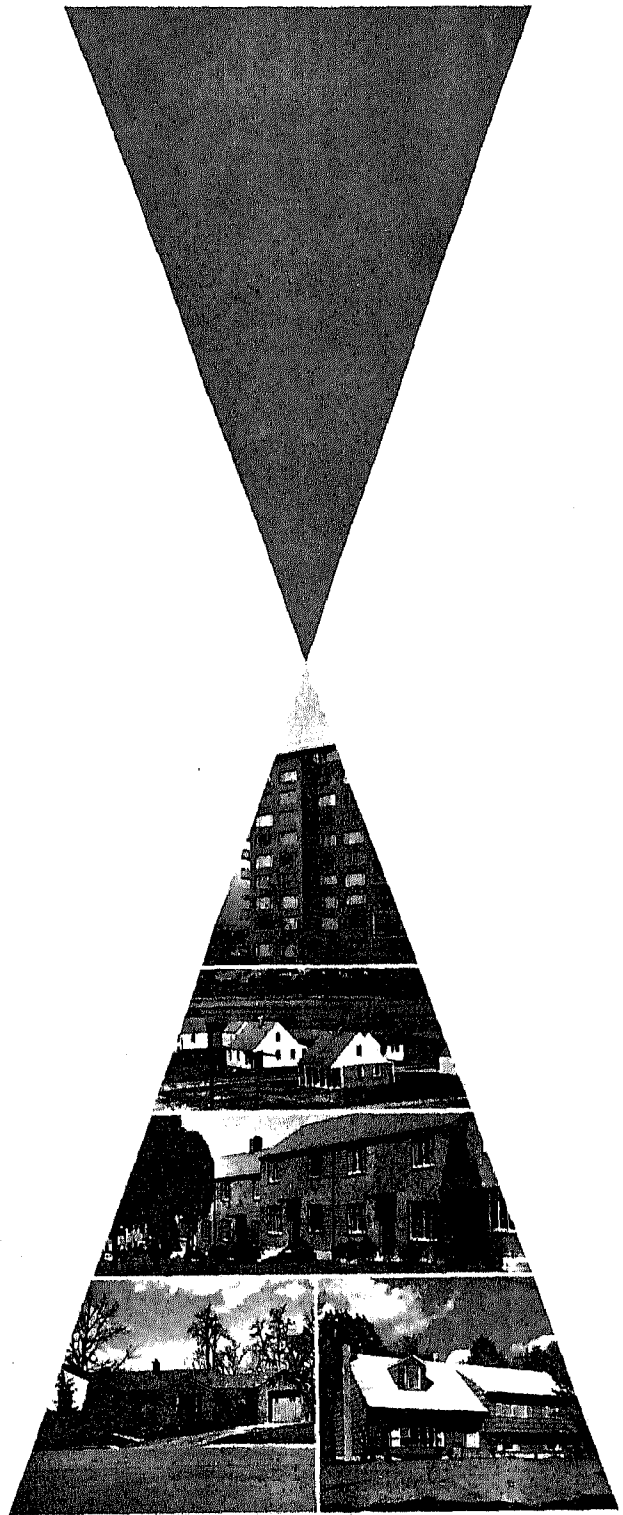

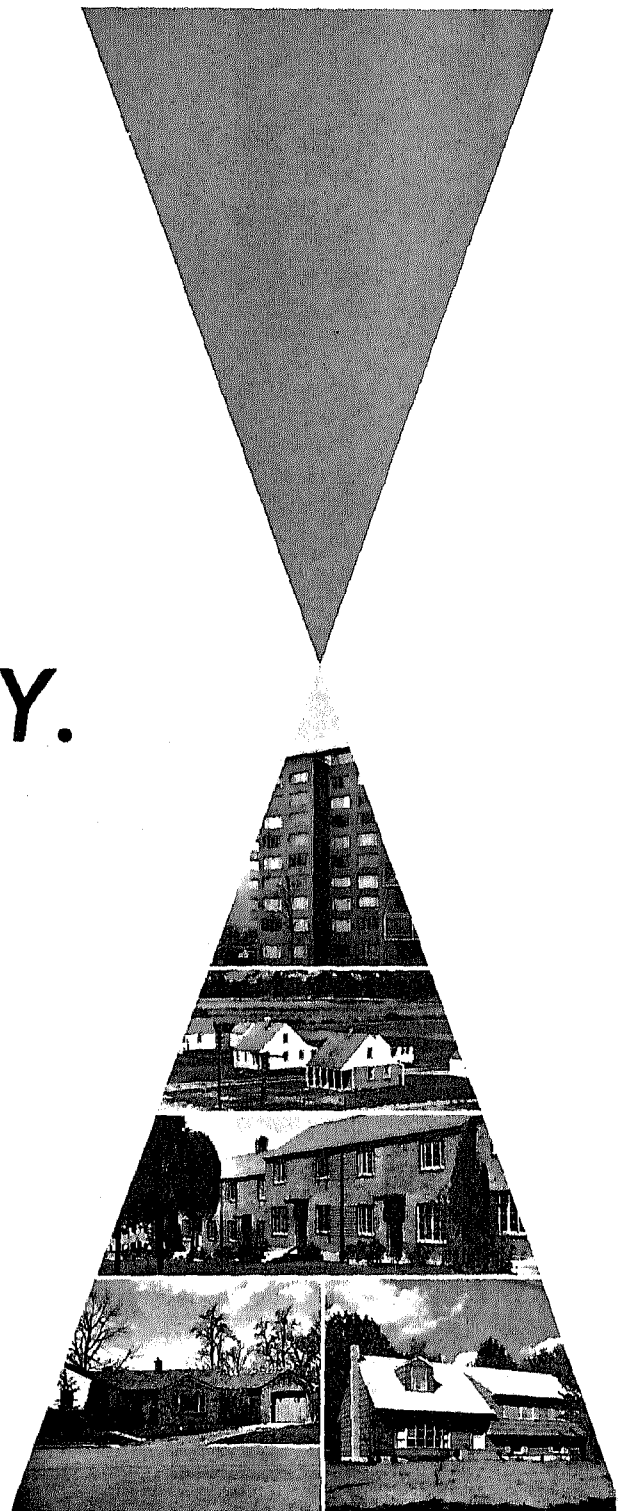

BY CENSUS TRACT AND BLOCKS: 1960

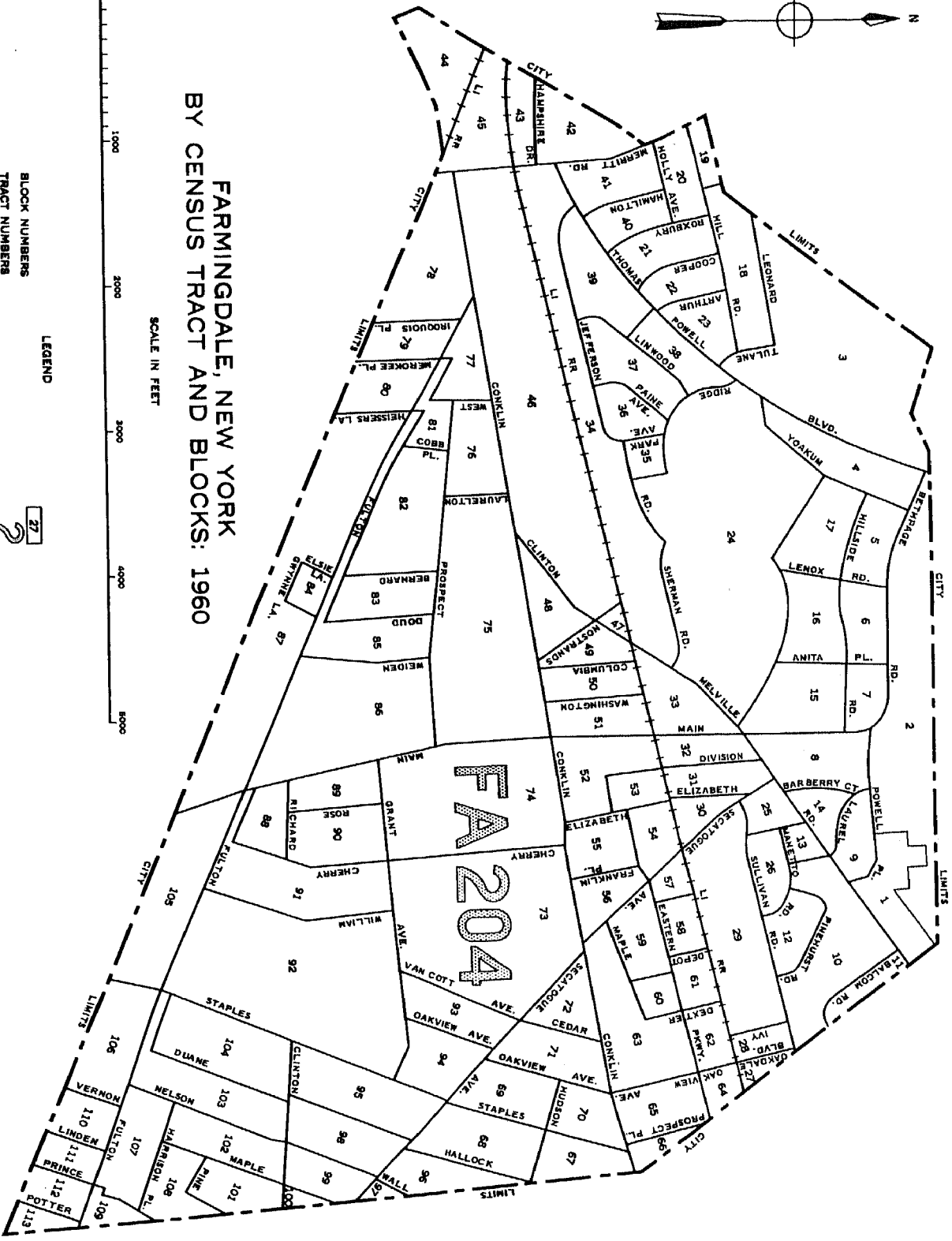

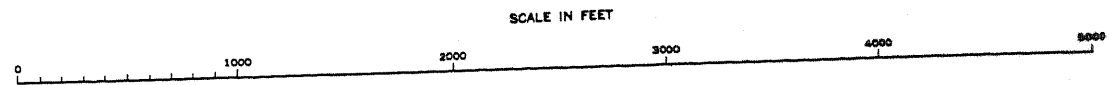
