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SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT

Per Capita Income, Median Family Money Income, and Low Income Status in 1969 for States, Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas, and Counties: 1970

This report presents data on per capita and median family income in 1969 for States, standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's) and counties ranked in descending order, from the highest to the lowest money income levels. Additional information on the proportion of families with incomes less than the low income level in 1969 is also shown for these areas. The data are presented in four tables--table 1 shows data for the United States by State; table 2 shows data for standard metropolitan statistical areas; and tables 3 and 4 show data for counties. Similar data on per capita and median family income in 1959 have been published in 1960 Census of Population Supplementary Reports, PC(S1)-48, "Per Capita and Median Family Money Income in 1959, for States, Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas, and Counties."

The statistics on per capita income, median family money income, and low income status of families in this report are published in U.S. Bureau of the Census, County and City Data Book, 1972, (A Statistical Abstract Supplement). Corresponding SMSA statistics have been further modified to reflect changes in geographic definition and the introduction of new SMSA's between April 1, 1970 and August 15, 1973.

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Of the 50 States and the District of Columbia, Connecticut was the highest ranking State in terms of per capita income (\$3,885) and the lowest in the proportion of families with income below the low income level (5.3 percent) while Alaska ranked highest in median family income (\$12,441). Mississippi ranked lowest in both per capita (\$1,925) and median family income (\$6,068) and had the highest percentage of families below the low income level (29.0 percent). Of the 263 standard metropolitan statistical areas, the Stamford, Conn. SMSA ranked highest in both per capita (\$6,319) and median family income (\$15,834). The McAllen-Pharr-Edinburg, Tex. SMSA ranked lowest in both per capita (\$1,482) and median family income (\$4,761).

When counties were ranked by per capita income, there were striking differences in both the proportion of the population residing and aggregate income received in the highest decile of counties (those with per capita income between \$5,446 and \$3,089) as opposed to counties with per capita income in the lowest decile (between

\$1,718 and \$516). As shown in table A, counties in the highest decile group contained 51 percent of the total population; whereas counties in the lowest decile domiciled about 2 percent of the population. Correspondingly, 59 percent of the total money income in the United States was acquired in the top decile of counties while only 1 percent was obtained in the lowest decile group.

It can be observed from table B that the 10 counties with the highest per capita income (between \$5,446 and \$4,644) had 2.75 and 4.36 percent of the U.S. population and aggregate income respectively, whereas the 10 counties with the lowest per capita income (between \$1,083 and \$516) had only 0.04 percent of the total population and 0.01 percent of the nation's aggregate income. These disparities are not surprising since the highest ranking are historically densely populated and very prosperous urban counties, whereas the lowest ranking counties are characteristically small and poor rural counties.

DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS

Income in 1969. Information on money income received in the calendar year 1969 was requested from all persons 14 years old and over. "Total income" is the algebraic sum of amounts received as wage or salary income, self-employment income, and income other than earnings. Wage or salary income is defined as the total money earnings received for work performed as an employee. It represents the amount received before deductions for personal income taxes, Social Security, bond purchases, union dues, etc. Self-employment income is defined as net money income (gross receipts minus operating expenses) from a business, farm, or professional enterprise in which the person was engaged on his own account. Self-employment income may be subdivided into farm and nonfarm self-employment income. Earnings is the algebraic sum of wage or salary income and self-employment income. Income other than earnings includes money income received from such sources as interest, dividends, net rental income, Social Security benefits, pensions, veterans' payments, unemployment insurance, and public assistance or other governmental payments, and periodic receipts from insurance policies or annuities. Not included as income are money received from the sale of property (unless the recipient was engaged in the business of selling such property), the value of income "in kind," withdrawals of bank deposits, money borrowed, tax refunds, and gifts and lump-sum inheritances or insurance payments.

In the statistics on family income, the combined incomes of all members of each family are treated as a single amount. Although the time period covered by the income statistics is the calendar year 1969, the composition of families refers to the time of enumeration (April 1970). For most of the families, however, the income reported was received by persons who were members of the family throughout 1969.

Median income. The median income is the amount which divides the distribution into two equal groups, one having incomes above the median, and the other having incomes below the median.

Per capita income. This is the average amount of income available for every man, woman, and child in an area. Per capita income is derived by dividing the total income of an area by the population in the same area.

Low income (poverty) status. Families are classified as being above or below the poverty level using the poverty index adopted by a Federal Interagency Committee in 1969. This index provides a range of income cutoffs or "poverty thresholds" adjusted to take into account such factors as family size, sex and age of the family head, the number of children, and farm-nonfarm residence. The poverty cutoffs for farm families have been set at 85 percent of the nonfarm levels. These income cutoffs

are updated every year to reflect the changes in the Consumer Price Index. The poverty threshold for a nonfarm family of four was \$3,743 in 1969. For a detailed explanation of the poverty definition, see Volume I reports of the 1970 Census of Population.

Limitations of the data. Since questionnaire entries for income are frequently based on memory and not on records, many persons tend to forget minor or irregular sources of income, resulting in the underreporting of income. In addition, there are errors of reporting due to misunderstanding of the income questions.

The income data in this report cover money income only. The fact that many farm families receive an important part of their income in the form of "free" housing and goods produced and consumed on the farm rather than in money should be taken into consideration in comparing the income of farm and nonfarm residents. It should be noted that nonmoney incomes are also received by some nonfarm residents. They often take the form of business expense accounts, use of business transportation and facilities, or partial compensation by business for medical and educational expenses. Many low income families also receive "income in kind" from public welfare programs. In comparing income data for 1969 with earlier years, it should be noted that an increase or decrease in money income does not necessarily represent a comparable change in real income, unless adjustments for changes in prices are made.

COMPARABILITY

1970 Census Volume I Reports. Statistics on per capita income, median family income, and low income status of families for States, SMSA's and counties are published also in 1970 Census of Population, Volume I Characteristics of the Population, chapter C, part 1 thru 52. However, the income data in these reports contain an overstatement of the number of families, unrelated individuals and persons with incomes of \$50,000 or more. The error, which was the result of a processing problem, occurred irregularly and appeared to have significant impact on income averages for only some of the many geographic areas shown in these reports. Corrections have been made to the income data in chapter C and are reflected in the statistics presented in this report. For further information on the corrections, see 1970 Census Users Bulletin No. 7 released in March 1973.

Bureau of Economic Analysis State and SMSA income series. The Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) of the Department of Commerce publishes annual data on aggregate and per capita personal income received by the population for each State and selected SMSA's. If the aggregate income was estimated from the income statistics shown in this report, it would be less than that

shown in the BEA income series for several reasons. The Bureau of the Census data are obtained directly from households, whereas the BEA income series is estimated largely on the basis of data from administrative records of business and governmental sources. Moreover, the definitions of income are different. The BEA income series includes some items not included in the income data shown in this report, such as income in kind, income received by nonprofit institutions, the value of the services of banks and other financial intermediaries rendered to persons without the assessment of specific charges, medicare payments, and the income of persons who died or emigrated prior to April 1, 1970. On the

other hand, the census income data include contributions for support received from persons not residing in the same household and employee contributions for social insurance.

Source of data. The statistics in this report were derived from a 20-percent sample of the population adjusted to represent the total population. More detailed definitions of the terms used in this report, explanations of collection and processing procedures and a statement on the sampling variability may be found in chapter C of 1970 Census of Population, Volume I, Characteristics of the Population.
