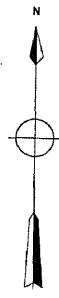
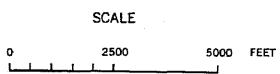
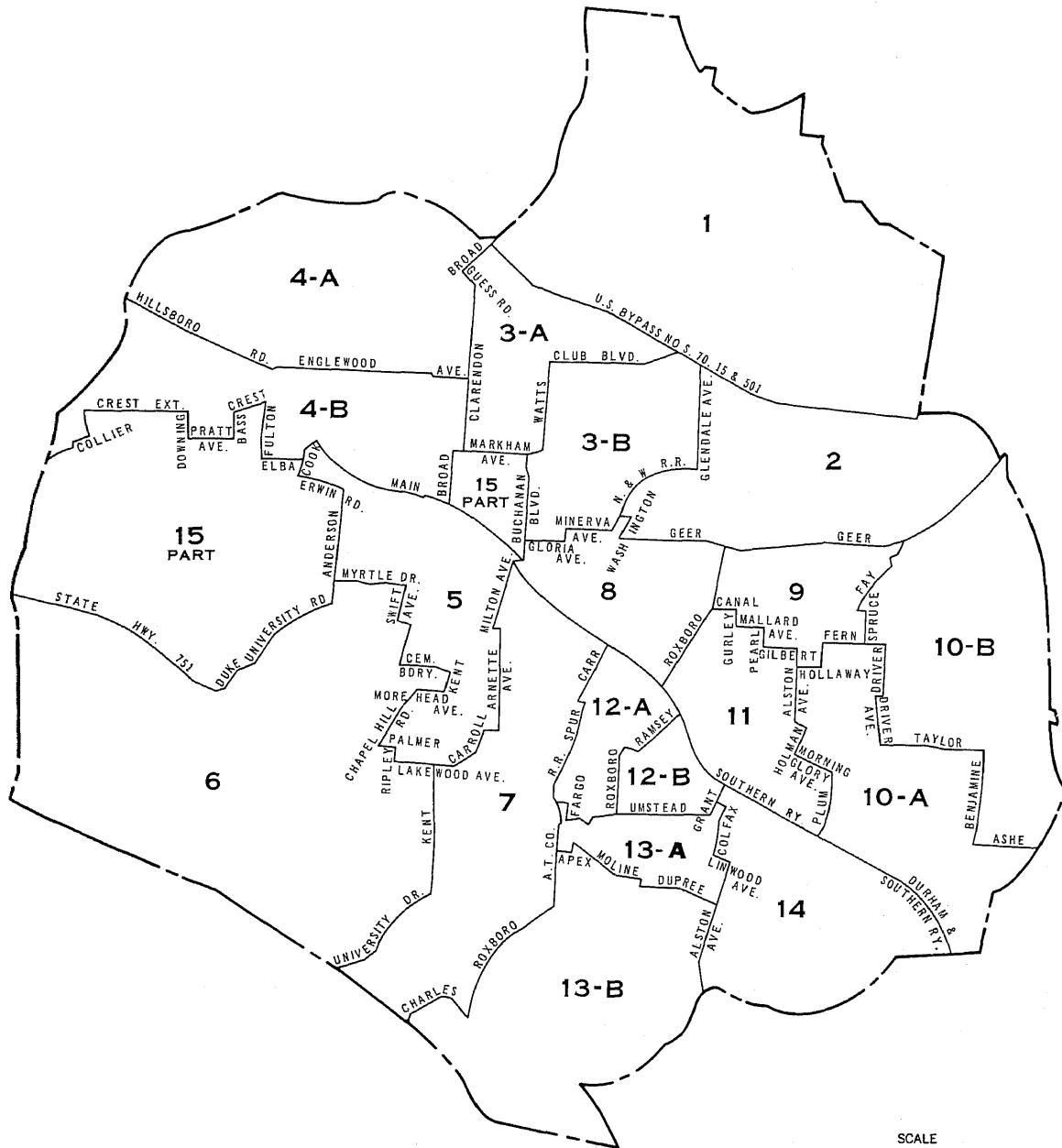

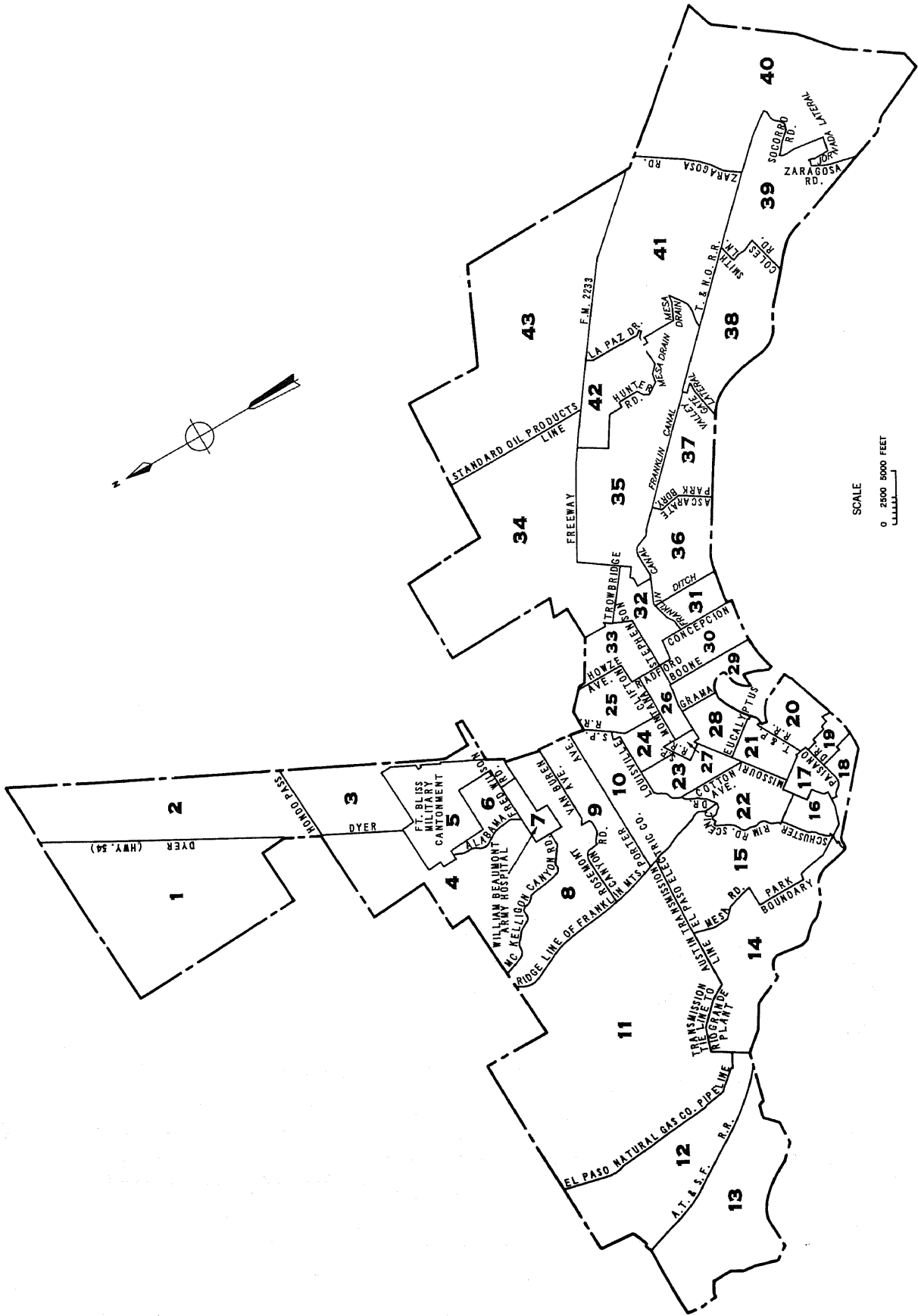
CENSUS TRACTS IN THE EL PASO SMSA

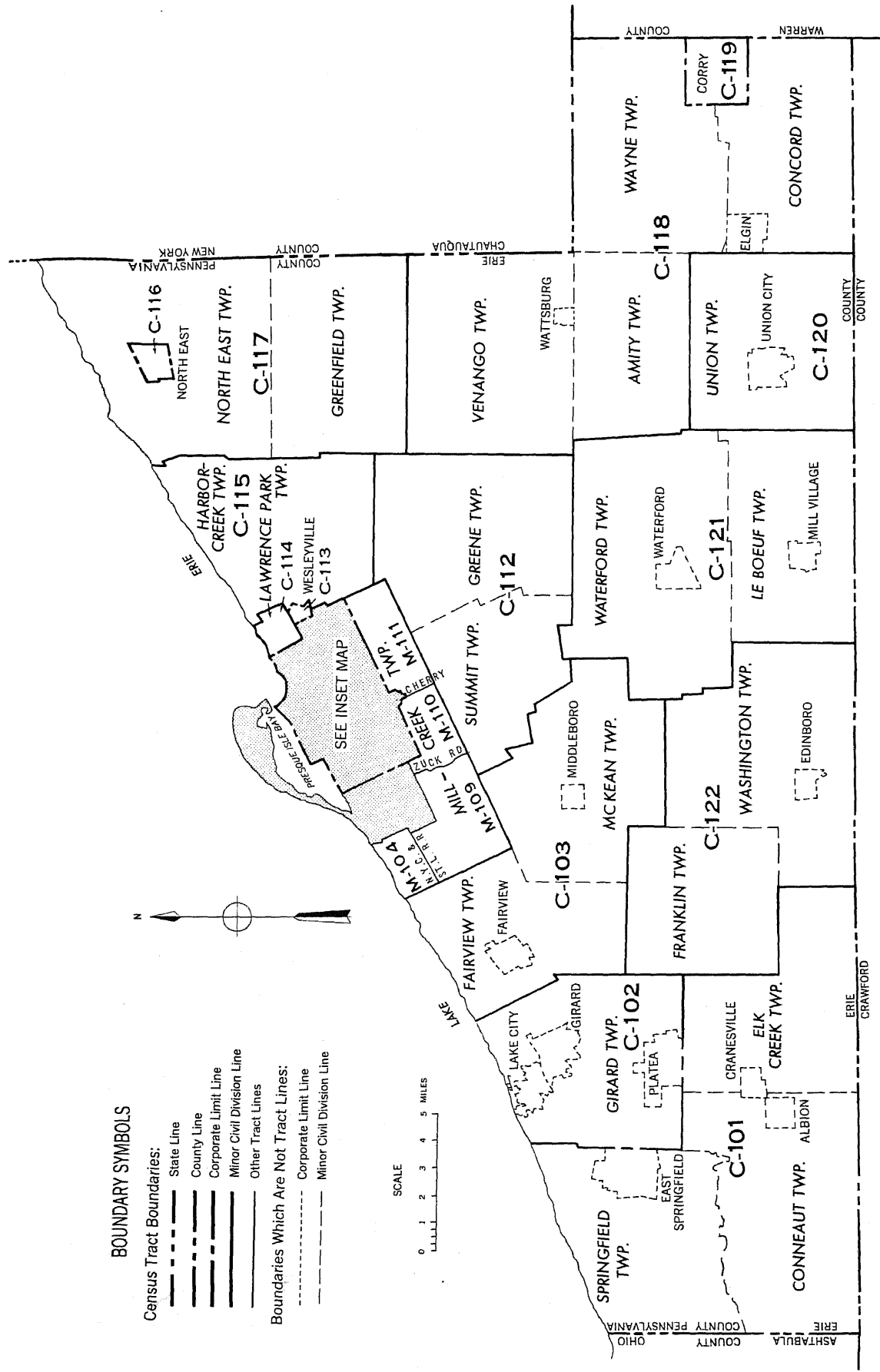
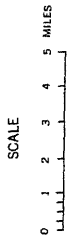
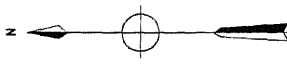
