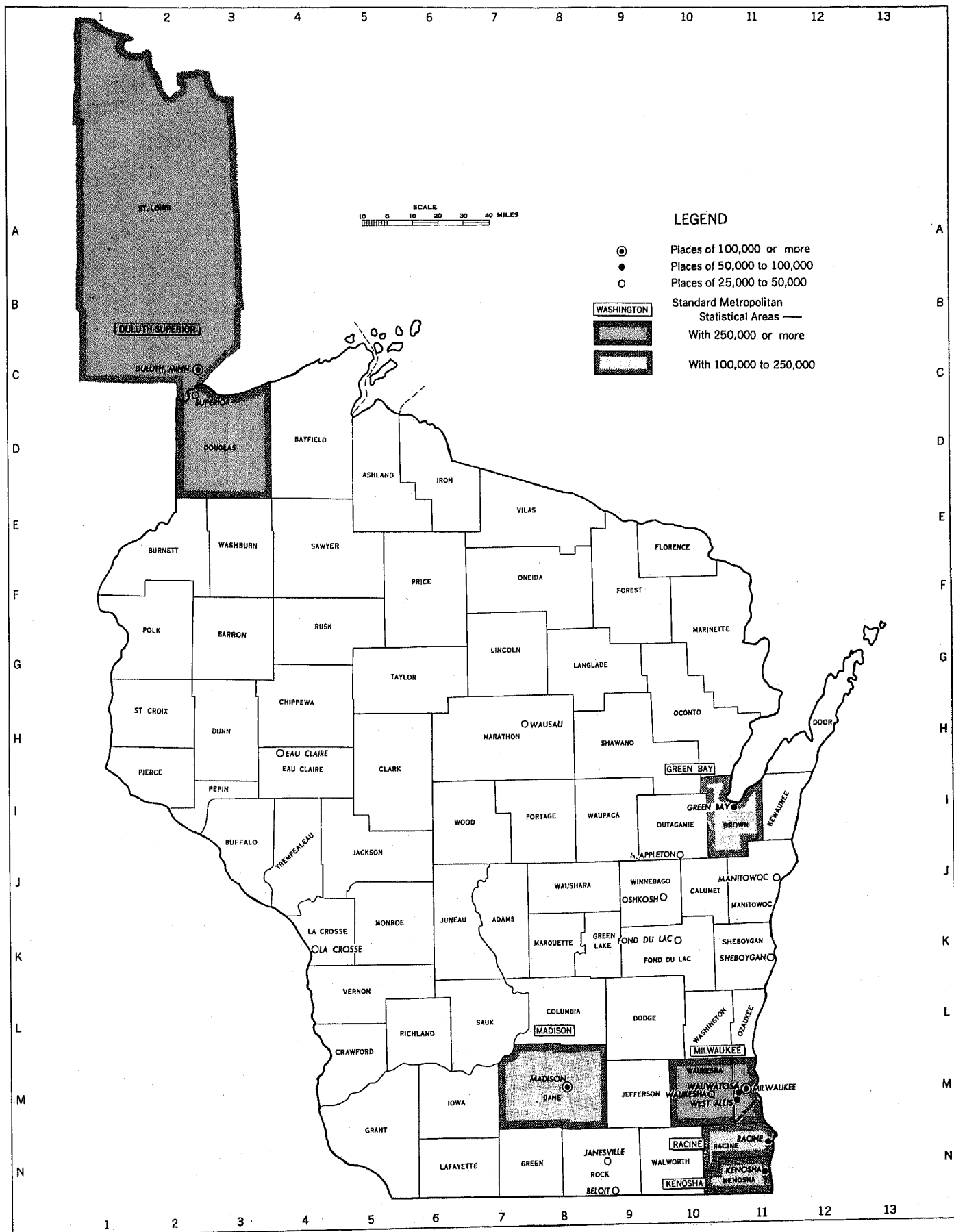

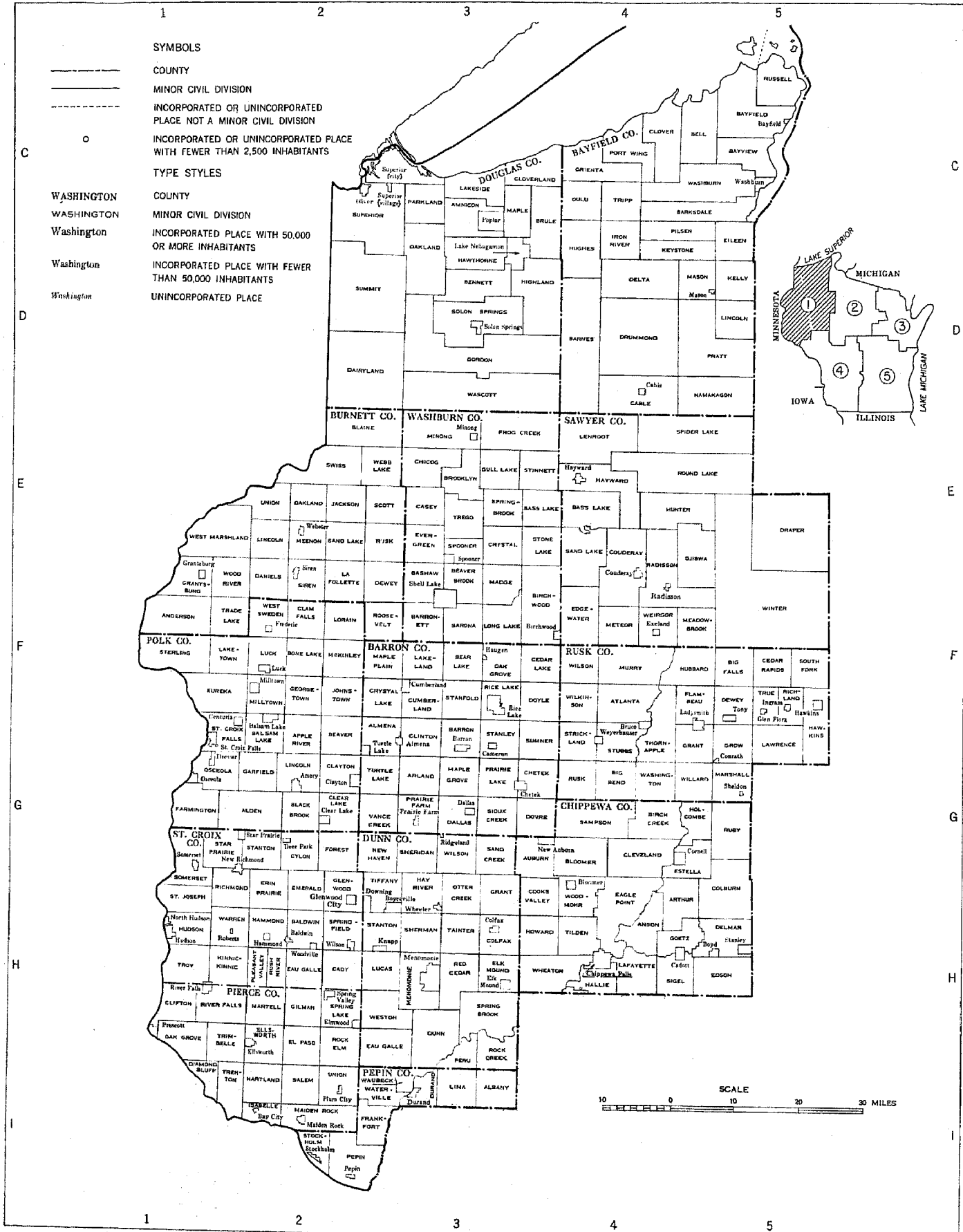

WISCONSIN— COUNTIES, PLACES OF 25,000 OR MORE, AND STANDARD METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREAS

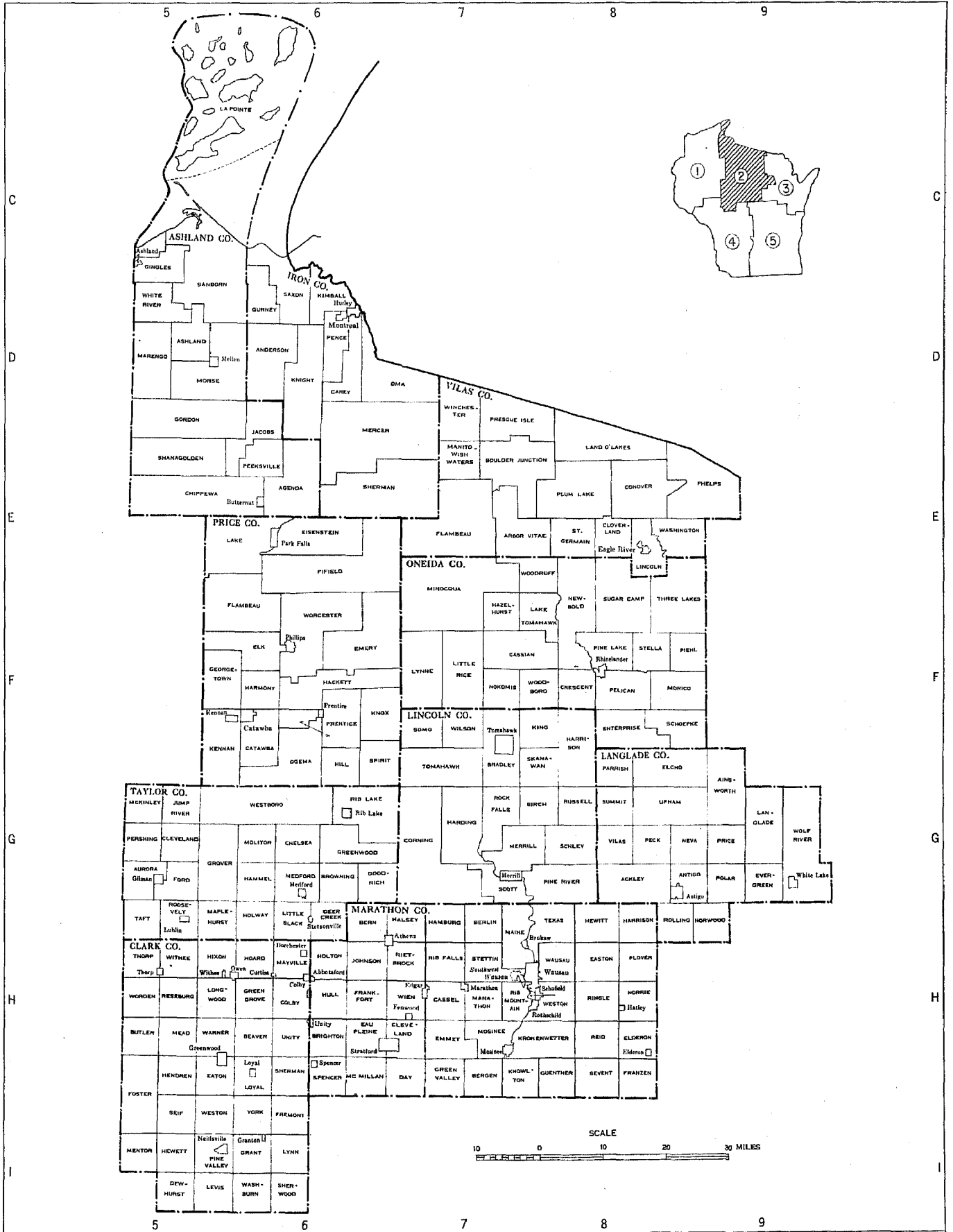

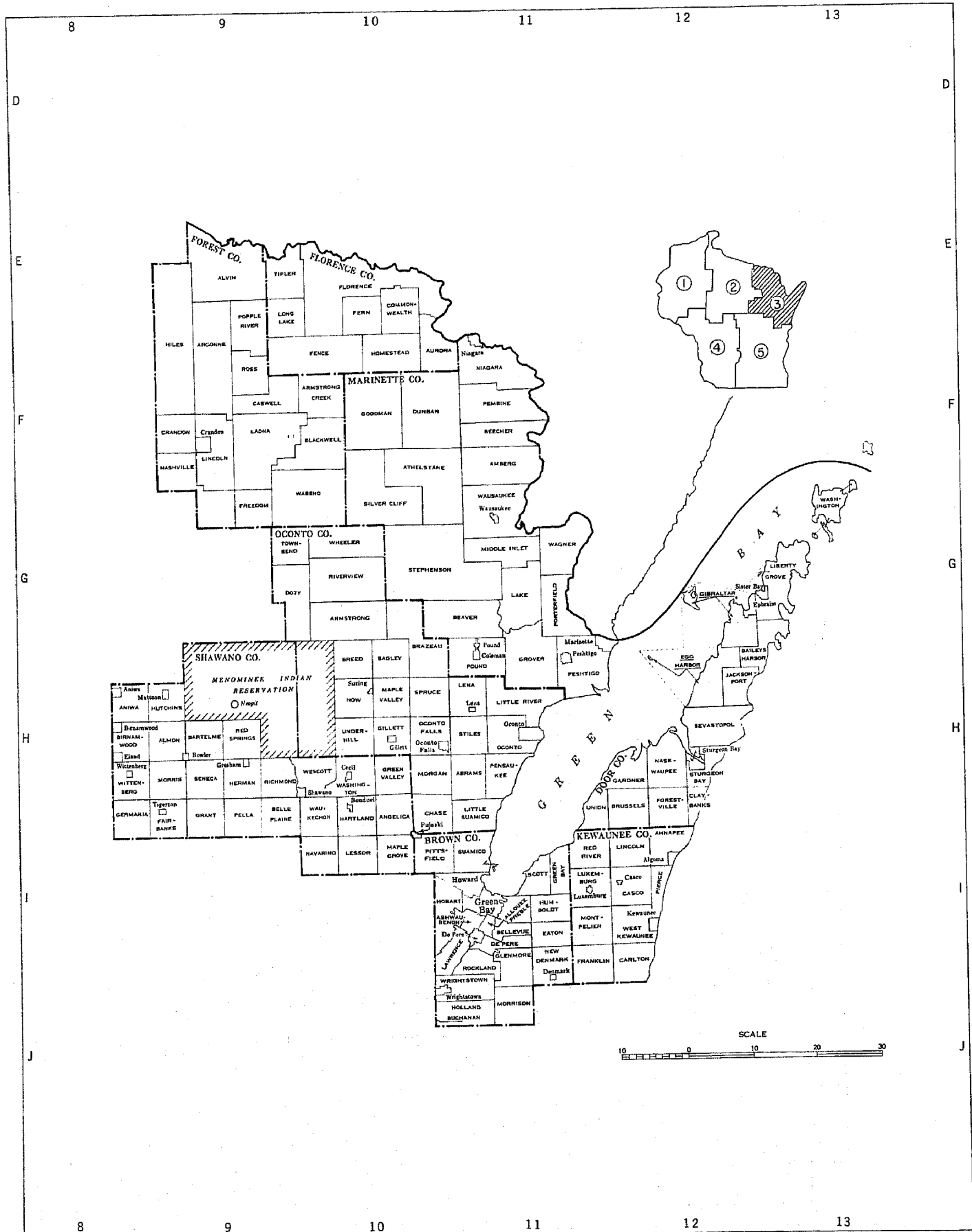
MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—TOWNS, CITIES, AND VILLAGES

MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—TOWNS, CITIES, AND VILLAGES

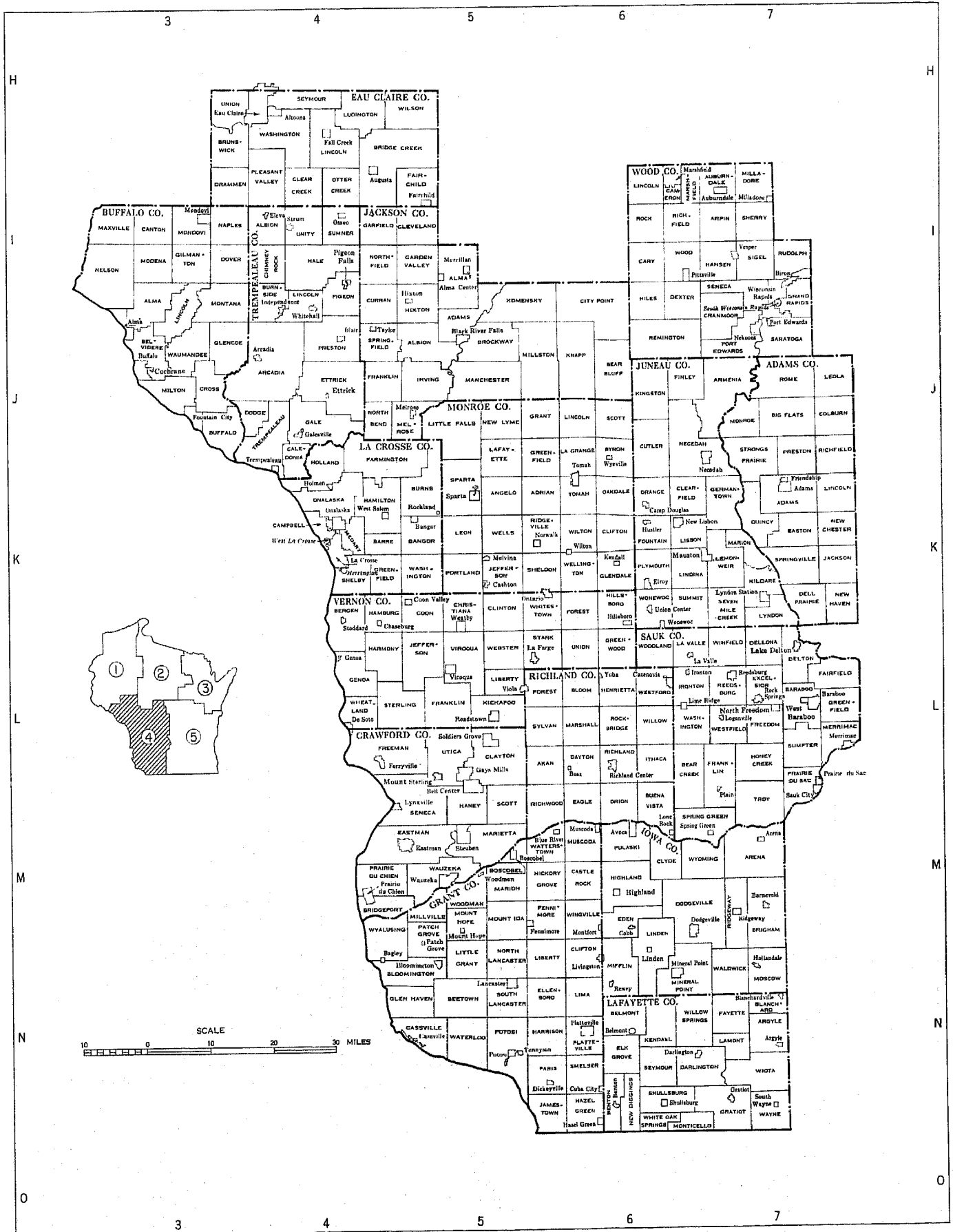


WISCONSIN—SECTION 3
MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—TOWNS, CITIES, AND VILLAGES

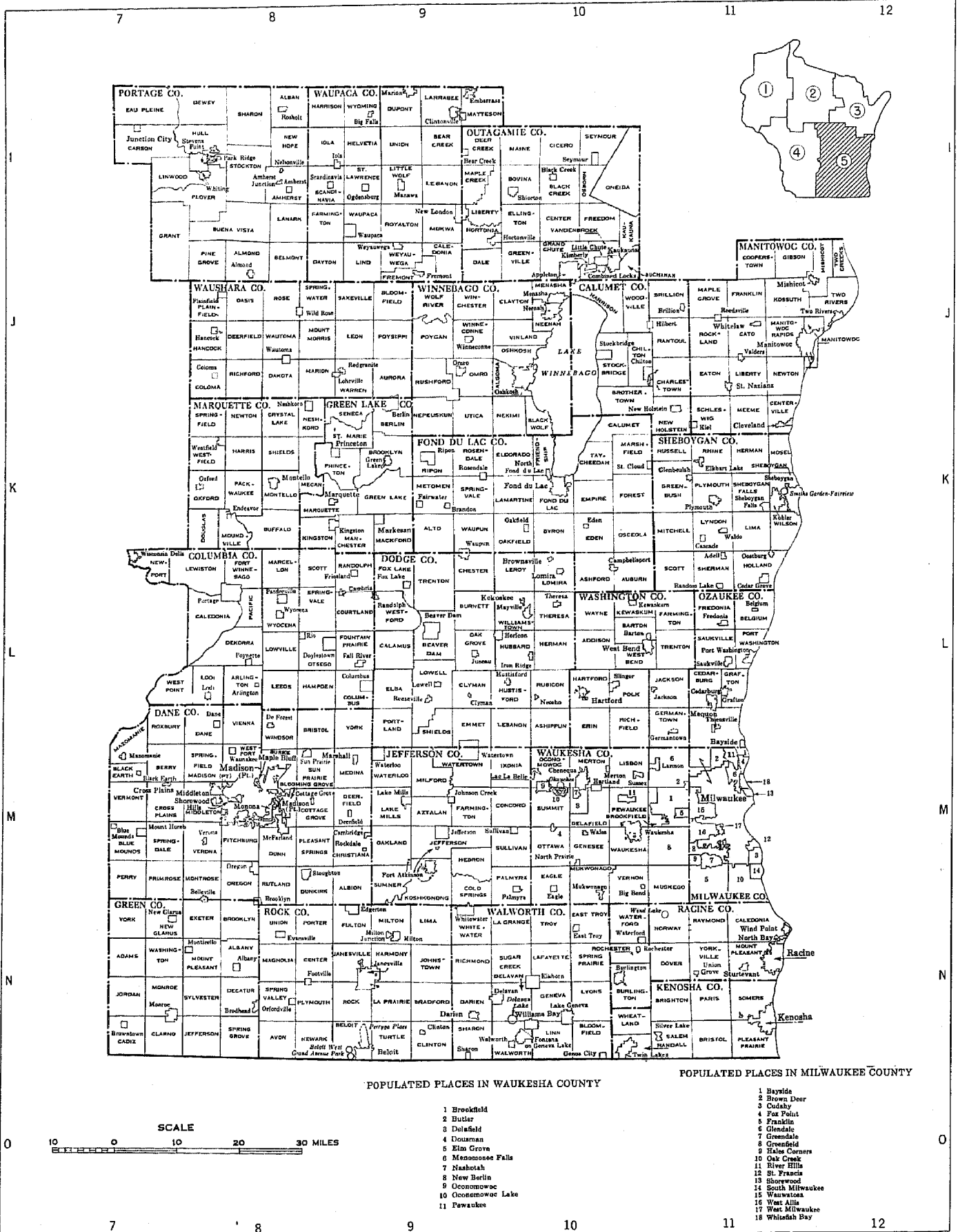

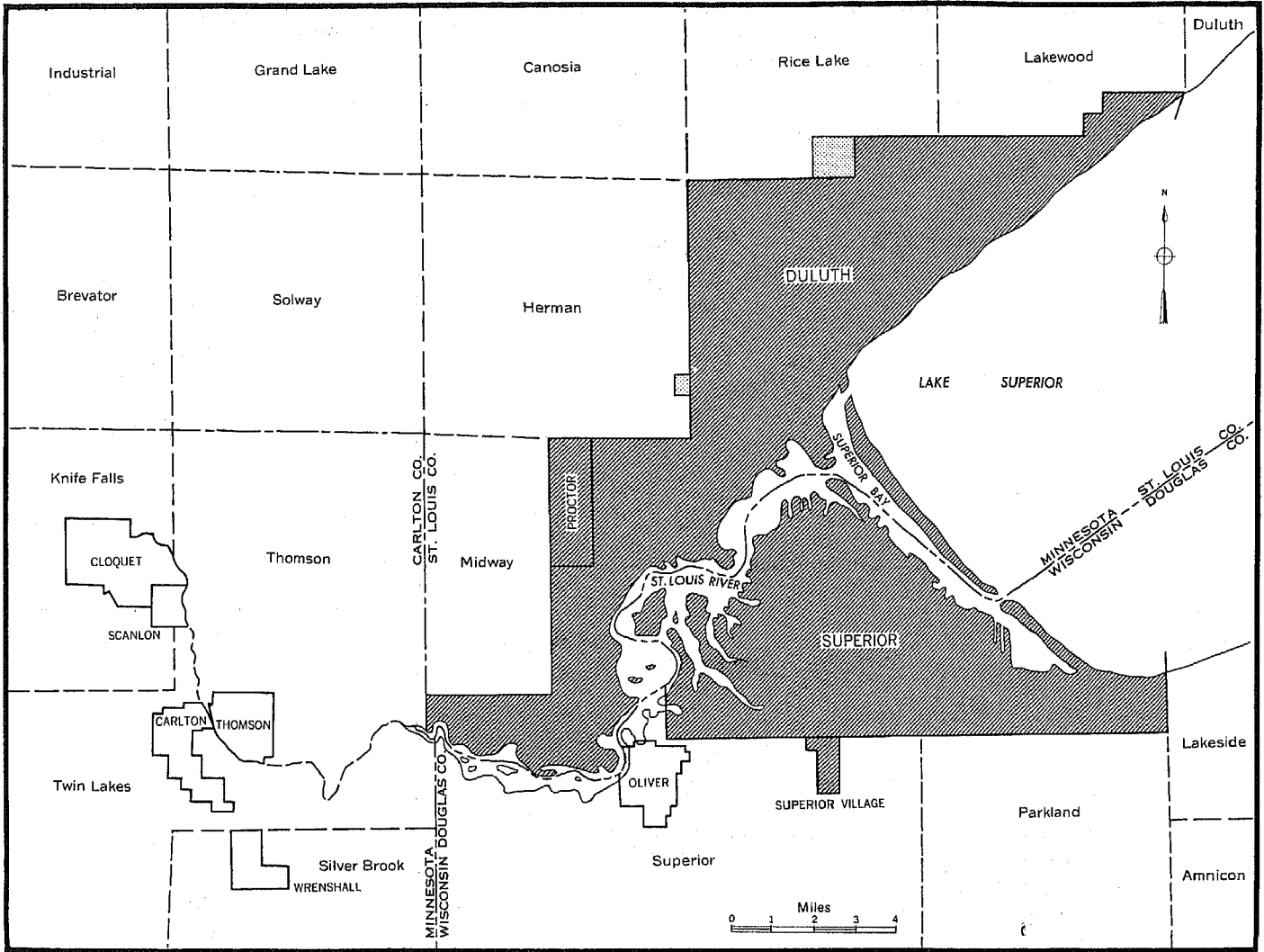






DULUTH-SUPERIOR URBANIZED AREA



COMPONENTS OF URBANIZED AREA

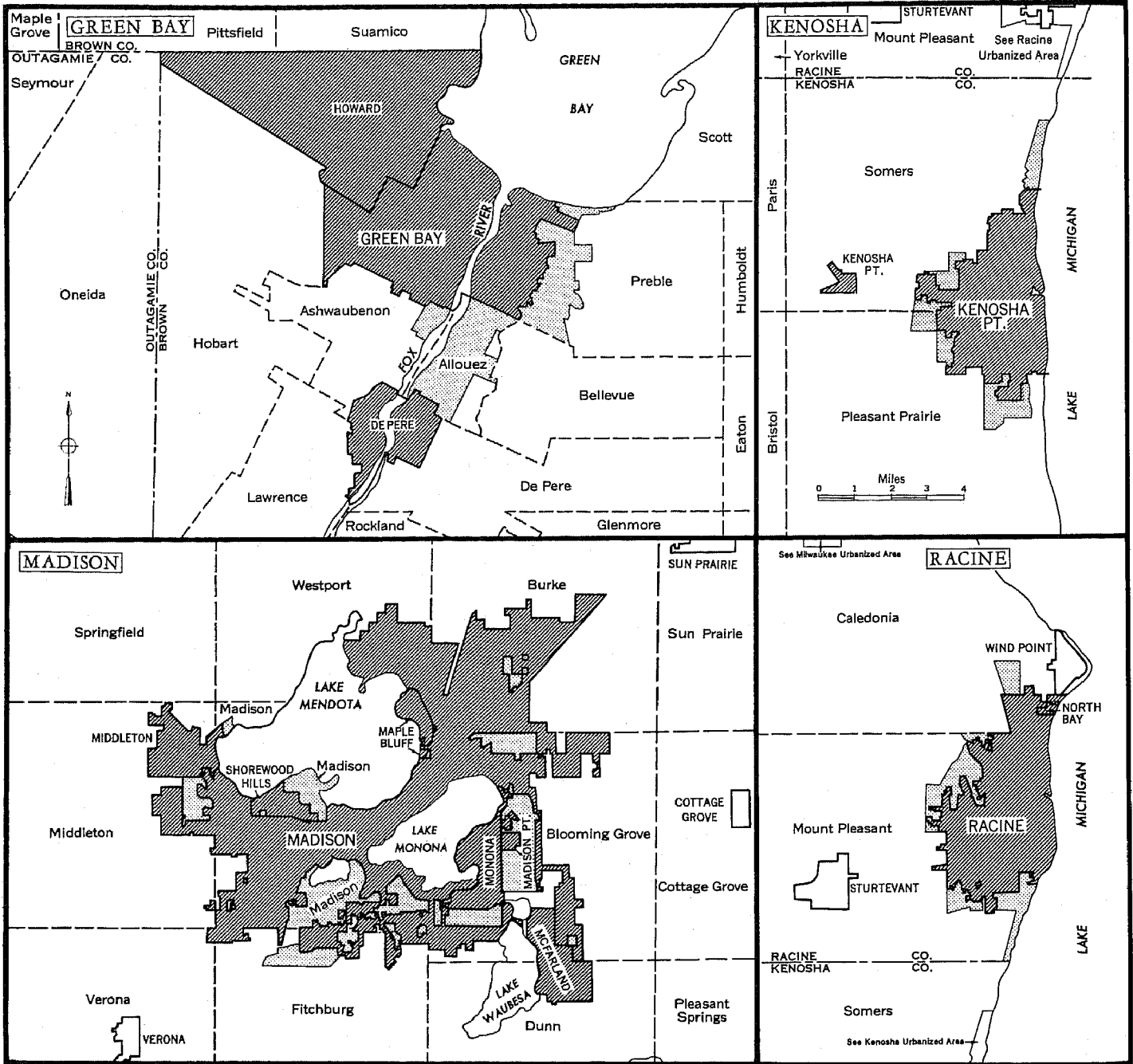
