As stated on page III, chapter a corresponds to the PC(1)-C Individual State reports. After completion of the computer tabulation on which the PC(1)-C reports were based, a misclassification was discovered between the farm and nonfarm components of the rural population. This misclassification did not affect the data for the rural area as a whole, or for urban areas or the State as a whole. Certain portions of the tabulations were reprocessed for presentation in chapter $C$ and corrected farm-nonfarm figures are presented here. As a result of this reprocessing, however, the distributions by certain characteristics for the total rural population implicit in the farm-nonfarm data tics for the total rural population impliclt in the farm-nonfarm data
presented in tables 48 to 58 , 70 to 80 , and 134 to 137 may riot always be consistent with the area-wide totals shown in chapter $C$; these differences, which are relatively minor, may occur in the data on school enroliment, residence in 1965, occupation, income, and poverty.

Because of apparent processing errors, "mean other income" is not shown in table 118 for the following groups reporting "other income": The 183 families in Farmington Compact; the 222 families in Farmington town; the 291 families in Haverhill town; the 336 families in Newport Compact; and the 627 families in Somersworth town. Also in table 118, "mean income" is not shown for all families, families with female head, and all families and unrelated individuals in these five places. Similarly, "mean income" is not shown in table 135 for 226 familles With female head in Sullivan County and in table 137 for 75 female unrelated individuals in Rockingham County. The effect of these errors on the income data shown in this report is minor.
