This report presents statistics from the 1960 Census of Population on social and economic characteristics of the inhabitants of the State and of selected subdivisions of the State. The data presented here are being issued in advance of their publication in the Final Report PC(1)-6C, which will provide additional information on the same characteristics of the population for this State, as well as definitions of terms and explanations of collection and processing procedures. The final report will be published within the next month or two.

The statistics in this advance report are presented in the form of preprints of three tables (32, 33, and 70) from the final report. Tables 32 and 33 present summary statistics on nativity, parentage, migration, education, families, employment status, occupation, industry, and income for persons in each of the standard metropolitan statistical areas, urbanized areas, and urban places of 10,000 or more in the State. Distributions by social and economic characteristics are shown in table 70 for the State by type of residence (central cities of urbanized areas, urban fringes, urban places of 10,000 or more outside urbanized areas, the remaining urban places, and rural areas).

All of the data in this advance report, and in the final report on which it is based, were tabulated from a 25-percent sample of the population, consisting of one household out of every four (and of one person out of every four persons not in households). Since the statistics shown here are based on a sample, they are subject to sampling variability, as will be explained in the final report. There may be differences between comparable distributions in this report and in other reports of the 1960 Census of Population because of sampling variability or errors in processing.

This report presents statistics from the 1960 Census of Population on social and economic characteristics of the inhabitants of the State and of selected subdivisions of the State. The data presented here are being issued in advance of their publication in the Final Report PC(1)-7C, which will provide additional information on the same characteristics of the population for this State, as well as definitions of terms and explanations of collection and processing procedures. The final report will be published within the next month or two.

The statistics in this advance report are presented in the form of preprints of three tables (32, 33, and 70) from the final report. Tables 32 and 33 present summary statistics on nativity, parentage, migration, education, families, employment status, occupation, industry, and income for persons in each of the standard metropolitan statistical areas, urbanized areas, and urban places of 10,000 or more in the State. Distributions by social and economic characteristics are shown in table 70 for the State by type of residence (central cities of urbanized areas, urban fringes, urban places of 10,000 or more outside urbanized areas, the remaining urban places, and rural areas).

All of the data in this advance report, and in the final report on which it is based, were tabulated from a 25-percent sample of the population, consisting of one household out of every four (and of one person out of every four persons not in households). Since the statistics shown here are based on a sample, they are subject to sampling variability, as will be explained in the final report. There may be differences between comparable distributions in this report and in other reports of the 1960 Census of Population because of sampling variability or errors in processing.

An outline of the publication program for the 1960 Census of Population may be obtained free of charge from the Bureau of the Census, Washington 25, D.C., or any U.S. Department of Commerce Field Office.

This report presents statistics from the 1960 Census of Population on social and economic characteristics of the inhabitants of the State and of selected subdivisions of the State. The data presented here are being issued in advance of their publication in the Final Report PC(1)-8C, which will provide additional information on the same characteristics of the population for this State, as well as definitions of terms and explanations of collection and processing procedures. The final report will be published within the next month or two.

The statistics in this advance report are presented in the form of preprints of three tables (32, 33, and 70) from the final report. Tables 32 and 33 present summary statistics on nativity, parentage, migration, education, families, employment status, occupation, industry, and income for persons in each of the standard metropolitan statistical areas, urbanized areas, and urban places of 10,000 or more in the State. Distributions by social and economic characteristics are shown in table 70 for the State by type of residence (central cities of urbanized areas, urban fringes, urban places of 10,000 or more outside urbanized areas, the remaining urban places, and rural areas).

All of the data in this advance report, and in the final report on which it is based, were tabulated from a 25-percent sample of the population, consisting of one household out of every four (and of one person out of every four persons not in households). Since the statistics shown here are based on a sample, they are subject to sampling variability, as will be explained in the final report. There may be differences between comparable distributions in this report and in other reports of the 1960 Census of Population because of sampling variability or errors in processing.

An outline of the publication program for the 1960 Census of Population may be obtained free of charge from the Bureau of the Census, Washington 25, D.C., or any U.S. Department of Commerce Field Office.

This report presents statistics from the 1960 Census of Population on social and economic characteristics of the inhabitants of the State and of selected subdivisions of the State. The data presented here are being issued in advance of their publication in the Final Report PC(1)-9C, which will provide additional information on the same characteristics of the population for this State, as well as definitions of terms and explanations of collection and processing procedures. The final report will be published within the next month or two.

The statistics in this advance report are presented in the form of preprints of three tables (32, 33, and 70) from the final report. Tables 32 and 33 present summary statistics on nativity, parentage, migration, education, families, employment status, occupation, industry, and income for persons in each of the standard metropolitan statistical areas, urbanized areas, and urban places of 10,000 or more in the State. Distributions by social and economic characteristics are shown in table 70 for the State by type of residence (central cities of urbanized areas, urban fringes, urban places of 10,000 or more out-side urbanized areas, the remaining urban places, and rural areas).

All of the data in this advance report, and in the final report on which it is based, were tabulated from a 25-percent sample of the population, consisting of one household out of every four (and of one person out of every four persons not in households). Since the statistics shown here are based on a sample, they are subject to sampling variability, as will be explained in the final report. There may be differences between comparable distributions in this report and in other reports of the 1960 Census of Population because of sampling variability or errors in processing.

An outline of the publication program for the 1960 Census of Population may be obtained free of charge from the Bureau of the Census, Washington 25, D.C., or any U.S. Department of Commerce Field Office.

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
