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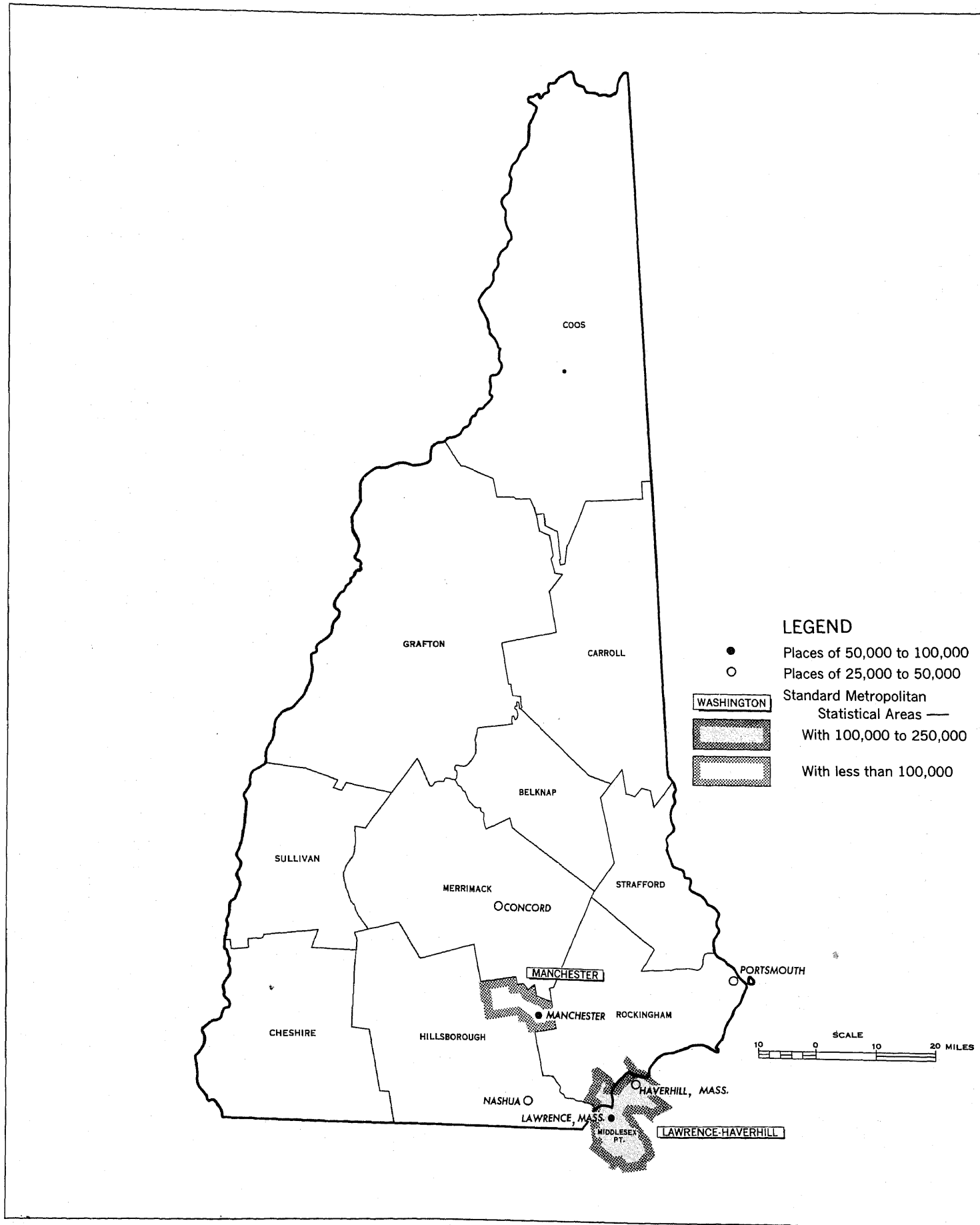

- [MANCHESTER] With less than 100,000

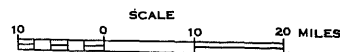
