60PH-3 and 60PH-4. --'Sample FOSDIC schedules': General arrangement and format

The general arrangement and format of the 60PH-3 and 60PH-4 schedules are identical. One side of the sheet consists of a housing panel and a population panel, and the other side consists of two population panels. Each population panel is for one individual; the three population panels are identical. The only difference between the two schedules is in the content of the housing panels; the population panels on the two schedules are exactly the same. The two sides appear as follows:

Those items which appear on only one of the two versions are covered in the enumeration on either a 20- or a 5-percent basis, as the case may be; those items which appear on both versions are covered on a 25-percent basis.

The four types of housing panels are reproduced on pages 20-23; the population panel is reproduced on page 24. On all the panels, the horizontal strip of "H" and "P"

There are two versions of both the 60PH-3 and 60PH-4 schedules--20 percent and 5 percent; the subsample designation is shown in the "form number" box in the upper left corner of the housing panel. The schedules were given to the enumerator in a spiral-bound book, wherein four "20-percent" sheets are followed by one "5-percent" sheet. This pattern is repeated throughout the book, with the starting position of the "5-percent" sheet randomized from one book to another.

The two versions of each schedule differ only with regard to certain items in the respective housing panels.

Items across the top is obtained by transcription from the 60PH-1 or 60PH-2 schedule.

In filling in the schedule, the enumerator started with the housing panel and then filled one population panel for each person in the household. If there were more than three persons in the household, a second schedule was used; information from items 2 and 3 in the housing panel of the first schedule was transcribed to the second, to identify it as a continuation of the first. For a vacant housing unit, the enumerator filled only the housing panel and made no entry in the population panels.

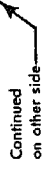

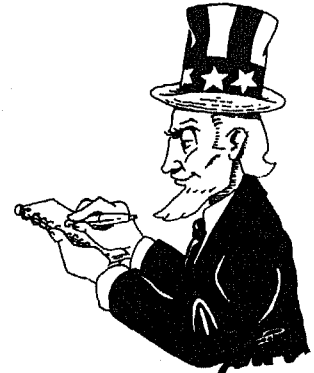
