SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT

Characteristics of the Spanish Surname Population by Census Tract, for SMSA's in Colorado: 1970

This report is one of a group of five reports presenting data for persons of Spanish surname in the standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's) of the five Southwestern States (report PC(S1)-57 for Arizona; report PC(S1)-58 for California; report PC(S1)-59 for Colorado; report PC(S1)-60 for New Mexico; and report PC(S1)-61 for Texas).

This report presents information on persons of Spanish surname living in census tracts of 400 or more persons of Spanish surname within SMSA's in the State of Colorado on April 1, 1970. It supplements the previously published 1970 census reports, Series PHC(1), *Census Tracts*, in which data were presented for the combined group "Persons of Spanish language or Spanish surname." In that group, persons of Spanish surname were combined with persons who were not of Spanish surname but who were of Spanish mother tongue or were living in families in which the head or wife reported Spanish as his or her mother tongue.

In the 1970 Census of Population, Colorado had 211,585 persons of Spanish surname. This total represented 10 percent of the State's total population, and 5 percent of the total Spanish surname population of the five Southwestern States (Arizona, California, Colorado, New Mexico, and Texas). The SMSA's described in this report comprise about 67 percent of the total Spanish surname population for the State.

In this report table 1 shows data on age, sex, relationship to head of household, type of household, school enrollment, years of school completed, and residence in 1965. Employment status, family income, and poverty status are given in table 2, and table 3 presents housing characteristics for households with a Spanish-surname head. Tables 1, 2, and 3 are similar in format to tables P-7, P-8, and H-5, respectively, of the 1970 census tract reports, Series PHC(1).

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Comparability with other census reports. The Spanish surname universe used in tables 1, 2, and 3 of this report is generally but not precisely comparable with the universe used for persons of Spanish surname in the 1960 census reports, *Census Tracts, Series PHC(1)*, since the latter includes only white persons of Spanish surname. In 1960, 98 percent of the population of Spanish surname in the five Southwestern States of Arizona, California, Colorado, New Mexico, and Texas, were reported as white. The corresponding figure in 1970 was 97 percent. The percentage varies, however, by State, and particularly by type of residence (metropolitan-nonmetropolitan, urban-rural, etc.) within the State. The percent distribution, by race, of the Spanish surname population in Colorado, by urban-rural residence and for SMSA's and selected places, is given in appendix table A.

The data in this report for persons of Spanish surname of all races are not strictly comparable to the data for persons of Spanish surname appearing in the 1970 publication, PC(2)-1D, Subject Report, **Persons of Spanish Surname**. In that report, the population of Spanish surname is restricted in most tables to persons of the white race and to persons of "other" races, excluding Negro, Indian, Japanese, Chinese, Filipino, Hawaiian, and Korean.

Persons of Spanish surname. Identification by Spanish surname was first used in the 1950 census and subsequently in the 1960 and 1970 censuses. Persons of Spanish surname were identified only in the five Southwestern States (Arizona, California, Colorado, New Mexico, and Texas); Spanish surname was not used as an identifier in the remainder of the United States because of the frequent occurrence in States other than the five Southwestern States of surnames identical to Spanish surnames but belonging to other ethnic groups e.g., Italian, Portuguese, French, etc. A manual coding operation was used to designate Spanish surnames, and coders were given a list of about 8,000 Spanish surnames originally compiled by the Immigration and Naturalization Service (and updated by the Census Bureau).¹

Although the manual coding operation of Spanish surnames did not change substantially since 1950, several changes were made in the content and format of the list used for the 1970 census. Content was expanded by adding surnames which had 25 or more listings in the 1962 edition of the Havana Cuba, telephone directory, and in the 1970 editions of the San Juan, Puerto Rico, and the Mexico City, Mexico, telephone directories.

Additions were also made by checking surnames with ethnic background in the 1968 October-December Urban Employment Survey and by including surname from the Charles R. Maduell Study.² In addition to coding as Spanish surname those names which were on the surname list, coders were instructed to code as Spanish any surname with endings in a, es, n, no, o, os, s, or z for which the front part of the name appeared on the list. Also, names which were on the list were coded as Spanish surnames if the name on the questionnaire had a prefix of De, Del, De La, De Las, or De Los, in addition to the name on the Spanish surname list. The name "Martin" was a special case. It was coded as Spanish: (1) if the person or either of his parents was born in a Spanish-speaking country in the Americas or Spain or (2) if the person indicated that Spanish was his mother tongue (on the 15 percent questionnaire); or (3) if the person indicated he was of Spanish origin (on the 5 percent questionnaire). Presentation of some Spanish surnames on the 1950 and 1960 lists was altered in 1970. Spanish surnames that varied only slightly from each other were combined into a single entry for the 1970 list. For example, the surnames Abel, Abela, and Abelas appearing separately in the 1960 list were grouped on one line in the 1970 list to read as Abel (as).

Standard metropolitan statistical areas. In the 1960 census reports, the Bureau of the Census recognizes 217 standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's) in the United States and 4 in Puerto Rico, making a total of 221. These include the 231 SMSA's as defined and named in the Bureau of the Budget publication **Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas: 1967**, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20410. Since 1967, 16 SMSA's have been added, of which 11 were defined in January 1968 and an additional 4 were defined in February 1971 on the basis of the results of the 1970 census. Changes in SMSA boundaries or titles made after February 1971 are not recognized here. SMSA's are defined by the Office of Management and Budget (formerly Bureau of the Budget).

A standard metropolitan statistical area is a county group of contiguous counties which contains at least one city of 50,000 inhabitants or more, or "twin cities" with a combined population of at least 50,000. In addition to the county or counties containing such city or cities, contiguous counties are included in the SMSA if, according to certain criteria, they are socially and economically integrated with the central city. Every SMSA must include at least one central city, and the complete title of an SMSA identifies the central city or cities. For a detailed description of the criteria used in defining SMSA's, see the Bureau of the Budget publication cited above.

Definition of census tract. Census tracts are small areas into which large cities and adjacent areas have been divided for statistical purposes. Tract boundaries were established cooperatively by a local committee and the Bureau of the Census. Tracts were generally designed to be relatively uniform with respect to population characteristics, economic status, and living conditions. The average tract has about 4,000 residents. Tract boundaries are established with the intention of being maintained over a long time so that comparisons may be made from census to census. A census tract which crosses the boundary of a place of 25,000 inhabitants or more is called a "split" tract. The totals for each of these "split" tracts appear at the end of each table.

In the decennial censuses, the Bureau of the Census tabulates population and housing information for each census tract, and the practice of local agencies to tabulate locally collected data by tracts has increased the value of census tract data in many areas.

For a further discussion of census tract data and their uses, see U.S. Bureau of the Census, **Census Tract Manual**, Fifth Edition, 1966, Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C. 20402.

Description of tracted area. The maps identifying the boundaries of the area for which the tract statistics are presented, are included in the 1970 census reports, **Census Tracts**, Series PHC(1). The maps also identify the location and number of each tract and, when appropriate, the limits of cities, townships, counties, or other subdivisions of the tracted area. Boundaries of the tracted area generally constitute a standard metropolitan statistical area (SMSA).

Sample size. The data in this report are based on a sample of 15 percent of the population and are therefore subject to sampling variability. Further information appears in the PHC(1) series, **Census Tracts**.

Derived figures (percents, medians, etc.). Percents, medians, and means, as well as certain rates and ratios are shown in these reports. For all types of derived figures in this report, the figure is not presented (but indicated by three dots "...") if the base is smaller than the minimum number prescribed for the sample on which the figure is based. The minimum base is 33 (persons, families, households, or housing units) for figures based on the 15 percent sample. Although figures are shown for all areas, except when the base is less than the specified minimum, the reader should exercise caution in the use and interpretation of data for very small areas or subgroups of the population because these data are especially subject to the effects of sampling variability, misreporting, and processing errors.

Percents which round to less than 0.1 are not shown but indicated as zero (i.e., "-"). The median, which is a

type of average, is the middle value in a distribution, i.e., the median divides the distribution into two equal parts—one-half of the cases fall below the median and one-half of the cases exceed the median. When the median falls in the lower terminal category of an open-end distribution, the method of presentation is to show the initial value of the next category followed by a minus sign; thus, for example, if the median falls in the category "Less than \$5,000," it is shown as "\$5,000-." When the median falls in the upper terminal category of an open-end distribution, the method of presentation is to show the initial value of the terminal category followed by a plus sign; thus, for example, if the median falls in the category "75 years and over," it is shown as "75+." The mean is the arithmetic average derived by adding the values in a particular distribution and dividing by the number of units in the distribution.

Symbols. A dash "-" signifies zero. Three dots "..." mean not applicable, or that the base for the derived figure is too small for it to be shown, or that the data are being withheld to avoid disclosure of information for individuals.

Population characteristics

Age. The age classification is based on the age of the person in completed years as of April 1, 1970, and was determined from the reply to questions on age and on month and year of birth.

Household. A household includes all the persons who occupy a group of rooms or a single room which constitutes a housing unit (see definition of housing unit, below). The average population per household is obtained by dividing the population in households by the number of household heads.

The population per household for persons of Spanish surname, shown in table 1, may not in all cases be a true representation of the household size for this group. For example, some persons may be roomers or domestic employees living with household heads of a different ethnic classification.

Relationship to head of household. Four categories of relationship to head of household are recognized in this report:

1. **Head of household.** One person in each household is designated as the "head," that is, the person who is regarded as the head by the members of the household. However, if a married woman living with her husband was reported as the head, her husband was considered the head for the purpose of simplifying the tabulations. Two types of household heads are distinguished — the head of a family and a primary individual. A family head is a household head living with one or more persons related to him by blood, marriage, or adoption.

younger persons slightly below, and for older persons slightly above, the true median.

Residence in 1965. Residence on April 1, 1965, is the usual place of residence five years before enumeration. The category "same house" includes all persons five years old and over who did not move during the five years as well as those who had moved but by 1970 had returned to their 1965 residence. The category "different house" includes persons who, on April 1, 1965, lived in the United States in a different house from the one they occupied on April 1, 1970, and for whom sufficient information concerning the 1965 residence was collected. These persons were subdivided into three groups according to their 1965 residence in or outside a standard metropolitan statistical area: "in central city of this SMSA," "in other part of this SMSA," and "outside this SMSA." The category "abroad" includes those with residence in a foreign country or outlying area of the United States in 1965.

Reference week. The data on employment status relate to the calendar week preceding the date on which the respondents completed their questionnaires or were interviewed by enumerators. This week is not the same for all respondents because not all persons were enumerated during the same week.

Employment status. Employed persons comprise all civilians 16 years old and over who were either (a) "at work"—those who did any work at all as paid employees or in their own business or profession, or on their own farm, or who worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers on a family farm or in a family business; or (b) were "with a job but not at work"—those who did not work during the reference week but had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent due to illness, bad weather, industrial dispute, vacation, or other personal reasons. Excluded from the employed are persons whose only activity consisted of work around the house or volunteer work for religious, charitable, and similar organizations.

Persons are classified as unemployed if they were civilians 16 years old and over and: (a) were neither "at work" nor "with a job, but not at work" during the reference week, (b) were looking for work during the past 4 weeks, and (c) were available to accept a job. Persons who did not work at all during the reference week and were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off are also included as unemployed.

The "civilian labor force" consists of persons classified as employed or unemployed in accordance with the criteria described above. The "labor force" includes all persons in the civilian labor force plus members of the Armed Forces (persons on active duty with the United States Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast

Guard). All persons 16 years old and over who are not classified as members of the labor force are defined as "not in labor force." This category consists mainly of students, housewives, retired workers, seasonal workers enumerated in an "off" season who were not looking for work, inmates of institutions, disabled persons, and persons doing only incidental unpaid family work (less than 15 hours during the reference week).

Occupation. The data on occupation in this report are for employed persons 16 years old and over and refer to the job held during the reference week. For persons employed at two or more jobs, the data refer to the job at which the person worked the greatest number of hours. The occupation statistics presented here are based on the detailed systems developed for the 1970 census: see **1970 Census of Population, Classified Index of Industries and Occupations**, U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C., 1971.

Income of families and unrelated individuals. In compiling statistics on family income, the incomes of all members 14 years old and over in each family are summed and treated as a single amount. However, in compiling the income data for unrelated individuals and persons 14 years old and over, the total amount of their own income is used. Although the income statistics cover the calendar year 1969, the characteristics of persons and the composition of families refer to the time of enumeration (April 1970). Thus, the income of the family does not include amounts received by persons who were members of the family during all or part of the calendar year 1969 if these persons no longer resided with the family at the time of enumeration. On the other hand, family income amounts reported by related persons who did not reside with the family during 1969 but who were members of the family at the time of enumeration were included. For most families, however, the income reported was received by persons who were members of the family throughout 1969.

The median income is the amount which divides the distribution into two equal groups, one having incomes above the median and the other having incomes below the median. For families and unrelated individuals the median income is based on the distribution of the total number of families and unrelated individuals, including those with no income.

The mean income is the amount obtained by dividing the total income of a particular statistical universe by the number of units in that universe. Thus, mean family income is obtained by dividing total family income by the total number of families.

Care should be exercised in using and interpreting mean income values in the statistics for small areas or small subgroups of the population. Since the mean is strongly influenced by extreme values in the distribution, it is

especially susceptible to the effects of sampling variability, misreporting, and processing errors. The median, which is not affected by extreme values, is, therefore, a better measure than the mean when the population base is small.

Poverty status in 1969. Families and unrelated individuals are classified as being above or below the poverty level, using the poverty index adopted by a Federal Interagency Committee in 1969. This index provides a range of income cutoffs or "poverty thresholds" adjusted to take into account such factors as family size, sex and age of the family head, the number of children, and farm-nonfarm residence. The poverty cutoffs for farm families have been set at 85 percent of the nonfarm levels. These income cutoffs are updated every year to reflect the changes in the Consumer Price Index. The poverty threshold for a nonfarm family of four was \$3,743 in 1969. For a detailed explanation of the poverty definition, see **Current Population Reports, Series P-23, No. 28, "Revisions in Poverty Statistics, 1959 to 1968."**

Households below the poverty level are defined as households in which the total 1969 income of the family or primary individual was below the poverty level. The incomes of persons in the household other than members of the family or the primary individual are not included when determining poverty status of a household.

The households for which poverty status is shown cannot be compared with the total number of households shown elsewhere. The former exclude those in certain types of housing units: owner-occupied units are restricted to one-family units on places of less than 10 acres and without a business on the property; and renter-occupied units exclude one-family units on places of 10 acres or more.

The "ratio of family income to poverty level" is obtained by dividing the income of a family by its corresponding poverty threshold. The "income deficit" is the difference between the total income of families and unrelated individuals below the poverty level and their respective poverty thresholds. In computing the income deficit, families reporting a net income loss are assigned zero dollars, and for such cases the income deficit is equal to the poverty threshold. The aggregate income deficit provides an estimate of the amount of money which would be required to raise the incomes of all poor families and unrelated individuals to their respective thresholds at the poverty level. The mean income deficit is the amount obtained by dividing the aggregate income deficit of a group below the poverty level by the number of families or unrelated individuals (as appropriate) in that group.

Housing characteristics

Housing units and group quarters. Living quarters are classified in the census as either housing units or group quarters. Usually, living quarters are in structures intended for residential use (e.g., a one-family home, apartment house, hotel or motel, boarding house, mobile home or trailer, etc.). Living quarters may also be in structures intended for nonresidential use (e.g., the rooms in a warehouse where a watchman lives), as well as in tents, caves, old railroad cars, etc.

A housing unit is a house, an apartment, a group of rooms, or a single room occupied or intended for occupancy as separate living quarters. Separate living quarters are those in which the occupants do not live and eat with any other persons in the structure and which quarters have either (1) direct access from the outside of the building or through a common hall or (2) complete kitchen facilities for the exclusive use of the occupants. The occupants may be a single family, one person living alone, two or more families living together, or any other group of related or unrelated persons who share living arrangements (except as described in the next paragraph or group quarters). For vacant units, the criteria for separateness, direct access, and complete kitchen facilities for exclusive use are applied to the intended occupants whenever possible (or to the previous occupants if this information cannot be obtained). Both occupied and vacant housing units are included in the housing inventory, except that mobile homes, trailers, tents, etc., are included only if they are occupied.

Group quarters are living arrangements for institutional inmates or for other groups containing five or more persons not related to the person in charge. Information on the housing characteristics of group quarters was not collected in the census.

Occupied housing units. A housing unit is classified as occupied if a person or group of persons is living in it at the time of enumeration or if the occupants are only temporarily absent, for example, on vacation. However, if the persons staying in the unit have their usual place of residence elsewhere the unit is classified as vacant.

Tenure. A housing unit is "owner occupied" if the owner or co-owner lives in the unit, even if it is mortgaged or not fully paid for. A cooperative or condominium unit is "owner occupied" only if the owner or co-owner lives in it. All other occupied units are classified as "renter occupied," including units rented for cash rent and those occupied without payment of cash rent.

Persons. Persons occupying the housing unit include not only occupants related to the head of the household but also any lodgers, roomers, boarders, partners, wards,

foster children and resident employees who share the living quarters of the household head. The data on "persons" show the number of housing units occupied by the specified number of persons.

Units with one or more roomers, boarders, or lodgers are shown as a separate category. Not included as "roomers, boarders, or lodgers" are foster children or wards, servants who live in, companions, and partners.

Year moved into unit. Data on year moved into unit are based on the information reported for the head of the household. The question refers to the year of latest move. Thus, if the head moved back into a unit he had previously occupied or if he moved from one apartment to another in the same building, the year he moved into his present unit was to be reported.

Rooms. Rooms to be counted include whole rooms used for living purposes, such as living rooms, dining rooms, kitchens, bedrooms, finished recreation rooms, family rooms, etc. Not counted as rooms are bathrooms, porches, balconies, foyers, halls, halfrooms, kitchenettes, strip or pullman kitchens, utility rooms, unfinished attics, basements, or other space used for storage.

Persons per room. This is computed by dividing the number of persons in the unit by the number of rooms in the unit. The figures shown, therefore, refer to the number of housing units having the specified ratio of persons per room.

Year structure built. Year structure built refers to when the building was first constructed, not when it was remodeled, added to, or converted.

Units in structure. In the determination of the number of units in a structure, all housing units, both occupied and vacant, were counted. The statistics are presented in terms of the number of housing units in structures of specified size, not in terms of the number of residential structures.

A structure is a separate building that either has open space on all sides or is separated from other structures by dividing walls that extend from ground to roof.

Plumbing facilities. The category "with all plumbing facilities" consists of units which have hot and cold piped water, as well as a flush toilet and a bathtub or shower inside the structure for the exclusive use of the occupants of the unit. "Lacking some or all plumbing" means that the unit does not have all three specified plumbing facilities (hot and cold piped water, as well as flush toilet and bathtub or shower inside the structure), or that the toilet or bathing facilities are also for the use of the occupants of other housing units.

Selected equipment. Statistics are presented for the number of housing units with the following selected equipment.

With more than one bathroom. A complete bathroom is a room with flush toilet, bathtub or shower, and wash basin with piped water. A partial or half bathroom has at least a flush toilet or bathtub (or shower), but does not have all the facilities for a complete bathroom. A housing unit "with more than one bathroom" has, in addition to one complete bathroom, one or more partial or complete bathrooms.

With public water supply. A public system refers to a common source supplying running water to six or more housing units. The water may be supplied by a city, county, water district, or private water company, or it may be obtained from a well which supplied six or more housing units.

With public sewer. A "public sewer" is connected to a city, county, sanitary district, neighborhood, or subdivision sewer system. It may be operated by a government body or by a private organization. Small sewage treatment plants which in some localities are called neighborhood septic tanks are also classified as public sewers.

With air conditioning. Air conditioning is the cooling of air by a refrigeration unit. A central system is a central installation which air-conditions the entire housing unit. A room unit is an individual air conditioner which is installed in a window or an outside wall and is generally intended to cool one room, although it may sometimes be used to cool more than one room.

With central or built-in heating system. Heating equipment refers to the type of heating equipment and not to the fuel used. A housing unit "With central or built-in heating system" contains a steam or hot water system, a warm-air furnace, built-in electric units, or a floor, wall, or pipeless furnace. "Steam or hot water" refers to a central heating system in which heat from steam or hot water is delivered through radiators or other outlets. "Warm air furnace" refers to a central system which provides warm air through ducts leading to various rooms; central heat pumps are included in this category. "Built-in electric units" are permanently installed in the floors, walls or ceilings. A "floor, wall, or pipeless furnace" delivers warm air to the room right above the furnace or to the room(s) on one or both sides of the wall in which the furnace is installed. "Other means" includes room heaters with or without flue, fireplaces, stoves, and portable heaters of all types.

With automobiles available. Statistics on automobiles available represent the number of passenger automobiles, including station wagons, which are owned or regularly used by any member of the household and which are ordinarily kept at home. Taxi-cabs, pickups, or larger trucks were not to be counted.

Value. Value is the respondent's estimate of how much the property (house and lot) would sell for if it were for sale. The term "specified owner-occupied units" means that the value data are limited to owner-occupied one-family houses on less than ten acres, without a commercial establishment or medical office on the property. Owner-occupied cooperatives, condominiums, mobile homes, and trailers are excluded from the value tabulations.

Mean value. Mean value is the sum of the individual values reported, divided by the number of owner-occupied units for which value is shown. For purposes of computation, the mid-points of the intervals were used, except that a mean value of \$3,500 was assigned to housing units in the interval "less than \$5,000" and a mean of \$60,000 was assigned to units in the interval "\$50,000 or more."

Contract rent. Contract rent is the monthly rent agreed to, or contracted for, even if the furnishings, utilities, or services are included. The term "specified renter-occupied units" means that the contract rent data exclude one-family houses on ten acres or more.

Gross rent. Monthly gross rent is the summation of contract rent plus the estimated average monthly cost of utilities (water, electricity, gas) and fuels (oil, coal, kerosene, wood, etc.), if these items are paid for by the renter, in addition to rent. Thus, gross rent is intended to eliminate individual differences which result from varying practices with respect to the inclusion of heat and utilities as part of the rental payment. Renter units occupied without payment of cash rent are shown separately as "no cash rent" in the rent tabulations.

Mean gross rent. Mean gross rent is the sum of the individual rental amounts divided by the number of renter-occupied units, excluding one-family houses on ten acres or more.

Gross rent as percentage of income. The yearly gross rent (monthly gross rent multiplied by 12) is expressed as a percentage of the total income in 1969 of the family or primary individual. The percentage was computed separately for each unit and was rounded to the nearest whole number. Units for which no cash is paid and units occupied by families or primary individuals who reported no income or a net loss comprise the category "not computed."
