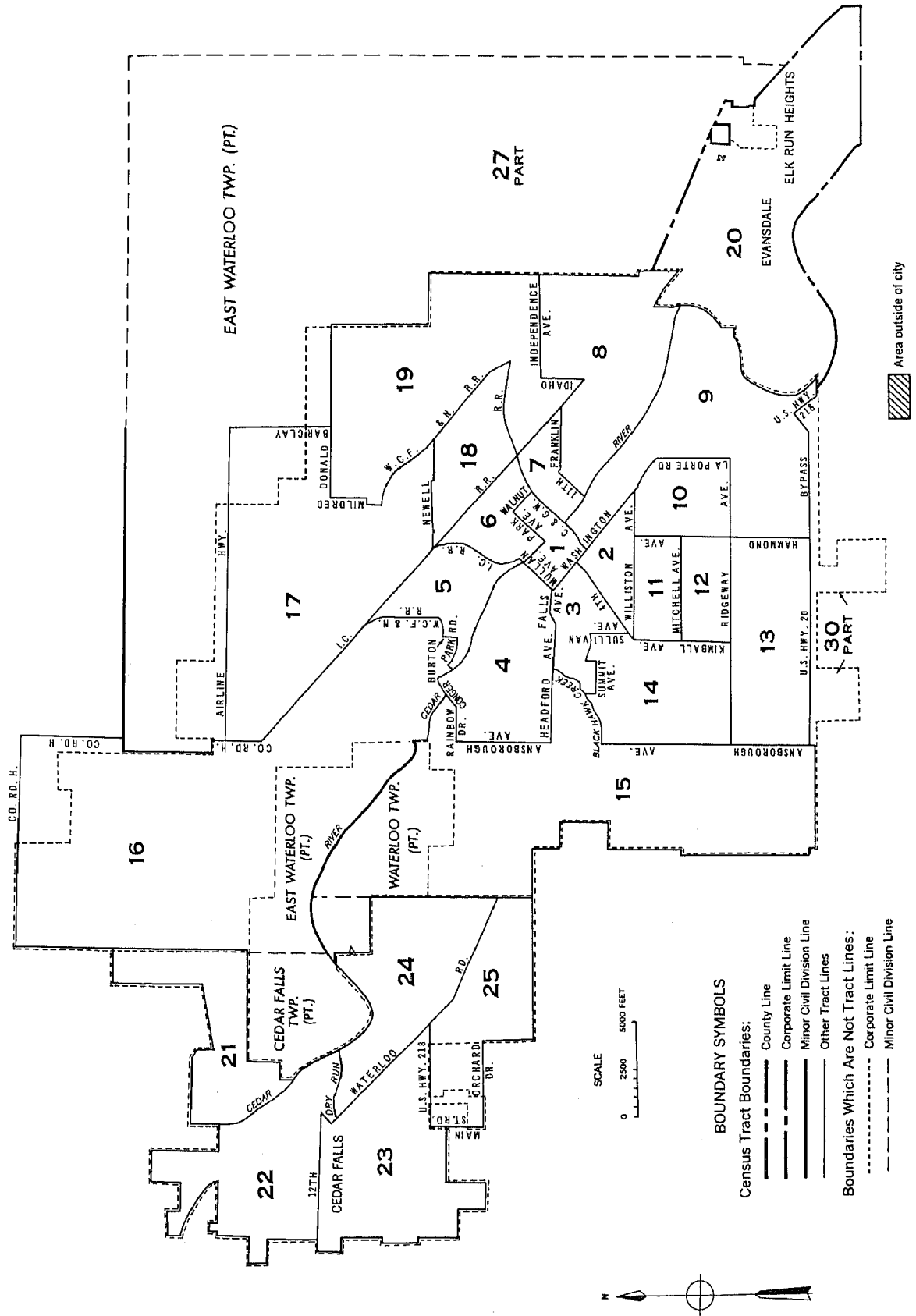

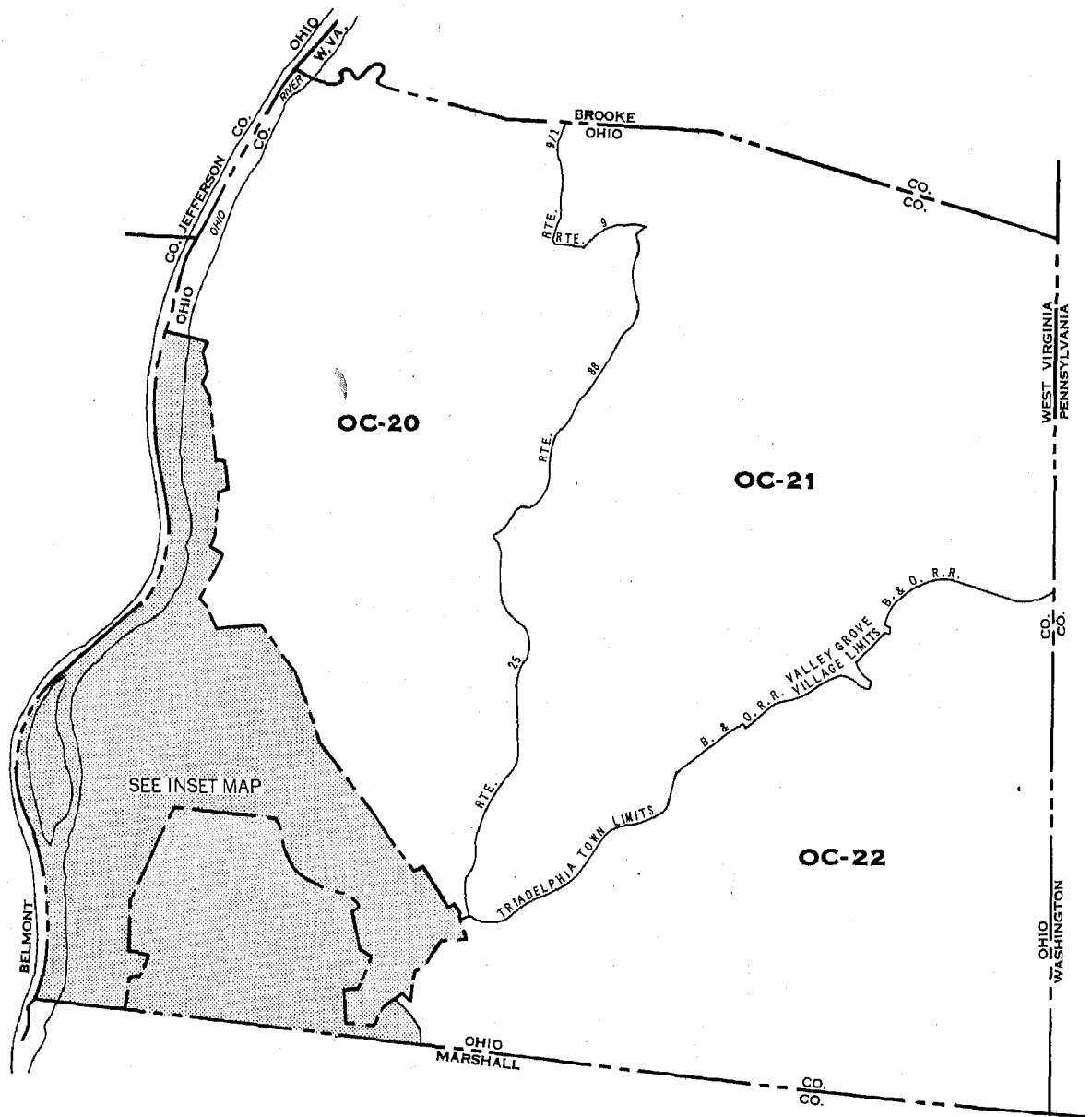

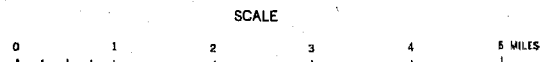

COMPARABILITY OF CENSUS TRACTS, 1960 AND 1950

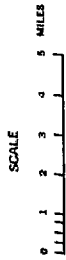

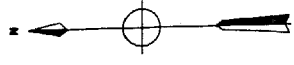
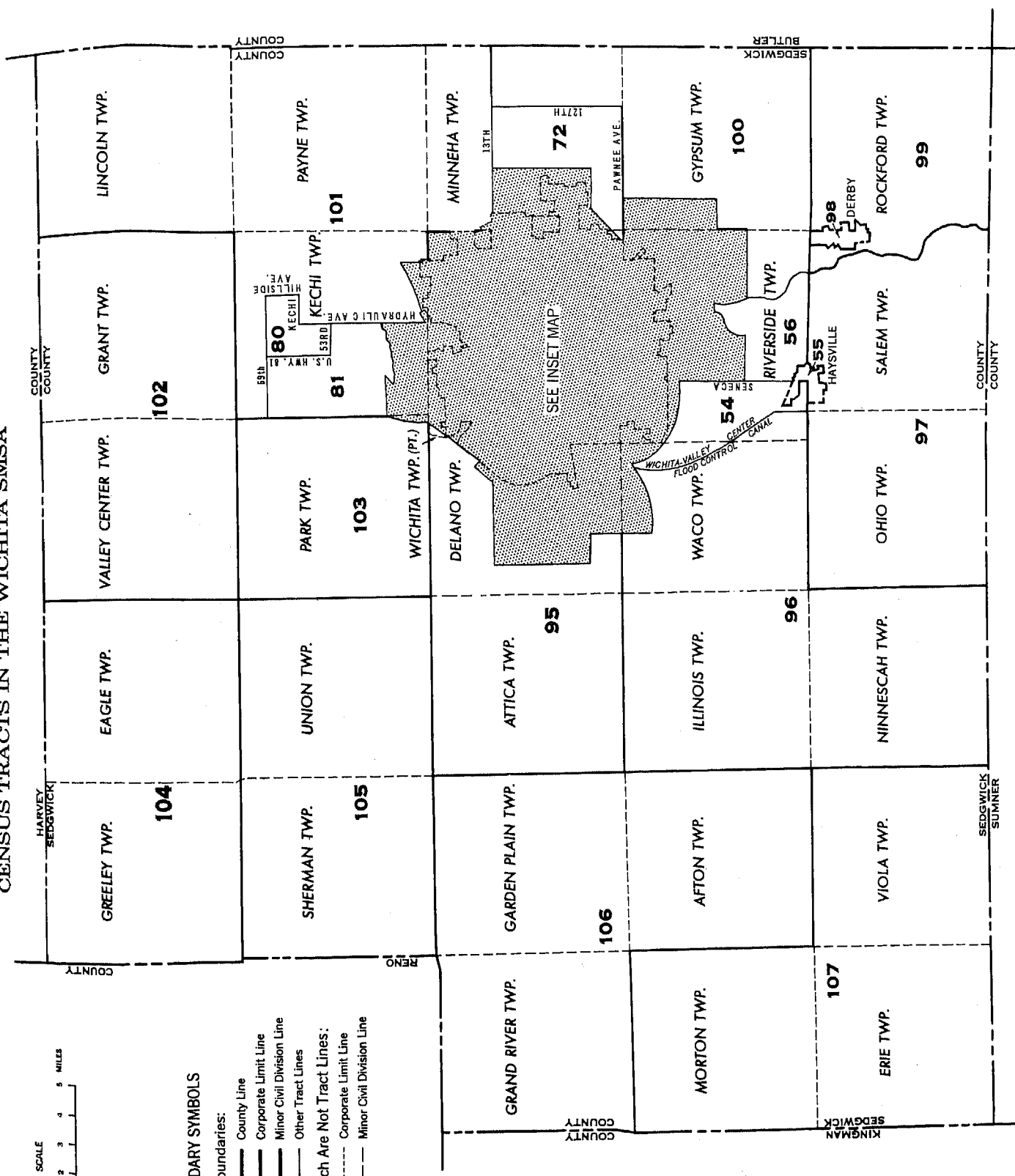
