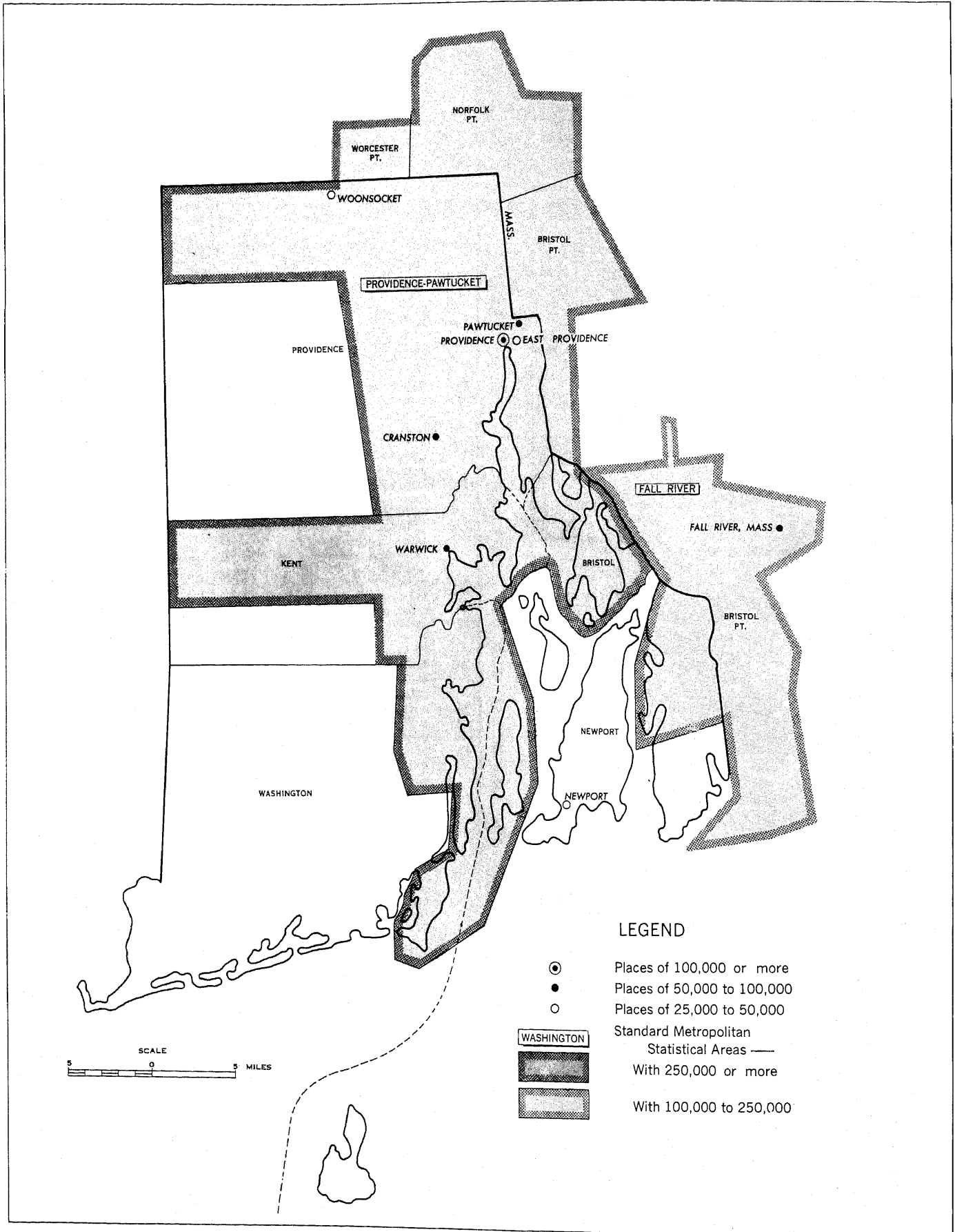

- With 100,000 to 250,000

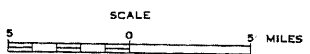
