RACE OF THE POPULATION BY COUNTY: 1970

(The tables presented here were compiled from other 1970 census reports and have been assembled in a format convenient for the user)

The tables in this report show the geographic distribution of selected racial groups in counties across the Nation in 1970. The selected racial groups include the Black, American Indian, Japanese, Chinese, and Filipino populations. Table 1 contains the total population and the population of each of the five selected racial groups for each county, by State, as of 1970. Table 2 presents 1970 and 1960 data for counties with at least 10,000 black persons. The counties are ranked according to the size of the black population in 1970. Corresponding figures are presented for American Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and Filipinos for counties with 1,000 or more of the specified group in tables 3, 4, 5, and 6, respectively. In table 7, 1970 and 1960 data are shown for the 10 counties, in rank order, with the highest percentage of blacks in 1970. Comparable figures are presented for each of the four remaining racial groups in tables 8-11. The last two tables (12 and 13) show for the United States, by regions, divisions, and States, the distribution of each of the selected racial groups as well as of the Korean, Hawaiian, Aleut, and Eskimo populations.

Slightly over one-half (53 percent) of the black population resided in the South in 1970, however, the counties with the largest concentrations of blacks were in the North and West. Cook County, Illinois, with almost 1.2 million blacks, ranked number one; Los Angeles, California, and Wayne County, Michigan, each with more than 700,000 black persons, ranked second and third, respectively, among the counties with the largest population. The five counties which comprise New York City—Bronx, Kings, New York, Queens, and Richmond—are usually considered as one geographical unit. Using this geographic concept, the largest concentration of the black population in one area would be found in New York City, with 1.7 million blacks (table 2).

In 1970, the American Indian population had reached at least 10,000 in 10 counties. McKinley County, New Mexico, ranked first with 26,507 Indians, followed closely by Robeson County, North Carolina, with 26,486 (table 3). The next three ranking counties were:

Los Angeles County, Calif.	24,509
Apache County, Ariz.	23,994
Navajo County, Ariz.	23,023

Most of the 10 counties with 10,000 or more Indians in 1970 have shown substantial growth since 1960. The most dramatic increase in the Indian population occurred in Los Angeles, where the Indian population climbed from 8,109 in 1960 to 24,509 in 1970, registering a 202 percent increase. This change was due partly

to the heavy immigration of Indians from the reservations and other rural areas during the period. However, Native Americans still comprised a very small proportion (0.3 percent) of the total population of Los Angeles County in 1970. In the 10 counties with the largest number of Indians, the proportion Indian of the total population ranged from the low of 0.3 percent for Los Angeles to 74.3 percent for Apache County, Arizona.

One hundred and sixty-four counties, including one independent city, had an Indian population of 1,000 or over in 1970. The 164 counties were distributed throughout the country, but the vast majority were located in States west of the Mississippi. About 71 percent of the 792,730 Native Americans resided in one of these counties in 1970.

Indians comprised less than 1 percent of the National population. However, they were a majority in the 10 counties with the highest proportion of Indians in 1970. Menominee County, Wisconsin, and Shannon County, South Dakota, had the highest proportions—88.5 and 86.2 percent, respectively (table 8).

The Japanese, Chinese, and Filipino populations were highly concentrated in a small number of counties (tables 4, 5, and 6). For example, close to 9 out of 10 Japanese lived in the 47 counties with the largest number of Japanese (1,000 or more) in 1970. The counties with the largest number of Japanese, Chinese, and Filipinos generally were found in the West, particularly California and Hawaii. The most noticeable exception was Cook County, Illinois, which had relatively large populations of each of the Asian American groups. Large numbers of the Asian Americans also resided in the five-county area constituting New York City.

The counties of Honolulu and Los Angeles had, by far, the largest number of Japanese and together contained 46 percent of all the Japanese in the Country (table 4). The 169,078 Japanese in Honolulu County constituted 26.9 percent of the total population of that county, however, in Los Angeles County the 104,078 Japanese accounted for only 1.5 percent of the county population.

The Japanese comprised a sizable proportion of the total population in four counties, all in Hawaii (table 9). The percent Japanese of the total population for these four counties was—

Hawaii.....	37.5 percent
Kauai.....	32.9 percent
Maui.....	31.7 percent
Honolulu.....	26.9 percent

In the 43 counties with 1,000 or more Chinese, the Chinese population ranged in numbers from 1,052 in Bexar County, Texas, to 58,696 for San Francisco County, California (table 5). The Chinese comprised less than one-tenth of the total population in all the counties in the Nation (table 10). Of the 10 counties with the highest proportion of Chinese (table 10), only San Francisco and Honolulu had the highest, each about 8 percent. For each of the 10 counties, the 1970 percentage represented an increase over 1960.

The two counties with the largest Filipino population were Honolulu, Hawaii, 65,553, and Los Angeles, California, 33,459 (table 6). Among the 10 counties with the highest percentage of Filipinos, counties in Hawaii led the ranking with Kauai County first, 27.3 percent, and Maui County second with 21.2 percent (table 11).

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Race. The data for race were derived from answers to question 4, which was asked of all persons (see facsimile of questionnaire item below). The concept of race as used by the Bureau of the Census does not denote any clear-cut scientific definition of biological stock. Rather, it reflects self-identification by respondents. Since the 1970 census obtained the information on race principally through self-enumeration, the data represent essentially self-classification by people according to the race with which they identify themselves.

For persons of mixed parentage who were in doubt as to their classification, the race of the person's father was used. In 1960, persons who reported mixed parentage of white and any other race were classified according to the other race; mixtures of races other than white were classified according to the race of the father.

In this report, the category "selected racial groups" includes Blacks, American Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and Filipinos. The category "Black" includes persons who indicated their race as Negro or Black, as well as some persons who did not classify themselves in one of the specific race categories on the questionnaire but who had such entries as Jamaican, Trinidadian, West Indian, Haitian, and Ethiopian.

The category "American Indian" includes persons who indicated their race as Indian (Amer.), as well as persons who did not classify themselves in one of the specific race categories on the questionnaire but reported the name of an Indian tribe or such entries as Mexican American-Indian, Canadian-Indian, or South American-Indian.

The category "Japanese" includes persons who indicated their race as Japanese, as well as persons who did not classify themselves in one of the specific race categories on the questionnaire but who had such entries as Japanese-American, Nipponese, or Oriental.

The category "Chinese" includes persons who indicated their race as Chinese, as well as persons who did not classify themselves in one of the specific race categories on the questionnaire but who had such entries as Chinese-American or Mongolian.

In addition to those persons who indicated their race as Filipino, the category "Filipino" includes persons who reported an entry such as Filipino-American.

The categories "Korean" and "Hawaiian" include persons in the 49 States, excluding Alaska, and in the District of Columbia who indicated their race as Korean or Hawaiian.

The categories "Aleut" and "Eskimo" include persons living in Alaska who indicated their race as Aleut or Eskimo.

In the tables, data for the categories "white" and "all other races" are not shown separately, but are included in the figures for the total population.

The category "white" includes persons who indicated their race as white, as well as some persons who did not classify themselves in one of the specific race categories on the questionnaire but entered Mexican, Puerto Rican, or a response indicating Indo-European stock.

The "all other races" category consists of persons who marked the "other" race category on the questionnaire. This last group includes Malayan, Polynesian, Thai, Vietnamese, etc.

Source of Data. Most of the statistics in this report are based on a complete count of the population and are the results of compilations from other 1970 and 1960 reports. The data for Aleuts and Eskimos are based on a 20-percent sample. The 1970 data are from the 1970 Census of Population, Volume I, Characteristics of the Population, Chapter B in the United States Summary, the various State volumes, and unpublished tabulations. Sources used for the 1960 data were the individual State reports of the 1960 Census of Population, Volume I, Characteristics of the Population and the supplementary report, Series PC(S1)-52, "Negro Population, by County: 1960 and 1950."
