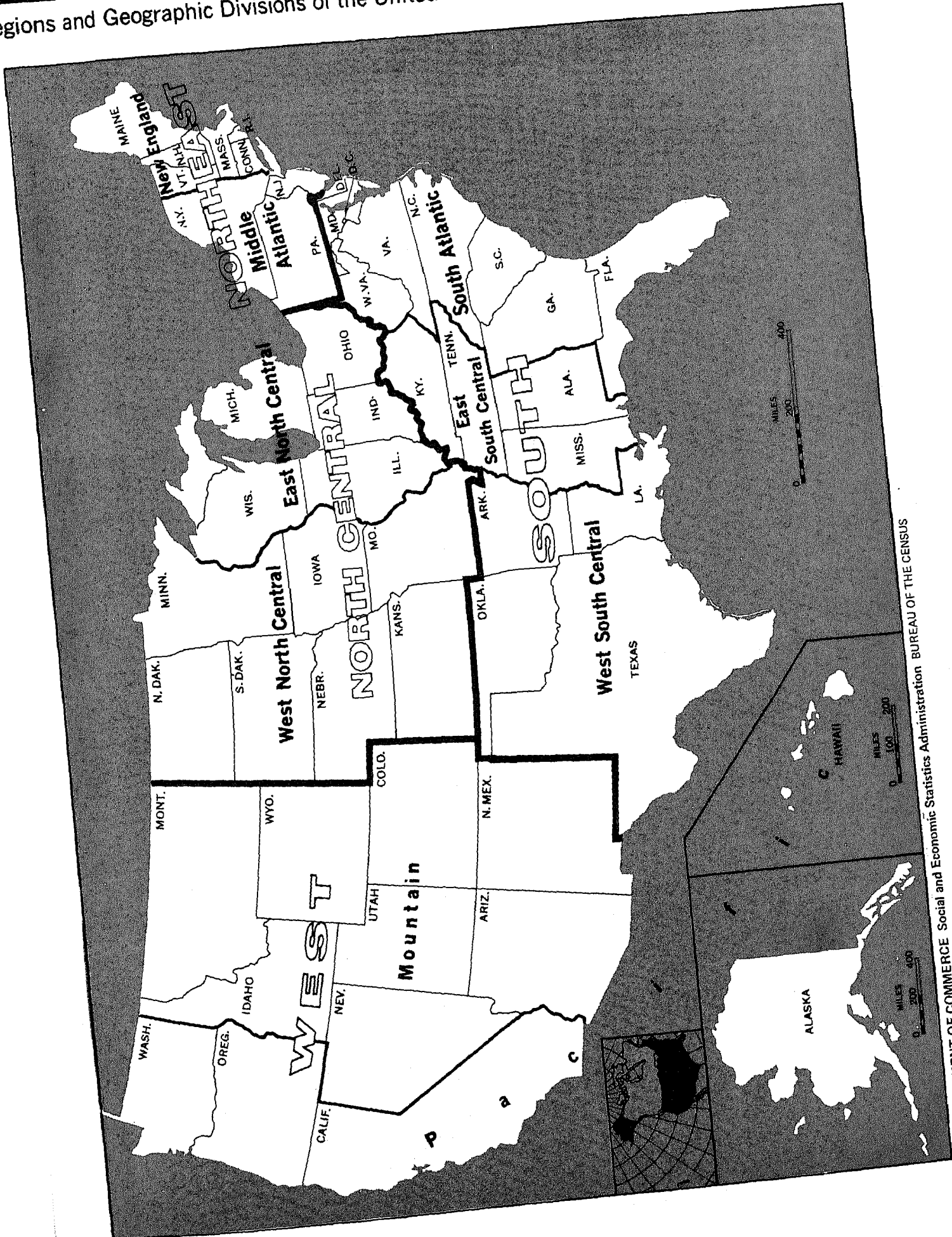

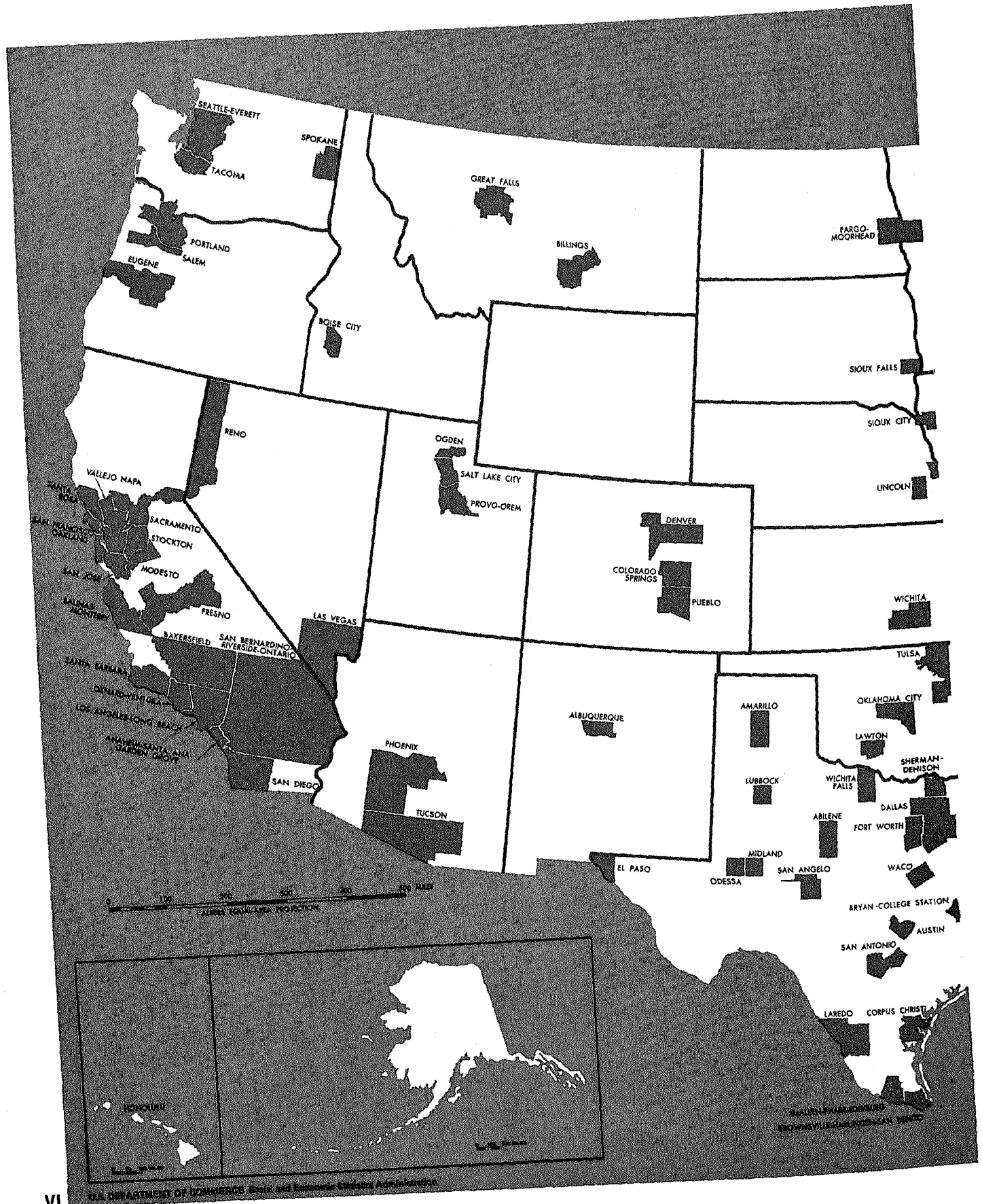

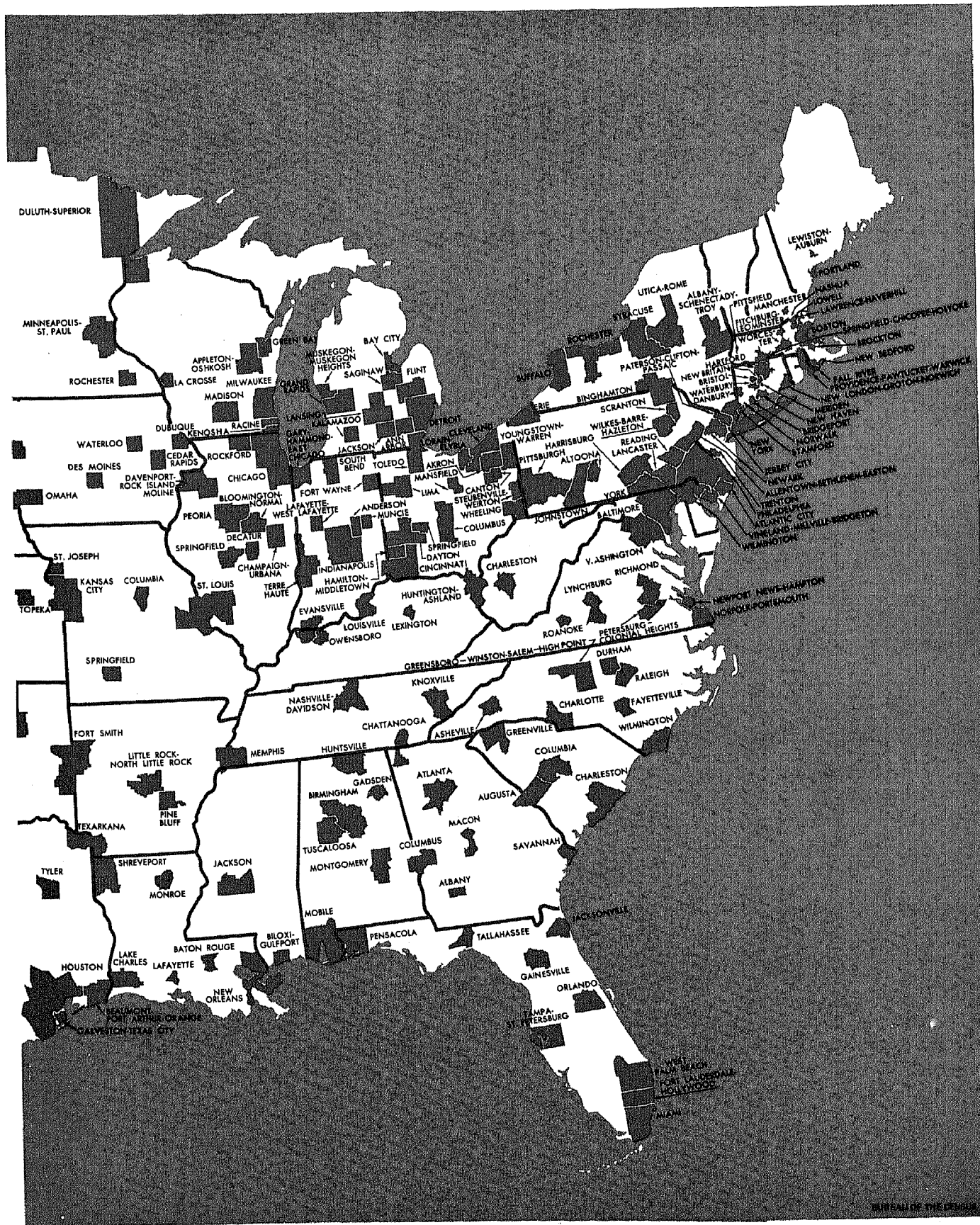

## GENERAL

This report presents statistics on the movement of persons five years old and over to, from, and within the standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's) of the United States during the period 1965 to 1970. The data were obtained from a question on residence on April 1, 1965, asked in the 1970 Census of Population. Legal provision for this census, which was conducted as of April 1, 1970, was made in the Act of Congress of August 31, 1954 (amended August 1957), which codified Title 13, United States Code.

A major portion of the information compiled from the 1970 Census of Population appears in Volume I, *Characteristics of the Population*, which focuses on the presentation of data for States, counties, places, and other areas of the United States. The present

report is part of Volume II, *Subject Reports*, wherein most reports concentrate on the presentation of national and regional data for a particular subject. For a description of Volumes I and II, as well as other elements of the data dissemination program of the 1970 Population and Housing Census, see Appendix E, "Publication and Computer Summary Tape Program."

The content and procedures of the 1970 census were determined after evaluation of the results of the 1960 census, consultation with a wide variety of users of census data, and extensive field pretesting. A number of changes were introduced in 1970 to improve the usefulness of the census results. For the characteristics shown in this report, the changes do not, however, affect to any appreciable extent the comparability of the 1970 data with those for 1960.

More detailed information on the technical and procedural matters covered in the text of this report can be obtained by writing to the Director, Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C. 20233. Such information will also appear in later reports of the 1970 census.

**Organization of the text.**—The text consists of this introduction and Appendixes A through E, which appear after the tables. The introduction contains information relating specifically to the principal subject of this report, such as definitions of terms and editing procedures. Appendix A provides general information concerning the presentation of data in this series of reports and the collection and processing procedures of the 1970 census. Appendix B describes the various area classifications (e.g., urban and rural residence, urbanized areas, etc.) and also explains the residence

rules used in counting the population. Appendix C provides brief definitions and explanations of subjects covered in cross-classifications in this report and other reports in this series. Appendix D presents information on sources of error in the data, sampling variability, ratio estimation, and editing procedures. Appendix E summarizes the data dissemination program.

**Content of the tables.**—Tables 1 through 5 show characteristics of movers between SMSA's, within SMSA's, and to SMSA's from nonmetropolitan areas. These data are shown by various size classes of SMSA's and nonmetropolitan places. Tables 6 and 7 show characteristics of movers to nonmetropolitan areas from SMSA's of each size class and from other nonmetropolitan areas. Tables 8 through 14 present separate data for the Negro population on the same types of movement as are shown for the total population in tables 1 through 7. Characteristics shown for the various classes of movers in tables 1 through 14 include age and sex, years of school completed, employment status, major occupation group, income in 1969, and children ever born.

Table 15 shows in-migrants and movers within individual metropolitan areas of 500,000 or more. Characteristics shown for the total and Negro population include age and sex, years of school completed, employment status, major occupation group, and income in 1969. The same characteristics are shown for out-migrants from these areas in table 16. The counties which make up each of the SMSA's shown in tables 15 and 16 are given in list A, at the end of this introduction.

Tables 17 through 22 present data on poverty status and receipt of public

assistance income for families of 6 selected cities. Characteristics shown include ethnic group, birthplace, and residence in 1965.

**Sample size.**—The statistics presented in this report are based on a 15-percent sample inflated to represent the total population. An explanation of the ratio estimation procedure and information on the sampling variability associated with the data are contained in Appendix D.

#### RELATED MATERIALS

**1970 census reports.**—The reports in Volume I of the 1970 Census of Population contain statistics on residence in 1965, State of birth, and year moved into present house for each State. Residence in 1965 and State of birth are also shown for the urban and rural parts of each State, for standard metropolitan statistical areas, urbanized areas, places, and counties. These data are summed to national and regional totals in the Volume I United States Summary report.

Volume II report/2E, **Migration Between State Economic Areas**, presents data on immigrants and out-migrants by age and sex for each of the 510 State economic areas (SEA's) into which the country is divided and a 510-by-510 matrix of SEA of residence in 1965 by SEA of residence in 1970. Plans for Volume II include additional reports on migration, covering such subjects as general mobility status by social and economic characteristics for States and the Nation, and State of birth by State of residence in 1965 and 1970.

Additional data on metropolitan area mobility are given for census tracts in the PHC(1) series on **Census Tracts** issued for individual SMSA's.

Data on year moved into present house according to various housing characteristics are presented for individual SMSA's in the HC(2) series on **Metropolitan Housing Characteristics** issued for individual SMSA's.

**Reports from earlier censuses.**—Like the 1970 census, the 1960 census contained a question on residence five years prior to the census date. An approach similar to that used in 1970 was followed in the publication of migration data from the 1960 census. The Volume I State reports presented data on mobility status and year moved into present house for States, by urban and rural residence, standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's), urban places of 10,000 or more, and counties. More detailed data were given in the Volume II reports PC(2)-2A, **State of Birth**; PC(2)-2B, **Mobility for States and State Economic Areas**; PC(2)-2C, **Mobility for Metropolitan Areas**; PC(2)-2D, **Lifetime and Recent Migration**; and PC(2)-2E, **Migration Between State Economic Areas**. Additional statistics on the mobility of the population were included in a few other PC(2) and PC(3) reports.

In both the 1950 and 1940 censuses, a number of special reports on mobility of the population were published. The statistics for 1950 related to residence one year earlier, rather than five years earlier; those for 1940 related to a 5-year period but differed somewhat in other respects from the 1960 and 1970 statistics.

**Current Population Survey.**—Sample data on mobility during the preceding year have been collected annually since 1948 in the Current Population Survey and have been

published mostly in **Current Population Reports**, Series P-20. Earlier surveys at irregular intervals covered other periods back to 1940.

**Estimates of net migration.**—The components of population change (natural increase and net migration) for the 1960-70 decade were estimated for the central city (cities) and the area outside the central city (cities) for each standard metropolitan statistical area. The estimates of net migration were prepared by means of the "residual method," whereby population change due to natural increase was subtracted from total population change over the decade, leaving a residual population change due to net migration. The residual method, therefore, includes the net effect of immigration and emigration, whereas the data in this report may sometimes include movers from abroad but make no allowance for persons leaving the United States. The 1960-70 estimates of net migration for metropolitan areas were published in U.S. Bureau of the Census, 1970 Census of Population and Housing, **General Demographic Trends for Metropolitan Areas, 1960 to 1970**, PHC(2)-1, United States.

Net migration was also estimated by means of the residual method for each of the 3,141 counties or county equivalents in the United States for the decade 1960-70. These data were published in U.S. Bureau of the Census, **Current Population Reports**, Series P-25, No. 461, "Components of Population Change by County: 1960 to 1970."

**Unpublished data.**—For most of the Volume II reports, statistics in addition to those published in the report are available on a reimbursable basis

from computer tape files. Data shown for the United States as a whole are available for regions, divisions, and States, and, in a number of instances, the data for some characteristics were tabulated in greater detail than shown in the reports. Requests for unpublished data, giving a specific description of the figures desired, may be made by writing to the Director, Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C. 20233. Inquiries concerning unpublished data should be transmitted to the Bureau as soon as possible because tape files are not maintained indefinitely.

**DEFINITIONS AND EXPLANATIONS OF PRINCIPAL SUBJECTS**

**Residence in 1965.**—The data on residence in 1965 were derived from answers to questions 19a and b (see facsimile below), which were asked of all persons in a 15-percent sample of the population. (Facsimiles of all other census questions and instructions to respondents are included in the Volume I reports.)

Respondents who reported that they lived in a different house on April 1, 1965, were instructed to report their usual place of residence on that date. In accordance with the

census concept of usual residence, persons in college or in the Armed Forces in 1965 were instructed to report as their 1965 residence the place where they were attending college or where they were stationed.

**Mobility status.**—Usual residence in 1965 was compared with usual residence in 1970 in order to determine each person's mobility status. The category "same house (nonmovers)" includes all persons 5 years old and over who were reported as living in the same house at the time of enumeration as five years earlier. Included in this group are persons who never moved during the five years, as well as those who had moved but by 1970 had returned to their 1965 residence. The category "movers" includes persons who, on April 1, 1965, lived in the United States in a different house from the one they occupied on April 1, 1970. This group was then subdivided according to type of move; e.g., movers within standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's), movers from nonmetropolitan areas, etc. Persons reporting the same area of residence (e.g., within SMSA's) could have moved from the area during the five-year interval but returned to

it before the 1970 census. Similarly, persons reporting a 1970 area of residence different from 1965 could have lived in several different areas during the five-year interval. The category "abroad in 1965" includes persons with residence in a foreign country, Puerto Rico, or an outlying area of the United States in 1965.

Persons 5 years old and over who indicated they had moved into their present residence after April 1, 1965, but for whom sufficiently complete and consistent information concerning residence on April 1, 1965, was not collected (or could not be inferred from information for other family members) are included in the group "moved, place of residence in 1965 not reported." Also included in this category are persons who gave no indication as to their movement since April 1, 1965, but were classified as having moved into their present house since April 1, 1965, on the basis of their response to question 18, "When did this person move into this house?" (All nonresponses to the latter question were allocated.)

**Size of place.**—For metropolitan areas, the size-of-place categories used in tables 1 through 14 for both 1970 and 1965 residence refer to the population of the area on April 1, 1970—that is, at the end of the migration interval. The individual SMSA's in each of the size classes may be determined from list B at the end of this introduction, which ranks SMSA's by 1970 population. Outside SMSA's, the size classes for residence in 1970 were based on the 1970 population; but those for residence in 1965 were determined somewhat differently, using the 1960 population or an intercensal

population count. A list was made of places which were outside the 1970 boundaries of SMSA's and had 20,000 inhabitants or more in 1960 or were known to have reached 20,000 from the results of a special census taken between 1960 and 1970. Nonmetropolitan residence in 1965 was then coded as being in one of these places or in the balance of the county. The columns of tables 1 through 14 conform to this system of classification.

In tables 6 and 13, the columns under "movers from nonmetropolitan

areas" exclude persons who moved within the same place. The category "movers within same place" consists of (1) persons who moved within a place that was identified as having a population of 20,000 or more at both the beginning and end of the migration period, and (2) persons who moved within a place that was not in the list of places of 20,000 or more at the beginning of the period but was shown to have at least 20,000 inhabitants by the 1970 census.

In tables 7 and 14, the columns under "movers from nonmetro-

politan areas" exclude persons who moved within the same place or balance of the same county. The column "within same place or balance of same county" refers to (1) persons who moved within a place that was identified as having 20,000 or more inhabitants at the beginning of the period but by the 1970 census had dropped below 20,000, and (2) persons who moved within the same county and whose residence at both dates was in the balance of the county, i.e., outside places of 20,000 or more.
